

Video Warning Travelers Not To Fly By Air India Creates Panic, Canada Asked To Enhance Security

A video of Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, head of Sikhs for Justice, warning people not to fly by Air India on November 19th, has created panic and fear amongst travelers.

"We are asking the Sikh people to not fly via Air India on 19 November. There will be a global blockade. Do not travel by Air India or your life will be in danger," the separatist leader said, repeating the threats in a video circulating on social media.

India is hosting the final match of the international men's cricket World Cup on the same date.

"It is the same day on which the final match of the World Terror Cup will be played. It will be shown to the world that a genocide of Sikhs happened in India and India did it. When we liberate Punjab, the name of these airports will be Shahid Beant Singh and Shahid Satwant Singh airport," said Pannun, referencing those who assassinated former Indian prime minister Indira



Gandhi in October 1984.

The video caused safety concerns among people, and at political and diplomatic levels. The Indian officials said they would discuss the threat with Canadian authorities.

"We shall take up the threat against Air In-

dia flights originating from and terminating in Canada, with the concerned Canadian authorities," India's high commissioner to Canada, Sanjay Kumar Verma, told the Indian newspaper Hindustan Times.

Vancouver Sun reported that the Canadian government and the RCMP have confirmed they were investigating a possible terror threat. "Our government takes any threat to aviation extremely seriously. We are investigating recent threats circulating online closely and with our security partners. We will do everything necessary to keep Canadians safe," said Laura Scaffidi, press secretary to Canada's transport minister.

The newspaper also said India asked Canada to step up security for Air India flights flying out of Vancouver and Toronto, but the transport ministry did not say what measures would be taken at the two major airports

New Canada Post Stamp Heralds The Arrival Of Diwali


JANCOUVER, BC: Canada Post issued a new stamp celebrating the arrival of Diwali, one of the largest, most popular, and widely celebrated festivals in India. Diwali, which is observed by Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains and other communities in Canada and around the world, celebrates the triumph of good over evil and light over darkness. During Diwali celebrations, small clay oil lamps called diyas are often lit in rows in homes and temples or set adrift on rivers, while fireworks signify gratitude for health, wealth, knowledge, peace and prosperity. Additionally, colourful geometric Rangoli patterns are created in entrance ways, living rooms and courtyards, while beautiful garlands -



known as toranas – are draped across the entrances and facades of homes and temples.

This year, the five-day celebration begins on November 12.







BC Brings In Legislation To Deliver More Homes Near Transit Hubs

VICTORIA, BC: Building more homes near transit hubs is the focus of new propAosed legislation aimed at speeding up the delivery of homes and encouraging more communities near the transit, services and amenities that make life better for people.

"Building more homes near transit is good for people, communities, and helps make the most of transit, infrastructure and services," said Ravi Kahlon, Minister of Housing. "But layers of regulations and outdated rules are stopping this kind of development from becoming a reality in too many municipalities. That's why we are taking action to remove barriers and deliver more transit-oriented communities, faster."

This legislation, if passed, will build on work underway to facilitate more transit-oriented development, create more livable communities and tackle the housing crisis. Earlier this year as part of Budget 2023, the Province committed approximately \$400 million to deliver thousands of units at or near transit over the next 10 to 15 years by accessing land that is suitable to be acquired near transit hubs and transforming it into thriving communities.

In some cases in B.C., higher-density neighbourhoods have been established around transit hubs, but in other cases, restrictive zoning bylaws and parking requirements, along with delayed development approvals, continue to slow down the delivery of homes and services near transit hubs. As B.C. continues to invest significantly in transit infrastructure, it is important that this investment accommodates additional housing units to create vibrant and livable neighbourhoods.



The proposed legislation will require municipalities to designate Transit Oriented Development Areas (TOD Areas) near transit hubs. These TOD Areas are defined as land within 800 metres of a rapid transit station (e.g., SkyTrain station) and within 400 metres of a bus exchange where passengers transfer from one route to another (e.g., Newton Bus Exchange in Surrey).

In these designated TOD Areas, municipalities will be required to: * permit housing developments that meet provincial standards

allowable for height and density. The minimum allowable height and density is based on tiers - at its highest in the centre of the TOD Area and will differ based on the type of transit hub (SkyTrain stop/bus exchange) and a municipality's size, population

and location.

Note: A full list of intended allowable standards is available in a backgrounder.

* remove restrictive parking minimums and allow for parking to be determined by need and demand on a project-by-project basis.

* utilize standards and details in the provincial policy manual to provide consistency in the approach to developing TOD Areas.

Municipalities will still be able to require builders and developers to add parking to accommodate people living with disabilities. Commercial parking requirements will not be affected within TOD Areas. Builders and developers will be able to build as much parking as desired for a project but will not be required to meet a minimum standard of parking units.

Modelling future scenarios cannot account for unforeseen circumstances, the changing nature of housing, real-estate markets and other factors, but preliminary analysis indicates the Province could see approximately 100,000 new units in TOD Areas in B.C. during the next 10 years.

To support the legislation, the Province will create a provincial policy manual to support municipalities with setting their site standards and moving forward with proposed housing projects.

Following the release of regulations and the policy manual in December 2023, the lands that local governments have designated for transit-oriented growth in their official community plans will be immediately captured under the new minimum allowable density requirements included in the legislation.

For the remaining TOD Areas that require local government designation, municipalities will have until June 30, 2024, to designate these areas (pending regulation). It is expected that approximately 100 TOD Areas will be designated in approximately 30 municipalities throughout B.C. within the first year of the new legislation coming into effect.

Where a local government's current zoning allows for less density than the new provincial minimum, the new increased minimum density must be allowed by the local government. However, local governments can approve higher density at their discretion.

This proposed legislation will advance alongside the proposed small-scale, multi-unit housing legislation (SSMU). While SSMU will add increased density near transit stops, TOD Areas that have higher density will take precedence over SSMU zoning should they overlap.







Median Income In Vancouver Nearly \$24,000 Less Than In Seattle—B.C. Cities Rank **Low In Regional Income Rankings**

ANCOUVER, BC: Median income for workers in Seattle dwarfs the median income for workers in Vancouver, underscoring a general prosperity gap between British Columbia and its regional neighbours, finds a new study released today by the Fraser Institute, an independent, non-partisan, Canadian public policy think-tank.

"At a time when affordability is top of mind, workers in B.C. make considerably less money than their counterparts in other jurisdictions," said Ben Eisen, senior fellow at the Fraser Institute and co-author of Measuring British Columbia's Prosperity Gap at the Metropolitan Level.



study-which compared the median employment income of 59 large urban areas in B.C., Alberta, Washington, Alaska, California, Oregon, Montana and Idaho-found that Vancouver ranks 48th with a median income of \$37,300, significantly lower than Seattle (\$61,056), which ranks 3rd, and well below the average median income of the 59 urban areas (\$43,810).

Beyond Vancouver, the remaining six urban areas in B.C. also rank low beginning with Victoria (42nd at \$37,890) followed by Kamloops (52nd \$36,060), Chilliwack (54th at \$33,650). Kelowna (55th at \$33,540), Abbotsford-Mission (56th at \$33,070) and Nanaimo (57th at \$32,770).

British Columbians "Many would likely be surprised to learn that workers in next-door Washington make substantially more than they do," Eisen said. "With its relatively low median employment income, Vancouver is an outlier among big cities in the western part of Canada and the United States," Eisen said.

Surrey Police Service Recognizes 50 Individuals at Awards Ceremony

On November 8, 2023, Surrey Police Service (SPS) recognized the outstanding contributions of 50 police officers and civilian staff for their work in furthering the development of SPS and excellence in policing.

"The accomplishments of this outstanding group of police officers and civilians is a testament to the commitment they have made to their professions and to the residents of Surrey," says Chief Constable Norm Lipinski. Several officers were recognized for their actions during critical incidents and investigations that required lifesaving efforts or exemplary police work. These included an SPS officer



grabbing a hold of the arms of a distraught man who had let go of the railing on a bridge; officer responses to shooting and stabbing incidents; an off-duty officer helping a trapped driver following a head-on collision;

and an SPS detective securing charges in a complex, historic, multi-jurisdictional crime.

SPS also recognized nine police officers and three civilians for their contributions to building the organization and advancing

the policing transition. Award recipients provided invaluable support for recruits and experienced officers joining SPS, and developed systems that benefitted all staff.

Surrey Police Board Commen-

dations were presented to seven civilians including those who were part of the original project team that helped to form Surrey Police Service, and three employees received BC Association of Police Boards Awards for excellence in supporting innovation and governance.

Ten SPS officers were also recognized for their long service in policing and the military.

This was SPS's second annual Awards and Recognition Ceremony. We look forward to many subsequent events where we can share stories of our officers and civilian staff, and the remarkable work they do to keep Surrey safe and to build a modern and innovative police service.

Video threatening travelers not to fly by Air Canada

Even the World Sikh Organization (WSO), strong supporter of Khalistan, called the threats concerning. On Platform X, WSO posted, that the organization was "concerned by reports of an unverified video circulating allegedly threatening travel via Air India. Innuendo or threats, particularly regarding issues as sensitive as airline safety, are unacceptable. The safety and security of all air travelers must be ensured."

Maninder Gill, MD, Radio India in a letter to Prime Minister Justin Trudeau called on the Canadian government to take strong action against the threat. "The hate and intimidation against the Indo-Canadian community in Canada has reached alarming levels."

The letter which was copied to various other members of parliament said, "The safety threats have now become open terrorism as one Gurpatwant Pannu of Sikhs for Justice (SFJ) has openly threatened

the India community to attack Air India and warned the Sikh community not to travel Air India as there could be a danger to their lives. This terrorist threat follows the threat to Hindu community by Pannu, where he threatened the Hindu community to "go back" to India. These terrorist threats are haunting the victims of the Air India terrorist attack which killed 329 Canadians, it is akin to rubbing salt on the wounds of the families that never received justice."

Gill further added that endangering the safety of an aircraft by disseminating false information is an offense punishable with life imprisonment under section 77 of the Canadian Criminal Code."

Tensions between India and Canada have been high ever since Prime Minister Justin Trudeau accused India of being involved in the fatal shooting of Canadian citizen Hardeep Singh Nijjar. Continued from Page 01

BC Green's Sanjiv Gandhi fired for liking post about Bonnie Henry and Nazi doctor

Deputy leader of the BC Green Party Dr Sanjiv Gandhi was fired from his position for liking a post on X, formerly known as Twitter, which called BC's top doctor Bonnie Henry: "Queenie Bonnie 'Mengele' Henry". Josef Mengele was an infamous Nazi doctor who experimented on

concentration camp victims during the Second World War.

Green leader Sonia Furstenau later tweeted, "Today, I was made aware of Dr. Sanjiv Gandhi, deputy leader, liking a tweet with an inappropriate comparison between our provincial health officer and Mengele. I find this unacceptable and I have removed Dr. Gandhi as deputy leader and accepted his resignation as a candidate."

Gandhi was named deputy leader in January. He is former chief of pediatric cardiovascular and thoracic surgery at BC Children's Hospital and has been an outspoken critic of the government's health-care policy, including its response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Gandhi was set to run in the 2024 election for a seat in Vancouver-Renfrew, currently represented by Health Minister Adrian Dix. In a statement Thursday, Gandhi said he liked the September post "inadvertently" and in error, and that he has since "unliked" it.

"We can be passionate and aggressive in criticizing the government, but personal attacks are categorically wrong, as was my misplaced 'like,'" his statement said.

Inter-Faith Conference On Peace And Harmony Organized By Khalsa Diwan Society

The world is inhabited by billions of people practicing different faiths. November 15, 2022, was the Day of Eight Billion people in the world. Out of this population, Christians represent about 32%; Muslims – 23%; Hindus- 15% and Buddhists- 7%. Sikhs, Jains, Taos, Bahais, and others are just 1%. It is worth noting that 16% of the world population has no religious affiliation. It is the third largest group after Christianity and Islam. By 2050, the world population is projected at 9.7 billion. By then, Canada would have 50 million.

From the very beginning, the world has



gone through many upheavals – natural and unnatural. By the count of casualties, humanity has suffered more by the hands of man than by natural or God-inflicted ferocities. After judging the devastation of the Second World War, the United Nations was established to save succeeding generations from the scourge of war. One of its purposes is to achieve international co-operation in solving international problems, by promoting and encouraging respect for human rights and for fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to race, sex, language, or religion. Man, however, has remained unsuccessful in his endeavors. One can witness chaos all around. There is violence galore in the name of race, sex, language, and religion.

An Inter-faith gathering was organized by the Khalsa Diwan Society, Ross Street, Vancouver on November 3, 2023, from 6 to 8 pm at the Museum building adjacent to the Main Gurudwara Saheb. The program was initiated by reciting (Ek noor te sab jag upjaya, kaun bhalle kau mande ----), a hymn from Guru Granth composed by Saint Kabir.

Representatives from Christianity, Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, and Sikhism spoke about peace and harmony. Islam

was represented by an Ahmadi, a Sufi, a Bahai and an Ismaili speaker. Hinduism was represented by a Hindu priest and a Brahma Kumari. Buddhism by a Tibetan Buddhist monk and Christianity by a Christian. Sikhism, of course, by the head priest of the Gurudwara.

All the speakers emphasized the importance of hope, harmony, compassion, co-operation, justice, love, non-violence, pluralism and understanding as inscribed in their holy scriptures. Hundreds were in attendance mainly from the Sikh community.

Today, it is not only the Inter-faith crisis, but Intra-faith disharmony that is spreading like wildfire. None of the major religions could keep as one unit but proliferated into several different sects committing atrocious acts against one another. It is a matter of appreciation that leaders of different religions at least shared one stage during the inter-faith gathering. However, it would have been a step forward if this programme had been held while sitting in the Main Hall of Gurudwara in front of Guru Granth Saheb. Next time, it could also be organized in a Church, in a Mosque or any other place of worship. It would set as an example of harmony if everyone would bow to each other's deity and invite each other to their houses for a meal and family get-togather. The children should be permitted to have interfaith and intra-faith marriage. The other communities also must be encouraged to attend such events. Let us come out of all the existing systems of faith, whether Inter or Intra, and live with universal principles of love, compassion, and service to others. Let us bridge the gap created by different faiths.

Inter-faith peace and harmony should become a continuously unfolding reality. The journey of inter-faith is not a race, but a marathon of love and compassion. Any person, a theist or atheist, who believes in life is worthy of respect.

It Is Beyond Time To Move From Nice Words To Meaningful Action

BC Human Rights Commissioner Kasari Govender's response to news of surging incidents of antisemitism and Islamophobia here in B.C.

In these dark times, I know I share the heaviness in my heart with many across B.C. and around the world. The devastating events in Israel and Palestine are creating ripple effects globally, including a surge of discrimination and violence targeting Jewish and Muslim people and recrimination against those speaking out peacefully against the unfolding humanitarian crisis in Gaza. Our communities are grieving; many are scared, angry or in pain.

Here in B.C., we know that global events can and do lead to a rise in hate locally. Since Oct. 7, the Vancouver Police Department alone has received reports of at least 18 hate incidents targeting the Jewish community.1 The National Council of Canadian Muslims has said the last few weeks "have been the worst" in decades in terms of Islamophobia reported to the organization.2

I am deeply concerned about the surging numbers of hate incidents impacting Jewish and Muslim communities here in B.C. and I am calling for immediate and sustained action to address and prevent hate in our communities. The surge of hate we are experiencing now follows on the heels of a wave of hate earlier this fall against trans and gender diverse people, which followed the dramatic rise of hate during the COVID-19 pandemic, including the rise of anti-Asian hate. Hate

is not new, but we know that without concerted action hate will rise during times of societal crisis and be amplified by the spread of misinformation and disinformation.

Every person in B.C. deserves to feel safe and to be free from discrimination and violence. We all also have the right to peaceful expression within the bounds of the law. Peaceful demonstration and protest are essential to our democracy in part because they allow us to speak up against injustice and violence, even when such views are controversial. Conversely, hate is corrosive to democracy. It bears repeating that fundamental human rights—including the rights to be free from violence and discrimination—are not up for debate and statements that undermine human dignity can amount to hate.

I am grateful that B.C.'s Premier has issued a statement speaking out against Islamophobia and antisemitism here in our province, and I am pleased to see the extension of Holocaust education in our school curriculum. Unequivocal condemnation of hate from our leaders is important. However, it is beyond time to move from nice words to meaningful action. It is critical that those impacted Islamophobic or antisemitic discrimination or hate have appropriate avenues for reporting incidents, that justice is pursued for hate crimes and that communities are supported with resources to build connection and take action to counter hate.

In March 2023, in response to the escalation of hate we witnessed during the COVID-19 pandemic, my Office issued recommendations calling for 12

transformative actions to prepare our communities for the next time global events bring a surge of hate to our shores. These recommendations are based on the voices of thousands of community members who participated in our inquiry into hate in the pandemic. Drafts of these recommendations were shared with the government in November 2022. For nearly a year, the provincial government has had this roadmap describing how to take action on these issues and yet has repeatedly delayed reporting to my Office, even on what actions they plan to take. I urge the Premier in the strongest terms to follow his words with concrete actions to solidify our communities against hate. We have the ability to address the rise in hate that occurs when we find ourselves in these moments of societal crisis; it is our responsibility to act.





KITCHENER, ON: The 16th annual Remembrance ceremony hosted by the Sikh community was held on Sunday, November 5 at the military grave of Canadian World War I hero, Private Buckam Singh, in Kitchener, Ontario.

According to the release, "It is the only military grave in Canada of a Sikh soldier from the World Wars, and the ceremony is the largest annual gathering of Sikh soldiers and veterans in North America." Buckam Singh came to Canada in 1907 from the village of Mahilpur in Punjab and was one of the earliest documented Sikhs living in Ontario.

"The Sikh community has organized this Remembrance Ceremony every year at the historic location of Private Buckam Singh's military grave to remember the 117,000 Canadian soldiers like Private Singh that have died since we became a nation; and the 83,000 Sikh soldiers of the British

Indian Army that died fighting along side their Canadian and British allies in two World Wars," said Sandeep Singh Brar, historian, Curator of SikhMuseum. com and the chief organizer of the annual event.

This year's keynote speaker was Randeep Singh Sarai, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Veterans Affairs and the Associate Minister of National Defence. Mr. Sarai drew parallels between Canada and being a Sikh, "The concept to serve is something you see when Canadian soldiers cross the ocean to fight...they stepped up to defend the ideals of freedom and liberty. Similarly, Sikhs have always had that same concept of fighting for those that are oppressed, serving wherever they are."

Sarai recounted his personal family connection to Remembrance Day,



Annual Sikh.

"My father also served in World War II. He enlisted when he was only 15 years old, not knowing much about war, except that his brother was already captured by the Germans as a prisoner of war, unsure if he was dead or alive. These are the types of sacrifices that hundreds and thousands of men and women went from far lands to serve for those ideals that we hold very dear to us and that we can now enjoy our freedoms here in Canada."

Among those attending the ceremony was MP Parm Bains, who represents the riding of Steveston—Richmond East in British Columbia.

Sarai observed, "We've come a long way where a man served for this country over 100 years earlier and 100 years later, another person from that same village now gets to represent his constituents in the House of Parliament."

The ceremony was well attended with nearly 200 people showing up on the cold day to participate including members of the Canadian Armed Forces, Cadets, Police Services, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Fire Services' Honour Guards, Royal Canadian Legion branches, veterans and elected officials from federal, provincial and municipal governments.
