Kulwant Kaur Allegedly Murdered By Husband Remembered As Hardworking And Caring Mother

Kulwant Kaur, a 46-year old woman from New Westminster, was stabbed to death allegedly by her husband this week in what is called a "domestic dispute."

The New Westminster Police was called in 200-block of Suzuki Street, New Westminster. On arrival, police found Kulwant suffering from life-threatening injuries.

"Sadly, despite life-saving efforts by the responding officers with support from the BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS), the victim succumbed to her injuries on scene," said Sgt. Timothy Pierotti of IHIT.

The 57-year-old suspect was taken into custody at the scene,



IHIT said. Balvir Singh, also a New Westminster resident, was charged with second-degree murder on Saturday.

'This appears to be an isolated incident between family members," said Pierotti. Pierotti

later confirmed to CTV that the couple were married. "This is. obviously, another tragic incident of domestic violence that

has ended with someone's life

being taken far too soon," he

Friends and family were shocked at the news. A fundraiser has been set up by Tegpal Sangha, a friend of the victim's family.

The brief about Kulwant informed that she came to Canada in 2019 to give her son a better life and brighter future. "On October 13th, she was taken from us in a domestic dispute. Kulwant passed away leaving behind her son."

Sangha says that Kulwant was an amazing mother and a loving daughter. "She was taken too soon at a young age of 46. She was a hardworking, kind, caring person and was looking to make a better life for her and her son."

Canada Withdraws 41 Diplomats from India



Visa processing for Canada in India, travel and trade will take a big hit after Canada announced that it has pulled 41 diplomats and their families from India. Canada's action came after New Delhi conveyed its plan to remove the diplomatic immunities of many diplomats present in India. Only 21 diplomats will remain in India. "Diplomatic immunities keep diplomates safe without fear of reprisal or arrest from the country they are in," said Minister Melanie Joly while making the announcement. (Read Full Story on Page 3)

BC Changes Policing Act To End Policing Transition Mess In Surrey

The BC government, this week, introduced changes in the existing Policing Act of the province to put a final verdict on policing transition in Surrey and lay a clear path for BC municipalities considering policing transition.

According to BC Public Safety Minister Mike Farnworth, "These changes address a lack of clarity in the Police Act that was exposed during the police transition in the City of Surrey." The proposed amendments, according to the minister, "contain provisions that provide clarity and finality to the




people of Surrey regarding their ongoing transition by specifying that the City of Surrey must provide policing services through a municipal police department."

The amendments also give the public safety minister the authority to cancel

the existing agreement between the Province and the City of Surrey for the RCMP's services and provide the government the ability to appoint an administrator to assume the functions of the Surrey Police Board to manage the Surrey Police Service.

Former teacher Mukhtiar Panghali who murdered his pregnant wife, granted full parole

former Surrey high school teacher full parole." Awho murdered his pregnant wife in 2006 and burned her body, has been granted full parole.

In granting Panghali full parole, the board says they believe he would not present an undue risk to society if released, and that his release would help facilitate his reintegration into society at large.

"Since your release on day parole, you have not posed any significant management concern and appear to be reintegrating appropriately," reads a decision addressed to Panghali, released on Oct. 6. "You have several positive supports and now, you have the support of the [Correctional Services of Canada] for

Panghali strangled his pregnant wife of nine years Manjit Panghali to death on Oct. 18, 2006 after she'd returned home from a prenatal yoga class, staged the discovery of her car in Whalley, burned her body on a remote beach along DeltaPort and then delayed for as long as he could to lodge a missing persons complaint with the Surrey RCMP, according to reports.

Panghali was arrested in March 2007 in connection with the murder of his wife. In 2011 was handed a life sentence for killing Manjit on convictions for seconddegree murder and indignity to a body.

CBC reported that the board attached conditions to Panghali's parole, which

include that he report all sexual and non-sexual relationships with women to his parole officer, and not consume alcohol. In addition, he was told not to contact Manjit's biological family

- including his daughter, who was four years old at the time of her mother's slaying. She is being raised by the victim's

'You voiced regret for your actions, appeared future-oriented and outlined your short- and long-term goals for your future," the board wrote of Panghali's parole hearing. "Your goal is to be a good father to your daughter, regardless if she resumes contact with you or not."

However, the board wrote there were





several factors that concerned them as they made their decision — including the fact Panghali "fantasized" about killing his wife for several months, and planned the murder despite other options being available to him. Panghali pleaded not guilty but was later sentenced to life in prison with no chance of parole for 15 years. His attempt to appeal his sentence was unsuccessful and Panghali later admitted to the murder, as well as his negative feelings toward his

Diplomats from India

Mélanie Joly, Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Marc Miller, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, issued the following statement:

"Canada confirms that India formally communicated its plan to remove immunities unilaterally for all but 21 Canadian diplomats and dependents in New Delhi by October 20, 2023. This means 41 Canadian diplomats and their 42 dependents were in danger of having immunities stripped.

"Given the security implications of India's actions on these Canadian diplomats and their families, Canada has facilitated their safe departure from India.

"A unilateral revocation of diplomatic privileges and immunities is contrary to international law, including the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations. This action taken by India is completely unreasonable and escalatory. India accredited each and every one of the Canadian diplomats they are now expelling. And all of those diplomats were carrying out their duties in good faith, and to the greater benefit of both countries.

"Diplomatic immunities should be respected and cannot be unilaterally revoked by a host country. If we allow this norm to be broken, no diplomat anywhere would be safe. As such, the Government of Canada will continue to respect diplomatic norms and not reciprocate this action.

"Canada will continue to defend international law, which applies equally to all states. Canada will continue to engage India and remains committed to dialogue as we move forward.

"Unfortunately, this mass expulsion will impact our operations, and client service will be affected. We will now be forced to pause temporarily all in-person services at Consulates, until further notice. India's decision will impact levels of services to citizens of both countries. Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) will continue to accept and process applications from India. However, certain application requirements will need to be completed locally or on-site in a secure environment. As a result, the reduction in the size of the IRCC team will affect

service standards for residents of India. "Five IRCC staff remain in India and will

focus on work that requires an in-country presence such as urgent processing, visa printing, risk assessment and overseeing key partners, including visa application centres, panel physicians and clinics that perform immigration medical exams. The rest of the work and staff will be reassigned across our global processing network.

"India's decision will not distract from Canada's legitimate investigation into the killing of Mr. Nijjar. Canada's priorities in this matter continue to be the pursuit of the truth, the protection of Canadians, and the defence of our sovereignty."

This year the annual Arjan Singh Memorial Award was given to Mr. Sucha Singh Claire for his services as a social activist and a Punjabi language columnist. Claire needs no introduction in the Indo-Canadian Sikh and Hindu community. Born on July 8, 1937, to Piara Singh and Nasib Kaur in village Jagat Pur Jattan, Kapurthala, Punjab, Clair migrated to England in 1962. From his early age, Claire has been a man of the masses.

In England, in addition to his job as a Machinist in the General Electric Company in Coventry he served as the Director of the Indian Workers' Association and the

and daughter Sukhwant Heer in Surrey and Darshpal Sandhu in California, USA. Claire made BC his home in October 1969 when he came to Vancouver. In May 1970, he became one of the first to establish his clothing business in the Shopping Center at Main Street and 49th Avenue, Vancouver.

Later, that shopping center was Indianized as "Punjabi Market". For several years, he served as a Treasurer and President of the Punjabi Market Association. The Market became gradually one of the significant landmarks for Indians living in North America. With the efforts of the Association, the Punjabi Markwet got its signage in Punjabi Language.

He was also Director and President of the Sunset Indo-Canadian Seniors' Society, Vancouver from 2011 to 2022.

Indo-Canadian Pioneer Harchand Singh Dhaliwal's Contributions Celebrated on his 90th Birthday



90 Years Young Dhaliwal Family Patriarch Harchand Singh

Over two hundred guests, including a large number of family members, celebrated the 90th birthday of Harchand Singh Dhaliwal, last week at Quilchena Golf & Country Club in Richmond.

Mr. Dhaliwal, born in 1933 at village Dhingrian in the Nawasher District, is the first son of Dharm Singh Dhaliwal (1880-1961). Dharm Singh was one of the first immigrants to British Columbia from Punjab, in 1908. Harchand Singh landed on Canadian shores in 1954, at age 21.

Herb Dhaliwal, former M.P. and federal Cabinet Minister, paid homage to the role of his father Harchand Singh and late mother Tej Kaur in facilitating the immigration and settlement of countless migrants from India, family and friends alike, who now call Canada home.

Attendees included Harchand Singh's children – son and five daughters, 11 grand-children and nine great-grandchildren. Also present were Members of Parliament Harjit Singh Sajjan, Sukh Singh Dhaliwal, Parm Singh Bains and Wilson Miao, as well as Richmond Mayor Malcolm Brodie.

Rt. Hon. Jean Chretien, who himself turns 90 next January, sent a special video message saluting Harchand Singh while noting the important role Herb Dhaliwal played as a three-portfolio Minister in his Government (1997-2004).

In recognition and appreciation of the 115 years since the arrival of the first Punjabis to Canada, the Dhaliwal family announced a gift of \$125,000. to be divided equally among the Canadian National Institute for the Blind (a favourite charity through whose programs Harchand Singh was a beneficiary since he lost his sight at only age 40), the Richmond Hospital Foundation, the Canadian Cancer Society, the Indo-Canadian Friendship Society of B.C. and Maison Aline-Chretien, a palliative care facility in Shawinigan, Quebec. To the surprise and applause of the crowd, as a spontaneous gesture attending Dhaliwal relatives from California - the Kooner Family - revealed their intention to match with another \$125,000.donation those same beneficiaries.

Seattle City Councilor Kshama Sawant to deliver Prof. Chinmoy Banerjee Lecture on Anti-Racism in October

The Institute for the Humanities at Si-I mon Fraser University has announced that Kshama Sawant, the well-known Seattle City Councilor, will deliver the second annual Prof. Chin Banerjee Lecture in Anti-Racism later this month. The title of her lecture will be "Anti-Racism, the Labour Movement, and the Role of Elected Officials."

The lecture, scheduled for October 30 at 6 PM at the downtown campus of SFU (515 West Hastings Street), Vancouver, will be co-sponsored by the Vancouver & District Labour Council, Dr. Hari Sharma Foundation, South Asian Network for Secularism and Democracy (SANSAD), and the West Coast Coalition Against Racism (WCCAR).

Prof. Chinmoy Banerjee taught 18-century and Restoration English literature, literary criticism, and post-colonial studies at Simon Fraser University for 35 years. An accomplished teacher, celebrated by students and colleagues, he was also an active human rights and anti-racism activist in the Vancouver community for 45 years. This annual lecture was started by the University's Institute for the Humanities to commemorate the life, work, and political activism of Professor Banerjee, who passed away on July 29, 2020.

The inaugural lecture was delivered in 2022 by Robyn Maynard, author of Policing Black Lives: State violence in Canada from slavery to the Present.

Kshama Sawant is the first elected socialist in Seattle in nearly a century. She was first elected to the Seattle City Council in 2013, running openly as a member of Socialist Alternative, long before Bernie Sanders and AOC were household names. She is currently the longest-serving sitting Seattle Council member.

It was her efforts that resulted in Seattle City passing a law in February 2023 to

amend anti-discrimination protections in employment, public places, housing, and contracting to include caste as a protected class. Seattle is the first city in the United States to ban caste discrimina-

An outspoken socialist who has taken no corporate campaign money, Sawant has won four elections defeating Seattle's elite, corporate landlords, and some of the most powerful corporations in the world like Amazon, who have spent millions of dollars to try and unseat her. Winning these elections also meant overcoming the opposition of the city's Democratic Party, who have attempted to defeat Sawant by running both bigbusiness-backed and self-described "progressive" candidates against her. Socialist Alternative and Sawant have consistently clarified that despite their differences, both Democrats and Republicans serve the wealthy, and that working people need a new party of their own.

Sawant has used her elected office to help lead movements that have won historic working-class victories. Alongside rankand-file union members and other workers, they made Seattle the first major city to gain the \$15/hour minimum wage in 2014 and won the Amazon Tax in 2020 on big business to fund affordable housing and Green New Deal programs.

Sawant has unwaveringly used her office to fight alongside rank-and-file union members and workers fighting for a union. Alongside Starbucks workers, Kshama fought to win a unanimous City Council resolution in 2022 in support of the Starbucks union drive.

Her office has a long track record of building united working-class struggle against

discrimination and oppression: replacing Seattle's Columbus Day with Indigenous People's Day; making Seattle the first-ever jurisdiction outside South Asia with a ban on caste discrimination; making Seattle and abortion sanctuary and fully funding abortion needs for anyone in the city, in the wake of the U.S. Supreme Court's repeal of Roe v. Wade; banning police use of chokeholds, chemical weapons, and other so-called "crowd control" devices, a victory won in the midst of the 2020 Black Lives Matter movement.

Every single one of the victories has been won by Sawant's office by mobilizing rank-and-file union members and progressive labor unions, non-unionized workers, renters, and community mem-

"Families and friends will gather to pray, fast and enjoy traditional dances and meals.


"Navratri is a reminder to us all that the diversity of our province is one of our strengths. On be-



October 16, On Oc Surrey Mayor and Council endorsed the operation of a Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system, in a new separated lane, along King George Boulevard from City Centre to South Surrey. The direction to city staff was to work with TransLink to advance its design.

BC Changes Policing Act To End Policing Transition Mess In Surrey

"People deserve to know who is protecting their homes, families and businesses when there is a change in policing in their community," said Farnworth. "These amendments mean that the confusion caused by the City of Surrey won't be repeated elsewhere in B.C. When passed, these amendments will ensure policing transitions proceed in a way that provides certainty for people and maintains public safety."

The proposed changes to the Police Act also clarify the process any municipality must follow when they wish to change their Police of Jurisdiction, actioning the government's commitment to remove uncertainty, enhance public confidence and keep people safe throughout British Columbia.

Farnworth said that while municipalities are responsible for providing local policing and law enforcement, the minister of public safety and solicitor general is responsible for ensuring that police services are in place in a community and that police operations are not impacted by one municipality changing their police of jurisdiction.

These amendments, according to the province will create a smoother process for all ongoing and future transitions by ensuring that once a transition plan is approved by the minister, the municipality has a legal obligation to complete the transition.

The amendment also clarifies the authority of the director of police services to oversee and give binding direction to parties to ensure that a minister-approved police change is implemented.



It will require that municipalities, police agencies and other entities must provide any information to the minister to assess a transition plan.

The proposed amendment will allow the minister to determine a path forward for a municipality that has just become responsible for providing policing services, in exceptional circumstances, such as when a municipality is unable to produce a transition plan that meets approval by the minister and when a municipality fails to implement a minister-approved transition plan.

These amendments are separate from the work underway to implement the recommendations made by the Special Committee on Reforming the Police Act. Phase 1 of police reform amendments are expected to be introduced in spring

BC Premier David Eby backing the legislation later said that whether or not Surrey is moving forward to a

municipal force "is no longer up for discussion, they are moving forward to a municipal force in Surrey.'

Surrey Mayor Brenda Locke however is still not conceding defeat. She held a press conference after Minister Farnworth's announcement. "We are still in the process of reviewing it and we will continue to do that," Locke

A week before the new legislation, Surrey's mayor had filed a petition with the Supreme Court to halt the policing transition for a judicial review of the minister's order of July in which he has asked the city to proceed with Surrey Policing transition.

According to experts, with new amendments that support policing transition, it will be hard to challenge it in court.



BC Introduces Legislation To Rein In Short-Term Rentals

Turning short-term rentals into homes for people is at the core of newly introduced legislation to regulate the rapidly expanding short-term rental market.

"Anyone who's looking for an affordable place to live knows how hard it is, and short-term rentals are making it even more challenging," said Premier David Eby. "The number of short-term rentals in B.C. has ballooned in recent years, removing thousands of long-term homes from the market. That's why we're taking strong action to rein in profit-driven mini-hotel operators, create new enforcement tools and return homes to the people who need them."

The legislation focuses on three key areas: increasing fines and strengthening tools for local governments; returning more short-term rentals to long-term homes; and establishing provincial rules and enforcement.

Short-term rental listings on online platforms (which may include, for example, Airbnb, VRBO, Expedia, FlipKey) have expanded rapidly over recent years. Data



shows that it continues to surge since the COVID-19 pandemic. B.C.'s short-term rental market is now at an all-time high, diverting thousands of long-term rental homes onto the short-term market. Cur-

rently, there are approximately 28,000 daily active short-term rental listings in B.C., an increase of 20% from a year ago. Data indicates that more than 16,000 entire homes are being listed as short-term

rentals for the majority of a calendar year. "The short-term rental market is creating serious challenges in B.C. and around the world," said Ravi Kahlon, Minister of Housing. "Operators with multiple listings are taking homes off the long-term market to make big profits while people pay the price - it can't go on like this. The legislation is comprehensive and designed to target areas with high housing needs. It's strong action and a thoughtful approach to tackle the growing short-term rental challenge and deliver more homes for people." The short-term rental market in B.C. is dominated by a small segment of profit-driven operators. Research from McGill University shows the top 10% of hosts earn nearly half of all revenue. Nearly half of all operators have multiple listings. Approximately 30 municipalities, including Vancouver, Victoria and Kelowna, have introduced short-term rental bylaws and licence fees to regulate the short-term rental market. The proposed legislation builds on those bylaws and equips municipalities with more enforcement tools.

Changes to how short-term rentals operate will come into effect through a phased-in approach.

Updating how short-term rentals are operated and enforced will contribute to thousands of homes being returned to the market over the next few years, while giving smaller communities and communities that are heavily reliant on short-term-rental-related tourism some flexibility. These areas will be able to choose to opt into the principal residence requirements depending on housing pressures in their communities

Communities on First Nations reserve land will be exempt from the legislation. Modern Treaty Nations will also be exempt from the legislation but will be able to opt into the legislation, if desired.

This proposed legislation will not apply to hotels and motels. Regulations are also being drafted to exempt additional types of properties, for example, timeshares and fishing lodges, which are not intended to be covered under the scope of the legislation.





New Jersey Sikh Mayor Ravi Bhalla Opens Up About Receiving Threat Letters

The Indian-origin Sikh mayor of Hoboken city in the US state of New Jersey has opened up about being the target of a series of letters that threatened to kill him and his family.

The letters, which he received last year, first called on Hoboken Mayor Ravi Bhalla, who is a practising Sikh, to resign, but then began threatening his and his family's life, targeting him for his Sikh faith, CBS News reported.

Bhalla, however, told CBS News in an interview that he and his family were standing strong and that hate was not welcome in his city.

Bhalla, who was first elected for the post of Hoboken mayor in 2017, said: "I'm very proud to lead this city as an American of



Sikh background." He won again in 2021 after running unopposed. For a man who always wears his turban with pride, Bhalla said he had been the target of threatening messages.

"Our family began receiving a

series of letters in the mail," he

The first, more than a year ago, asked him to resign, and then a second letter threatened his life.

"The third threat, the most jolting, came soon thereafter and said, 'This is your last warning. If you don't resign immediately, we will kill you, we'll kill your wife, we'll kill your children," he recounted.

One letter read: "It's time to kill you." "There was a lot of angst, anger, a lot of hate, combined with actual threats upon my life and the life of my children and my wife," Bhalla said.

It was enough for law enforcement agencies to provide the mayor with 24-hour security, including for his two children at school.

"My biggest concern was for my kids. I signed up to be mayor, but my kids didn't sign up to this type of behaviour," Bhalla said. Bhalla is well aware of the backlash Sikh-Americans endured after 9/11.

"As a Sikh-American, I'm a proud American and I want people to be treated equally," Bhalla said in response to a question on his experience as a Sikh politician 22 years after the attack that shook the entire country.

"There still is a strain of extremism in America, and it's just unfortunate to see that small strain is somewhere in Hoboken, as well. And I think that's what needs to be called out and that's what people need to know about so that we can eventually put an end to it through education and through love," he said.

Sikh Teen in US Punched for Wearing Turban

In a racially motivated attack, a man punched a 19-year-old Sikh teen multiple times and attempted to remove his turban on board a Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) bus in New York City.

Police said both men were riding on a shuttle bus on Sunday morning near 118th Street and Liberty Avenue in Richmond Hill when the suspect approached the victim, ABC7 news channel reported.

"We don't wear that in this country," the suspect told the victim pointing at his turban, following which he punched the young Sikh several times and tried to remove it.

He then got off the bus and remains at large, the New York City Police Department (NYPD) said, urging the public to help in nabbing the suspect.

Releasing a picture, the NYPD described the suspect as "a male, 25-35 years of age, dark complexion, slim build, approximately 5'9 tall, with brown eyes and black hair".


The victim, who suffered a minor cut and pain, refused medical attention at the scene, police said.

Slamming the incident, the US-based Sikh Coalition said on X that it is "deeply disturbed by an apparent hate-motivated attack on a Sikh teen".

"We are in contact with the survivor and working with him to provide support as needed; he has requested anonymity for the time being. Our current understanding is that (the) NYPD is, appropriately, investigating this incident as a hate crime," the Coalition said.

"Right now, the victim is very traumatised," community activist Japneet Singh told ABC7. "The family is very scared for him."

Japneet said the victim was injured badly and won't be able to work for the next few days.

CREA Lowers Resale Housing Market Forecast on 'Higher for Longer' Rates

TTAWA, ON: The Canadian OReal Estate Association (CREA) has updated its forecast for home sales activity and average home prices via Multiple Listing Service (MLS) Systems of Canadian real estate boards and associations for 2023 and 2024.

The national sales-to-new listings ratio has fallen from near 70% to 50% in the span of just five months, while the rally in prices has slowed markedly, or in the case of Ontario, reversed.

As a result of these weaker sales and pricing trends since the summer, combined with softer market conditions going forward and "higher for longer" interest rates, the forecast for sales and average prices over the balance of 2023 and into 2024 has been lowered.

Some 449,614 residential properties are forecast to trade hands via Canadian MLS Systems in 2023, a 9.8% decline

from 2022. Unlike the previous downgrade in July, which was broad-based, the October downward revision to sales was predominantly due to fewer expected sales in Ontario and British Columbia. These more than offset an upward revision to the forecast for activity in Alberta.

The national average home price is forecast to decline by 3.3% on an annual basis

to \$680,686 in 2023. This is down from CREA's previous forecast, owing primarily to the compositional impact of lower sales in Ontario and British Columbia, by far Canada's two most expensive provinces for real estate. Provinces forecast to see small average price gains this year include Alberta, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Newfoundland and Labrador.

Surrey Board of Trade Wants Pension Innovation on Federal Government Agenda

At the annual Canadian Chamber of Commerce Convention in Calgary on October 13-14, the Surrey Board of Trade won the support of 430 chambers of commerce and boards of trade in Canada on their policy to instigate change on pension innovation.

"There are 10 million Canadian workers who are not members of a private sector pension plan," said Anita Huberman, President and CEO, Surrey Board of Trade. "There is very clear evidence that there needs to be a re-charged pension plan that meets the demands of today's socio-eco-

nomic paradigm. Canada has suffered from stagnated innovation in its retirement income system."

The Surrey Board of Trade recommends that the Federal Government assess the pool of employees currently covered under the traditional defined benefit, defined contribution, and group-registered retirement savings plans. Improving financial literacy through effective programs and protecting existing registered pension plans is also recommended.

SBOT has asked the Federal government to increase pension coverage through

the development of attractive products for workers without occupational pension plans and increase labour force participation rates at older ages as life expectancy increases.

Reform the current regulatory environment to support innovation pension reform that includes:

- a. Regulatory support for private sector multi-employer pension programs;
- Regulatory framework to include multi-employer pension programs across provincial jurisdictions;
- c. Regulatory framework for trusteed pen-

sion plans that do not require government or union sponsorship

- d. Regulatory frameworks that allow and promote private sector access to the very solutions already available in the public sector.
- e. Regulatory frameworks and support that provide access to the efficiencies of collective pension plans and that recognize the unique needs of small private sector employers and self-employed individuals
- f. Add to the portfolio of the Minister of Seniors.

Where To Access Care For Kids Ahead Of Respiratory Season

A head of this respiratory season, BC Children's clinicians are advising families of the different care options available to them, depending on the urgency of their child's health concern:

Emergency care: children with a medical emergency, such as difficulty breathing, require immediate medical attention. Families are urged to call 9-1-1 for ambulance services or visit their nearest emergency department or urgent and primary care centre.

Non-urgent concerns: may be managed by a family doctor, walk-in clinic or an urgent and primary care centre, if available in your community.

BC pharmacies: As of this year, BC pharmacists can now provide direct care for select minor ailments including pink eye (conjunctivitis), upset stomach, sprains and strains and allergies.

HealthLink BC: provides reliable, non-emergency health information and advice any time of the day or night by phone at 8-1-1.

British Columbians can call for advice on how to manage their symptoms, and when and where to seek care. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, you can contact HealthLinkBC using Video Relay Services (VRS), or Teletypewriter (TTY) by dialing 7-1-1.

Additional supports: BC Children's Hospital has a dedicated webpage, developed in consultation with emergency medicine doctors. It offers guidance on the top urgent issues that require care from your nearest emergency department, and those that can be managed in other clinical settings. In September 2023, BC Children's also launched Sunny Bear chat bot to advise families of hospital services and to provide tips on staying well during respiratory season.

Dr. Garth Meckler, Division Head, Emergency Medicine, BC Children's said, "Our message to families is simple: if your child has an emergency health concern, our specialist ED team are prepared to provide exceptional care to them. When our ED is busy, however, clinicians must first focus their attention on children with the most urgent issues first, including those with life-threatening conditions. This can result in a longer wait for children with less urgent concerns. We kindly ask all families to be patient and respectful to our staff. We know it is a stressful and anxious time visiting our hospital with an unwell infant or child. Rest assured, our staff do their utmost to provide the best possible care to all pa-

For children and families waiting for care for a less urgent issue, clinicians advise arriving at the ED prepared, including bringing phone chargers, packing snacks and drinks, toys or books, and other items to support and soothe their child while they wait. Where possible, one to two family members or caregivers are welcome to accompany each patient in the ED. This ensures sufficient space for other families and children waiting, limits risk of exposure to our most vulnerable



patients, and allows providers to focus their attention on patients.

"Last year, our hospital experienced significant demand for ED care at the height of respiratory season. We recognize the significant stress this posed to families seeking care for their children. This year, we reviewed the operational adjustments made last year in preparation for the respiratory season ahead. Our priority is to ensure every family visiting our ED this fall/winter knows they are in safe and capable hands when they walk through the doors of our hospital," said Christy Hay, Executive Director, Clinical Service Delivery, BC Children's.

BC Funds 142 Supportive, Market-Rental Homes In Vancouver

MANCOUVER - People experiencing or at risk of homelessness have increased access to safe housing with 80 new supportive housing units and 62 market rentals now open in Gas-

"The Stanley will provide much-needed housing as we seek to break the cycle of homelessness and offer stable housing and support for our most vulnerable people," said Ravi Kahlon, Minister of Housing. "We are pleased with this collaboration as it is one of the many steps our government is taking to prevent and reduce chronic homelessness in the province."

The redeveloped five-storey



Stanley building at 53 West Cordova St. has 80 units of studio and one-bedroom homes. The supportive-housing project is a

partnership between the Province through BC Housing, Westbank Corp. and PHS Community Services Society. BC Housing owns the Stanley and PHS is the

Westbank replaced the former Stanley with the new building, adding a separate 62-unit market-rental building called Blood Alley. The latter is an 11-storey building at 23 West Cordova St. of one- and two-bedroom homes. Blood Alley has a separate entrance and is owned and operated by Westbank Corp. Both buildings have commercial space on the ground floor.

The Province committed approximately \$18.5 million in funding for the project. The City of Vancouver contributed \$1.6 million.

"Access to safe, stable housing

with supports is critical for our residents who are sheltering outdoors," said Ken Sim, mayor of Vancouver. "Eighty people experiencing or at risk of homelessness will have a safe and warm place to call home when the Stanley opens. We look forward to continuing our partnership with all levels of government and working with the community to tackle the homelessness crisis in our city together."

The project is part of a \$19-billion housing investment by the B.C. government. Since 2017, the Province has nearly 77,000 homes delivered or underway, including nearly 8,000 homes in Vancouver.





Set in a futuristic and apocalyptic world, Ganapath starts with a voiceover by Dalapati (Amitabh Bachchan), telling us how a destructive war led to the world being divided in two parts - one with the rich and the mighty building a luxurious, high-tech Silver City being ruled by their heartless kingpin Dalini. And the other with the poor and the needy being left to rot and struggle for their survival.

Upon seeing his people falling apart, Dalapati tells them to channelise their anger in the right direction and just vent it out in the fighting ring, thereby uniting them. But soon, John English (Ziad Bakri), Dalini's aide is sent search for, and pick the best fighters for his wrestling matches. Switch to the Silver City and we're introduced to Guddu (Shroff), who wakes up with four skimpily clad women in his bed, six on the floor and one in the bathtub, showering him with kisses. Yes, that's how a hero's entry is supposed to be. But things go downhill when Guddu and John's girlfriend (Elli AvrRam) are caught together, and they face his wrath and are buried alive. But when has the hero given up so easily? A miracle brings Guddu back, and he is told by Kaizad (Jameel Khan), to go the other side of the world and meet Shiva (Rashin Rahman) and say, "Ganapath aala". And that's all. After this, whatever happens, only Vikas Bahl knows, and he miserably struggles to convey that to us. Ganapath attempts to make

up being yet another mindless dystopian tale. Even if the story seems to come together after some time, it never reaches a point that you want to believe in it.


