4 Indians, Including An Infant Freeze To Death Near Canada-Us Border; PM Trudeau Vows Action

4 bodies were found frozen just inside the Canadian side of the international border in an apparent human smuggling operation. The dead bodies were tentatively identified as the family of four that was separated from a group of other Indians at the US side of the border.

MANITOBA: In a heartbreaking tragedy, a family of four Indians, including a baby, has died from exposure to extreme cold



weather on the Canadian side of the border approximately 10km east of Emerson, in an apparent human smuggling operation. Canadian police said the conditions where the four bodies were found were extreme and the temperature was 35 below zero degrees with a wind chill.

The US, Canadian and Indian officials across the world called it an extremely tragic and heartbreaking incident. Canada's Prime Minister Justin Trudeau called it a "mind-blowing" story. "It's so tragic to see a family die like that, victims of human traffickers ... and of people who took advantage of their desire to build a better life," he said in a press conference, Reuters reported.

"This is why we are doing all we can to discourage people from crossing the border in an irregular or illicit manner.

Fraser Health had announced its decision to temporarily shut down the hospital's maternity unity due to lack of staff. However, on Thursday Fraser Health reversed the decision and announced to keep the maternity ward open. In a media conference, Dr. Victoria Lee, president and CEO, Fraser Health, said tnat "expectant individuals



who have pre-existing plans to deliver their babies at the hospital will be able to see those plans through with only sporadic single-day diversions and only when necessary."

4 Innocent Bystanders Injured In Langley, Coquitlam And Surrey Shootings

SURREY: Last week witnessed an increase in gun violence on the streets of Lower Mainland. These shootings were extremely tragic since innocent bystanders became victims along with those involved in the crime. Although the initial investigations found out that the violence is not related to Lower Mainland Gang conflict. But the police officials has reassured the public this does not take away importance of public safety and they are aware of the seriousness of the situation.

Chief Superintendent Ghalib Bhayani, Operations Officer for the Lower Mainland District RCMP along with Superintendent Duncan Pound, Deputy Operations Officer for the Combined Forces Special Enforcement Unit of British Columbia (CF-SEU) issued a joint statement to update the public about the gun crime and the police agencies efforts to stop this.

"We are here to address the recent shootings that have left four innocent bystanders injured in Langley, Coquitlam and Surrey, respectively. I want those victims and their families to know that we are thinking of them and wish them the best in their recoveries," Bhayani said.

Bhayani said that police community was acutely aware that "these acts of violence impact the public's sense of safety and well-being. That is unacceptable." But he reassured the pub-



lic that efforts are on to put a check on gun violence. He said that last year's efforts had resulted in a decrease in gun violence, but "Unfortunately, what we are experiencing now is an evolution, in that we are seeing street level criminals in what looks like interpersonal conflicts creating violence on our streets."

Superintendent Pound giving details about the recent crime said, "While CFSEU-BC isn't the investigative agency for the recent incidents, early indications are that in the three most recent shootings in Langley, Coquitlam and Surrey where one person lost their life and innocent bystanders were injured all initially appear connected to street-level drug trafficking. They do not, at this time, appear to have any direct links to the Lower Mainland Gang Conflict and do not appear to be connected to each other."

Robert Tomljenovic Found Guilty In 2020 Surrey Shooting Death Of Pritpal Singh

Surrey: On April 7, 2020 at 12:43 a.m., the Surrey RCMP responded to the reports of shots fired at the 8800-block of 138A Street. On arrival they found 21-year-old Pritpal Singh suffering from a gun shot wound.

On April 13, 2020, the Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) with the assistance of the Surrey RCMP and the Lower Mainland District Emergency Response Team (ERT) arrested Robert Tomljenovic for the murder of Pritpal Singh. On April 14, 2020, Tomljenovic was charged by the BC Prosecution Service.

Trial commenced in October of 2021. On January 20, 2022, Robert Tomljenovic

was found guilty of Manslaughter and Robbery with a firearm. The next court appearance is for sentencing.

"This outcome was the result of the tireless efforts of our IHIT investigators and partners from the Surrey RCMP" said Sergeant David Lee of IHIT, "our investigators will now be reaching out to the family of Pritpal Singh."

String Of Downtown Eastside Stabbings

Vancouver – Vancouver Police are investigating after four people were hospitalized in three separate stabbings on the Downtown Eastside.

The stabbings were among nine violent incidents VPD responded to in the neighborhood Wednesday.

"We're reviewing evidence to determine if any of these incidents are connected," says Constable Tania Visintin. "We're troubled by this level of violence, and we're concerned it could escalate."

The first stabbing occurred Wednesday morning, just after 4:30 a.m. A 29-year-old man stumbled into a convenience

store near Main and East Hastings streets bleeding from a large laceration on his face. Officers and paramedics responded, and the man was rushed to hospital with non-life threatening injures.

Hours later, around 1:30 p.m., VPD responded to a street fight near Main and Hastings streets. When officers arrived, they found one man suffering from a wound to his face, and another with head and torso injuries. Police are now trying to identify a five foot eight Indigenous man who was seen running north on Columbia Street. The man was wearing a grey and white hooded sweater, dark-coloured sweat pants, and

a black baseball cap.

Finally, around 6 p.m. yesterday, VPD officers were called to an apartment building near East Cordova and Columbia streets, after a man posted on social media that he was bleeding to death from a stab wound. He was taken to hospital and is now expected to survive.

"All three investigations are still in the very early stages. The motives for these violent attacks are unknown at this time," adds Constable Visintin. "No arrests have been made, and we're asking anyone with information to contact us."





BC Announces New Complex Care Housing For Vulnerable Population

The first four housing sites will be in Surrey, Abbotsford and Vancouver

SURREY: BC has announced a first-of-its-kind complex-care housing program for British Columbia's most vulnerable people who need a level of support that goes beyond the current housing model. The proposed model will integrate housing, health and social supports to people who have overlapping issues such as homelessness, substance abuse and mental health challenges.

The first four housing sites will be in Surrey, Abbotsford and Vancouver.In Surrey the new Foxglove supportive housing will be the site fir this housing.

Complex-care housing is voluntary and integrated within the health-care system with direct connections to treatment and specialized care that could include support from nurses, peer, social workers and other health professionals. These first four locations will serve approximately 100 people who need enhanced support beyond what is provided in existing supportive housing.

Government will monitor and evaluate implementation of complex-care housing services to inform areas of focus in future expansion.

Giving details of Surrey's site, Mayor Doug McCallum said, "At the new Foxglove building in Surrey,the Complex Care Housing program will be provided to 34 intensive supportive housing spaces

and 5 transitional or respite spaces."

"The Complex Care Housing spaces at the Foxglove building will be a valuable addition to the new supportive housing that City Council has put in place in Surrey. I commend the Province for the action being taken on this important issue and I look forward to working with them on building more innovative supportive housing projects in Surrey."

In 2021, three new modular housing sites were open in Surrey creating 136 units of supportive housing for the most vulnerable. Foxglove is one of three new supportive housing buildings that will open in 2022. The three new buildings will create an additional 230 apartments and single bedroom units to house the homeless and other populations in need.

In addition to the various health, personal, social and job supports provided in supportive housing, the enhanced clinical and other services available in complex-care housing include:

- * physical, mental-health and substanceuse care:
- * psychosocial rehabilitation supports;
- * social, emotional and community supports:
- * personal care and personal living supports:
- * Indigenous cultural supports; and
- * co-ordination and navigation services.

Scammer Asking For 'Bail Money' Gets Arrested By

Delta Police

Awould-be-scammer, looking to collect \$25,000 for "bail money" from a Delta resident, instead was met by police at the door and arrested.

Marie-Jeanne BELANGER, age 22, of Quebec, is facing one charge of committing fraud over \$5,000. She was released from custody on Jan. 17, on a number of conditions.

A Delta resident received a series of phone calls from someone claiming to be with the RCMP on January 13, and was told she urgently needed to provide bail money for her grandson. Notably, the person on the line knew the name of her grandson. She was told to keep the conversation confidential.

"Unfortunately scammers will often pretend to be with police or government agencies, in order to gain the trust of the victim," explains Inspector Brian Hill, in charge of frontline patrol at Delta Police. "Phone calls from these scammers may even appear to be coming from the agency or police department. However, we want the public to know it's very easy for phone numbers to be faked or spoofed."

In this case the victim handed over \$10,000 on January 13, to a person who collected the cash directly from her, at her home. On the 14th, the scammers called back, saying the victim's grandson needed additional money for probation, another \$25,000.

"Fortunately she became suspicious, particularly when her supposed grandson was not able to answer questions," says Inspector Hill. "She called Delta Police, and we immediately began an investigation. Thanks to her timely alert, our officers were in place when the suspect showed up at her door that evening."

Police arrested the suspect without incident and are currently working with other police departments in the Metro Vancouver area to determine if this incident is linked to other similar complaints, some of which were recently publicized by media

"I can also confirm that there are outstanding persons of interest in this matter, with whom the police would like to speak," says Insp. Hill.

Police have not recovered the \$10,000 that the victim initially handed over. No money was provided during the second instance.

The public is cautioned that Canadian police will not contact you in any manner to request funds for bail money, probation, etc. If you suspect the person on phone pressuring you to hand over money may not be who they claim, hang up immediately. Use the internet to find a general number for that agency, and call them directly, to determine if there is any legitimacy to what is claimed.

The "Bail Money" scam


North Vancouver RCMP also alreted the community to the "Bail Money" scam that starts on the phone and ends with the fraudsters going to victims' homes to collect cash.

The "bail money" scam goes like this:

1. The phone call: A fraudster calls you and pretends to be your grandchild/child/other relative, a police officer or a lawyer.

2. The emergency: The fraudster tells you that your relative has been arrested and is in jail.

gendra Yadav, Mayank Gandhi, ShaziaIlmi, Shivendra Chauhan and a number of volunteers. In the end, when Raizada tries to meet Kejriwal, it is shown that he is unable to meet.

The six parts web series' song 'Kitna Chanda Jeb Mein Aaya' - sung by Udit Narayan, composed by Pravesh Malik, lyrics for which have been written by Annu Rizvi - had become an instant hit and caught the imagination of people, especially on social media.

The web series was released on YouTube on January 17.

Raizada had taken a sabbatical from his practice in Chicago and had joined the AAP as a volunteer in 2013.

According to Raizada, he remained with the party till its victory in Delhi Assembly polls in 2015 and even worked in the government for some time. Then, when the issue of "lack of transparency" in donations came forth

ahead of 2020 elections, he raised his voice against the party.

The AAP has emerged as a main contender in the political space in Punjab and recently declared Bhagwant Singh Maan as its CM face. Raizada had even toured Punjab recently and held a press conference in Chandigarh in January first week, and again, declared how the party had "systematically deviated from the principles.'

"Remember they came promising vyavastha Parivartan (systemic change). But now they have totally changed," Raizada said in an interview to IANS and recalled the happenings in the party that led him to raise voice against the "non-transparent" manner in which donation collection was happening then.

Former AAP members Yogendra Yadav and Prashant Bhushan too had raised their voices about these things and were later thrown out of the party.



The thought of web series came to Raizada's mind to bring out what he claims are the "wrongdoings" that went on in the party. The series could not be completed before the February 2020 Assembly polls in Delhi, so he released only the theme song and a trailer in January.

"If you look at it, Kejriwal is still

doing the same thing. After gathering large donations in a nontransparent manner, he is still saying, 'I will break piggy banks of children to collect funds for getting work done'. Therefore, I thought, people need to know the truth," he said as the reason for bringing out the web series on YouTube now.

Chetna Association Of Canada Lauds Decision To Postpone Punjab Polls To Feb 20

The Javanti falls on February 16. A large number of devotees start moving to Varanasi around a week before the day of celebration and polling on February 14 would have deprived them of voting.

"By having the elections on the

same day as the Jayanti would not have only dampened the celebrations across the globe, it would have also resulted a lack of confidence in the institution mandated to facilitate fair elections. By listening to the petitioners and making timely decision, we commend the Election Com-

mission and convey our heartfelt gratitude. There is a large following of Guru Ravidass in Canada who will also be observing the Guru Ravidass Jayanti around the same time. Many of these patrons will also now be able to observe the day with a greater joy," a note from the Association mentioned.

Peace Arch Maternity Unit To Remain Open; Thanks To Surrey Mayor, Community, Health Staff For Raising Concerns

Although the health authority explained that the decision came because of the "new scheduling commitments from the pediatric group at Peace Arch Hospital and commitments from other provider partners," the significant role of community, leaders and health staff that raised strong voice against the closure, cannot be denied.

Dr. Semion Strovski, head of the Peace Arch maternity clinic, was amongst the first to raise concerns about the closure. In his interviews to various media outlets, he said that he was "disappointed" as proposals to improve pediatric services, retention and recruitment were made 3 years ago.

Fraser Health explaining its decision to temporarily close the maternity unit stated, "Recruiting pediatricians to work in smaller hospitals, particularly those such as Peace Arch Hospital that do not have pediatric units, can be a challenge since some pediatricians prefer to work in larger acute settings."

In response to a gap in pediatrician availability due to an unexpected leave at Peace Arch Hospital, Fraser Health then asked expectant individuals to attend Langley Memorial Hospital for their deliveries. "When we are unable to fill gaps in physician availability or other non-medical staff, we reluctantly implement



temporary diversions to ensure the safety of our patients," the health authority explained.

Criticism and outrage poured in from would be mothers and residents of the White Rock community who rallied outside the hospital, against the decision.

Surrey's Mayor Doug MacCallum, issued a strong statement and reassured the residents of Surrey "to count on the full weight of the City of Surrey to help solve Peach Arch Hospital's maternity ward closure issue"

Reacting to the overwhelming

response by the community, Surrey Mayor

said that as the second largest city in BC and growing by more than 1000 residents each month, the demand for local and accessible healthcare was a top priority for the more than 600,000 people who reside in Surrey.

He called the outrage "justifiable because according to him "the money raised by the hospital foundation specifically for the maternity unit has been all for naught."

"As a former Chair of Peace Arch Hospital, I would strongly urge Fraser Health and the Ministry of Health to rescind their decision. I want to assure them that they can count on the full weight of the City of Surrey to help solve this problem. The Peace Arch Hospital maternity unit is a critical component of health care for the community and it should stay that way for now and the future," the Mayor said.

The health authority finally reverted the decision and came out with "significant new scheduling commitments from the pediatric group" to keep the maternity unit up and running. It said, "The

maternity unit at Peace Arch Hospital is fully funded and will remain fully funded. As well, in partnership with the Ministry of Health, we have been able to implement an alternative payment model to support pediatric recruitment. We have also expanded our services to support a Pediatric Rapid Access Clinic at Peace Arch Hospital. These actions underscore and reaffirm our commitment to maternity and pediatric services at Peace Arch Hospital. Recruitment is a challenge, and for this reason is a priority, and we will provide regular updates on progress. All partners are committed to working towards safe maternity services at Peace Arch Hospital with no disruption while Fraser Health continues its recruitment efforts. We acknowledge all of our partners for their continued support for maternity and pediatric services at Peace Arch Hospital."

Mayor McCallum said, "There is no question that the decision to keep the maternity unit open is the right one. I want to thank the residents, doctors and nurses for banding together to voice their concerns. I also would like to thank Health Minister Adrian Dix and Fraser Health CEO Dr. Victoria Lee for their efforts in finding a solution to keep this valuable community health resource open."



U.S. Attorney's Office at the District of

Minnesota elaborated on the US side of the incident in a statement. "The U.S. Border Patrol (USBP) based out of P'GRC Pembina, North Dakota initiated a traffic stop on a whitecolored, fifteen passenger van less than one mile south of the U.S./Canadian border in a rural area between the official ports of entry located at Lancaster. Minnesota and Pembina, North Dakota. The driver of the ve-



According to US court documents, law enforcement discovered cases of plastic cups, bottled water, bottled juice, and snacks located in the extreme rear of the passenger van. Law enforcement also discovered receipts dated January 18, 2022, for the drinks and snacks, and rental agreement receipts in Shand's name for the van, with the return date listed for January 20, 2022.

USBP arrested Shand for smuggling undocumented foreign nationals. While Shand and the two passengers were being transported to the Pembina Border Patrol Station in North Dakota, law enforcement encountered five additional Indian nationals approximately a quarter mile south of the Canadian border walking in the direction of where Shand was arrested.

They appeared to be headed to an unstaffed gas plant located in St. Vincent, Minnesota. The five Indian nationals explained that they had walked across the border expecting to be picked up by someone. The group estimated they had been walking around for over 11 hours. One of the group members was in possession of a backpack that did not belong to him. He stated he was carrying the backpack for a family of four Indian nationals that had earlier walked with his group but had become separated during the night. The backpack contained children's clothes, a diaper, toys, and some children's medication.

Later during the day on January 19, 2022, USBP received a report from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police that four bodies were found frozen just inside the Canadian side of the international border. The dead bodies were tentatively identified as the family of four that was separated. Two of the surviving Indian nationals sustained serious injuries and were transported to a hospital.

India's High Commissioner to Canada Ajay Bisaria described the incident as a grave tragedy. "This is a grave tragedy. An Indian consular team is travelling today from @IndiainToronto to Manitoba to coordinate and help. We will work with Canadian authorities to investigate these disturbing events," Bisaria tweeted. Assistant Commissioner Jane MacLatchy, Commanding Officer of the Manitoba RCMP said in a statement, "I know that what I'm about to share is going to be difficult for so many to hear. I am here to advise you of the discovery of four deceased individuals in Manitoba

near the Canada/ US border." informed She

that on the morning of January 19, 2022, Manitoba RCMP officers with the Integrated Border Enforcement Team received concerning formation from their counterparts in the United States.

Specifically, the Assistant Commissioner Jane MacLatchy. information outlined that officers with the US Cus-

> toms and Border Protection had apprehended a group of individuals who had crossed into the US from Canada, near the town of Emerson, Manitoba, Further, it indicated that one of the adults had items meant for an infant but that no infant was with the group.

> Upon receiving this information at 9:23 am, a search was immediately launched on both sides of the border.

> RCMP officers were already patrolling the area and the search began at 9:24am. Extensive patrols were conducted and, at approximately 1:30pm, the bodies of three individuals were located on the Canadian side of the border, approximately 10km east of Emerson.

> They have been identified as: an adult male; an adult female; and an infant.

> Fearing there may be additional victims, officers continued their search and located the body of an additional male, believed at this time to be in his mid-teens. All victims were located approximately 12 metres from the US/Canada border.

> "At this very early stage of the investigation, it appears that they all died due to exposure to the cold weather. Work is underway to identify the victims and an autopsy has been scheduled to confirm the cause of death," she said.

> We are very concerned that this may have been facilitated in some way and that these individuals, including an infant, were left in the middle of a blizzard when the weather hovered around -35 degrees Celsius when factoring the wind.

> These victims faced not only the cold weather but also endless fields, large snowdrifts, and complete darkness.

> As we suspect the group is tied to the individuals found on the US side of the border, we are working in close collaboration with U.S. Customs and Border Protection and the U.S Department of Homeland Security."

> In a statement, the Canada Border Services Agency said it is also working with law enforcement partners, as well as its American counterparts, on the investiga-

Top 5 Tips for Driving Safe in Winter

Winter conditions make driving a challenge, even for experienced drivers. Rain, snow, fog, and slippery roadscan be tough to navigate. Weather conditions change quickly and unexpectedly. Personal injury claims spike in the winter, but there are steps you can take to prevent accidents. Here are mine five top tips on how to drive safe during winter:

1. Winterize your vehicle: Take your vehicle for a tune-up before the winter weather

If a winter storm is in the forecast, avoid driving if possible. You can't get into a crash if you aren't out on the roads.

4. Reduce speed:Posted speed limits are meant for ideal conditions. When dealing with snow, rain, ice, or fog, it may be safer to drive at less than the posted speed limit. Slowing down gives you time to react to road conditions and other drivers.


Leave space. Speed is a major factor in winter accidents, but so is proximity to other vehicles. The closer you are to other drivers, the less time you have to reactif your vehicleskids or you lose control. When you leave extra room and increase following distance, you give yourself time to react if another driver suddenly brakes, loses control, or does something unexpected. Use extra cautionaround highway maintenance vehicles such as snowplows, salt/ sand trucks. Maintenance vehicles often throw up snow and debris that reduces visibility.Leave as much room as possible.

Remember, even if you follow these tips, you may still be vulnerable to having a motor vehicle accident due to the presence of black ice. Black ice commonly forms on concrete after freezing rain or snow, which impacts stopping distance and vehicle handling. Black ice is very difficult to see on the road, so in addition to understanding how to drive on it, try to be aware of the traffic surrounding you to spot it in ad-

Supports **Expanded** For Flood-Affected Residents

/ICTORIA - Starting Feb. 1, 2022, people affected by the flooding in fall 2021 receiving Emergency Support Services will see this support evolve to personalized wraparound services delivered by the Canadian Red Cross.

Through the Red Cross, the provincial and federal governments will provide personalized recovery support, including interim housing and basic needs assistance. These personalized supports will be funded by donations to the 2021 Canadian Red Cross British Columbia Floods and Extreme Weather Appeal.

"This is expanding on the initial support that evacuees have received through Emergency Support Services since Nov. 15, 2021. Personalized recovery support will include assessments to identify needs and will complement local government and provincial efforts to assist people as they navigate the recovery process," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General.

The Government of Canada and the Province of British Columbia committed to matching donations to the Floods and Extreme Weather Appeal, and thanks to the generosity of Canadians, the Red Cross has raised more than \$30 million in donations for more than \$90 million. As of Jan. 17, 2022, the Red Cross has distributed more than \$17 million in evacuation-related emergency financial assistance to more than 7,200 eligible households.

A Red Cross case manager will help households access assistance from existing government programs where eligible, such as Disaster Financial Assistance, and develop a plan for recovery that can access additional funds to repair or rebuild their primary residences or relocate to a new community.

The Red Cross is reaching out to people who are currently receiving Emergency Support Services, or those that have indicated they would like to discuss recovery supports.

Scott Mulder will sit in Quesnel where he will serve as the sole judge. His appointment will fill the role being vacated by the resident judge upon his retirement. Michael Munro will sit in Victoria to help fill the role left by a senior judge who retired on Dec. 3, 2021. His appointment will also help support the virtual bail court for the southern area of Vancouver

Rapid Test Kits Distributed For Symptomatic School Staff

week, 200,000 rapid antigen test kits are being shipped to the kindergarten-to-Grade 12 (K-12) sector for use by staff, teachers and administrators with symptoms of COVID-19.

Rapid antigen tests are an additional tool that can be used to support the continuity of learning in schools with the aim to reduce transmission of CO-VID-19.

The number of teaching and non-teaching staff will determine the number of tests received by each school district, independent schools and First Nation schools. In B.C., there are approximately 86,700 public school employees, 16,000 employees of independent schools and 1,000 employees in First Nation schools.

The Ministry of Health and the Office of the Public Health Officer continue to direct how rapid antigen tests are best used as part of the provincial pandemic response, including if additional tests will be deployed for use in the K-12 sector.

The allocation of test kits for the K-12 sector was



received from Artron Laboratories Inc., a Burnabybased company, and is in addition to supplies provided to medical health officers in health authorities that will continue to be used to investigate clusters and outbreaks in schools.

The Ministry of Education continues to engage with experts on ventilation and work with school districts to improve ventilation systems, including the deployment of HEPA filters in classrooms that do not have access to mechanical ventilation systems. Since the beginning of the pandemic, B.C. has invested \$114.5 million to assist school districts in upgrading ventilation in thousands of classrooms across the province. Additional funding to support further ventilation improvements and upgrades in K-12 public schools will soon be made available.

The Rolling Truck Program had been scheduled for introduction on February 1, which would have financially punished Independent Opera-

tors already facing challenging circumstances. Citing recent extreme weather and ongoing impacts from COVID-19, the Port of Vancouver made the deferral announcement following receipt of a letter from Transport Minister Omar Alghabra asking for consideration for a "short delay" of the program.

In a media release UTA stated that signed by both the Government of Canada and the Port of Vancouver. the 2014 Joint Action Plan ended the Port labour disruption under false pretenses. Now nearly 8 years later, a number of commitments made by the Port of Vancouver and the Government of Canada have yet to be

"These broken promises include no enforcement for unlicensed trucks on Port-leased property, no common terminal reservation system and waiting time fee payments that are not always paid to Independent Operators," said Gagan Singh of the UTA The UTA is calling on Transport Canada to take the next 90 days to work on addressing these outstanding issues with tangible action. "While the UTA supports the deferral of the Rolling Truck Age Program, there are a number of issues that the Government of Canada and the Port of Vancouver must live up to as per the agreement we all signed in 2014," says Singh. "If labour fairness, peace and stability is a commonly-held goal for all parties. then it is critical that we make use of the next few months to fix the problems that were supposed to be solved nearly eight years ago."

"The UTA is extremely grateful for the efforts of the Minister on this file, and of the various members of the Pacific Liberal Caucus for their strong advocacy," added Singh. "We look forward to broadening the conversation with Transport Canada and these elected officials to finally create a fair and profitable marketplace for all involved."

Over the coming weeks, the UTA will be releasing a publicly available list of outstanding commitments as well as improvements to working conditions still necessary. Executive members look forward to subsequently meeting with Transport Canada and Port of Vancouver officials in support of improving Canada's global competitiveness.





Advice For Lower Mainland Businesses To Protect Against Break-Ins And Vandalism

VANCOUVER: There have been news stories in recent weeks about a rash of brazen robberies including shoplifting - sometimes in large quantities, as well as break-ins and vandalism of Lower Mainland businesses including smashed store windows.

"Businesses that serve the public are especially exposed to this kind of risk – everything from retail stores to car lots," said Lin-

> da Annis, Executive Director of Metro Vancouver Crime Stoppers.

> Metro Vancouver Crime Stoppers and local police suggest there are several measures businesses can consider to better protect their property, their merchandise and themselves.

> Many helpful crime prevention tips like the ones below are available on the Crime Stoppers website solvecrime. ca and on RCMP and police department websites.

HELPFUL ADVICE FOR BUSINESSES LARGE AND SMALL

- Move merchandise away from windows or remove it altogether from easy access in a retail space.
- Have shatterproof (burglar resistant) glass in your windows.
- Keep the sight lines to your business clear. Trim shrubs in front and keep windows as clear as possible of posters and signs that can block your visibility.
- Add window shutters if your store is in a high- risk area for crime.
- Lock valuables in a safe or remove from the premises.
- · Shred sensitive papers.
- Keep a record of serial numbers for valuables, and/or engrave them with a driver's licence number in case they're stolen and later recovered.
- Check your locks pin tumbler cylinder locks work well.
- Have one key and lock for outside doors and a different key and lock for interior doors.
- Re-key your store/business if keys are lost and ensure you keep a log of who has keys.
- Ensure your alarm is working properly.
- Flood your premises with light inside and improve outdoor lighting to ensure your business and the space around it are well-lit.





Higher Inflation, Unemployment Make Canada **6th Most "Miserable" Country Among**

35 Advanced Economies

higher inflation rate coupled with higher unemployment make it the 6th most miserable countries among 35 advanced economies worldwide, finds a new study released by the Fraser Institute, an independent, non-partisan Canadian public policy think-tank.

"Canadians are rightly concerned about the country's high inflation and unemployment rates, and when compared to other developed countries, Canada is not doing well," said Jason Clements, executive vice president of the Fraser Institute and co-author of Return of the Misery Index.

7ANCOUVER—Canada's The study finds that out of the International Monetary Fund's 35 most advanced economies, Canada has the 6th worst Misery Index score in 2021 of 10.88—a combination of Canada's inflation rate of 3.15 and unemployment rate of 7.72.

> Only five countries are more miserable than Canada. Spain is the worst with a Misery Index score of 17.61, followed by Greece (15.73), Italy (11.96) and Iceland (11.26). Other notable countries, which are less miserable than Canada, include France (10.10), the United States (9.72), Australia (7.33) and the United Kingdom (7.17). The least miserable countries



with the lowest index scores are Switzerland (3.57) and Japan (2.61).

The Misery Index was developed by American economist Arthur Okun as a way to capture both the costs of high inflation and high unemployment.

While prominent in policy discussions in the 1970s and 1980s, the Misery Index all but disappeared from public discourse starting in the early 1990s as inflation was tamed and remained low, and unemployment in most countries trended downwards.

"The fact that we are again discussing the Misery Index and Canada's high ranking on it is bad news for all Canadians, who will suffer as a result," Clemens said.

"Governments across Canada, particularly the federal government, should prioritize those policies that will make Canadians less miserable by lowering inflation and unemployment."

Canada **Should Cut** Taxes To Combat Inflation

TTAWA, ON: The Canadian Taxpayers Federation is calling on the federal government to join other countries in cutting taxes to help taxpayers deal with a rising cost of living. "Canadians are fueling up at

the pumps and then worrying about whether they have enough left over for ground beef at the grocery store," said Franco Terrazzano, Federal Director of the CTF. "Inflation is a key econom-

ic issue facing Canadian families and our politicians need to wake up and provide some relief."

Prices increased by 4.8 per cent year over year, according to inflation data released by Statistics Canada this week.

The federal carbon tax has increased twice during the pandemic and is scheduled to increase again to 11 cents per litre of gasoline on April 1. 2022. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said he will increase the carbon tax to nearly 40 cents per litre of gas by 2030 and impose a second carbon tax through fuel regulations that could add an additional 11 cents per litre.

Canadian workers making more than \$64,900 will see their payroll tax bills increase by \$396 this year. The federal government is set to increase alcohol taxes for the third time during the pandemic on April

While Canada is raising taxes, other jurisdictions are providing relief during the pandemic:

- · South Korea reduced gas taxes by 20 per cent for six
- · Spain cut its value added tax on electricity from 21 to 10 per cent until April 30
- · Italy is cutting income and business taxes · France is reducing electricity
- The United Kingdom cut fuel
- taxes on short flights · Poland is reducing food and
- fuel taxes · Sri Lanka is cutting food and medicine taxes
- · India cut fuel taxes
- · Eleven American states are cutting income or business taxes rates

"High taxes and soaring prices are making the tough times tougher in Canada," said Terrazzano. "While other countries are cutting taxes, all we get from Canadian politicians are higher tax bills. It's time for Ottawa to provide some tax relief and make life in Canada a little more affordable."



"In the past, Bank of Canada tightening has usually led to falling home sales and flattening home prices, so it wouldn't be a surprise to see the same happening in the upcoming round of tightening" says Ogmundson. "Based on previous trends and our model simulations for what might be to come with respect to rates, we have outlined a number of likely scenarios in this report."

The Bank of Canada has signaled that in response to elevated Canadian inflation, it will begin raising its policy rate or "tightening" monetary policy this year. The impact of this type of action on housing markets is generally predictable, however, with BC's housing markets currently undersupplied with record-low numbers of active listings, the impact on prices may not be as significant.

"With markets so out of balance, we expect home price growth to slow but to what extent depends on the final rate destination for the Bank of Canada and for Canadian mortgage rates," adds Ogmundson. "Our model simulations show only a minor impact on home prices in the first two years following the Bank raising its overnight rate."

British Columbia set a new record for home sales last year with 124,854 residential unit sales were recorded by the Multiple Listing Service® (MLS®) in 2021, a 32.8 per cent increase from the 94,001 units sold in 2020. That, however, doesn't discount the seriousness of the incidents, as gun violence is completely unacceptable. "The disregard for the safety of the public and the police that gun carrying criminals continually show, highlighted by recent events, is unacceptable and we are doing everything we can to hold those responsible accountable. We also know that sometimes violence that occurs at the street level can escalate and draw in groups and individuals more entrenched and connected to conflicts like the Lower Mainland Gang Conflict," Pound said.

He ended with a message to those involved in any level of drug dealing or gang-related activity. "It does not have to be an inevitability for you to end up either in jail or dead. There is help available. Please reach out to our Gang Intervention

and Exiting Team. Call them at 604-897-6023."

The Telugu original, released in 2020, emerged as one the highest-grossing Indian films of that year.

Swara Bhaskar: Post-Covid fatigue is a real thing




