The province of British Columbia has taken a historic first step in this direction by introducing Anti Racism Data Act. As the name suggests, the Act will help

# **BC** Correction's Officer Bikramdeep Randhawa's Murder Outside Delta Walmart **Was A Result Of Mistaken Identity**

Investigators believe Randhawa's killers mistook him for an individual involved in the ongoing lower mainland gang conflict

DELTA: On May 1, 2021, Bikramdeep Randhawa was shot and killed near the Walmart Parking lot located in the busy intersection of 120th Street and 72nd Avenue, Delta. Randhawa was identified as an off-duty BC Corrections Officer.

The Delta Police Department Major Crime Section took conduct of the investigation and, over the past year, have conducted extensive interviews and completed over 300 follow-up tasks in trying to identify



and charge those individuals responsible for Randhawa's murder.

date, investigators are confident that Randhawa's murder was a result of mistaken identity. Investigators believe that his killers mistook him for an individual involved in the ongoing lower mainland gang conflict. Investigators are confident they have identified the suspects involved in this murder.

This investigation is active, and the Delta Police have been working with other partnering agencies to hold those responsible for this murder accountable.

Deputy Chief Harj Sidhu stated, "It is not lost on the investigative team or the Delta Police as a whole the tragedy of seeing an innocent person caught up in the senseless violence of the ongoing gang conflict that cost a life."

# Gene Lahrkamp, Canada's **#2** fugitive wanted in Jimi Sandhu's Murder, dies in Plane Crash

The Combined Forces Special Enforcement Unit of British Columbia (CFSEU-BC) confirmed that one of the plane crash victims in northwestern Ontario on April 30th, 2022, was the fugitive wanted for murder by the Royal Thailand Police.

On April 30th, 2022, a small plane occupied by four individuals crashed near Sioux Lookout in northwestern Ontario. All four individuals on board did not survive the crash. On May 2nd, 2022, the CF-SEU-BC confirmed that one of four individuals in the plane crash was identified as Gene Karl Lahrkamp. Jimi Sandhu, former Abbotsford gangster, was murdered in Thailand on February 4th, 2022, and the Royal Thai Police subsequently identified two Canadian suspects, Gene Karl Lahrkamp and Mathew



Dupre. Following the murder, both Lahrkamp and Dupre fled Thailand to Canada.

The Royal Thai Police charged both Lahrkamp and Dupre with murder and engaged the Canadian Department of Justice (DOJ) to request assistance in locating and arresting them.

As a result, Provisional Arrest Warrants were issued in Canada for the arrest of Lahrkamp and Dupre. Due to Sandhu's gang affiliations and history in British Columbia, CF-SEU-BC led the Canadian investigation into the search for Lahrkamp and Dupre. Dupre was arrested on February 20th, 2022 in Alberta with the assistance of local RCMP and has been held in custody to await the extradition process.

# **HR Plan for transition of policing** services in Surrey formally agreed to by Surrey Police Service and RCMP

A significant milestone in the transition of policing services in Surrey has now been reached with the SPS-RCMP Human Resource Strategy and Plan ("HR Plan") formally agreed to by the Surrey Police Service (SPS) and RCMP, and endorsed by the Surrey Policing Transition Trilateral Committee (SPTTC).

The development of this HR Plan was a collaborative effort between the RCMP, SPS, and the three levels of government (SPTTC). The maintenance of effective policing and the preservation of public safety were the predominant considerations.

The HR Plan will guide the continuing implementation of the first phase of the transition of policing services in Surrey from the RCMP to SPS. The Plan outlines the expected numbers for the deployment of SPS officers and the related demobilization of RCMP members until the end of May 2023, as well as the required SPS recruitment and HR processes.

assigned into positions within the Surrey RCMP detachment, under the command of the RCMP. To date, 66 SPS officers have been deployed into policing operations, and more will join every two months. It is expected that there will be 295 SPS officers working alongside RCMP members by May 2023; they will be primarily assigned to Frontline duties, with some going into Investigative Services and Community Services.

Conversely, as SPS officers deploy in, RCMP members will be transferred out of the detachment on a regular basis. Based on current attrition and deployment plans, it is estimated that the RCMP will redeploy between 175 - 195 police officers to other RCMP postings through to May 2023. The RCMP will be working with members on their career options within the RCMP, ensuring timely transfers are aligned with the HR Plan in order to continue providing consistent policing service levels. "The RCMP is committed to working collaboratively with our partners for the smooth transition of policing to Surrey Police Service. The most important focus, as always,

during this process," said A/ Commr. Brian Edwards, Officer in Charge, Surrey RCMP.

"Surrey's transition to a local municipal police service continues to move forward. The endorsement of the SPS-RC-MP Human Resources Strategy and Plan allows both the RCMP and SPS to plan for the significant work ahead over the next 13 months, as more SPS officers are deployed to serve Surrey residents. We will continue to work closely with the RCMP throughout this unprecedented policing transition," Chief Constable Norm Lipinski, Surrey Police Service.

With the implementation of the HR Plan, the planning will continue for several important issues to advance the transition, including:

- · Pathway to the change of
- command from RCMP to SPS Transfer of equipment/assets
- from RCMP to SPS · Establishment of the SPS information technology infrastructure
- · Shared use by the RCMP and SPS of the existing City owned or leased facilities

This work will determine next steps in the transition process beyond May 2023.

# **Canadian Leaders Stand In Solidarity With Women Abortion Rights**

NDP leader Jagmeet Singh called on Liberals to improve access to safe abortion services and make contraceptives free

anadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and NDP are expressing their solidarity for abortion rights as the decades-old battle over the issue exploded this week in United States after a draft

U.S. Supreme Court decision, leaked late on Monday.

The draft showed that a majority of justices prepared to overturn the 1973 Roe v. Wade decision that protects abortion rights. The court on confirmed the authenticity of the leaked document.

Canadian leaders, how-

ever, affirmed their support of women's right to choose. "The right to choose is a woman's right and a woman's right alone. Every woman in Canada has a right to a safe and legal abortion. We'll never back down from protecting and promoting women's rights in Canada and around the world," said PM Trudeau in a tweet.

The Bloc Quebecois, a federal political party, also moved a motion in Canada's Parliament Tuesday to recognize a woman's "free choice in the matter of abor-

Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland said she was "both shocked and deeply troubled" by the leaked ruling and said her government has a "clear and determined commitment" to protect a woman's right to choose.

NDP Women and Gender Equality Critic, Leah Gazan called the leaked report "deeply concerning." "When abortion rights are denied or when safe abortion services are inaccessible, pregnant people face serious injury or death. Seeing these rights in danger is extremely concerning. We understand and empathize with the worry and fear people living in Canada are feeling right now," Gazan added.

In Canada, the right to an abortion is se-





cure because of strong laws and widespread support amongst Canadians. Canada's Supreme Court decriminalized abortion in a historic 1988 ruling. Ostensibly, since then, abortion has been a medical procedure like any other. But barriers to access persist, especially for people liv-

ing outside urban areas. NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh called on the Liberal government to do more than talk about women's right to safe abortion services by urging them to take meaningful action to ensure greater access is available across the country. Singh also wants the government to make contraceptives free as quickly as possible as part of the Pharmacare program they agreed to deliver for Canadians.



# **Christopher Ram** charged for alleged Langara exposer

Vancouver Police in-Avestigation has led to the arrest of a man who allegedly committed an indecent act at Langara College last month.

Christopher Ram, 35, has now been charged with one count of indecent act in relation to a March 27 incident. At the time of his arrest, Ram was wanted BC wide for two unrelated indecent acts.

The first reported indecent act at Langara College occurred on March 20, when a man exposed his genitals to a student in the college

The second reported incident occurred on March 27 when a man exposed his genitals to a staff member at the college. The suspect left before police were called.

Three weeks later, on April 19, a man exposed his genitals to a student inside the college library. Again, the suspect left before police arrived.

In all three incidents, the suspect was described as dark-skinned and about 5'5" to 5'7" tall.

Last week, VPD released



images of the man who allegedly committed a number of indecent acts in and around Langara College.

VPD patrol officers spotted the suspect walking near Main Street and Terminal Avenue Sunday afternoon and took him into custody without incident.

# **CFSEU-BC** makes Arrests and Seizures to target Gang Activity in Lower Mainland

The Combined Forces Special Enforcement Unit of British Columbia (CF-SEU-BC) led a month-long initiative in collaboration with the Surrey, Langley and Burnaby RCMP in an effort to reduce opportunities for gang violence in identified high-risk place and times.

Throughout the project CF-SEU-BC's UGET seized: firearms, suspected illicit substances including fentanyl, cocaine, and methamphetamine, \$50,561 Canadian cash, 5 vehicles and 87 weapons (knives, bear spray, brass knuckles, batons, crossbow, combat hatchets and axes).

In total, UGET created 213 files, of which 40 involve criminal and provincial investigations and charges.

Using information from previous gang-related violent events, the CFSEU-BC's Uniform Gang Enforcement Team was deployed into identified areas during specific times of the day and worked with officers from the Surrey RCMP Gang Enforcement Team, Burnaby Gang Enforcement Team and Langley RCMP Project Team to enhance their respective suppression and enforcement



efforts.

"Gang and organized crime-related activities and violence impacts every community in British Columbia. Working with our partners in Surrey, Langley, and Burnaby, enhanced patrols and time spent along high-traffic corridors in these jurisdictions sought to not only disrupt gang activity, but also to provide more opportunities for the interdiction of illegal weapons and commodities," said Superintendent Alison Laurin, CF-SEU-BC's Deputy Operations Support Officer.

Using past crime data as a guide to where to most effectively deploy officers, the objective was to mitigate, disrupt, and suppress violence through proactive and high visibility enforcement, Laurin informed.

Delta police reassured that all police agencies within the lower mainland work collaboratively to end this senseless violence. "The public needs to be vigilant and report any suspicious persons or activity. The

Delta Police Department has taken several measures to ensure public safety with the ongoing gang violence."

The Delta Police informed Randhawa's family and BC Corrections Services that this investigation continues to be a priority for the Delta Police.

The shooting happened shortly before 5 p.m. on Saturday at Scottsdale Centre near the intersection of Scott Road and 72 Avenue, in 2021 according to a news release from the Delta Police Department.

When officers arrived at the scene, they found a man who was in critical condition.



unfortunately the victim in this incident did pass away," said Leeson in an earlier release.

B.C. Government Employees Union president Stephanie Smith issued a statement offering condolences to Randhawa's friends and family.

"We are all shocked and devastated at the loss of one of our own," Smith said. "While the loss of any member under any circumstances is a tragedy, the public and violent nature of Bikramdeep's death make this loss immeasurably worse, especially for the members at Fraser Regional Correctional Centre who counted him as a colleague and a friend."

Shortly after the shooting, a vehicle was set on fire in Burnaby in an alley near Clinton Street in the Royal Oak neigh-



bourhood. Delta police later confirmed that the vehicle was the suspect vehicle in the Scottsdale Centre shooting.

Investigators know that there are individuals with specific and valuable knowledge of this murder, and are asking that they or anyone else with information contact the Delta Police or if they wish to remain anonymous to call Crime Stoppers at 1 (800)-222-8477.

# BC's Introduces Anti Racism Data Act To Measure Systematic...

"For too long, systemic racism and the long-lasting effects of colonialism have unfairly held people back when it comes to education, job opportunities, housing and more," said Premier John Horgan. "These injustices are compounded when Indigenous Peoples and racialized communities ask for action, only to be told by government to provide evidence using data that is not being collected."

SFU Beedie professor June Francis said that noting that unequal access to services and harmful treatment by government agencies have long been obscured by a lack of data. "These inequities are hidden. When you say [racism] exists, people would say, 'How do you know? Where is [the data]?" said Francis. "It is an important beginning in addressing institutional and structural barriers and biases in our polices, programs and services."

Rachna Singh, Parliamentary Secretary for Anti-Racism Initiatives, while explaining the thought that went behind introducing this act, said, "Racism is very much

prevalent in BC and across Canada. Although many communities like our South Asian community have come a long way and achieved a lot, but government structures are still deeply embedded in racism either consciously or unconsciously."

Singh said, "We have been listening from various communities about racism for such a long time but there was no formal way to measure racism. To tackle systemic racism, to bring racial equity it was important we collect data. And we found either the data was not collected or done in inconsistent way."

Data collected and spread without a well-defined and articulated process and purpose, has more risk of doing harm than benefitting a community. Singh quoted the example of COVID data collection after which South Asian community was stereotyped and targeted for being disproportionately hit by Covid infections. "Whereas that data showed us why South Asian community was at higher risk of getting infections because many South Asian worked as frontline workers."

Singh informed that this Act will enable enhanced collection, analysis and utilization of data in a way that honours the rights of communities instead harm them. "Sometimes people are not very comfortable telling about their ethnicities, gender identity again and again."

So the data will be collected on a voluntary basis through a population survey, she said.

Safeguards will be in place to ensure the data isn't used for harm and ministries will be required to follow careful guidelines before information is released publicly.

"The advantage of having comprehensive race-based data collection is that we can shape policies at the provincial level and then implement those throughout government and indeed throughout communities with confidence that we're doing so based on data, driven by the ev-



idence," said Premier Horgan.

The anti-racism data legislation builds upon initial recommendations from the B.C. Human Rights Commissioner's report, The Grandmother Perspective, which provides suggestions about how government can use disaggregated data to address systemic discrimination. It is also informed by recommendations from the In Plain Sight report from Mary Ellen Tur-

pel-Lafond, which outlines steps for government to address anti-Indigenous racism in the health-care system.

Singh informed that the act is the result of many community based engagements where more than 13,000 people were involved to giver their input on data collection. "More than 90% of racialized people who provided feedback through community-led engagement sessions believed

that collecting intersectional demographic data such as ethnic origin, ancestry, faith, ability and gender identity could bring positive change in B.C. and be a step toward building trust between government and Indigenous Peoples and racialized communities," Singh said.

"This historic legislation will fundamentally change government programs and services in B.C. by removing long-standing barriers," said Singh.

Singh said that this Act is only first step in our province's efforts to eliminate systematic racism.

"Our work doesn't end today - we must face up to the discomfort of talking about racism and fully commit to the work needed to be anti-racist. We will continue to work with Indigenous Peoples and racialized communities at every stage as we take the next steps to implement this legislation based on mutual trust and respect as we build a better, more inclusive B.C. for everyone."

# **Are Slip and Fall Settlements Taxable?**

The general rule is that slip and fall compensation is not taxable. Damages for personal injury claims are not considered income by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA); therefore, they are exempt from income tax. This tax exemption applies to compensation for physical and/or mental personal injuries and includes:

"Special damages;" including out-of-pocket expenses such as medical and hospital expenses, future loss of earnings; and
"General damages;" for pain and suffering, loss of amenities of life, loss of earn-



ing capacity, shortened expectation of life, and the loss of financial support caused by the death of a supporting individual.

The tax exemption for personal injury damages applies regardless of whether the amount you receive is paid pursuant to an out-of-court settlement or in accordance with a court order made by a judge or jury after trial. It also doesn't matter if the compensation is paid as a one-time lump sum or over time in periodic payments through a structured settlement. As long as the amount paid arose from a claim for damages for personal injury or death, it is not taxable as income when received, even if the damages were calculated with reference to your loss of earnings.

Be warned, however, if you are considering investing your personal injury compensation. A slip and fall settlement is not taxable when you initially receiveit, but income earned on an investment is taxable income (for example,interest, dividends, or capital gains earned if you invest the money you received as compensation for your injuries). 

# **Toxic Drug Crisis Continues In BC: 165 More Lives Were Lost In March 2022**

The data showed death amongst female remained relatively high

JICTORIA: Toxic drugs claimed the lives of more than 150 British Columbians for the 18th consecutive month, according to the latest preliminary data released by the BC Coroners Service.

Additional key preliminary findings showed that the number of illicit drug toxicity deaths in March 2022 equates to approximately 5.3 deaths per day. The report notes that male illicit drug toxicity death rates decreased in March, while female rates remained relatively high.

The data also pointed that illicit drug rates in all health authorities, except Fraser Health, decreased in March. However, illicit drug toxicity death rates in all health authorities remain elevated.

Expedited toxicological testing continues to provide evidence of the drug supply's inconsistency and volatility. The detection rate for benzodiazepines, which rapidly increased from 15% of samples in July 2020 to 52% of results in January 2022, were detected in only 32% of tests conducted in March.

However, the detection rate of fentanyl and its analogues continues to surge, with 94% of returned samples testing positive in March. Additionally, previously undetected substances such as flualprazolam are being found in increasing numbers of test results. Sheila Malcolmson, Minister of Mental Health and Addictions called every life lost "a tragedy." She asked people to stay safer by buddying up and downloading the free Lifeguard app, carrying naloxone with you, or visiting a supervised consumption site or an overdose prevention site for free drug checking and other harm-reduction services. For help, please check https://www. stopoverdose.gov.bc.ca/.'

Trevor Halford, Official Opposition Critic for Mental Health and Addictions, said that the BC Coroners Service Death Review Panel report, released March 9, 2022, outlined a 30/60/90-day action plan which "the NDP government should be following to help stop these deaths yet, inexcusably, the NDP has already missed the first critical deadline.'

With twice as many people now dying from overdoses compared to when the public health emergency was first declared, it's clear the NDP's current patchwork approach is not working," she said.

# **6 Indians Apprehended On Sinking Boat In Dangerous Smuggling Attempt To Enter Us From Canada**

Indian nationals, Six aged 19-21 years, were felony, which carries a penalty of arrested by the US border authorities after they were apprehended on a sinking boat during a failed attempt to be smuggled into America from Canada.

The US Customs and Border Protection said in a press release, "Six (6) of the subjects, all ranging from ages 19 to 21 years old, were citizens of India and charged with Improper Entry by Alien in violation of 8 USC 1325."

The seventh subject, a United States Citizen, was charged with

Alien Smuggling in violation of 8 USC 1324. Alien smuggling is a a fine and up to 10 years in prison for each violation, the release

The US Customs and Border Protection said in a statement that on April 28, suspicious activity was reported to the Akwesasne Mohawk Police Service, which notified the Saint Regis Mohawk Tribal Police Department about a boat containing multiple subjects traveling from Canada near Cornwall, Ontario; toward the United

The Saint Regis Mohawk Tribal Police Department responded and observed the vessel taking on water and sinking in the Saint Regis River in Akwesasne. Answering the call for assistance,



Border Patrol agents and the Hogansburg-Akwesasne Volunteer Fire Department (HAVFD) arrived on the scene to find the reported vessel almost entirely underwater. One of the subjects exited the sinking boat and made his way to the shoreline.

The HAVFD deployed a boat and was able to recover the other six (6) distressed subjects. It was later determined there were no life jackets or other safety equipment on board the sinking boat.

Due to the water temperature being just above freezing, all seven

(7) subjects were evaluated and treated for hypothermia by medical professionals. Upon their release, they were arrested by Border Patrol agents and transported to the Border Patrol Station for processing.

"Outstanding cooperation between law enforcement and rescue services prevented what could have been a horrific tragedy," said Chief of Police Matthew Rourke of the Saint Regis Mohawk Tribal Police Department.

The proclamation read that "on May 23, 1914, three hundred and seventy-six British subjects from India of Sikh, Muslim and Hindu origin arrived in Vancouver Harbour aboard the Komagata Maru, which was docked in the Burrard Inlet with passengers seeking to enter Canada, and on July 23, 1914, the Komagata Maru was forced to leave as a result of the discriminatory "Continuous Journey" regulation enacted by the Government of Canada, without allowing the passengers to disembark,

and upon their return to India, 19 passengers were killed and others imprisoned." On May 23, 2008, by request on behalf of the Descendants of the Komagata Maru Society, the British Columbia Legislative Assembly stood together to formally apologize to passengers on the Komagata Maru and their families, stating that "the House deeply regrets that the passengers, who sought refuge in our country and our province, were turned away without benefit of the fair and impartial treatment befitting a society where people of all cultures are welcomed and accepted." "NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that May 23, 2022, shall be known as "Komagata Maru Remembrance Day" in the Province of British Columbia," the proclamation stated.

The Komagata Maru Society also made efforts to request the city of Winnipeg to rename Trail Park as Komagata Maru Park. Toor informed that On April 28, 2022, the City of Winnipeg Council's had approved the executive policy committee recommendation report to rename its Singh Trail Park to Komagata Maru Park in memory of the Komagata passengers unanimously, recently.

"I would like to say thank you to the Respected Mayor and Councillors and City Staff, City of Winnipeg for recognizing the Komagata Maru passengers and making this realty. its a great tribute to those passengers who suffered a lot during the tragedy," he said. Renaming Singh Trail Park to Komagata Maru Park will help educate the community and remind us of Winnipeg's unique and diverse population. bbotsford, B.C. (May 2) - The Sal-Avation Army is providing ongoing flood relief to some of the hardest hit areas in the province, including \$500,000 to First Nations groups, who are still dealing with a massive recovery effort.

"The funding will help communities in their continued recovery efforts," says Salvation Army spokesperson Mike Leland. "Some of the hardest hit communities are still dealing with a massive cleanup and restoration efforts, including some first nations communities that were completely cut off during the floods. Our goal is to get them back to some sense of normalcy as soon as possible."

To date the organization has provided more than \$600,000 to regions impacted by the flood earlier this year. The initial round of funding was in support of immediate relief efforts: food security, evacuation supplies, temporary shelters. This second round of funding totaling \$725,000 will go directly to support communities that are dealing with recovery and restoration: construction, equipment and labour, and continued

nities include Abbotsford, Chilliwack, Merritt, and Princeton and the First Nations Emergency Service Society.

# **ICBC Changes its Policy on Seeking Costs From**

# **Cyclists and Pedestrians**

when cyclists, pedestrians and other active transportation users could be charged with damages to a vehicle when they have some responsibility for a crash.

"Government and ICBC listened to the concerns raised from cycling advocates and Mr. Bolliger about the decision to bill him for vehicle damage after he was involved in a collision," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General. "The previous approach was not reflective of the changes we've made to auto insurance in British Columbia and that needed to be fixed."

Moving forward, ICBC will no longer seek recovery for costs in some clearly defined situations, including:

- · Where a cyclist or pedestrian has suffered a severe or catastrophic injury.
- If there has been a fatality.

**▼**CBC is making changes to its policy on • When ICBC must determine liability as 50/50 because there is not enough evidence to determine what happened.

Additionally, claims involving a cyclist or pedestrian who has suffered a non-severe injury will be carefully considered by a committee of experts. These changes mean that, moving forward, the instances of when ICBC may seek recovery from cyclists or pedestrians will be much more

"We are committed to continuing to improve and this claim highlighted a situation where improvements needed to be made, and we are now making those changes,' said Nicolas Jimenez, President and CEO of ICBC. "Our new care-based model is just one year old and we will keep looking for ways to improve on how we deliver Enhanced Care to British Columbians."

In finalizing these policy changes, ICBC



met with the BC Cycling Coalition and Hub Cycling to receive their feedback on how the changes better meet the needs of people cycling and other vulnerable road

"We feel the changes are a move in the right direction to support cyclists and vulnerable road users across the province, and we thank ICBC for recognizing the issues and being open to listening to the ongoing concerns of our members," said Mike Koski, Executive Director, BC Cycling Coalition. "By listening and taking action, positive change was made within just a matter of weeks."

In addition to the broader policy changes, ICBC was recently provided with a final report from police on Mr. Bolliger's claim. That information was new to ICBC and has led to a change in the liability decision

> to hold the driver of the vehicle 100% responsible for the crash. Mr. Bolliger is therefore not responsible for any damages or costs and will be fully compensated for damages to his bicycle and any other items.

Importantly, any cyclist or pedestrian injured in a crash with a vehicle is entitled to receive all of the care and recovery benefits they need under Enhanced Care, regardless of whether they were responsible for the crash or not.

Bond franchise producer Barbara Broccoli says "it's going to take some time" before Craig's replacement is named, reports 'Variety'.

"It's a big decision," Broccoli told Variety at the Longacre Theatre on Thursday at the opening night of 'Macbeth' on Broadway, which she is producing and in which Craig is also starring.

"It's not just casting a role. It's about a whole rethink about where we're going. I'm just here celebrating one of the greatest actors on the planet, Daniel Craig." Broccoli continued to praise Craig's acting chops, which she's supported as a producer for all five of his Bond films, from 'Casino Royale' in 2006 to 'No Time to Die' in 2021.

She was also a producer on Craig's last appearance on stage, in Sam Gold's 2016 production of

Shakespeare's 'Othello' at New York Theatre Workshop. Gold is directing Craig once again in his adaptation of the Scottish Play, in which Craig stars alongside Os-

car nominee Ruth Negga.
"He has an amazing range and he can do anything," Broccoli said of Craig.

"He's just the greatest actor ever, and I think audiences will be thrilled by this portrayal because he's funny, he's dangerous, he's all the things you would want. Together -- he and Ruth -- it's just sexy..."

"The chemistry between the two of them, the volatility, it's like fireworks and it's fun and sexy and there's lots of blood."

The production, alongside a number of other Broadway shows, has faced numerous Covid difficulties, with Craig briefly stepping out of his role after testing positive for the virus earlier this month.

'Macbeth' endured an 11-day shutdown, and Gold even filled in for one of his missing actors on April 14, with an assistant stage manager feeding him lines through an earpiece.

Broccoli said the company has been "making the most of it," and lauded Craig's work at the helm. "Daniel is such a great company leader," Broccoli said.

"He kept the spirit and the momentum going, because at one time we had 11 of the actors out, including Daniel, so he bounced back and Ruth is incredible... We have a great show and I'm just so pleased that things are looking up."


