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Another Indian International

Student Killed In Attack Kartik Vasudev who came to Canada 3 months ago was brutally shot dead at Toronto's Subway station

The random attacks on international students from India are happening at alarming numbers across Canada. In one more tragic attack, another international student from India succumbed to his injuries after he sustained multiple gun shots at a Toronto Subway station. The victim was identified by Toronto police as 21 year old Kartik Vasudev.

Vasudev's news comes only a month after an Indian student working as security guard at UBC Kelowna's campus was attacked. On Thursday, April 7, 2022, at approximately 5 p.m., Toronto police responded to a radio call at Sherbourne TTC Subway station for a shooting. It was reported that a man had been shot at the Glen Road entrance of Sherbourne Subway Station. He received medical attention by an off-duty paramedic. The police informed that



Vasudev had sustained multiple gun shot wounds and was taken to hospital where he succumbed to his injuries. Investigators allege that the suspect discharged a handgun striking the victim multiple times before fleeing the scene. Later on, the police informed that the same suspect killed another person the next day.

"These murders are believed to be random attacks and the victims were not known to the accused or each other," the police in-

Toronto police was able to arrest the suspect with in couple of days. Chief of Police James Ramer informed that 39-year-old Richard Jonathan Edwin was arrested. The same suspect also approached the second victim, 35-year-old Elijah Eleazar Mahepath who was walking westbound on the north side of Dundas Street East near George Street. The accused discharged multiple rounds striking the victim. Again, he fled the scene on foot.

Investigators are working to establish the full motive behind the attacks and these remain active investigations.

The police say Khunkhun does


not have a criminal record. "The shooting appears targeted, but its connection to the Lower Mainland gang conflict remains to be determined. IHIT is engaged in intelli-



gence and information sharing with the Combined Forces Special Enforcement Unit (CFSEU-BC) to determine if this shooting is connected to ongoing gang activity," said Sergeant David Lee of IHIT. On April 9, 2022, at around 4:30

p.m., Ridge Meadows RCMP responded to shots fired at a parking lot near a gym at 22600-block of Lougheed Highway.

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United Truckers Association Announces Next Path For Truckers' Advocacy

First general meeting of 2022 aims to continue momentum after recent breakthroughs

SURREY, BC – The United Truckers Association ("UTA") gathered for its first meeting of 2022 this week, following successes achieved on off-dock enforcement and the delay of the Port of Vancouver rolling truck-age program.

The focus of the meeting was the 2014 Joint Action Plan, which was signed onto by the Government of Canada, Government of British Columbia and the Port of Vancouver to end the region's last major labour dispute. However, in 2022, the three signatories have yet to live up to all of their commitments.

The final piece of fixing Metro Vancouver's drayage industry lies within that document, according to Gagan Singh, spokesperson for the UTA.

"While we are pleased with the progress that is being made by the Commissioner on illegal off-duck enforcement, there are still a number of problems from 2014 which continue to victimize drivers," said Singh. "The meeting was a launch for our next campaign to ensure that these proposals are lived up to, and that the UTA acts as a cooperative partner in that process."



"The UTA was extremely disappointed by the decision from the BC NDP governing caucus to snub the meeting and send no representatives. UTA members were left thinking that the provincial government has more important priorities than pandemic essential workers like truckers," said Singh.

By contrast, the presence of Sukh Dhaliwal and Parm Bains on behalf of the Government of Canada was a welcome sign for the future. Unfortunately, the Port of Vancouver continues to ignore UTA meeting invites, which is a trend that has spanned several years.

The UTA agenda discussed the idea of introducing a company drivers registry and overtime within the BC Container Trucking Act. The impacts of out of control fuel costs were also an important topic of discussion.

Without the engagement of all three entities on fulfillment, the UTA might be forced to pursue legal options surrounding the agreement.

"The labour disruption in 2014 seems to have ended as a result of false pretenses if we judge the performance of the all three of the other signatories," added Singh. "We will continue to reach out to all as an industry partner working towards taking the necessary steps forward for long-term labour stability, efficiency and growth."

Alberta revises policy for hiring Bearded Corrections Peace Officers, WSO welcomes announcement

Edmonton: The Government of Alberta has revised its policy on hiring correctional officers which previously denied bearded applicants from applying. The World Sikh Organization of Canada had been contacted by several Sikh applicants who were barred from becoming CPOs because of their religiously mandated beards.

The WSO had reached out to Alberta Correctional Services in order to find a solution.

The Alberta Government announced this week that effective immediately, applicants with facial hair for religious or medical reasons can apply to be correctional peace officers (CPOs).

Pursuant to this announcement, Alberta Correctional Services will be procuring Powered Air Purifying Respirators (PAPRs) which accommodate beards and will allow Sikh CPOs to serve while maintaining safety standards.

The Alberta government in a news release mentioned that observant Sikhs maintain uncut hair (kesh) as an article of faith. For many Sikh men, the requirement to be clean-shaven is incompatible with their faith. Abolishing this job requirement recognizes an individual's right to practise their faith when

applying for a job and doing their duties. "The former government's 2016 policy requiring job applicants to be clean-shaven prevented observant Sikh men from applying to be correctional peace officers.

I commend the Correctional Services division for rectifying this situation and for sourcing new personal protective equipment that will allow front-line correctional peace officers who are observant Sikhs to stay true to their faith and fulfil their duties in a safe manner," said Tyler Shandro, Minister of Justice and Solicitor General.

The decision was welcomed across Alberta community, reassuring faith in Canada's inclusion and diversity.

World Sikh Organization of Canada President Tejinder Singh Sidhu said, "We had been approached by a number of Sikh candidates who had been barred from becoming correctional peace officers in Alberta. We are grateful to Minister of Justice and Solicitor General Tyler Shandro and the Government of Alberta for having resolved this matter in a timely manner. Inclusion and diversity are essential and religious accommodation is a legal right in Canada. We are proud to continue to advocate on behalf of the Sikhcommunity to ensure that Sikhs in Canada can serve in every profession without compromising their faith."

Devinder Toor, MLA for Calgary-Falconridge, said, "I recently became aware of the requirement that Albertans who wish to become correctional peace officers must be clean-shaven. This puts not only Sikhs but many other Albertans in an impossible situation. They must either violate their religious beliefs or give up on becoming a CPO. Due to this requirement, many Sikhs did not even apply. This is a completely unacceptable situation that no Canadian of any background should ever have to experience. My sincerest thanks to the Alberta government for their quick response and initiative in finding a solution that enables front-line Sikh officers to serve their province while upholding their religious beliefs."

hough Sikhs around the world cele-I brate Vaisakhi on April 14, Prakash Utsav of Guru Nanak is also April 14. For some reason it is celebrated on Kartik Purnima. This article is to create awareness of celebrating Prakash Utsav of Guru Nanak on April 14.

Guru Nanak travelled extensively for 25 years of his life teaching people the message of one God who dwells in every one of His creations and constitutes the eternal Truth. He set up a unique spiritual, social, and political platform based on equality, fraternal love, goodness, and virtues.


There are 974 Shabds of Guru Nanak in the Guru Granth Sahib, with some of the major being the Japji Sahib, the Asa Di Vaar and the Sidh-Ghost. They give answers to the religious and social problems of that time and even today. He rejected all the old beliefs, rituals and practices of that time and needs to be rejected even today. His teachings are universal for the humanity, which are as relevant today as they were at that time.

When Guru Nanak was born Moguls were ruling over majority Hindu population of India. Moslems being rulers considered themselves to be superior to Hindus. Hindus themselves were also divided among themselves based on their castes. All this was causing a lot of tension and stress with accompanying mental health problems in the society. First sermon of Guru Nanak in 1499 AD was: "No one is Hindu or Moslem. We all are children of one God, so are equal." He declared brotherhood of mankind and fatherhood of God. Thus Guru Nanak laid the foundation of 'Human Rights for All' at that time. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations on 10 December 1948. Even today people are being tortured, massacred everywhere in the world because of their religion, caste, race, colour and gender.

When asked in Mecca by Hajjis is Hindu great or Moslem, Guru Nanak replied that neither Hindu nor Moslem is great. It is your deeds, which make you great, not the religion. Even today atrocities are being committed in the name of religion. Many are suffering from mental health issues because of this discrimination.

Majority of world religions had placed women in a secondary position to men. This had been a major cause of conflict, frustration and stress among women. Guru Nanak gave women social equality and religious freedom. He said, "Why call woman low who, give birth to kings and all." Colorado in USA was the first state to adopt an amendment granting women the right to vote in 1893. Michigan, South Dakota, Oklahoma were last in 1918. Guru Nanak gave them equal rights in 1499. Even today women all over the world are considered second class citizen and are even paid less than a man for the same job. Still atrocities like rape, burning alive for dowry, are being committed on women.

Guru Nanak neither accepted other's viewpoints forcibly nor forced His ideas onto others. He always reasoned and made others understand His viewpoint. He visited numerous places of Hindu and Moslem worships to explain and expose through His reasoning and preaching, fruitlessness of their ritualistic practices. Today again there is need to reason and not to force our ideas on to others. If all of us and more so world leaders adopt this, many of our conflicts and that of the world at large with accompanying mental health problems can be prevented and solved as well. This can be used at family level also. Our children want to reason about everything we do and we should explain rather forcing them.



This can reduce the conflict between parents and children.

Guru Nanak was a great teacher. When He went to Mecca with Hajjis to teach them that God is not only in the direction of Kaaba, He dressed like them and talked in their language. He taught us the importance of culturally sensitive ways to deliver the services.

Guru Nanak lived by example. Whatever He preached, He lived by that. It teaches us that we should be role models for others. We should live the life we want others to live. That is true for parents and leaders in the society.

Guru Nanak taught us that we should give up our pride, ego, Haumai and be humble. He said that Haumai is a chronic disease. Most of the conflicts in the world today and at our homes are due to Haumai, ego. Ego bound individuals get stress and mental health problems and give stress and mental health problems to others. Learning to control ego, Haumai, by accepting humility as prescribed by Guru Nanak can directly improve the mental health of the individual and the community as well.

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
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As Tragic As It Gets: BC Loses Close To 10,000 **People To Toxic Illicit Drugs, Since 2016**

174 more lives lost in February 2022, Surrey; Vancouver record most deaths; 78% of those dying in 2022 were male.

ICTORIA - Preliminary data released by the BC Coroners Service reveals that the toxic drug supply has claimed the lives of 9,410 British Columbians since January 2016, and that at least 174 lives were lost in the month of February 2022.

"As we approach the sixth anniversary of the declaration of the public-health emergency into substance-related harms, we are continuing to lose members of our communities at an unprecedented and terrifying rate," said Lisa Lapointe, chief coroner. "The

deaths of another 174 B.C. residents, so many of them young and middle-aged men with years of life ahead of them, is yet another reminder that urgent action is needed on a provincewide scale. I extend my deepest sympathy to the many families, friends and communities who are grieving the loss of a loved

February is the 17th consecutive month in which more than 150 lives were lost to illicit drugs in B.C. The 174 deaths equate to approximately 6.2 deaths per day.

The provincewide death rate in 2022 now stands at 43.5 per 100,000 residents, but rates of death in some health authorities, including Northern Health (62.7) and Vancouver Coastal (52.8), are significantly higher. By Health Service Delivery Area, the highest death

rates in 2022 have been recorded in Vancouver (78.0), Thompson Cariboo (76.2) and Northern Interior (73.6), underscoring the reality that the impact of the toxic drug crisis is being felt in communities through-

Notably, while 74% of decedents in 2022 were between 30 and 59 years of age, six of the lives lost in February were under the age of 19 after zero such deaths were reported in

Preliminary toxicological results in early 2022 provide further evidence of the inconsistency and volatility of the illicit drug supply. Fentanyl continues to be the predominant substance found in post-mortem testing. Alarmingly, the toxicity of fentanyl is growing with February being the third consecutive month in which more than 20% of fentantrations greater than 50 micrograms per litre. Additionally, between July 2020 and February 2022, etizolam was detected in 41% of expedited testing results. This benzodiazepine analogue has a highly sedating effect that cannot be reversed by naloxone and, as a result, its presence creates significant life-saving challenges for first responders.

There continues to be no evidence that prescribed safer supply or diverted prescription opioids are contributing to the illicit-drug crisis in British Columbia.

First responders arrived and found one man suffering from gun shot wounds. Paramedics rendered treatment however, the man was pronounced deceased at scene. IHIT was called in to investigate. To further advance the investigation and identify potential witnesses the police have also released photos of the suspect vehicle and is seeking public assistance in locating this vehicle and the suspect.

Homicide investigators have identified a suspect vehicle seen leaving the parking lot. The vehicle is described as a newer model red Honda 4-door sedan with a sun roof. Anyone who has seen this vehicle is being asked to call IHIT. Images of the vehicle have been provided for identification. Homicide investigators are also seeking dash-cam and video footage in the area of 226 Street and Lougheed Hwy on April 9 at around 4:30 p.m.



IHIT is working in partnership with the Ridge Meadows RCMP, the Integrated Forensic Identification Section (IFIS), and the BC Coroners Service. The investigation is at its initial stages. Video canvassing is progressing as is the collection of forensic evidence.

"We are seeking this vehicle and its occupants, but warn you to not approach them," said Sergeant David Lee of IHIT, "if you think you've seen this vehicle driving or parked, call the police."





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33 Year Old South Surrey's David Goldstein Dies In Shooting Not Related To Gang Conflict

n April 6, 2022, at around 1:30 a.m., the Surrey RCMP responded to shots fired at a home at 24 Avenue and 152A Street. On arrival, first responders found a 33-year-old man with critical injuries. He was transported to hospital for treatment.

To further advance the investigation and identify potential witnesses, the victim is being identified as David Goldstein from White Rock. On April 8, 2022, David Goldstein succumbed to his injuries. The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) continues to investigate.

IHIT is working in partnership with the Surrey RCMP, the Integrated Forensic Identification Section (IFIS), and the BC Coroners Service to gather priority evidence. Homicide investigators are speaking to witnesses and continuing their canvassing. At this time, the shooting does not appear random and is not connected to the ongoing Lower Mainland gang conflict. IHIT is looking to speak to anyone who knew David Goldstein or the activity at that residence. Homicide investigators are also interested in gathering surveillance video or dashcam footage from the area of 24 Avenue and



152A Street on April 6 at around 1:30 a.m. "We are looking to establish a timeline of events," said Sergeant David Lee of IHIT, "we ask Mr. Goldstein's associates to come forward and provide information key to this investigation." * The townships that experienced the highest number of illicit drug toxicity deaths in 2022 were Vancouver, Surrey and Victoria.

* In 2022, 86% of illicit drug toxicity deaths occurred inside (56% in private residences and 29% in other residences including social and supportive housing, single room

occupancy, shelters and hotels, as well as other indoor locations) and 13% occurred outside in vehicles, sidewalks, streets, parks, etc.

* The proportion of decedents who were are 50+ years of age has steadily increased year after year for the past six years. In 2022, 39% of decedents were at least 50 years.

* No deaths have been reported at supervised consumption or drug overdose pre-

Robert Tomljenovic Sentenced For The Shooting Of Pritpal Singh

SURREY: A man has been sentenced in the April 2020 shooting of Pritpal Singh.

On April 7, 2020, at around 12:43 a.m., the Surrey RCMP responded to a shots fired call at the 8800 block of 138A Street in Surrey. Upon arrival, first responders found 21-yearold Pritpal Singh fatally shot on the front lawn of his residence. This was believed to be a random incident.

A thorough investigation was conducted by the Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT), with urgent priority analysis being completed by the RCMP Forensic Laboratory. On April 12, 2020, homicide investigators arrested Robert Tomljenovic and he was charged by the BC Prosecution Service (BCPS) for second degree murder and robbery with a firearm.

Following a trial in January 2022, Robert Tomljenovic was found not guilty of second degree murder, but guilty of manslaughter and robbery with a firearm. On April 12, 2022, Robert Tomljenovic was handed a sentence of 12 years less time served. IHIT wishes to recognize the Surrey RCMP, the Integrated Forensic Identification Section (IFIS), and homicide and major crime investigators who were relentless in their pursuit of evidence.

"Through the actions of our investigators and partners, we were able to quickly identify and apprehend the person responsible" said Sergeant David Lee of IHIT, "we hope this outcome provides some closure to the family of Pritpal Singh."

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Climate Change And Its Effects Are Real: Be Prepared, Buy Floods And Fire Insurance

VICTORIA - To prepare for this year's spring freshet and wildfire seasons, the Province is urging caution and encouraging people to prepare for these hazards.

British Columbians can take steps to better protect their homes and financial security by buying flood and fire insurance, and can take further action to minimize the potential for damage when flooding is forecast or wildfire threat is high. "As we've seen in re-

cent years, from wildfires to floods, many households in the province are uninsured or underinsured for the hazards we face in British Columbia, which are becoming more frequent due to climate change," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General. "The Province is working hard to support those affected by recent disasters, but ultimately flood and fire insurance is one of the best ways you can protect your family."

Home insurance is widely available in every community throughout the province and provides coverage for fire damage and losses. While residential flood insurance can be limited in areas of higher risk, insurance representatives can help determine if residential flood insurance or sewer-backup coverage is available for your property.

Disaster Financial Assistance is not available for losses due to wildfire because of the availability of fire insurance, which is why it is important to discuss coverage with an insurance company or representative. People can also contact the Insurance Bureau of Canada at 1 844 227-5422 for information regarding home insurance.

verity of extreme weather events like floods, storms and wildfires in British Columbia," said Aaron Sutherland, vice-president, western and Pacific, Insurance Bureau of Canada. "Insurance is a critical tool to help individuals and families prepare for and recover from - these risks, should the worst occur."

Those who have already purchased insurance should review their policies to ensure their coverage best meets their needs.

This is particularly important to do outside of flood and wildfire season, as homeowners may face challenges obtaining new policies or coverages if their property is under evacuation alert or order. If you are placed under evacuation alert for any reason, you should immediately:

- * Get prepared to leave your home on short notice.
- * Get your grab-and-go bags ready (which should include several days of clothing. toiletries and medications), your emergency plan, copies of important documents and important mementos.
- * Listen to local emergency officials for further information on the situation.

If you are placed under evacuation order for any reason, you must:

- Leave the area immediately.
- * Follow the directions of local emergency officials and evacuate using the route(s) they have identified.
- * Do not return home until vou have been advised that the evacuation order has been rescinded.

Here are some tips to help British Columbians prepare for flooding:

* Clear debris from gutters and downspouts, and have a household plan ready.

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n the second such assault in less than 10 days, two ■ Sikh men were attacked and robbed in Queens, the same neighbourhood in the city where an elderly Sikh man was assaulted early this month. The Consulate General of India in New York said in a tweet that the "assault on two Sikh gentlemen in Richmond Hills, New York" is deplorable. "We have approached the local authorities and New York City Police Department in the matter," the Consulate said. It added that it notes that a police complaint has been filed in the

incident and one person has been arrested. The Consulate said that it is in touch with the community members and "ready to offer all assistance to the victims."

Community-based civil human rights organisation The Sikh Coalition said that the two Sikh individuals were attacked and robbed in Richmond Hill, Queens.

The attack happened "very close" to the area where septuagenarian Nirmal Singh was punched in an unprovoked assault on April 3. Commenting on the latest attack, Queens Borough President Donovan Richards said that it is "another difficult day" in the Richmond Hill area, "as we learn of a second attack on a Sikh neighbour - days after Singh's assault."

"No one deserves to experience the horrific violence that Nirmal Singh experienced last weekend

Today, we stand as one #Queens community to stand in solidarity with our entire Sikh community. An attack on one of us is an attack on all," Richards Tweeted. New York City Council Member Shahana Hanif, who represents Brooklyn, tweeted that "Our thoughts with the entire City this morning. From the senseless shooting in Sunset Park to the horrifying attack against our Sikh neighbours in Richmond Hill, our communities are hurting. Please look out for each other today-we keep one another safe."

"While random attacks like these are generally rare, there is no information at this time to suggest that these cases - with the exception of the Sherbourne Street and Dundas Street shootings for which Mr. Edwin has been charged - are connected. There is also no information to suggest these attacks are anything but random acts of violence," said Chief of Police James Ramer.

Edwin was taken into custody on the evening of Sunday, April 10, 2022 without incident. He has been charged with two counts of First Degree Murder.

"We are shocked & distressed at the unfortunate killing of Indian student Kartik Vasudev in a shooting incident in Toronto yesterday," the Consulate General of India wrote in a statement posted on Twitter on Friday. "We are in touch with the family and will provide all possible assistance in the early repatriation of mortal remains," it said. According to media reports Vasudev was a resident of Ghaziabad near Delhi. It was just three months ago that he left for Canada to pursue his dream of getting higher education and work in digital marketing. But fate had other plans. Kartik's father Jitesh Vasudev and mother Pooja remembered how their child had charted out his journey to Canada - something he had been planning and researching since clearing his class 10.

Kartik had left for Canada this year to pursue higher education. "He had a lot of dreams and used to say he would go to Canada to fulfil all dreams," his mother Pooja told PTI at their home.

Kartik had enrolled at the Seneca College in Toronto and his offline classes were yet to begin. He had been studying online till now, she said.

"Right after completing Class 10, he shared with us that he wanted to go to Canada. He was a good student. He scored very good marks in classes 10 and 12, and even during graduation from Delhi," Jitesh Vasudev, told

Seneca College said Kartik was enrolled in its marketing management programme.

"The Seneca community is saddened to hear of the tragic death of Kartik Vasudev, a first-semester Marketing Management student," a spokesperson said in a statement. "Our thoughts are with his family, friends and classmates. Counselling support is being made available to students and employees. Police had said the suspect in the shooting was a Black male standing five-foot-six to five-foot-seven inches tall with a medium build. This was city's 19th murder of the

Vaisakhi: A Time to Remember Teachings of Sikhism

celebrated 7 aisakhi is throughout the world on April 13th every year. While for Hindus it is an ancient festival marking the Solar New Year and also celebrating the spring harvest. It is also one of the three festivals chosen by Guru Amar Das to be celebrated by Sikhs (other being Basant Panchami and Diwali). The Khalsa calendar (New Year) also starts from the creation of Khalsa Panth on Vaisakh 1, 1756 Bikrami (30 March 1699).

Today, there are approximate-

ly 30 million Sikhs worldwide, making Sikhism the world's firth largest major religion. India's Sikh population stands at 21 million, which is only 1.72% of the country's total population.

The History of Vaisakhi, in relation to Sikhism, traces its origin to March 30, 1699. Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth in succession, called a congregation ceremony from across the country at Keshgarh Sahib near Anandpur Sahib to instil courage and strength to sacrifice against the tyranny of Mughal ruler Aurangzeb. Aurangzeb was converting the Hindus and the Sikhs to Islam at the point of a sword. At the ceremony the Guru selected Five volunteers who were ready to give their lives to fight against injustice. In today's parlance this congregation can be called the first national integration council



because followers gathered from four corners of India breaking all barriers of caste and creed. Those Five volunteers, who were baptised as Panj Piaras - five beloved - by the Guru were: Bhai Daya Singh (a shopkeeper from

Lahore), Bhai Dharam Singh (a farmer from Meerut), Bhai Himmat Singh (a water carrier from Jagannath Puri, Odisha), Bhai Muhkam Singh (a tailor from Dwarka - Gujarat), Bhai Sahib Singh (a barber from Bidar, Karnataka). Through this historical event the foundation of Khalsa Panth (Order of the Pure Ones) was laid.

From then onward all the followers of the Guru were given the surname 'Singh' and 'Kaur' for male and female respectively. They were also commanded to bear the following articles of faith: Kesh (hair), Kangha (wooden comb), Kachera (loose undergarment), Kirpan (short curved sword) and Kara (iron or steel bangle). They were required to refrain from: Hukka (intoxication or tobacco), Hajjamat (shaving of hair), Halaal (meat prepared in the Muslim way), and Haraam (adultery).

Sikhism is the fifth largest religion in the world. It is a distinct monotheistic religion with its own unique divine scripture and beliefs. It was founded in the Punjab Province (Undivided India) in the 15th Century by Guru Nanak Dev, the First Guru of the Sikhs. The Ten Gurus in their succession are: Guru(s) Nanak, Angad, Amar Das, Ram Das, Arjan, Hargobind, Har Rai, Har Krishan, Teg Bahadur and Gobind Singh.

The fifth Guru Arjan Dev compiled Guru Granth Sahib, (Adi Granth) in 1604 and installed it in Harminder Sahib, known as the Golden Temple in Amritsar. The holy Granth, in addition to the teachings of the Gurus, contains hymns of renowned Bhagats/Saints of that time like: Kabir, Namdev, Ravidas, Sheikh Farid, Trilochan, Dhanna, Sheikh Bhikan, Jaidev, Surdas, Pipa and Sadhna. The importance of the inclusion of these hymns was to denounce caste and religious barriers. The Tenth Guru bestowed the Guruship forever to Guru Granth Sahib - the Holy Book.

The most important and guiding hymn in the Granth is 'Japji Sahib' which reads, "Ek onkar, satnam, karta purkh, nirbhau, nirver, akal murat, ajoony, saibhan, gurparsad". (One Universal Creator God. The Name is Truth. Creative Being Personified. No Fear. No Hatred. Image of the Undying. Beyond Birth. Self-Existent. By Guru's

The principal teachings of Sikhism are that there is only one God and that all human beings can have direct access to God with no need of rituals or priests. It denounced the caste system and taught that everyone is equal, regardless of caste or gender.

Three important pieces of advice of Guru Nanak Dev Ji

- · Kirat Karo: Earn an honest, pure and dedicated living by exercising God given skills, abilities, talents and hard labour.
- Naam Japo: Do meditation in the name of God, especially chanting Waheguru which means Wonderful Lord.
- · Vand Chako: Share with the community whatever you have earned. This could be wealth, food and knowledge.

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

- * Elevate and anchor utilities, * Never drive or walk through such as heating systems, electrical panels and sockets.
- * Keep clear of eroded banks as they may result in unstable ground. Keep children and pets away from stream banks.
- * With higher water levels, boaters and water users can expect increased debris
- * Boaters should be aware of the impact that their wake can have on shorelines and reduce speed accordingly. Wave action can cause erosion or flooding.

- * Stay alert for changing conditions, particularly if you live in low-lying areas or near water-

Here are some tips to help British Columbians prepare for wildfires:

* Remove combustible material

(woody shrubs, dry grasses, etc.) ly combustible structures away down to mineral soil and use non-combustible materials, such as gravel, brick or concrete, in areas adjacent to your home.

- * Clear leaves and evergreen needles from gutters, and avoid planting flammable trees and plants, such as cedar, spruce, juniper, pine and tall grasses near building structures.
- * Keep lawns well watered and mowed, and move firewood piles, construction materials, storage sheds and other potential-

from your home.

- * Measure the distance between the outermost branches of trees to ensure a minimum of three metres between them.
- * Remove small coniferous or evergreen trees that can act as a "ladder" for fire to reach treetops.
- * Remove branches within two metres of the ground to help stop surface fires from moving into treetops.
- * Clean up fallen branches, dry grasses and needles to eliminate

potential surface fuels.

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
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





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Ranbir-Alia Wedding: Alia Shares Dream-Like Pictures From A Special Day

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


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
