

# **Is Canada's Cap on International Students** Fair, or Will It Create Further Loopholes?

As the nation adapts to these changes, the next two years will be crucial in assessing the effectiveness and consequences of this policy shift. Will the minister's one-sizefits-all announcement become a blunt instrument to damage good institutes, further exploit students and not do much to rein in the bad actors?



The Government of Canada's recent move to put a cap on international students' study permits for two years has evoked diverse sentiments across Canada and around the world.

While some view it as an anticipated and essential step, others argue that it may adversely impact businesses and the education sector, given the significant contribution of the international student community to their sustenance.

The announcement brings forth concerns about potential fee increases for domestic students by some colleges striving to offset the impact on their operations. Changes like getting

an attestation letter from the province are seen as an extra administrative hurdle. The government has also decided not to give postgraduate work permits to students who come for a diploma, certificate or undergraduate program.


Canada's Immigration Minister, Marc Miller, defended the cap, as a necessary move because as rapid increases in the number of international students have put pressure on housing, health care and other services. He also said the changes were necessary "to better protect international students from bad actors and support sustainable population growth in Canada."

# Surrey Police Board's 2024 Budget Will Be \$141.5 Million

I released information on its 2024 Surrey Police Services (SPS) provisional budget, what SPS say, "to provide clarity, transparency, and accountability during the transition from an RCMP detachment to a municipal police department." "There is a lot of misinformation on the policing costs in the City of Surrey, and I believe that budget transparency is important for the people of Surrey to understand the costs and the transition plans for SPS," said Mike Serr, Surrey Police Board Administrator.

The budget, provided to the City of Surrey on November 30, 2023, was developed with guidance from Jessica McDonald, Strategic Implementation Advisor, and

with support from Deloitte, an independent accounting firm.

The total 2024 budget is \$141.5 million. "Based on the City of Surrey's current financial reports, the 2024 provisional budget fits within the City of Surrey's financial framework and accounts for only 42% of their allocated policing funds, said Serr.

Breaking down the budget he said, "\$119.5 million will for ongoing operations, \$6.6 million for equipment and capital expenditures and \$15.4 million for investments through the previously established Policing Transition Project Fund," he said.

Based on this budget, by the end of 2024, SPS will have 526 police officers, making up approximately 67% of the

City's targeted policing strength for 2024, he added.

"The budget is predicated on the growth of Surrey Police Service and the corresponding winding down of the RCMP. The efficient and orderly transition to SPS follows the guidelines set out by the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General and will reduce transition costs by eliminating the administrative overlap of running two police agencies in Surrey," said Serr. SPS is currently made up of 346 police officers and the 2024 budget allocates a hiring target of 180 additional police officers, which would bring the total number of SPS officers to 526 by the end of 2024.

"The Board remains committed to transparency and open dialogue and will take every



step available to make sure people are heard and, most importantly, kept safe through this transition," said Mr. Serr. "I have an open and standing offer to brief the Surrey City Council on this budget submission and to have open discussions about any amendments. To date,

this invitation to discuss this budget proposal has not been accepted."

Of the 180 new police officers, SPS is targeting 135 experienced officers from across Canada and 45 recruits that will be trained at the Justice Institute of British Columbia.

# Surrey Mayor says SPS Public Announcement Of 2024 Budget Will Not Change Anything

Brenda Locke, Mayor of Surrey, in a statement responded to the Surrey Police Service release of 2024 budget. She called it the same one brought to the City of Surrey in November of last year. She said, "There is nothing new here and the fact is nothing has changed on our end. The City of Surrey's 2024 budget is being worked on by our Finance staff. Until that is done, and only once that is

done, will we know what effect the SPS budget will have on the property tax rate."

She said that Solicitor General Mike Farnworth is suggesting that the transition can go forward over the next three years without the Surrey taxpayers being forced to pay more. "To suggest such a thing is not only disingenuous but reveals the continued lack of knowledge and due diligence on the part of



the NDP government when it comes to the financial ramifications of this transition to Surrey. The province has already estimated that the switch to the SPS will cost a minimum of \$30M extra per year. Unless the Province plans to fund 100% of all of the SPS's extra costs, not just for three years but beyond, any shortfall will fall on the backs of Surrey residents and

businesses."

"We are five years into this transition, which was supposed to be completed by April 1, 2021, and the SPS current staffing levels are only at 25%. The SPS plan is to have enough funds to hire 180 officers in 2024. That's an unrealistic goal when you consider it is like trying to hire enough officers to staff an entire police department the size of Delta Police," she added.

was believed to be staying in Delta at the Officers attended and located two victims inside a vehicle, suffering from gun shot wounds.

> A 20-year old woman, identified as Jasmine Lindstrom, and a 24-year old man, later identified as Juvraj Jabal of Surrey, were found with serious injuries and were taken to hospital for emergency care. While Lindstrom survived the shooting, Jabal later succumbed to his injuries in hospital. The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) took conduct of the investigation and continued to work closely with the Surrey RCMP, the Integrated Forensic Identification Section and the BC Coroners Service.

> Through extensive video canvassing, it was determined that the shooting had occurred in the 10200-block of 170a Street, Surrey, in close proximity to an elementary school. On January 23, 2024, Kontos was arrested in Richmond Hill, Ontario and was subsequently charged with one count of

first-degree murder for the homicide of Jabal and one count of attempted murder in relation to Lindstrom.

"This was a two-year long investigation, in which we utilized every tool at our disposal to locate Kontos," said Sergeant Timothy Pierotti of IHIT. "IHIT will continue to be relentless when it comes to bringing those responsible for these senseless homicides to justice. We're thankful as always for our partners at the Surrey RCMP Detachment and the South Simcoe Police Service for their ongoing support during this investigation."

# **Amritpal Saran killed in** targeted shooting in Abbotsford mall parking lot

Investigators have identified 25-year-old Amritpal Saran as the victim of a shooting in Abbotsford.

According to police Saran was found dead inside a vehicle after a shooting at an Abbotsford Mall in the 32900-block of South Fraser Way on January 20, 2024 at approximately 5:45 p.m.

The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) took conduct of the investigation and will be working closely in partnership with the AbbyPD and the BC Coroners Service.

Shortly after the shooting, AbbyPD were advised of a vehicle fire in the 2900-block of Townshipline Road, in Abbotsford.

IHIT investigators are working with AbbyPD forensic experts to determine any connection between the two scenes.

"Initial evidence suggests this was a targeted shooting. Investigators have identified the victim as Amritpal Saran of Abbotsford and are now releasing his name in hopes of furthering their investigation,"

# Nisha Pahuja's To Kill A Tiger Nominated For Academy

**Award For Documentary Feature Film** 

Canadian film maker Nisha Pahuja's documentary To Kill a Tiger has been nominated for the Oscar for Documentary Feature Film at the 96th Academy Awards.

In To Kill a Tiger, Ranjit, a farmer in Jharkhand, India, takes on the fight of his life when he demands justice for his 13-year-old daughter, the survivor of sexual assault. In India, where a rape is reported every 20 minutes and conviction rates are less than 30 percent, Ranjit's decision to support his daughter is virtually unheard of, and his journey unprecedented.

The nomination is the latest honour for To Kill a Tiger, which to date has received over 20 Canadian and international awards.





Since then, it's won over 20 awards, including Best Documentary Feature at the Palm Springs International Film Festival and three Canadian Screen Awards. The film grew out of a long career of addressing various human rights issues, notably violence against women in India. In 2015, Pahuja won an Amnesty International Media Award for Canadian journalism after making a short film about the Delhi bus gang rape for Global News. # **BC Coroner Marks 2023 As Deadliest** Year Of Overdose Deaths In Provincial History

VICTORIA, BC: Preliminary reporting released by the BC Coroners Service confirms that toxic, unregulated drugs claimed the lives of at least 2,511 people in British Columbia in 2023, the largest number of drug-related deaths ever reported to the agency. "Tragically, toxic, illicit drugs are continuing to cause unprecedented numbers of deaths across our province," said Lisa Lapointe, chief coroner. "This crisis, driven primarily by unregulated fentanyl, has cost our province dearly in the loss of much-loved and valued members of our communities. We cannot bring our deceased loved ones back, but we can and must do much more to protect the lives of tens of thousands of our family members, friends and colleagues

The total number of lives lost in 2023 equates to an average of 6.9 deaths per day and is 5% more than the previous high of 2,383 deaths recorded a year earlier in

"Today's report is a damning indictment of the NDP government's disastrous decriminalization policy which has recklessly endangered lives," said BC United Leader Kevin Falcon. "The consequences of this government's negligence can be seen in the lives lost, families broken, and communities suffering."

As has been the case throughout the public health emergency, no area of B.C. was spared the devastation caused by toxic drugs in 2023. The Vancouver-Centre

includes Vancouver's Downtown Eastside, reported a rate of death more than 12 times greater than the provincial average. The next highest rates were observed in Hope, Alberni/Clayoquot, Terrace and Greater Campbell River. Four of the province's five regional health authorities saw recordhigh numbers and rates of death. Toxicological testing confirms that illicit fentanyl continues to drive the toxic-drug crisis. Fentanyl and its analogues were by far the most regularly detected substances, appearing in more than 85% of test results conducted in 2023. The Coroners Service continues to monitor closely for the presence of prescribed safersupply medications in its testing, with hydromorphone detected

in about 3% of

Unregulated drug toxicity is the leading cause of death in British Columbia for persons aged 10 to 59, accounting for more deaths than homicides, suicides, accidents and natural disease combined. The lives of at least 13,794 British Columbians have been lost to unregulated drugs since the public-health emergency was first declared in April 2016.

"As we approach the eighth anniversary of the declaration of the public-health emergency that has cost so many lives across B.C., our province needs a co-ordinated, evidence-based response that is commensurate with the scale of this health crisis," Lapointe said. "Deaths due to drug toxicity are preventable, and I urge our political leaders at all levels to collaborate on a

thoughtful, comprehensive plan that puts people first."

The townships experiencing the highest number of unregulated drug deaths in 2023 were Vancouver, Surrey and Greater Victoria.

Additionally, smoking the most common mode of consumption in 2023 with 65% showing evidence of smoking followed by injection (14%), nasal insufflation (14%) and oral

# **Man Found Deceased In Residential Fire In Surrey**

Currey RCMP is assisting Surrey Fire Services following a fatal residential fire in Surrey.

On January 22, 2024 at 3:22 am, Surrey RCMP received a report of a structure fire in upper residential suites of a commercial building in the 13400-block of 71A Avenue. Police arrived on scene as the Surrey Fire Department were evacuating the occupants of other suites. Surrey Fire Department located a man in a suite, and with the assistance of BC Emergency Health Services (EHS) performed lifesaving efforts; unfortunately, the 54-year-old Surrey man did not survive. Two pets also died in the fire. Surrey RCMP General Investigation Unit (GIU) investigated alongside the Surrey Fire Inspector, and have determined the cause of the fire was not suspicious.

As the SPS ramps up its operations, there will be a proportional decrease in RCMP expenses. This means there should be no overall increase in the policing service budget and is in line with the City of Surrey's 2024 budget allocation. SPS's proposed budget was reviewed by auditor Deloitte and would use \$142 million of the city's \$337 million available funds for policing in the city, according to city financial plans and reports. This further discredits Mayor Brenda Locke's claim that there will be a double-digit property tax increase, if there is a double digit property tax hike it is not due to SPS policing budget constraints but rather a result of Brenda Locke hiring expensive consultants, poor financial mismanagement and petty vindicative political motivations.



# Is Canada's Cap on International Students Fair, or Will It Create...

Opposition leader Pierre Poilievre called the cap justified but said it will not control the damage that has already been done. He blamed the government for unleashing the chaos in the system by inviting students without doing homework to ensure enough housing, infrastructure, and credible education institutions.

Neera Agnihotri, a volunteer with One Voice Canada and an immigration consultant highlighted the strain on major cities like Toronto, Vancouver, Quebec, and Calgary. She argued that the uncontrolled influx of international students, coupled with rising immigration targets, has jeopardized housing, healthcare, and infrastructure services, impacting not only students but also compromising affordability for locals.

Brampton City Council unanimously passed a motion calling on the federal government to require international student visas to include a housing address consistent with local by laws as a component of the approvals process.

#### KEY CHANGES AND IMPLICA-TIONS

The first change is the limit on study permits. Canada is expected to approve approximately 360,000 study permits reduced from nearly 560,000 issued in 2023, a decrease of 35%. This will have a direct impact on a number of international students enrolling in education institutions. A group of 24 colleges in Ontario has also said in a statement that this rushed decision will create havoc for students, the labour market, and reputation of good colleges. "The federal government failed to recognize that public colleges have a year-round intake of students, designed specifically to meet employer needs. Colleges work year-round, as the demand for more people in the labour market is year-round. That means there are students already well into the application process, ready to start in May in programs for key sectors of Ontario's economy.'

Indian students are poised to bear the impact as they constitute the largest cohort of international students in Canada in recent years. Media reports indicate that in 2022,

more than 41%, totaling 225,835 permits, were granted to Indian students.

#### NO WORK PERMIT FOR UNDER-GRADUATE PROGRAMS

There will be a cap on number of students coming to each province. IRCC will allocate a portion of the cap to each province and territory, who will then distribute the allocation among their designated learning institutions. To implement the cap, as of January 22, 2024, every study permit application submitted to IRCC will also require an attestation letter from a province or territory. Provinces and territories are expected to establish a process for issuing attestation letters to students by no later than March 31, 2024. The Ontario College group called it a new and unexpected administrative hurdle that is halting all student visa processing right now, "as the provincial government currently has no process for generating such letters."

Also starting September 1, 2024, international students who begin a study program that is part of a curriculum licensing arrangement will no longer be eligible for a postgraduation work permit upon graduation. "Under curriculum licensing agreements, students physically attend a private college that has been licensed to deliver the curriculum of an associated public college. These programs have seen significant growth in attracting international students in recent years, though they have less oversight than public colleges and they act as a loophole with regards to post-graduation work permit eligibility," the minister said. Neera Agnihotri says that not giving work permits to undergraduate students will certainly limit the number of students coming to Canada. Gaining international experience is one of the important aspects of studying in a different country. "Students who have spent thousands of dollars to study and get work permit will not be eligible for it. Many would look to get LMIAs." She warns students to be aware of exploitation since they might be lured to pay extra to get LMIA.

Ontario colleges in a statement have also expressed concerns about undergraduate students not able to work after diplomas or certificates. "College graduates fill key needs across sectors that include advanced manufacturing, mining, the electrical vehicle industry, early childhood, health care, housing construction and others that our economy depends on."

The exemptions for students in master's and PhD programs don't reflect the current and future demands in Ontario's labour market. For example, 60 per cent of the current vacancies in health care in Ontario are for college graduates. The colleges are proposing exemptions for students in high-demand programs – not just for master's and PhD students.

#### NO WORK PERMIT FOR SPOUSES

The government has also announced that open work permits will only be available to spouses of international students in master's and doctoral programs. The spouses of international students in other levels of study, including undergraduate and college programs, will no longer be eligible

#### THE GOOD NEWS

The announcement of cap may have strangled hopes of many students who are planning to study in Canada but there is a good news. First, these are all temporary measures that will just be in place for two years. Also, the government has made it clear that with this announcement study permit renewals will not be impacted. Those pursuing master's and doctoral degrees, and elementary and secondary education are not included in the cap. Current study permit holders will not be affected. The minister said, "In the coming months, we will continue to work to provide clear pathways to permanent residence for students with in-demand skills and explore new measures to better transition international students to the labour force.'

As the nation adapts to these changes, the next two years will be crucial in assessing the effectiveness and consequences of this policy shift. At the end it is important to note that the minister's one-size-fits-all announcement should not become a blunt instrument to damage the good actors in college education and not do much to rein in the bad actors.

# **Police Data Reveal Shocking Number Of Drivers In BC Are Operating Without Insurance**

**B**C Highway Patrol and Coquitlam RCMP said that they are experiencing a dramatic rise in vehicles without valid insurance.

From December 1, 2023, to January 11, 2024, BC Highway Patrol - Kootenay has located 177 drivers operating uninsured vehicles. Each driver received a violation ticket for no insurance for \$598 dollars.

On the other hand Coquitlam RCMP have issued 24 violation tickets for driving without vehicle insurance. "This is a dramatic increase compared to January 2023 which saw 11 violation tickets for the entire month. With only 18 days into January, this is a 46% increase," Staff Sergeant Mark McCutcheon, Coquitlam RCMP's Traffic Services Commander.

Throughout the past year, Police have seen a steady increase in the number of vehicles on our roadways that are travelling without vehicle insurance. On May 1, 2022 licence plate decals were



discontinued by ICBC and were no longer required on vehicles.

"When our officers stop vehicles for no insurance, drivers are often saying that they forgot or didn't realize because they don't have the decal reminder on their vehicle anymore," said McCutcheon. "We strongly encourage drivers to ensure that their vehicles are properly insured before traveling."

"Drivers should think about the risks

of operating without insurance which include paying a significant fine, being financially responsible for a collision, and expensive towing costs," said the Officer in Charge of Kootenay Highway Patrol, Inspector Chad Badry. "There is a risk of a driver's license suspension or increased sanctions in court for repeat offences."

Driving without insurance can result in a \$598 violation ticket and the vehicle being towed. In addition to the violation ticket, if the vehicle is involved in a collision while it is not insured, the driver could be sued or held liable for damages. BC Highway Patrol has compiled the top 10 excuses encountered:

ICBC never sent me a reminder.

I am on the way to purchase insurance right now.

I forgot.

I don't have a decal anymore.

My insurance is paid for automatically, so I thought I didn't need to renew.

The registered owner is my mom, dad or friend and it's their job.

This is a company vehicle.

My vehicle is actually insured, but I don't have the documents.

I cancelled the credit card that was making the preauthorized payments.

I know I don't have insurance, but I really needed to go somewhere.

Police advice to registered owners and drivers:

Owners must renew their own insurance as is not automatically renewed

Drivers should check the expiry dates on vehicle's documents before driving

Renewal notices are sent only as a courtesy and your address should be up to date

Set a reminder in your phone's calendar Documents must be kept in the vehicle or drivers may receive an \$81 dollar fine Insurance can often be renewed online or over the phone.

# Young Indo-Canadian Man Arrested In **Shooting Death Of Nishan Thind**

Peel police have arrested a man It was determined he had been and continue to lock for and continue to look for a teenage suspect in connection with the fatal shooting of an 18-yearold Brampton man last month.

The police have not yet revealed the reason behind shooting.

Meanwhile, the alleged shooter, who police said is a 16-year-old boy, continues to be at large. He is wanted on a Canada-wide warrant for manslaughter.

Police cannot release his name

under the provisions of the Youth Criminal Justice Act.

# Conservative Leader Pierre Poilievre Affirms Business-Driven and

Regardless of the complexity of questions like diplomatic tensions with India or the straightforward question of constructing a community center for the Filipino community in BC, Conservative leader's answers were driven by two overarching solutions ie putting Canada first on the diplomatic front and on domestic front putting more money in pockets of people so they can afford things they

When asked about diplomatic relations, especially with India, Poilievre said all his foreign policy would reflect a commitment to prioritize Canadian interests. "All of my foreign policy will be driven by one thing ie what's good for Canada. We are going to start

putting our own country first for a change. This idea that we have had for eight years under Trudeau to cower to foreign governments, and multinational bureaucracies, to get seats to different UN commissions and let US walk all over us -- would be over. We will stand for Canada."

He said when it comes to India, he sees it as a big powerful democracy, emphasizing the importance of doing business with the second biggest populous nation on Earth while keeping Canada's welfare at the forefront. "I want more trade and jobs for our people."

His focus on bilateral relations with India will be in terms of business. "My priorities with India will include selling our natural gas so that we can



shut down coal fire plants and replace them with clean Canadian gas that is liquefied here in British Columbia. And we want to get a direct flight from Vancouver to Amritsar so that we can shorten travel time for the largest diaspora Punjabi community. Singapore Malaysia, Italy, UK all have direct flights to Amritsar so why not Canada?

Trudeau signed an open skies agreement with no direct flights to Amritsar. He took our Punjabi community for granted and didn't care inconvenience it caused particularly seniors and business owners who visit Punjab. I want to fix that."

With respect to increasing foreign interference, he said Canada needs to protect its citizens from foreign influence by any government and Canada needs a public registry for agents of "foreign authoritarian regimes who influence or manipulate" Canadian politics. Apart from foreign issues, the leader criticized the current government's handling of economic issues too. He blamed the rising cost of increased housing living, prices, and higher taxes on Justin Trudeau's eight-year tenure. "Our country has never been in worse shape than it is after eight years of Trudeau. Two million people forced to a food bank every single month in Canada."

Poilievre's solution involves a 'common sense' conservative approach, advocating for lower prices through the elimination of the carbon tax on gas, heat, and groceries. "We're going

to bring home lower prices by axing the carbon tax on gas, heat, and groceries by capping, spending, and cutting waste to balance the budget and bring down inflation and interest rates."

In the realm of immigration, Poilievre criticized Trudeau for failing to help immigrants get licensed in professions. "We'll bring on powerful paychecks of lower income taxes that reward hard work by bringing in a blue -sealed national testing standard to allow our brilliant immigrant doctors and nurses to take a test prove they're qualified and get to work in their field. We have, for example, 32,000 immigrant nurses that can't work. Many of them are Filipino.'

To address the housing crisis, Poilievre proposed incentivizing bureaucracies to speed up the permitting process for home building. "We'll create financial incentives for the local bureaucracies to speed up lower the cost of building permits, free up land, so we can build."

On crime prevention, Poilievre advocated for stricter measures, including keeping repeat violent offenders in prison and banning hard drugs. "We will also ban hard drugs, stop giving out opioids, and instead provide recovery and treatment services so we can bring our loved ones home drug free."

In essence, Pierre Poilievre's 'common sense' approach involved breaking down complicated issues and finding simple answers for all the things the Trudeau government is finding difficult right now ie inflation, housing and cost of living. However, it will not be uncommon to point that the true test of his common sense agenda will only be possible if he secures victory in the upcoming elections!

# **BC** To Restrict Use Of Cell Phones In Schools

SURREY, BC: The Province is moving forward on three important actions to keep kids and young people safe from online threats, restrict cellphones in school and hold social media companies account-

"Today, kids live with different challenges than they did a generation ago, and they face them all in the palm of their hand," said Premier David Eby. "While cellphones, the internet and social media help us connect with each other, they also present risks that can harm kids. The impact and influence of these tools is so great, and the corporations so powerful, it can be overwhelming for parents. That's why we are taking action to protect kids from the threats posed by online predators and the impacts of social media companies.

The announcement includes three concrete actions to keep kids and young adults safe: \* restricting the use of cellphones in schools;

\* launching services to remove images from the internet and pursue predators; and \* legislation to hold social media companies accountable for the harm they have

Research shows that frequent cellphone interruption in the classroom, social media platforms with addictive algorithms and predators who seek to exploit young people all present significant risks to young people. Studies have found that children's mental health and physical safety can suffer as a result of body-image distortion, cyberbullying, images shared without consent and disturbing instances of sextortion.

The Province will work with school districts to ensure all schools have policies in place by the start of the next school year to be able to restrict students' cellphone use in the classroom.

"Having cellphones in the classroom can be a distraction from the kind of focused learning we want kids to experience at school," said Rachna Singh, Minister of Education and Child Care. "There also is a time and a place for cellphones, including when they support student accessibility purposes. By learning in a safe school environment how to use their cellphones responsibly and respectfully, including when to put them away, students will be better able to develop healthy habits around technology and social media use in their everyday lives." The Province is also ensuring more digital

"That's why we are providing supports for people, especially young adults, to take down their private images from websites and pursue damages against predators."

Driving suspensions from 24 hours to 90 days

Vehicle impoundment

Fines, from \$600 and up to \$4,060 Jail time

Mandatory rehabilitation

Installation of ignition interlock in your vehicle

You may also have to pay a Driver Risk Premium, on top of your insurance, and if you crash while driving impaired, you're likely in breach of your insurance policy. That means you could be personally responsible for 100 per cent of the costs if you damage someone else's property or injure them (source: ICBC).



# Federal **Commission** Requests **Information** on Alleged Interference by India

anada's Foreign Interference Commission is looking to examine the alleged meddling by India in the country's last two general elections.

The commission, in a statement on Wednesday, said it had asked the federal government to produce documentation related to these allegations. "Pursuant to its Terms of Reference, the Foreign Interference Commission has requested that the Government of Canada's collection and production of document relating to paragraphs clause (a)(i)(A) and (a)(i)(B) of its Terms of Reference include information and documents relating to alleged interference by India related to the 2019 and 2021 elections."

The commission's terms of reference, published last year, direct it to assess possible interference by China, Russia and other foreign state- or non-state actors in the 2019 and 2021 federal elections, the CTV News reported.

The commission's initial hearings will begin on Monday. The hearings, which will last five days, will identify the challenges, limitations and potential adverse impacts associated with the disclosure of classified national security information and intelligence to the public.

# Shelter Costs Continue To Be A Major Driver Of Inflation In Canada

Canadian prices, as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), rose 3.4 per cent on a yearover-year basis in December, up from a 3.1% increase in November.

The increase was largely driven by base-year effects from gasoline, which were low in December of 2022. Excluding energy costs, CPI rose 3.7 per cent year-over-year in December, down from 3.8 per cent in November.

Shelter costs continue to be a major driver of inflation, with mortgage interest costs up 28.6 per cent and rent up 7.7 per cent from last year in December. Grocery price inflation remained unchanged from November at 4.7 per cent year-over-year in December. Month over month, seasonally adjusted CPI rose 0.3 per cent.


In BC, consumer prices rose 3.4 per cent year-over-year. The Bank of Canada's preferred measures of core inflation, which



strip out volatile components, remained between 3.5 and 4 per cent per cent year-over-year in December.

Despite a disappointing uptick in the year-over-year percentage change in CPI, the general picture remains similar. CPI is stubbornly high, still within the 3-4 percent territory that it has occupied since roughly the spring.

Although gasoline prices drive volatility in the measure, including most of the December increase, shelter and food costs remain well above their prepandemic norms and are causing



the CPI to remain broadly elevated.

The annualized 3-month percentage change in the Bank of Canada's preferred measures of inflation, including CPI-median and CPI-trim, both ticked up last month and remain between 3 and 4. Amid tepid GDP growth

and softening labour markets, financial markets continue to expect the Bank of Canada to cut rates substantially by the summer of 2024, but this will, of course, depend on the rate of economic growth and price appreciation in the first half of the year.

# Federal Court of Canada rules Trudeau's use of the Emergencies Act 'unconstitutional' and unreasonable

In a landmark ruling, a Federal Court judge ruled this week that the Liberal government unconstitutionally and unjustifiably invoked the Emergencies Act in response to ongoing Freedom Convoy blockades in early 2022.

On Feb. 14, 2022, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's government announced it was invoking the exceptional powers of the Emergencies Act for the first time in response to ongoing, weekslong Freedom Convoy blockades in Ottawa that thwarted police control. This was the first time the Act was invoked since its enactment in 1988.

The Act, invoked for just over

one week, was used to freeze some convoy participants' bank accounts, compel tow truck companies to co-operate with local police clearing out blockades and mark parts of downtown Ottawa as a no-go zone. It was also meant to prevent protesters who had blockaded the US-Canada border in Ontario and Alberta from returning.

Four groups applied for judicial review of the decision. The Applicants/Parties raised issues which lead to the following three key questions.

Was the Proclamation unreasonable? The Court concluded that the Proclamation was unreasonable and illegal.

"The Proclamation applied the temporary special measures in all of Canada's provinces and territories, despite the lack of evidence that it was necessary. Apart from the situation in Ottawa, the police were able to enforce the rule of law by applying the Criminal Code and other legislation," the court document mentions.

Also the Court said that there was not enough evidence to support that the activities reached a threshold defined as "threats to the security of Canada".

The Court found that there was no infringement of the rights to freedom of peaceful assembly and of association. Regarding the argument raised by the two men whose bank accounts were frozen, that their rights to due process and the peaceful enjoyment of property under the Canadian Bill of Rights were violated the Court found that there was no infringement.

"I have concluded that the decision to issue the Proclamation does not bear the hallmarks of reasonableness — justification, transparency and intelligibility—and was not justified in relation to the relevant factual and legal constraints that were required to be taken into consideration," stated Federal Court Justice Richard Mosley.

At a press conference from the



cabinet retreat in Montreal, Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland said the federal government plans to appeal the decision.

"I would just like to take a moment to remind Canadians of how serious the situation was in our country when we took that decision," she said. "The public safety of Canadians was under threat. Our national security, which includes our national economic security, was under threat."

motion urging the government to require study visas to include an accommodation address.

The move comes in the wake of an exacerbating housing crisis, leading to unaffordable rentals that are forcing students, many of them Indians, to live in unsafe and illegal conditions in the country.

"We can't have international students living in 3rd world conditions while being used as an ATM for the college they are going to," Brown, whose city has seen a large influx of international students, wrote in a post on X on Saturday.

"Brampton City Council has unanimously passed a motion calling on the federal government to require international student visas to include a housing address consistent with local by laws as a component of the approvals process," Brown said.

According to the Mayor, the current system allows international students to be routinely taken advantage of and is exacerbating the housing crisis. "Requiring a housing address as part of the visa approval process would ensure every college has an appropriate housing plan and spur new student housing construction," Brown wrote.

According to official figures, the number of international students in Canada has crossed the one million mark, just as the country mulls capping their arrival. There were more than 800,000 international students in Canada in 2022, and the federal government has said previously it expected more than 900,000 in 2023


As the housing crisis has been blamed on an increase in migrants and international students, Brown said it is the immigration system that needs to be fixed while supporting the arrival of international students in Canada.

# Vancouver Coastal Health Sounds A Warning About Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH) is issuing a warning to the public about carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning as B.C. heads into the coldest winter months.

During the colder months, when people spend more time indoors, VCH hospitals see an increase in CO poisoning with an average of 31 emergency department visits each month, compared to 19 visits per month during the warmer months of the year (when comparing April – September to October – March 2018-2023).

CO is produced by burning gasoline, wood, propane, charcoal and other fossil fuels. Improperly ventilated appliances and engines using these fuels in a tightly sealed or enclosed space may allow the gas to accumulate to dangerous levels. Prolonged exposure to this invisible, odorless gas can cause significant damage to an individual's internal organs and, in some situations, may be fatal.

There are many simple steps people can take to reduce their risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. These include installing a carbon monoxide detector in your home and checking its batteries every year. If you live in a home with a furnace, ensure it is checked by an accredited professional annually.

The BC Drug and Poison Information Centre receives about 350 CO exposure referrals each year and between 20-40 of those cases are treated in Vancouver General Hospital's hyperbaric chamber. VCH has the only publicly-funded hyperbaric chamber in B.C. It provides 100 per cent oxygen in a high-pressure environment, which increases the level of oxygen in a patient's bloodstream, helps the body rid itself of CO, and aids healing.

Given exposure can cause very subtle symptoms, many people may not even be aware that they require care. Symptoms include Common Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Headache, dizziness, and fatigue

Blurry or double vision

Chest pain

Nausea and vomiting

headache, blurred vision, nausea, shortness of breath and/or confusion. If you think you or someone you're with may have carbon monoxide poisoning, immediately seek fresh air and emergency care.

# Funding Available For Farmers, Ranchers Prepare For Extreme Weather

VICTORIA: B.C. farm and ranch business owners can now apply for funding to help prepare and protect their farms and animals from extreme weather emergencies. Funding that opened on Tuesday, Jan. 23, 2024, will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis with up to \$50,000 available per applicant and per project category.


Through the Extreme Weather Preparedness for Agriculture program, \$2 million is available to support producers with projects that help prepare farms for wildfires, flooding, and extreme heat.

The program began in 2022 and has supported more than 150 projects on B.C. farms in the poultry, dairy, beef,

tree fruit, and berry sectors.

Examples include: improving cooling systems for barns, enhancing shade and heat protection for livestock and crops, protection and storage of feed and fuel, protection of wells, FireSmart critical infrastructure assessments and retrofitting farm buildings in preparation of wildfires.

The Extreme Weather Preparedness for Agriculture program is part of B.C.'s Climate Preparedness and Adaptation Strategy and is delivered by the Investment Agriculture Foundation of BC (IAF), with funding from the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP), and CleanBC.



The Sustainable CAP is a five-year, \$3.5-billion investment

by federal, provincial and territorial governments to strengthen competitiveness, innovation, and resiliency of the agriculture, agrifood and agri-based products sector. This includes \$1 billion in federal programs and activities and a \$2.5-billion commitment that is cost-shared 60% federally and 40% provincially/territorially for programs that are designed and delivered by provinces and territories.

# Not Just Your House, Declutter Your Emotions For A Fresh Start

Site Medical Director Dr. Marietta Van Den Berg offers tips to deal with six common types of clutter. According to her clutter can affect our stress and anxiety levels

Out with the old, in with the new. For many people, the new year is a time to clean house.

By now, the tree is probably down and the holiday decorations put away. But what to do with the things that accumulate over the year and clutter our homes and lives?

According to psychiatrist and Surrey Memorial Hospital Site Medical Director Dr. Marietta Van Den Berg, clutter can affect our stress and anxiety levels, as well as our productivity. It can influence our ability to focus and may trigger coping and avoidance behaviors.

"Think about how hard it is to concentrate when you are in a noisy mall or restaurant, how draining it is," says Dr. Van Den Berg. "Visual stimuli and the physical environment also drain cognitive resources."

Clutter, she says, represents postponed decisions.

"When we do not make decisions, we end up with stuff in our lives. We have things in our homes because we have not made decisions around whether we need them, whether to get rid of them or where to put them, and we have clutter in our lives because we have not decided what is and is not important. When we avoid making decisions, we then get decision fatigue and then we avoid the issue altogether and the clutter

grows."

Dr. Van Den Berg offers some tips to deal with six common types of clutter:

#### Waste clutter

No one wants to contribute to landfills. We can choose to sell, donate or toss items. We must learn to live with and tolerate the difficult feelings that come with disposing of items we don't want or need, and then use those feelings to make better decisions when buying more stuff in the future.

#### Aspirational clutter

This includes the clothes in the closet that we have had for years because we intend to lose weight, and the craft and hobby supplies that we will use when we have more time. This represents our past selves and our future selves, not our present reality. The solution, says Dr. Van Den Berg, is to change and close the gap between the desired and current self, or let it go.

#### **Progress clutter**

The parts you ordered that need to be installed, the projects you started that need to be completed, or even the letters that need to be posted all represent progress clutter. Close the gap, schedule the task and complete it, or have an "in-progress" basket that you keep out of the way.

#### Sentimental clutter

Decide how many useless things holding sentimental value you can accommodate without them becoming clutter. For example, perhaps allocate one banker's box per child for elementary artwork, school reports and year books. Find a way to hold onto the memory, not the item.

Offer larger items, like furniture, to family members, or repurpose them to fit your current needs.

"This includes the gifted and inherited stuff that you may

hate but feel obliged to keep," says Dr. Van Den Berg. "I have that - a whole house full of antique furniture where nothing matches in case my children want it someday. I intend to have two antique chairs sanded, painted white and distressed...I feel if I must bear the burden of ownership at least I can do it in a manner that looks pretty to me and works for me."

#### I-might-need-this clutter

Keeping something because you might need it is centered on fear. Fear of not having something when it is needed, fear of regret and fear of not being able to afford or find the item in the future. It represents a fear of loss of control of future possible needs.

Ask yourself: When did I last

use it? If not in two seasons, you probably do not need it. If you decide to keep an item, remember it is a tradeoff of the cost of your time, space, and attention against a possible future need.

**Emotional and mental clutter** Rather than creating a "to-do" list, consider scheduling items or doing them immediately.

Worries and thoughts take up headspace, time and attention. Consider writing them down.

To reduce emotional clutter, be realistic about your capacity and capabilities. If people in your life constantly "take" from you, bring you down or clutter your emotional space, time, energy and attention, either reduce the impact they have on your life or cut them out.

"Enough is enough. It's time Brown told The Globe that to clean up this broken federal program," he said.

In a letter to the federal immigration and housing ministers last month, Brown also called on the government for a more restrictive visa policy, according to The Globe and Mail newspaper.

This included capping student permits issued annually, and postsecondary prioritising institutions that have a housing plan.

"Data demonstrates Ontario has more international students than all other provinces and territories combined, and a substantial portion of new international students settle in Brampton where they face issues such as housing affordability and as a result, insufficient living conditions," the letter read.

"These changes to the international student program will help alleviate the pressures international students face and municipalities like Brampton who carry the responsibility of creating conditions to help international students thrive."

many students reside in his community while attending colleges hundreds of kilometres away.

"It's a massive resource drain. The city gets no compensation for the fact that they're not paying taxes. They're living quite often 16 people in a basement apartment," Brown

Earlier this month, Immigration Minister Marc Miller said he will closely analyse the number of international students and temporary residents entering into the country with the government facing backlash over housing affordability and rising cost of living.

Further, he called on the provinces to stop licensing substandard private colleges that he says churn foreign graduates out like "puppy mills"

Brown also mentioned in his letter that public and private colleges have significantly increased international enrollment to up their profit over the past 10 years, but have added little to no new oncampus housing.






