- The study authorization has also been extended for work permit holders. Foreign workers can now study for more than 6 months program without applying for separate study permit
- Under category-based candidates selection, STEM and health workers will be invited to work and live in Canada






Community Together Gala Raises Funds for KidsPlay Mental Health Programs

Thousands gather at Surrey Gurdwara for slain Hardeep Nijjar's Funeral

Supporters of slain Sikh leader Council, Moninder Singh, in an in-Hardeep Sikh Nijjar gathered in and around Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara located at 72 Avenue and Scott Road in Surrey, to attend his funeral and last viewing, on Sunday June 25. Nijjar, a vocal Khalistan supporter, a plumber by profession and president of Surrey's famous Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara, was shot to death on June 18, at 8:27 p.m, in the parking lot of the Gurdwara, by 2 suspects who fled on foot. A memorial has been erected in the gurdwara's parking lot at the place Nijjar was killed.

His killing has sparked fear and safety concerns amongst other Khalistan supporters and Sikhs in general. "CSIS has known that Nijjar faced an imminent threat to his life for months. The fact that he was assassinated in this manner is a failure of these bodies to provide protection to someone they knew would be targeted," said WSO President Tejinder Singh Sidhu. President of the BC Sikh Gurdwara

terview to Omni TV said that he was also concerned about his safety. He informed that like Nijjar, he was warned by the Canadian Intelligence Agency about threats to his life.

Sikh organizations and many Nijjar supporters are speculating the role of foreign interference in his killing for his support for a Khalistan. Many are calling on Canadian intelligence and law enforcement to fully investigate and get to the bottom of the shooting that killed Nijjar.

NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh wrote a letter to Public Safety Minister Marco Mendicino informing that the Sikh Community feels "worried and unsafe than they has previously.'

"In that vein, I'm calling on you and your department to do everything within your power to get to the bottom of this murder and to address the various allegations reported by the Toronto Star and the Vancouver Sun." New Democrat Caucus MLAs also

issued a statement in which they expressed deep shock by the horrific killing of Nijjar. "This was an abhorrent act of violence, made even more disturbing by its presence at a place of worship where people go to find peace. We must all stand against it as a community. Law enforcement authorities are actively investigating. They have our full support as they work to bring those responsible to justice." The statement was jointly signed by Ravi Kahlon, Harry Bains, Rachna Singh, Bruce Ralston, Jinny Sims, Garry Begg, Mike Starchuk, Jagrup Brar, Aman Singh.

While the police said no motive has been determined so far, they confirmed that it was a targeted shooting and there was no threat to public living in that area. Canadian police say the investigations would be completely "evidence based". Investigators are calling on public to assist.

RCMP Assistant Commissioner Brian Edwards called Nijjar's killing "bra-





zen" and "appalling," and said it was "disgusting" that the incident happened at a place of worship, with many other community members present during the attack.

Edwards said the only way for people to respond should be to come forward with evidence to help solve the case. "How we deal with fear is we come together," he said during a news conference. "Everybody comes together and makes a statement and says, 'We're not going to take this."

"Everybody who's a witness comes forward. Everybody

who has dashcam video. Everybody who hears something comes together, and we bring it forward to advance the investigation."

Indian immigration agent Brijesh Mishra apprehended in Canada

The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has apprehended and charged Brijesh Mishra a citizen of India, for alleged immigration-related offences.

ishra was accused of in-Wolvement in a scandal related to fake Canadian college admission letters. The situation has put hundreds of students from Punjab and other Indian states at risk of deportation due to the fraudulent college admission letter

According to news report in The Toronto Star, Brijesh Mishra was living in Surrey all the time when authorities in India and Canada were trying to haunt him down. As reported in Toronto Star, Mishra had crossed over to

Baltej Dhillon Becomes First South Asian Canadian To Be Appointed As Chair Of Work Safe BC's Board Of Directors

VICTORIA - Baltej Dhillon has been appointed chair of WorkSafeBC's board of directors for a three-year term, effective Friday, June 30, 2023.

Dhillon is the first South Asian Canadian to take on this role and has been a member of WorkSafeBC's board of directors since 2017. He replaces the outgoing chair, Jeff Parr, who served from August 2020 to June 2023.

"I thank Jeff Parr for his service, and look forward to working with Baltej Dhillon to continuously improve our workers' compensation system," said Harry Bains, Minister of Labour. "Baltej was a veteran police officer who brings expertise in law enforcement and six years of experience as a director at WorkSafeBC. He will be committed to WorkSafeBC's role in investigating serious workplace incidents to prevent similar incidents from happening again."

Dhillon had a distinguished career as a police officer for more than three decades,

working in intelligence, special enforcement, protective services and in investigations for the Air India task force and the Pickton case. He made history by being the first RCMP member to wear a turban as part of the uniform. He also received Queen Elizabeth II Golden and Diamond Jubilee medals for community service.

"I look forward to taking on the role as chair of WorkSafeBC's board of directors," Dhillon said. "I am committed to working with our key stakeholders to improve workplace health and safety and help ensure that workers get home safely at the end of the day. I am excited to begin working as chair with my fellow board members and WorkSafeBC staff to continue making progress in improving the

workers' compensation system to meet the needs of workers, employers and others throughout the province."

The WorkSafeBC board of directors is appointed by the B.C. minister of labour. The board members serve as stewards of WorkSafeBC and the workers' compensation system. The Workers Compensation Act requires that the board of directors includes representation from professionals from a range of relevant fields, including occupational health and safety, law enforcement and an actuary. Representation must also include workers, employers and the public interest.



More Should Be Done To Remember The Victims Of Air India Bombing





Victims of Air India bombing were remembered on the National Day of Remembrance for Victims of Terrorism. Flags at various federal, provincial and municipal governments offices across Canada were flown at half-mast.

The 38th annual memorial for the 331 victims including 82 children of the terrorist bomb-

ings of the Air India flight from Canada was held on Friday, June 23, 2023 at 6:30 p.m., at the Air India Memorial in Stanley Park's Ceperley Playground. The annual memorials of this tragedy are organized by family members of the victims.

"This memorial not only remembers the 329 victims including 82 children of this terrible terrorist bombing, but all their family members and 2 baggage handlers in Narita, Japan who died almost at the same time as a second terrorist bomb bound for another Air India flight exploded prematurely," said former Surrey-Tynehead MLA Dave S. Hayer.

"These horrendous acts live on in the memories of all family members of the victims and these annual memorial ceremonies continue to remind us all, that terrorism has no place in a civilized world and that it must be stamped out at all costs," Hayer said.

During Hayer's 12 years from 2001 – 2013 as an MLA, he spoke often in the BC Legislature about the Air India bombing disaster, strengthening the rights of victims and against terrorism.

Mr. Major Sidhu's sister, nephew and niece were killed on Air India Flight 182 on June 23, 1985.

The Air India Memorial in Ceperley Park was unveiled in 2007 to commemorate the worst aviation tragedies in Canadian history, and to stand as a monument against terrorism.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau in a statement said, "Thirty-eight years ago today, en route from Canada to the United Kingdom, a bomb exploded on Air India Flight 182 – a terrorist attack that shook our country to its core. This hateful act – the deadliest terrorist attack in Canadian history – killed all 329 people on board, including 280 Canadians, and forever altered the lives of their families and loved ones who continue to live with the pain of their absence every day.

"Terrorism seeks to instill fear, division, and hatred within our communities. We can never allow the actions of a few to overshadow the values of peace, tolerance, and diversity that define our society and unite us as Canadians.

"Today offers an opportunity to reflect on how we can continue to defend peace and security and promote human rights here at home and around the world. It is also an opportunity to express our profound gratitude to the first responders, members of the Canadian Armed Forces, members of law enforcement agencies, and the countless others who work tirelessly to keep our communities safe," he said. As some Canadians reflect on the 38th anniversary of Canada's worst terrorist tragedy, the sense among many is that more should be done to remember the victims. A new Angus

Reid Institute study finds that nine-in-ten Canadians say they have little (61%) or no (28%) knowledge of the worst single instance of the mass killing of their fellow citizens, with three-in-five (58%) of those younger than 35 saying they have never even heard of it. In British Columbia, where the conspiracy to commit the bombings was hatched, and On-

tario, where many of the victims lived, awareness is higher, but fewer than one-in-six in each province say they know a lot about the attack.

Among those who are most aware, more than two-in-five (42%) say that Canada has not done enough. This is perhaps reflected in the low levels of awareness among the population.

Guilty Plea Entered In Investigation Of Stabbing Of Surrey's Harpreet Kaur Gill

A Guilty Plea Has Been Entered In Relation To The December 7 Murder Of Harpreet Kaur Gill. Gill, a 40-year-old mother of three kids, was brutally killed in her Surrey residence allegedly by her husband Navinder Gill in December 2022. The police laid second-degree murder charges on the husband and the case is before the court.

n December 7, 2022, at 9:22 p.m. the Surrey RCMP responded to a report of a stabbing in the 12700-block of 66 Avenue, Surrey. Officers attended and found a 40-year old woman, later identified as Harpreet Kaur Gill,



in medical distress, resulting from multiple stab wounds. Despite the best efforts of first responders, Gill succumbed to her injuries after being transported to a local hospital. According to police, "A suspect was arrested at the scene and taken into police custody. The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) took conduct of the investigation and worked closely with the Surrey RCMP."

On December 16, 2022, a charge of second-degree murder was laid against the suspect, identified as 40-year old Navinder Gill of Surrev, the husband of Mrs. Gill.

On June 22, 2023, Navinder Gill entered a guilty plea to the charge of second-degree murder.

The matter will now proceed to a sentencing hearing which is anticipated to be scheduled for later this vear. The reason for the murder has not yet been made official, but according to community organizations and media reports, it was a case of domestic violence. A Go-FundMe Page was created to raise funds to arrange for Harpreet's parents' to travel cost from India to Canada and pay for her funeral. "I'm proud of the hard work done by the IHIT team and the Surrey

RCMP, which brought this file to this point," says Sergeant Timothy Pierotti of IHIT. "Cases that involve domestic violence have an impact on the entire community. If you or someone you know is in need of help, please reach out to your local police."

As this matter remains before the courts, there will be no media availability at this time.

South Asian Community Hub Receives Funding To Offer More Mental Health, Addiction Support To South Asian People



Youth Asian people and Otheir families living with mental-health and addictions challenges in the Lower Mainland will have access to more culturally relevant sup-

The provincial government has provided \$100,000 to fund mental-health and substance-use programming for South Asian people in the Greater Vancouver area. The new funding will support three part-time outreach workers, as well as people with lived experience who will engage with South Asians who are homeless or at risk of being homeless.

Outreach workers will connect people and families with wraparound services and resources, such as food banks, income and housing supports, counselling, home detox programs and medical services.

These services are expected to support approximately 50 to 75 people who use drugs and another 150 to 200 members of their families.

"South Asian Community Hub outreach workers will develop relationships with these families that are built on respect, trust and cultural safety in their first language," said Gary Thandi, board member, South Asian Community Hub (SACH). "Too often these families are not aware of how to access financial aid and health and mental-health resources, as well as how to access harm-reduction supplies, detox or treatment. Through sustained, respectful and culturally responsive relationships, SACH outreach workers will ensure these families receive the types of support they need."

BC Invests \$1.5 Million Strengthens Supports For **International Credential Recognition**

/ICTORIA - The Government of B.C. is providing \$1.5 million to the Association of Service Providers for Employability and Career Training (ASPECT) for new grants to organizations that help internationally trained professionals get through the credential recognition process.

Many immigrants arrive in B.C. with valuable education, experience and skills. Internationally trained professionals need to have their qualifications recognized by a professional regulatory authority to work in their chosen profession. The process of having education, skills and work experience from outside Canada assessed against Canadian standards is often referred to as foreign credential recognition. However, there are hurdles in the way of internationally trained professionals to have their credentials recognized.

"We know that many internationally trained professionals are struggling to have their credentials recognized in their chosen profession," said Andrew Mercier, Minister of State for Workforce Development. "This is about fairness and making sure that people who have the skills and expertise can access supports and services provided through their local non-profit and immigrant service organizations.'

The Province held a series of public surveys and discussions aimed at identifying clearer and faster pathways for skilled peo-

and will guide the international credential recognition legislation aimed at reducing barriers and supporting more internationally trained professionals.

Reetinder Kaur, doctoral student

and project director, Providence Health Care Research Institute, said, "As an internationally trained professional, finding a suitable job in my profession was a challenge, but through the support of programs such as the International Credential Recognition Fund, the process will become much easier. I personally overcame these challenges through support in 2020 from Progressive Intercultural Community Services Society's Foreign Credential Recognition program."

Janet Morris-Reade, CEO, AS-PECT, said that Employment service organizations are connected to internationally trained newcomers and their communi-

Canada to give 3-year open work permit to US H1B Visa holders under its...

"With Canada's first-ever immigration Tech Talent Strategy, we're targeting newcomers that can help enshrine Canada as a world leader in a variety of emerging technologies. I'm grateful for the collaboration of the tech, start-up and business communities, who have provided valuable insight to develop this strategy. Having a fast and flexible approach, one that is broadly supported by Canadians, is truly Canada's immigration advantage," said Minister Fraser.

He informed that approved applicants will receive an open work permit of up to three years in duration, which means they will be able to work for almost any employer anywhere in Canada. Their spouses and dependants will also be eligible to apply for a temporary resident visa, with a work or study permit, as needed.

This will expand the opportunities available for skilled workers to continue to pursue their careers in the high-tech sector and contribute to economic growth and prosperity in North America.

This measure will remain in effect for one year, or until IRCC receives 10,000 applications. Only principal applicants, and not their accompanying family members, will count toward the application cap.

Canada will also be developing a new Innovation Stream under the International Mobility Program to attract highly talented individuals. It will let employers hire foreign workers without a labour market impact assessment (LMIA). This will be introduced later this year.

Digital nomads working remotely for an employer outside of Canada will also be able live and work here for up to 6 months at a time. They don't need a work permit. All they need is visitor status.

The minister also announced a new temporary measure that re-

moves the limit on the length of the study programs that temporary foreign workers can enrol in without a study permit.

Starting immediately, foreign workers will have the opportunity to seek additional training and education that can help them in their careers. This measure will also help foreign workers expand their future job prospects and increase their opportunities to transition to permanent residence. Prior to this change, foreign workers could study while working, but only in programs of 6 months or less. For longer programs, they had to apply for a separate study permit. This has been a barrier for those who wish to improve their education and receive more training, including those needing to upskill or validate their foreign credentials through certain programs.

With this new 3-year temporary measure, foreign workers can study full time or part time while their work permits are valid or until the expiration of the policy, with no restrictions on the length of the program.

This temporary measure applies to those who hold a valid work permit or who have submitted an application to renew their work permit on or before June 7, 2023, and are authorized to work. If a foreign worker wishes to study longer than the duration of their work permit, they still need to apply for a study permit.

New changes to Canada's flagship economic immigration program, Express Entry were announced last month under which the Government of Canada can issue invitations to apply for permanent residency in Canada to candidates from particular fields or with specific skills, training or language ability.

Fraser announced a dedicated round of invitations to be sent to health workers and STEM profes-

sionals.

Candidates with STEM expertise – including data scientists, software developers and programmers, mathematicians, statisticians and actuaries, and electrical and electronics engineers – will help Canada's science and technology sector, bringing in the skilled talent that businesses need to drive innovation and achieve their growth potential.

Candidates with health care expertise including doctors, nurses, dentists, pharmacists, physiotherapists and optometrists will be invited in first round. The first round for category-based selection will invite 500 health workers to apply. A second round, inviting 1,500 workers to apply, will take place on July 5. This phased approach will ensure the smooth launch of the program. and by bringing in the talent the

BC Hydro To Install Free 8,000 Air-Conditioning Units For Vulnerable And Low-Income Groups

Between June 2 and July 28, 2023, BC Hydro is offering all residential customers \$50 off the purchase of a qualifying energyefficient room air conditioner

TICTORIA: The BC government has announced that it will be providing \$10 million for BC Hydro to expand its Energy Conservation Assistance Program to include free, publicly funded portable air conditioners (AC). More people who are the most vulnerable during extreme heat emergencies will have access to more cooling options to stay safe.

Because of this investment, B.C. Hydro expects to install 8,000 air-conditioning units over the next three years for people who have low incomes and are medically vulnerable to heat.

It is anticipated at least 50% of the AC units will be installed in apartments or multi-unit dwellings, with the remaining balance installed in single family dwellings.

To ensure that air conditioners are provided to those who need them, the application process will be income tested. People can apply for a portable AC through BC Hydro's online platform or by mailing in a paper application. The application will also have an option for a medical referral by home health-care workers for heat-vulnerable individuals and households.

Between June 2 and July 28, 2023, BC Hydro is offering all residential customers \$50 off the purchase of a qualifying energy-efficient room air conditioner. Eligible products include Energy Star window air conditioners that use 30% to 40% less power than standard units and portable air conditioners offering best-in-class efficiency and features. For more details, visit: www.bchydro. com/deals.

A wide range of actions are underway following engagement with vulnerable populations, emergency planners and other stakeholders to better understand ways to



better protect people most at risk during extreme heat emergencies. Highlights include investing \$369 million to the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund; providing more than \$52 million to support long-term care facilities to install or upgrade existing heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning (HVAC) systems; distributing an emergency inventory of cooling and clean air items to non-profit operators, through BC Housing; and connecting home and community care providers to people who are most at risk, such as through chronic disease registries. BC Hydro has also partnered with Vancouver Coastal Heath (VCH) and other organizations to provide \$150,000 to VCH for the purchase, delivery and installation of larger portable air-conditioning units to community organizations, such as seniors' centres and neighbourhood centres, so they can create cooling sites during heat events.

In addition, BC Hydro will cancel planned outages during significant heat events to ensure there is power for customers when they need to keep coo. It will offer rebates up to \$11,000 for homes heated by fossil fuels switching to electric heat pump and as much as \$7,000 for homes replacing electric heating systems with an electric heat pumps; and in partnership with CleanBC, offer the Home Renovation Rebate Program with several energy savings rebates for homes in B.C., which includes as much as \$10,000 in rebates on energy-efficient windows, doors and insulation to help keep the cool air in and hot air out.

California's Jaspal Gill Sentenced For Smuggling Over 800 Indians Into US Using Uber

SEATTLE, US: A 49-year-old resident of Elk Grove, California, was sentenced in U.S. District Court in Seattle to 45 months in prison for smuggling more than 800 Indian citizens into the US using ride-hailing app Uber.

Rajinder Pal Singh, aka Jaspal Gill, pleaded guilty in February 2023, admitting that he took in more than \$500,000 as a key member of a smuggling ring bringing hundreds of Indian Nationals across the border from Canada and then to locations in the mid-west and beyond, the Department of Justice said in a press release.

"Over a four-year period, Mr. Singh arranged for more than 800 people to be smuggled into the U.S. across the northern border and into Washington State," said Gorman. "This conduct was not just a security risk for our country, it also subjected those smuggled to security and safety risks during the often weeks-long smuggling route from India to the United States. Mr. Singh's participation in this conspiracy preyed upon the Indian Nationals' hopes for a better life in the United States, while saddling those smuggled with crushing debt of as much as \$70,000." "Mr. Singh spent years illegally smuggling hundreds of Indian nationals into this country; all to make a quick profit," said Special Agent in Charge Robert Hammer, who oversees HSI operations in the Pacific Northwest. "Mr. Singh crushed the dreams of so many who quickly found themselves drowning in debt to their smuggler and unable to realize the life they sought in this country. Mr. Singh won't need to order up any more Uber rides for the next three

According to records filed in the case, as early as July 2018, Singh and his coconspirators used the ride share app Uber to transport people who had illegally crossed the border from Canada to the Seattle area.

Once the non-citizens had been smuggled into the U.S., Singh coordinated with other coconspirators who, using one-way vehicle rentals, would transport these individuals to their ultimate destinations outside Washington State.

Singh and his coconspirators used sophisticated means to launder the organization's illicit proceeds. For example, on one instance, Singh and his coconspirators arranged for smuggling fees to be sent via Hawala from India to New York. Once the smuggling fee was received in cash

from the New York Hawala, these funds were converted into a check, mailed to a coconspirator in Kentucky, and then were washed through multiple financial accounts. In the plea agreement, Singh admitted that the purpose of this money movement was to obscure the illicit nature of these funds, i.e., money laundering.

The smuggling scheme has been underway since at least 2018. In all, the investigation estimates that between July 2018, and April 2022, the 17 Uber accounts tied to this smuggling ring ran up more than \$80,000 in charges.

Singh has agreed to forfeit cash and other personal property seized during the search of his residences, as well as a money judgement of \$500,000 which represents proceeds he obtained from his criminal scheme.



101-Year-Old Sikh World War II Veteran Honoured By UK PM Rishi Sunak



ritish Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has Bhonoured Rajindar Singh Dhatt, one of the last surviving Sikh soldiers who fought in the Second World War with a Points of Light honour at a UK-India Week reception at 10 Downing Street.

Dhatt, 101, was recognised on Wednesday for his service and his work running the "Undivided Indian Ex-Servicemen's Association" to help bring together British Indian war veterans.

Dhatt, based in Hounslow in southwest London since 1963, was born in pre-Partition India in 1921 and fought with the Allied forces during the British colonial period.

"It is an immense honour to receive this recognition from the Prime Minister, to whom I would like to extend my deepest appreciation for acknowledging the importance and impact of the 'Undivided Indian Ex-Servicemen's Association'," said Dhatt.

"The journey of establishing this organisation was driven by a deep sense of duty as an ex-serviceman and the vision of fostering unity, support, and camaraderie. This award serves as a testament to the tireless efforts of countless individuals who have contributed to the success and growth of the association over the years," he said. Dhatt joined the British Indian Army during the Second World War and excelled up the ranks, being promoted to Havildar

He was later drafted to the Far East campaign to fight in Kohima in northeast India to support the Allied Forces and help break through the Japanese defences, Downing Street said. After the war, Dhatt returned to India before settling in London with his family



On Monday afternoon, the third occupant of the Hyundai, who was previously in critical condition succumbed to their injuries. The driver of the Volkswagen was initially detained for an impaired driving investigation, and has since been served documents prohibiting him from driving and released pending further investiga-

Police will be looking at all the circumstances of this collision; at this time speed and alcohol are believed to be contributing factors in this collision.

"The Surrey RCMP Criminal Collision Investigation Team is actively working to gather crucial evidence and piece together what led to this tragic collision that has now claimed three lives, " says Surrey RCMP Media Relations Officer, Corporal Vanessa Munn. "Investigations of this nature are complex and can take time to complete, but our officers are committed to conducting a thorough investigation and providing the families who lost loved ones with answers about what transpired." 



Sikh Organizations Condemn Attacks on Sikhs in Peshawar

TTAWA: The World Sikh Organization of Canada (WSO) and United Sikhs have condemned the outrageous attacks on Sikhs in Peshawar Pakistan by Islamic State group's Khorasan chapter

One Sikh shopkeeper, Manmohan Singh lost his life, while in another separate incident a day before, Sikh shopkeeper, Tarlok Singh, was shot and injured. According to WSO, IS-K has claimed responsibility for both attacks. The WSO called on the Government of Pakistan to ensure that the Sikh community is protected and ensure that those responsible for the attacks are brought to justice.

The attacks over the past 48 hours are only the latest in a series of targeted killings of members of the Sikh community in Peshawar. On March 31, 2023, Dayal Singh was shot while sitting in his shop. In May 2022, two other Sikhs were shot and killed.

WSO President Tejinder Singh Sidhu said,





"The cold-blooded murder of shopkeepers Ranjit Singh (42) and Kuljeet Singh (38) can be located in the larger pattern of targeted killings of Sikhs in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province -- United Sikhs, an international, non-profit, non-governmental advocacy organization

the Government of Pakistan must immediately address. There have been at least twelve such terrorist attacks on Sikhs over the past few years. Sikhs have lived

this is clearly an attempt to drive them from their homes."

He added, "The IS-K repeatedly engaged in targeted killings and terrorist attacks the mass exodus of the community from that country. Pakistan must do all that is necessary to avoid a similar outcome in Peshawar."

According to UNITED SIKHS, Manmohan Singh was a Sikh man who ran a grocery store in Rashid Garhi, Peshawar. He was the sole breadwinner for his family. He is survived by his wife, a child, elderly parents, a sister and a disabled brother.

"We are appalled by these targeted attacks on Sikh men in Pakistan. These attacks are not only horrific, but they are also a violation of human rights. All BC Schools Report Cards To Show **Proficiency Scale Instead Of Letter Grades**

ICTORIA: All students from kindergarten to Grade 9 in British Columbia public schools will now be assessed with a proficiency scale instead of letter grades.

The provincial proficiency scale uses the terms emerging, developing, proficient and extending to describe student learning. The updates to student reporting will not affect post-secondary entry requirements for students. All students from kindergarten to Grade 12 will also be included in their own reporting through self-reflection and goal-setting exercises. A graduation status update is also being introduced for grades 10-12 to help students and their families stay on track for graduation.

A statement from the Education Ministry says that starting in the 2023-24 school year, only students in Grades 10, 11 and 12 will receive letter grades and percentages so post-secondary entry requirements

"Since 2016, school districts representing approximately half of B.C. students have tested and adopted new reporting on student progress to make sure we are evaluating the skills that students need for the future," said Rachna Singh, Minister of Education and Child Care. "Report cards will continue to update parents and caregivers about students' progress, while also effectively preparing students to succeed, whether in post-secondary education or in the future careers of their choice.

Many BC schools have already been

The remaining school districts will update their kindergarten through Grade 9 student progress reporting to align with curriculum modernization that started in 2016.

"Here in the Surrey School District, we've been implementing this evidence-based reporting model for a few years now. As educators, we know first-hand that how we report on a student's individual learning affects the way they engage with their teachers, their school and their community. Our district is focused on ensuring the best outcome for every student, and we will continue supporting our educators, students and their families with this modernized approach to K-12 reporting," said Mark Pearmain, superintendent, Surrey School District.

The 2023-24 school year will be the first year that all school districts in B.C. will implement a provincial proficiency scale instead of letter grades on student report cards from

kindergarten to Grade 9, while letter grades and percentages will remain in place for students in grades 10, 11 and 12. Nearly half of B.C. students and their families have transitioned to the new model of reporting since it was first piloted in the 2016-17

"We have received these new report cards for both our son and daughter, and it has helped us better understand their learning needs. The emerging to extending scale, supplemented with teachers' comments, provides a bigger picture than a simple letter would," said Gagan Atwal, mother of a Grade 8 student in Surrey. "Now, we have deeper insight into where our child's doing well and if there's another aspect of a subject that needs a bit more work. And it's a good thing that grades 10, 11 and 12 will continue being assessed with grades or percentages because it helps with the kids' post-secondary admissions."

In 2016, the Province released the modernized K-12 curriculum, which continues to provide students with a strong foundation for core learning, such as with reading, writing and numeracy, while also teaching children how to communicate, solve problems and use their knowledge in ways that matter in school, post-secondary education and future careers. Information and supports for the modernized policy and changes in reporting are available for schools, educators and families. Additional information for teachers, such as a webinar series, will be released during the 2023-24 school year.

Hearts Are Broken, Families Are Grieving, A Community Is Feeling Immeasurable Loss — Manitoba Bus Tragedy

Pamily, friends and community members are grappling with losing their loved ones in one of Manitoba's deadliest crashes.

Fifteen people were confirmed dead Thursday, June 15, after a semi-trailer collided with a small bus that was carrying about 25 people — most of whom were seniors from in and around the western Manitoba city of Dauphin, about 150 kilometres north of Carberry.

RCMP released the names of those who were killed last week, during a news conference. The people on the bus were beloved grandparents, mothers, fathers and siblings.

Supt. Jeff Asmundson, Manitoba RCMP west district commander started his speech on a very emotional note. "The word tragedy has been used a lot over the last week. But never has that word had as much meaning as it does when we look at these photographs. There has been a cloud over this community since the collision occurred," he said.

He said, "Hearts are broken, families are grieving, a community is feeling immeasurable loss. The communities



of Carberry and Dauphin will be forever connected." First responders who were at the scene are making their way through the enormity of what occurred.

"The main thing that has helped me cope through everything that has happened is how everyone came together – the passing motorists at the scene, Rural Fire departments, EMS, Police, Mental health workers, community members, local churches and of course the victim's families," he said.

Supports were put in place for the family right away. Offers for assistance and support for this tragedy showed the compassion of Manitobans and Canadians.

"I was there with the families, on that first day, as they awaited news on their loved one and having no idea what to expect. At the scene, people came from all over to assist," he said.

"Officers at the Dauphin Detachment and Major Crime Services came in after their shifts to answer the phones, even though they couldn't tell people what they wanted to hear – where their loved ones were. We knew it was important that there was a voice on the end of the phone when those families called us," he said.

The impact of this loss will be felt for a long time to come.

Manitoba Government Invests In Supports For Newcomers Entering Education System

To support an influx of newcomers entering the education system in Manitoba, the annual Intensive Newcomer Support Grant will be increased to a \$2.4 million investment for the 2023-24 school year, Education and Early Childhood Learning Minister Wayne Ewasko announced.

"Manitoba schools have seen a significant increase in enrolment from newcomers and this investment will support school divisions as they respond to higher student numbers," said Ewasko. "Regardless of whether learners are long-time residents or newcomers, our government is committed to ensuring that all Manitoba students receive a high-quality education."

The minister noted the Manitoba government increased the program's budget by \$900,000. The \$1.5-million investment for the 2023-24 school year will maintain that increase and add an additional \$600,000 for the program, bringing the total investment for the upcoming school year to more than \$2.4 million.

The Intensive Newcomer

Support Grant is a proposal-based grant that supports newcomer students, many of whom come from refugee backgrounds with disrupted schooling. The grants will help fund critical supports and programming needed for newcomer students during the 2023-24 school year. All 16 divisions that applied for the grant will receive increased funding to support students in the classroom.

The increased funding comes as school divisions are experiencing unprecedented demand for newcomer resources due in part to an influx of newcomers fleeing the brutal war of aggression in Ukraine, the minister noted.

"Since September 2022, River East Transcona School Division has welcomed more than 1,270 newcomers from across the globe into our schools and classrooms. These students and their families contribute to making our community a vibrant, exciting, and inspirational place to live, learn, and grow," said Sandra Herbst, superintendent, River East Transcona School Divi-

sion. "Funding is imperative to not only support newcomer students' transitions, but to fulfil the hopes that propelled their families' often difficult and traumatic journeys to Canada. We require these additional monies to ensure our students' academic, social, and emotional success."

The additional \$1.5 million for the Intensive Newcomer Support Grant builds on significant investments in education, including \$100 million in new kindergarten to Grade 12 education funding for the 2023-24 school year, the minister added.

The minister noted the Manitoba government is committed to ensuring that all Manitoba students succeed, no matter where they live, their background or their individual circumstances, as outlined in Manitoba's K to 12 Education Action Plan, which is guided by six overarching principles including equity and inclusion.

These developments follow the recent announcement by Immigration Minister Sean Fraser, who pledged to halt the pending deportations of international Indian students who claim to have been deceived by Mishra and other unscrupulous agents. Fraser announced to put a pause on imminent deportation of 100s of international students, majority of them from Punjab, who were caught in this fake admission letter scandal and were protesting to stop their deportation. Fraser said those students will also be issued Temporary Resident Permits (TRP) to prevent any imminent deportation.

However, this is not a sweeping order where everyone facing deportation due to fraudulent documentation, will be offered TRP. According to the minister only those students who came to Canada with a genuine intent to study, and without knowledge of the use of fraudulent documentation. will be issued the permit.

Hundreds of international students have been staging a 24hr protest in front of the CBSA office at 6900 Airport Road in Mississauga. Both Conservative and NDP leaders had stepped in to support the students and asked government to stop their deportation.






