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

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White Rock Horror: 28-Year-Old **Arrested in Fatal Stabbings; Community Mourns Kulwinder Sohi's Loss**

White Rock Police have arrested and charged 28-year-old Dimitri Nelson Hyacinth from Surrey in relation to the stabbing that killed Kulwinder Singh Sohi, a young Punjabi male last week near White Rock Pier.

The same man was also charged in relation to the aggravated assault of Jatinder Singh on April 21. The two tragic incidents that occurred just days apart left the White Rock community shaken, concerned and feeling unsafe since the area is considered safe and the pier is one of the most popular lookout places for Lower Mainland families. The incidents also raised concerns among the Punjabi community as both the targets were Punjabi males.

Family and friends of Sohi and locals gathered in a vigil and attended a town hall to put forth some tough questions for the police and the local authorities. They demanded answers as to why more wasn't done to alert the public after the first non-fatal attack on April 21.

"There was nothing at the time to make us believe it was an active threat. ... We considered



it, it's always something top of my mind. Always," said White Rock RCMP Staff Sgt. Rob Dixon. Dixon shared that the number of police patrols along the promenade and Marine Drive increased immediately after the Sunday incident. Several members from the South Asian community also expressed how the two incidents, which saw South Asian men as victims, have been affecting their community.

The potential of racial targeting in the stabbings was raised multiple times.

White Rock RCMP responded to a report of Sohi's stabbing in the 15400-block of Marine Drive on April 23, 2024 at 9:26 p.m. Officers along with BC Ambulance Emergency Health Services attended and upon arrival, located a 26-year-old man,

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Arjun Sahnan wanted Canada-wide

The Edmonton Police Service (EPS) has issued Canada-wide warrants for 19-year-old Arjun Sahnan, who is alleged to be

Three Indian nationals arrested in Edmonton in killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar

In a significant development in the high-profile murder investigation of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, Canadian police arrested and charged 3 suspects who are Indian nationals and nonpermanent residents of Canada. The suspects were not known to the police. They have been living in Canada for between 3 to 4 years. The individuals Kamalpreet Singh, Karanpreet Singh and Karan Brar (all in there 20s) were arrested in Edmonton, Alberta on Friday







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Hardeep Sidhu charged with second-degree murder of Surrey woman

Hardeep Sidhu, 39, has been charged in relation to an April 2024 homicide in Surrey which police call an isolated incident where the victim and the suspect knew each other.

On April 26, 2024, the Surrey RCMP were notified after a 33-year old woman, later identified as Pawitarpreet Kaur Sidhu was found deceased inside her home. Frontline officers along with Surrey RCMP support units attended and took control of the scene.

Evidence located on scene resulted in the deployment of the In-Homicide tegrated Team Investigation (IHIT), who have now taken conduct of the investigation, and continue to work closely in partnership with the Surrey RCMP, the BC Coroners Service and the Integrated Forensic Identification Section.

On May 1, 2024, with the assistance of members of the Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA) and the Combined Forces Special Enforcement Unit (CFSEU-BC), 39-year-old Hardeep Sidhu of Surrey was taken into custody in relation to the homicide and subsequently charged with second-degree murder.

"This was an isolated incident between parties that were known to each other," said Sgt. Timothy Pierotti of IHIT. "We're asking anyone with information or who had recent contact with the people involved, to contact IHIT immediately."

BC moves to ban drug use in public places

A midst continuous pushback from various groups, health care workers and communities, the BC government has decided to ban the use of drugs in public places.

This will provide police with the power to enforce against drug use in all public places, including hospitals, restaurants, transit, parks and beaches.

This change, however, would not recriminalize drug possession in a private residence or place where someone is legally sheltering, or at overdose prevention sites and drug checking locations.

"Keeping people safe is our highest priority. While we are caring and compassionate for those struggling with addiction, we do not accept street disorder that makes communities feel unsafe," said Premier David Eby. "We're taking action to make sure police have the tools they need to ensure safe and comfortable communities for everyone as we expand treatment options so people can stay alive and get better."

Last year, B.C. began a pilot project allowing drug users to carry small amounts of illicit drugs, including fentanyl and cocaine, for their own use. B.C.'s three-year exemption under section 56(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act to decriminalize people who use drugs was first requested on Nov. 1, 2021, and enacted on Jan. 31, 2023.

Eby's government tried to ban drug use in a wide range of public places last year through provincial legislation, but the move was challenged and frozen in provincial court. This time, the premier is going further, asking the federal government — which has ultimate jurisdiction over criminal law in Canada — to dramatically scale back BC's ex-



emption in the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act.

The province has now requested a sweeping amendment to the federal exemption. Frustration over the slow pace of provincial court proceedings, and the "quickly escalating situation on the ground" with drug use in places like hospitals and restaurants convinced Eby to take a different approach, he said at a press conference in Vancouver.

Premier David Eby said Friday in Vancouver that he has received assurances from Prime Minister Justin Trudeau that the federal government will help ensure police can enforce a ban on illicit drug use in any public spaces, including parks, transit, hospitals, restaurants and beaches.

The B.C. government is currently working with Health Canada to urgently change the decriminalization policy to stop drug use in public and has requested an amendment to its s.56 exemption to exclude all public places. That includes a place to which the public has access as a right or by invitation, express or implied, whether or not a fee is charged for entry, and on public transit. Importantly, the Province is

working to ensure the exemption continues to apply to private residences, healthcare clinics that provide outpatient addictions services such as Rapid Access Addictions Clinics, sanctioned overdose prevention sites, including those operated by housing providers, as well as drug checking sites and to people lawfully sheltering overnight.

The Province is also working with police on guidance to ensure that people who merely possess drugs but are not threatening public safety, their own safety or causing a disturbance, will not be subject to arrest or charge.

Adrian Dix, minister of health also informed that the Ministry of Health is developing a consistent approach to prevent illicit drug use in B.C. hospitals through universal policies, practice requirements, and appropriate enforcement approaches. Working in partnership and consultation with First Nation and Indigenous partners, health-care providers, professional associations, health-care unions, patients and communities.

Vancouver Mayor Ken Sim welcomed the province's decision to ban use of drugs in public spaces. In a statement he said, "Our vision for Vancouver is of a secure and safe city, where families can ride the Sky Train or play in our beautiful parks with the assurance that these public spaces remain free from drug-related activities.

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India summons Canadian diplomat over pro-Khalistan separatism slogans at Trudeau speech

The Indian government summoned Canada's Deputy High Commissioner Stewart Wheeler to explain "separatist slogans" shouted at Khalsa Day celebrations in Toronto where Prime

Minister Justin Trudeau gave remarks, India's Ministry of External Affairs said in a press release on Monday.

According to an article in The National Post, the press release by the Indian

government states, "The Government of India's deep concern and strong protest was conveyed at such disturbing actions being allowed to continue unchecked at the event," the press release read.

"This illustrates once again the political space that has been given in Canada separatism, extremis m and violence. Their continued expressions not only impact India-Canada relations but also encourage climate of violence and criminality in Canada to the detriment of its own citizens."

Justin Trudeau a s s u r e d Canadians of Sikh heritage that his government will always be there to protect their rights freedom. and His statement came soon after 'Khalistan Zindabad' slogans were raised on the occasion of Khalsa

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
Day on Sunday, April 28, in Toronto, according to a video in the YouTube channel of Canadian media organisation CPAC.


Trudeau said, "The story of the Sikh community in Canada is, in fact, the story of the Canada...To the nearly 800 thousand Canadians of Sikh heritage across this country, we will always be there to protect your rights and your freedom, and we will always defend your community against hatred and discrimination."

Your right to practice your religion freely, and without intimidation is exactly that. A fundamental right guaranteed in the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms that we will always stand up and defend you for," Trudeau assured the Sikh community in his Khalsa Day address.

Trudeau's remarks come at a time when the diplomatic relations between India and Canada are going through a difficult phase. The killing of India-designated terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar, had sparked a row between India and Canada.

The gala was a huge success with over 600 guests attending to raise money and awareness for the creation of a South Asian Community Hub in Surrey to support community members in need of culturally sensitive and linguistically relevant mental health, addiction, and social services. "Every individual we help has a unique story. Our outreach workers take time to understand their story and provide culturally and linguistically appropriate services in a timely manner. Our holistic approach helps individuals navigate complex systems and provides support to the family members who are also affected," said Daljit Gill-Badesha, executive director, South Asian Community Society. The Province contributed \$100,000 to SACH to support its work. This is the second year SACH has received provincial funding for a total of \$200,000 for its ongoing operations. SACH provides peer support, outreach, harm reduction and personal hygiene supplies, as well as opportunities for social connection for people who might be isolated. "People of South Asian heritage who want to reach out for support often face significant barriers, like stigma, language, racism and lack of culturally appropriate care," said Jennifer Whiteside, Minister of Mental Health and Addictions. This change aligns with the critical work we have already undertaken with the federal and provincial governments to address open drug use in public areas, especially around playgrounds, splash pads, beaches, and sports fields. These spaces should be free from drug-related activities, ensuring that families and children can enjoy them without exposure to harmful substances," he added.

Opposition leader Kevin Falcon, whose party has been asking the provincial government to scrape the decriminalization pilot all together, said, "Today's announcement is nothing more than political damage control by David Eby to mask the obvious

conclusion that his reckless decriminalization experiment has failed as he now tries to hide the chaos and harm his policies have caused. Over the past 15 months, it has become painfully clear that this policy has neither saved lives nor reduced drug overdoses, but has instead spread harm and disorder in communities across British Columbia."

"Instead of upholding their commitments to scrap the decriminalization pilot when it clearly wasn't meeting its goals, David Eby and the NDP have stubbornly persisted with this dangerous policy. From its inception, the decriminalization experiment has failed to connect drug users with any necessary treatment or recovery services. The entire NDP approach has been built around normalizing drug use, which only further harms kids and communities," Falcon said.

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
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Surrey RCMP is seeking public's assistance in identifying break and enter suspects

In an effort to advance an investigation Linto an attempted break and enter into a residence, Surrey RCMP is sharing an image and video of the suspects involved. On April 28, 2024 at approximately 11:36 am, Surrey RCMP responded to an attempted break and enter to a home in the 7200-block of 189 Street. Two men attended the front door of the residence and used a breaking and entering tool as well as physical force in their attempt to gain entry. They did not gain entry into the home and they fled from the property prior to police arriving on scene.

When officers arrived on scene, they conducted extensive patrols in the area; however, the suspects were not located.

"We believe this was a targeted, isolated incident and thankfully entry was not gained," says Corporal Sarbjit K. Sangha. "This was a brazen daytime attempt-



ed break and enter into a home and we are sharing this image and video with the public in an effort to identify these two individuals".

The suspects are described as follows: Suspect one is described as a black male, medium build and he was wearing a grey hoodie with insignia "X CORP" at the front, black pants, black balaclava mask and black gloves. Suspect two is described as a Caucasian male, medium build, black "Bench" jacket with a hood,

black pants, a black facemask and camo gloves.

Amritpal Dhindsa charged in Newton townhouse fire

Surrey RCMP took Amritpal Dhindsa, 22-years-old, in custody after reports of a Newton townhouse fire which is believed to be suspicious in nature.

The Surrey RCMP responded to a report of a fire at a townhouse complex in the 12700 block of 66 Avenue on April 26, 2024 at approximately 12:30 pm. Police officers along with the Surrey Fire Department attended the scene as multiple neighboring residences were evacuated as efforts were made to contain the fire.

A total of three units were directly affected by the fire. There were no reported injuries to the occupants of the townhouses.

Dhindsa, was taken into custody in relation to this incident. He has been charged with the following offences: arson, assault with a Weapon, uttering threats, possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose x2.

Dhindsa has been remanded until his next court appearance on May 3, 2024.

Indo-Canadian man Posing as investment firm representative arrested

Ahas been arrested in an investment scam in which he acted to be from the investment firm Schroders and offering fraud investments.

The police have arrested and charged an Indo-Canadian man Arvinder Singh. However, investigators believe there may be additional victims.

According to the police, it is alleged that the suspects are placing advertisements with internet search engine providers to promote various fraudulent investments.

The advertisements link to fraudulent investment comparison sites, and will prompt victims to supply their name, telephone number and email address. Once the informa-

24-year-old Brampton man tion has been provided, suspects posing as representatives of Schroders Management Inc. will then call victims, Suspects will then email fraudulent Schroders prospectuses and application forms to victims. Suspects will offer high return on investments with seemingly little or no risk. One victim in Toronto was defrauded of over \$200,000.00 Canadian Dollars, the police informed.

Singh has been charged with fraud Over \$5000. Investigators believe there may be additional victims.

Tips for prospective investors:

- be wary of any cold calls and/or unsolicited persons offering investments opportunities
- do not rush into making a decision. If possible, consult with a

known financial planner and/or financial institution such as your home bank

- contact the alleged investment company by phone to ensure the person is employed by them
- conduct a Google search for any scams or complaints associated with the investment company
- contact Police if you suspect you have been the victim of an Investment Scam

Members of the public are reminded to be vigilant any time they're searching for investment opportunities.

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Fuel fraud investigation in Delta leads to large-scale illegal drug recovery

What started as a small investigation focused on fuel purchase fraud, quickly grew into a long-term project that has resulted in five individuals facing 47 charges including controlled drugs and substances, firearms, and a civil forfeiture

In February 2023, the Delta Police Department's (DPD) Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) learned of a fuel fraud scheme involving fraudulent cardlock cards being produced and used. Dozens of fraudulent transactions had been conducted with a value of greater than \$25,000. The investigation identified an organized group was involved in the fraud.

In April 2023, the CRU executed a search warrant related to the fuel fraud investigation at a property in the 6100 block of 104th Street, Delta. As a result of



the search warrant, a number of criminal offences were identified including: oaded restricted and prohibited guns; a fully operational drug lab; and an illegal marijuana grow operation.

As a result, \$1,000,000 street value



drugs were seized along with vehicles associated to organized crime. At the time of warrant execution, one man was arrested on an outstanding Canada-wide warrant. Two vehicles have since been subject to civil forfeiture proceedings, while other civil forfeiture processes are still in progress.

On April 22nd, 2024, the Public Prosecution Service Canada (PPSC) approved charges against 5 individuals Robert Johan Simonsen of Surrey, Richard Stephen Voszler of Delta, Robert Joseph Stephen Lavalee of Surrev. Robert Sean Rylands of Abbotsford, and Norman Sterner of Delta.

Two of the five individuals charged have been arrested in relation to this investigation, while the remaining three accused are currently wanted on unendorsed warrants. We ask that the named individuals turn themselves in to the DPD for processing of their warrants. "When we commence an investigation, we follow the evidence, and we don't necessarily know where a specific file is going to go. Our CRU showed commitment and follow-through on a complex investigation, with a complex disclosure package. I am very proud of the work of our CRU members. I would also like to acknowledge our Federal Crown partners who approved the charges in a complex and difficult file," stated Chief Neil Dubord, when asked about this investigation.

3-month-old, grandparents visiting from India killed in Toronto highway crash

Ontario's Special Investigations Unit and the baby, according to the news release. killed four people, including a threemonth-old boy, after police chased a suspect through oncoming traffic on Highway 401 east of Toronto.

Two grandparents, a 60-year-old man and 55-year-old woman, were killed in the collision, said the SIU, the organization that examines deaths involving police in Ontario. Both grandparents were visiting Canada from India, the agency said in a news release.

The infant's parents, a 33-year-old father and 27-year-old mother, were also injured in the crash, the SIU said, adding that they are residents of Ajax, Ont. The parents were in the same car as the grandparents

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That chase ended in a fatal collision that involved at least six vehicles, according to the SIU. The robbery suspect was also

From the cargo van initially being investigated by police and involved in the collision the 21-year-old male driver was pronounced deceased at the scene. The 38-year-old male passenger was transported to hospital for treatment of serious injuries.

Two subject officials and four witness officials have been designated. The SIU has assigned seven investigators, one forensic investigator and one collision reconstructionist to the case.







Canada-wide warrant issued for Arjun Sahnan alleged **Shooter in Edmonton extortion incidents**Investigators have determined that Sahnan fled to India after shootings, second suspect, vehicle still outstanding

The Edmonton runes vice (EPS) has issued Canada-wide warrants for 19-year-old Arjun Sahnan, who is alleged to be responsible for three drive-by shootings believed to be connected to an ongoing extortion series. Investigators have determined that Sahnan fled to India, leaving on a flight that he had booked prior to committing the Winnipeg and Sherwood Park shootings.

The police said on Dec. 21, 2023, at 2:50 a.m. in the Cy Becker neighbourhood in Edmonton, shots were fired at an upstairs bedroom window where the homeowners were sleeping. Four other occupants, two of them children, were also asleep in the home at the time of the shooting.

Days later, on Dec. 24, 2023, at 8:45 p.m., shots were fired at a home in northwest Winnipeg that was occupied by several family members. One bullet traveled through a bedroom, barely missing the occupant inside, and passed through a connecting wall into an adjacent occupied room. The shooting was captured on security cameras in the area. The suspect vehicle

is a black SUV with no front license plate, which is unusual in Manitoba. Police are looking for information about this vehi-

In both the Edmonton and Winnipeg shootings, the homeowner was extorted for money and threatened prior to the shooting. No one was injured in either shooting.

On Dec. 29, 2023, at 1:08 a.m., shots were fired at an unoccupied home in the Fountain Creek neighborhood of Sherwood Park. One bullet traveled through



a window into a children's playroom and struck a toybox inside. No one was injured, and the suspect vehicle was captured on security cameras in the area. The homeowner received no threats prior to the shooting, and investigators believe the shooter accidentally targeted the wrong house.

Through ballistic analysis, police have de-

termined that the same gun was used in all three driveby shootings. Canada-wide warrants have been issued for Sahnan, who is alleged to be responsible for the shootings. FIU investigators have determined that Sahnan fled to India, leaving on a flight that he had booked prior to committing the Winnipeg and Sherwood Park shootings.

"Our Firearms Investigation Unit is a sophisticated team with the resources to investigate these complex files, regardless of where the offences take place," says S/Sgt. Eric Stewart, Guns and Gangs Section. "Committing gun crime in other provinces and fleeing the country will not prevent us from charging a suspect and holding them accountable."

Citizens are asked to reach out to police with any information about Sahnan's whereabouts. Investigators are also asking the public for tips regarding a second suspect connected to the Winnipeg shooting, as seen in the surveillance images below.

On Apr. 24, FIU executed search warrants and arrested an individual in connection to a Jan. 10, 2024 drive-by shooting at a Cy Becker residence occupied by a family with children. No one was struck in that shooting, although bullets were recovered from inside the home. Police had previously issued a news release seeking information about the suspect vehicle in that shooting, which has since been identified. The firearm used in that shooting is still outstanding, and FIU investigators are working to locate it. 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BC to offer rebate on construction of Secondary suite

 ${f B}^{\rm C}$ has launched a three-year pilot of the new Secondary Suite Incentive five years. Program.

Starting Thursday, May 2, 2024, homeowners in most B.C. municipalities and regional districts can apply to the program through BC Housing's secondary suite website.

The program will offer forgivable loans of as much as 50% of the total cost of renovations, up to a maximum of \$40,000, for successful applicants to add a secondary suite or accessory dwelling unit (garden suite, laneway house, carriage home, etc.) on the property of their primary residence. The loan can be forgiven if the new unit

Approximately 1,000 homeowners each year will receive forgivable loans, which will add 3,000 new rental units at below-market rates. Those rates for bachelor, one-bedroom, two-bedroom and three-bedroom-plus units have been set for 2024-25.

To be eligible, homeowners must also:

- * obtain a building and occupancy permit from their local government;
- * have a combined gross annual income of homeowners on title of less than \$209,420;
- * have a BC Assessment value on their



property below the homeowner grant threshold (\$2.15 million in 2024).

Homeowners who want to know if they're eligible for the program can check BC Housing's website. Eligible applications to the program will be approved on a first-come, first-served basis by BC

Fraud suspect in multiple **Lower Mainland jurisdictions** arrested and charged

suspect who committed multiple to Crown Counsel when he received Afrauds throughout the Lower Mainland has been arrested and charged.

In January 2024, Surrey RCMP frontline responded to three separate complaints where people were selling merchandise on a social media platform and became victims of fraud. Some victims reported being shown an envelope of money when they met with the buyer, but later discovered they did not receive the agreed-upon payment. Surrey RCMP frontline officers took conduct of the files, as there were similarities in all three investigations.

Upon further review of these investigations, the officer found more files of the same nature in other cities in the Lower Mainland. This included Vancouver, Burnaby, Richmond, West Vancouver and Maple Ridge. Surrey RCMP officers took over all of the investigations, and were able to identify a suspect based on the evidence gathered. The primary investigator with Surrey RCMP frontline was in the process of completing a report information that the suspect had been arrested by Toronto Police on April 8,

The officer was able to complete the report to Crown Counsel on an urgent basis which allowed a Canada wide warrant to be issued with transport custody

Forty-four-year-old Florian Dinca of Quebec is charged with two counts of fraud and nine counts of fraud over \$5000. On April 28, 2024, Dinca was transferred to Surrey pre-trial and remains in custody until his next court appearance on May 3, 2024.

"This was a complex investigation which included multiple jurisdictions. The primary investigator's dedication and investigative skills were paramount in identifying the suspect", says Cpl. Canada announces full pause on Self-— Employed Persons Program

Marc Miller, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, recently announced several changes to Canada's federal business programs in order to help reduce processing times and the application backlog. These changes take effect on April 30, 2024.

To improve the Start-up Visa Program, Canada will encourage designated venture capital firms, angel investor groups and business incubators to focus on the most promising proposals by:

- capping the number of permanent residence applications we will accept for processing each year to those associated with no more than 10 start-ups per designated organization

- providing priority processing for entrepreneurs whose startup is supported by Canadian capital or by a business incubator that is a member of Canada's Tech Network, including applications in the inventory and new applications as they are submitted

In addition, Minister Miller announced a full pause on application intake for the Self-Employed Persons Program to focus on processing applications from the inventory, starting April 30, 2024. The Self-Employed Persons Program provides a pathway to permanent residence for people with notable experience in art, culture, recreation or sports and who will contribute to Canada's cultural vitality.

"Due to the high number of applications submitted for this program, processing times have increased to beyond four years. While the pause is in place, IRCC will continue finalizing applications from the backlog while assessing options for reforming the program and ensuring its integrity," he said.

Open burning of any kind banned in Surrey as of May 1

s the summer season draws near, the Surrey Fire Service (SFS) is reminding citizens and visitors that open burning of any kind is banned in the City of Surrey as of May 1.

Seasonally high temperatures and dry weather conditions present an increased risk of brush fires and nuisance smoke throughout the City of Surrey. Surrey Fire Service responses to brush/grass fire incidents continues to trend higher than the five-year average. In 2023, between May 1 and November 1, SFS attended over 809 brush/ grass fire incidents.

Open burning, including backyard fires and beach fires, are not permitted in the City of Surrey. Any fire service attendance to an open burning complaint will require extinguishment and may be subject to cost recovery.

Natural gas, propane or charcoal briquettes are permitted so long as they are being used in ULC/CSA-approved devices for that particular product. Charcoal briquettes are allowed on private property but may be prohibited (when the fire danger rating is at high or extreme) in City parks and on City beaches. The 2024 Nissan Sentra sedan is enhanced for the new model year with revised interior, mild exterior styling, and improved fuel economy. This well- selling, popular compact sedan slots into the Nissan lineup between the smaller Versa and larger Altima models. Changes include an updated exterior front fascia and restyled headlights on all models, plus new 16-inch alloy wheels designs. The sporty SR trim adds subtle changes to the front and rear ends., plus new badges, and interior detailing. The Sentra features a new Xtronic CVT for better fuel consumption and smoother shifts pattern. Also new is standard an Idle Stop Start system, to help save fuel when the car is topped. The Sentra is also available with a 6-speed manual transmission on the base "S" and sporty "SR" models.

The Sentra has a standard, fuel-efficient 2.0-liter inline-four engine with 149 horsepower and 146 lb-ft of torque and with either a six-speed manual on the entry level car or the CVT. (Continuously variable transmission.)There are 7 trim levels in Canada with pricing ranging from a competitive \$22,548 to \$30,648. The entry-level, S model with a six-speed manual transmission is \$22,548. The mid-range SV Moonroof CVT trim is \$26,948 MSRP. The top-of-the-line SR Premium CVT (As tested) is \$30,648. All models are subject to Freight and PDI at \$1,850. Our sporty Sentra SR Premium has the new dark chrome trim for the V-motion grille, Red SR badges, dark chrome outer finish elements on the front fascia and a body-colored lower trim strip below the grill and 18-inch black alloy wheels. Inside the SR Premium interior adds a leather-wrapped shift knob and premium sport cloth seat trim with contrasting orange stitching. Intelligent Around View® Monitor, an 8-speaker Bose® personal sound system and much more equipment is also added. Finally, there are two eye-catching two-tone paint options, with the optional black roof that looks very slick. All Sentra's comes well equipped with as standard comfort, safety features and driver aids such as: Apple

CarPlay and Android Auto smartphone integration as standard. Safety is extremely high with as standard Nissan Safety Shield® 360, a suite of six advanced driver-assist systems including Automatic Emergency Braking with Pedestrian Detection, Blind Spot Warning, Rear Cross Traffic Alert, Lane Departure Warning, High Beam Assist and Rear Automatic Braking.

Additional driver-assist technology includes Intelligent Driver Alertness4, available Intelligent Around View® Monitor, available Intelligent Cruise Control5 and standard Easy-Fill Tire Alert system. Adaptive cruise control and a 360-degree parking camera system are options.

Interior wise, the Sentra cabin looks upscale, well built, and finished with good materials quality. The interior design is appealing with a sporty theme and comprehensive dash and driver display. The 8-inch touchscreen is equally easy to read and use. A sporty D-shaped steering wheel, round air vents inspired by elements of the Nissan Z sports car are present plus attractive trim and console details. Storage is good with many cubbyholes and compartments. The front seats have decent cushioning and support and the rear seats are also comfortable and roomy for two adults. There is plenty of interior room for front occupants and tear legroom is amongst the best in this class of sedan. The Sentra's trunk provides a generous cargo space with 405 litres of cargo space, a wide



opening and low leftover height. The standard 60/40 split-folding back seat also offers more versatility.

On the road the wider stance provides a lower centre of gravity and more stable composure. The handling is good, with nice reflexes. The suspension is smooth, and irons out rough surfaces well. Steering is nicely balanced and overall, the Sentra is a fun to drive sedan. With 149 horsepower and 145 lb.-ft of torque available, acceleration is adequate, enough for everyday driving, but don't expect high performance, it more for docile everyday driving. In routine driving, the Sentra's continuously variable automatic transmission is smooth and unobtrusive

and is much improved on the previous version for sure. The Sentra delivered reassuring pedal feel and solid stopping power on all road conditions. Fuel economy is estimated by EnerGuide at City (L/100 km):7.4, Hwy (L/100 km):6.1.

Not much to gripe about, the CVT is sluggish in providing fast acceleration and back seat room for three is tight. These are minor niggles.

To sum up, I like the cool exterior styling, the nice interior, and the decent equipment levels for the attractive pricing structure. The 2024 Nissan Sentra offers compelling value. with loads of standard tech and safety features for the family. The SR Premium version is genuinely nice and although fully loaded is still reasonably priced. Highly recommended



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



White Rock Horror: 28-year-old.

later identified as Kulwinder Singh Sohi, on the White Rock Promenade, suffering from fatal stab wounds.

"Witnesses described seeing Mr. Sohi in a physical altercation with the suspect, before giving chase eastbound on the Promenade toward the parking lot adjacent to the Grand Chief Bernard Robert Charles (Pa-Kwach-Tun) Memorial Plaza," said Sergeant Timothy Pierotti of IHIT.

"This occurred in a very public location. From our video review, we know there were many witnesses in the area. If you were there or parked in the area, now is the time to call IHIT. We will continue to work tirelessly, supported by the White Rock members as well as the other I-Teams, to identify, locate and arrest the person responsible for this tragedy," he said.

Sohi's stabbing came just a day after Jatinder Singh another Punjabi male was stabbed on April 21 in the evening at around 9 PM. The police located a 28-year-old victim and provided first aid until paramedics arrived. The victim was transported to a hospital by Emergency Health Services with non-life-threatening injuries.

Manpreet Kaur and her husband Jatinder Singh were spending what was supposed to be a relaxing night on the White Rock Pier when Singh was stabbed in the neck from behind, CityNews reported. According to media reports, the couple had arrived in Canada just 2 months before.

The suspect was described as a black male, wearing a ball cap and a grey hoodie.

Cst. Chantal Sears of White Rock RCMP said, "Given the apparent similarities between this incident and the one which occurred on Sunday evening, police are investigating to determine whether or not there is a conclusive link between the two events." White Rock mayor Megan Knight issued a statement after the tragic death of the young

man, "I want to extend my condolences to the family of the young victim impacted by the tragic events of last night. Like many, I was profoundly saddened to learn of this distressing incident."

To address these events, the city has heightened police presence and patrols along the waterfront and surrounding areas.

Gurleen Sohi, sister of Kulwinder has also started a GoFundMe page to raise money for performing last rituals. She wrote, "My brother was brutally murdered on 23rd April 2024. My brother was stabbed multiple times at white rock pier beach. Kulwinder was hard working and really passionate person. I'm really shocked and depressed after this tragic loss. Our parents are still in India and we want to give peace to Kulwinder soul by performing last rituals at our hometown."

Three Indian nationals arrested

They are facing charges of first-degree murder.

Hardeep Singh Nijjar was shot and killed in broad daylight outside the Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara on June 18 2023. Since then, involvement of Indian government in the murder of Nijjar has been probed.

The police, however, did not give any clear answers on the involvement of the Indian government or the motive behind the murder since the investigation was still ongoing.

RCMP Assistant Commander David Teboul said the Canadian agencies were working with foreign law enforcement agencies including US and India on the investigation. He said the collaboration had not been easy but rather "challenging and difficult" with Indian agencies.

Officer Mandeep Mooker said, "It is a complex investigation. We understand that the community is going to have a lot of questions. However, at this time the police cannot answer all the questions. This investigation does not end here. The investigation is ongoing."

Assistant Commissioner Brian Edwards said, "The murder of Sikh Sepratist Hardeep Singh Nijjar was outrageous since it had a profound impact on the residents of

Surrey. From day one this community, most importantly Scott Road gurdwara people, came forward to work with and alongside the police in advancing the investigation. Despite their intense grief, they were patient and provided trust in the police to move forward. Investigations in Canada are complex and take time. Our community is extremely strong and will work with police to hold those responsible."

Surrey mayor Brenda Locke in a statement said, "Today, the RCMP have announced three people have been charged in connection to Mr. Nijjar's murder. I want to take this opportunity to thank the Integrated Homicide Investigation Team, CFSEU, Edmonton Police Service and Surrey RCMP for their unwavering pursuit in bringing those responsible

for the killing of Mr. Nijjar to justice. During this uncertain time of policing in Surrey, the RCMP's professionalism and dedication have never been in question. I also want to echo the comments made by Assistant Commissioner Brian Edwards, Officer in Charge of the Surrey RCMP, who recognized the community for their support and patience throughout the investigation. I am grateful for the strength and unity that has been demonstrated by all who have been affected by this heinous crime. Our thoughts remain with the family and loved ones of the victim. I also would like to urge the Federal Government to take every opportunity to determine if there was foreign government involvement in the murder of a Canadian citizen on Canadian

Motorcycle season is here: share our roads to keep riders safe, urges ICBC

With the arrival of warmer spring temperatures, many motorcyclists throughout the province will set off on their first ride of the season. In B.C., motorcycle crashes significantly increase from May to September with 212 people injured in crashes with motorcyclists each month.* ICBC is asking riders and drivers to do their part to prevent crashes and share our roads together safely.

Motorcyclists are at a much

higher risk of being injured in a crash than drivers due to their lack of protection. The average age of a motorcyclist injured or killed in crashes in B.C. is 45 years old and these crashes occur most often in the Southern Interior (28%) followed by Vancouver Island (22%), Greater Vancouver (21%), and the Fraser Valley (17%).

"We know motorcyclists are enthusiastic about seeing our beautiful province by bike and we want to help keep them safe this season," said Shabnem Afzal, ICBC's director of road safety. "As a rider, wear gear every time you ride. Riders and drivers need to stay focused on the road, leave plenty of space, and choose safe speeds to prevent crashes."

"As we embrace the warmer weather and motorcyclists take to the roads, it's imperative to remain vigilant and aware of our surroundings," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General. "Let's work together to promote safe riding practices, enhance visibility, and foster mutual respect among all road users. Together, we can ensure that every journey on two wheels is a safe one."

Motorcyclists are invited to practice their riding at free skills course events taking place this spring in the Lower Mainland: Abbotsford on May 18, Surrey on May 26, Coquitlam on June 15,

Chilliwack on June 22, and North Vancouver on July 13. Police motorcycle riders will guide riders of all experience levels through a challenging training course to help improve their skills. ICBC's road safety team will be doing gear giveaways at these events and demonstrating protective clothing and gear options for riders.

ICBC's collision coverage for motorcyclists now includes improved coverage for gear.

Drugs, firearms, vehicles seized, three arrested after investigation into Burnabybased drug trafficking organization

Burnaby-based drug trafficking organization, the Burnaby RCMP Drugs and Organized Crime Section, with the assistance of the Lower Mainland Integrated Emergency Response Team (ERT), executed search warrants on two residences located in Burnaby and Coquitlam.

During these searches, officers with Burnaby RCMP Drugs and Organized Crime Section located and seized a significant amount of drugs, including more than ten kilograms of pre-packaged and bulk suspected fentanyl, cocaine, rock cocaine (crack), methamphetamine, Xanax, Oxycontin and Percocet pills.

On March 22, 2024, following to make fraudulent credit cards an investigation into a were also seized. A stolen car was recovered while another vehicle thought to be involved in drug trafficking, along with several filled gas cans, were seized as offence-related property. Three people were arrested and released with a court date.

On April 2, 2024, Burnaby RCMP Drugs and Organized Crime Section, with the assistance of ERT, executed a third search warrant on another residence in Burnaby.

This search yielded a large amount of suspected fentanyl and cocaine packaged for street sale along with a handgun with an extended magazine and ammunition. A vehicle was also seized. One person was arrested and released with a court date.

The investigation included the

seizure of more than 3,000 Hydromorphone (Dilaudid) pills as well as methadone. The seized drugs have been sent for further testing.

"This is a significant seizure that not only included a large and bulk quantity of drugs including fentanyl thought to be destined for trafficking, but also included firearms, ammunition, vehicles involved criminal activity," said Chief Superintendent Graham de la Gorgendiere, Burnaby RCMP's Officer In Charge. "It is believed these seizures have disrupted a crime group not only involved in drug trafficking, but also planning violence against rival gangs involved in the BC gang conflict." The investigation is ongoing and charges are pending for multiple suspects.

Gross core cost for FIFA World Cup in Vancouver estimated upto \$581 million

With seven matches to be played in Vancouver during the FIFA World Cup 26 tournament, the Province, City of Vancouver and BC Pavilion Corporation (PavCo) have updated their estimates of the costs, revenues and economic benefits for the world's largest single sporting event.

The gross core cost for FIFA World Cup 26 in Vancouver is estimated to be between \$483 million and \$581 million. These gross costs are expected to be offset by \$383 million to \$436 million in estimated revenues and recoveries, including:

* \$116 million in direct financial contribution from the federal government:

* \$230 million in estimated revenue from the additional major events municipal and regional district tax introduced

in the City of Vancouver in February 2023; and

* \$37 million to \$90 million in anticipated revenue from other sources, such as facility rental fees and the FIFA commercial revenue program, includes revenue opportunities at the FIFA fan festival, and opportunities for host city supporters and donors, and other provincial revenue.

After taking into account estimated revenues recoveries, the Province estimates the net core cost of seven FIFA World Cup 26 matches to be \$100 million to \$145 million. This does not take into account potential additional provincial tax revenues as identified in the Province's updated estimates of economic impact benefits, which are projected to be \$224 million.
