

Three Indian nationals accused of killing Hardeep Nijjar appear before court amid pro-Khalistan slogans



Canadian officials have yet to confirm the visa status of the killers', according to media reports they came to Canada on student visa, raising questions on security lapse in Canadian immigration system

Friends and family of slain Hardeep Singh Nijjar and supporters of Khalistan crowded outside a BC provincial courtroom on the day three accused killers of Nijjar made their first court appearance. The killers were not physically present but made the appearance by video. The suspects, Karan Brar, Karanpreet Singh,

and Kamalpreet Singh, charged with first-degree murder and conspiracy, were arrested in Edmonton last Friday.

They were dressed in orange jumpsuits during their court appearance. The judge questioned the trio in brief.

Indians will decide the fate of India, not foreigners: Indian High Commissioner

The arrest of three suspects in the killing of Khalistan supporter Hardeep Singh Nijjar stirred a flurry of sentiments and reactions within the community, among Khalistan supporters, Canadian dignitaries, and Indian diplomats. Some Sikh leaders welcomed the arrest and said they have faced threats for years, and they accused advocacy for the secession of India on foreign

the Indian government of trying to silence them. Canadian policy makers have asserted their duty to safeguard Canadian citizens on Canadian soil, vowing to investigate any potential foreign involvement in the incident. Canadian officials said that every Canadian citizen has a right to freedom of expression.


Indian authorities, on the other hand perceive

soil as a direct affront to India's unity rather than an exercise in freedom of expression. India has accused Canada of welcoming criminals and giving space to terrorists in the name of freedom of expression. But Ottawa has repeatedly insisted India has not proven that people it accuses of terrorism have actually done anything that meets the threshold under Canada's criminal code.

High Commissioner Sanjay Kumar Verma

Canada lacks "understanding" about New Delhi's concerns, which stem from "national security threats emanating from the land of Canada. These threats are largely emanating from Canadian citizens. These represent "red lines" for India. Indians will decide what will happen to India. Indians will decide the fate of India, not the foreigners.

Foreign Minister Melanie Joly

Canada's position has always been clear. Our job is to protect Canadians and we stand by the allegations that a Canadian was killed on Canadian soil by Indian agents. Now, the investigation by the RCMP is being done. I won't further comment and no other on the question of our relationship with India is I think that is always better when diplomacy remains in private and Canada will continue to stand by first protecting Canadians, making sure that we also protect our sovereignty and in the end



Indian External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal

No specific or relevant evidence or information has been shared by the Canadian authorities till date. You will therefore understand our view that the matter is being pre-judged. Obviously, there are political interests at work. We have long maintained that separatists, extremists, and those advocating violence have been given political space in Canada. Our diplomats have been threatened with impunity and obstructed in their performance of duties. We have also pointed to the Canadian authorities that figures associated with organized crime with links with India have been allowed entry and residency in Canada. Many of our extradition requests are pending. We are having discussions at the diplomatic level on all these matters

Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara

While today's action by Canadian authorities, which led to the arrest of those directly involved in the killing, is a step forward, it only scratches the surface. High-ranking Indian diplomats, provided logistical support and intelligence for the assassination. They must be charged. Canadian politicians of every stripe must stand with the Canadian Sikhs Right to peacefully advocate for Khalistan without facing any violent retaliation from the Indian Government. The murder of Hardeep Singh Nijjar has shaken the Sikh community in British Columbia, the larger South Asian community, and Canadians across the country. We are glad that there have finally been arrests that will bring some justice for Mr. Nijjar's family and community. Those responsible should face the full consequences of their crimes, and the government's law enforcement and intelligence agencies must relentlessly pursue any other person or entity that

can be held accountable and brought to justice. We wish the government was able to foil this plot and stop this murder from happening in the first place, as was the case in the United States. This only further demonstrates that the government must take further action to protect our country, including by immediately implementing a foreign influence registry.

While we welcome arrests, we believe these arrests raise disturbing questions about the nexus between the Government of India and criminal gangs. How is an Indian criminal who has been in Indian prison since 2014 able to operate a gang targeting Sikhs in Canada for murder and extortion, on this scale? Report by the Foreign Interference Commission has confirmed that India uses proxies in Canada who work with Indian intelligence officials in India and Canada. While the arrest of the hit squad is important, what's even more important is identifying and bringing to justice those who directed these operations. It would seem that the trail leads to India's embassies and consulates in Canada and directly to the Government of India.

India's Foreign Minister S Jaishankar accuses Canada of welcoming criminals

India's Foreign Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has accused Canada of welcoming criminals from India. His remarks came after the arrest of three suspected killers of Hardeep Singh Nijjar. Although Canadian officials have yet to confirm their immigration status many media outlets claimed that the suspects came to Canada

on student visas.

Jaishankar said the protests in Canada have gone beyond the limits of free speech, and he reacted to last week's arrest by repeating claims that Ottawa allows Indian criminals to immigrate to Canada.

He also accused Canadian politicians of various stripes of giving electoral clout to people wanting to carve out a Sikh homeland separate from India, called Khalistan. Jaishankar made the comments Saturday at an event in the eastern city of Bhubaneswar at a forum of intellectuals.

One attendee asked Jaishankar about countries like the U.S. and Canada wanting to partner with India while allowing people to support a separatist movement there, which New Delhi deems to be unconstitutional. Another attendee inquired about last Friday's arrests, and Jaishankar addressed both questions.

"It's not so much a problem in the U.S.; our biggest problem right now is in Canada," Jaishankar said, adding the governing Liberals as well as other parties "have given these kinds of extremism, separatism, advocates of violence a certain legitimacy, in the name of free speech."

Jaishankar said he has asked Foreign Minister Melanie Joly about "attacks or threats" to India's diplomatic missions and staff in Canada.

"I tell the foreign minister (Joly) saying, 'Suppose it happened to you. if it was your diplomat, your embassy, your flag, how would you react?' So, we have to keep our position strong," he said.

Jaishankar reiterated his ministry's insistence that Ottawa is allowing criminal elements to operate in Canada and affiliate with Sikh separatists.

"Somebody may have been arrested; the police may have done some investigation. But the fact is (a) number of gangland people, (a) number of people with organized crime links from Punjab, have been made welcome in Canada," he said.

"These are wanted criminals from India, you have given them visas ... and yet you allow them to live there."

New Delhi raised that same concern a week before Trudeau announced that India was suspected of involvement in Nijjar's death last September. In its readout of Trudeau's meeting with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Jaishankar's ministry

had called out "the nexus of (Khalistan separatism) forces with organized crime, drug syndicates and human trafficking."

Canada's Immigration Minister Marc Miller rejected External Affairs Minister

Miller rejected External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's remark that Ottawa is "lax" about admitting criminals into the country, saying authorities conduct a thorough record check on people entering Canada on student visas.

Responding to a question on Monday about Jaishankar's remarks, Miller said, "We're not lax, and the Indian Foreign Minister is entitled to his opinion," reported the Cable Public Affairs Channel -- a Canadian speciality television channel.

When asked what the Canadian government planned on doing about it, he said, "About what the Indian Foreign Minister said? Let him speak his mind. It's just not accurate."

He said that Canada conducts a criminal record check on people entering the country on student visas.

Canada takes "any report like this very seriously", Miller said.

He refused to confirm if the three Indians arrested for Nijjar's murder were in Canada on a student visa, asserting that there's information that he can't share at the time because of the ongoing police investigation

Budget 2024 invests in Sikh Canadian heritage projects



Prime Minister Justin Trudeau on May 4 highlighted investments included in Budget 2024 to preserve Sikh Canadian heritage.

"The story of the Sikh community in Canada is, in fact, the story of Canada. The investments in Budget 2024 will help Sikh Canadians share their own stories, create their own

spaces, and preserve their own heritage – because diversity is our greatest strength. Let's keep working together to make Canada more inclusive, more vibrant, and more welcoming for everyone," said Trudeau.

The investment aims to create the Gallery of Global Sikh Art and Culture in the Royal Ontario Museum. With a \$6 million investment, Canada will be working closely with the Sikh Arts and Culture Foundation and the Royal Ontario Museum to build a space dedicated to Sikh arts, culture, and heritage.

"The Royal Ontario Museum is tremendously grateful for the \$6 million commitment to the Gallery of Global Sikh Art and Culture in the 2024 federal budget. Developed with the support of the Sikh Arts and Culture Foundation of Canada, and the broader Sikh community, this future gallery will be an important expansion of the Museum's suite of galleries devoted to South Asia, which was the first of its kind in Canada," said Josh Basseches, Director and Chief Executive Officer of the Royal Ontario Museum.

The budget will also support the completion of a short film on Canadian and Indian soldiers in the First and Second World Wars. "With a \$1.8 million investment, we'll be supporting the Indus Media Foundation in Surrey, British Columbia, to complete this short film. By preserving this heritage and encouraging others to learn more, we're keeping Sikh Canadian stories alive for the next generation," said Trudeau. The Indus Media Foundation is a registered non-profit society based in lower mainland British Columbia. The Foundation seeks to foster appreciation for Punjabi

"Canada is proud to be home to one of the largest Sikh diasporas in the world. The investments we are making are a recognition that Sikh Canadians have significantly contributed to making our country stronger, more prosperous, and more diverse. The new Gallery of Global Sikh Art and Culture at the Royal Ontario Museum will be a welcome addition to the community," said Chrystia Freeland, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance.

Starting September international students can work only 24 hours per week

Immigration Minister Marc Miller this week announced the temporary policy allowing students to work more than 20 hours per week off campus will come to an end on April 30, 2024, and it will not be extended.

The minister has announced a new cap that will allow international students to work off-campus for up to 24 hours per week starting in September. However he said, "As we head into the summer session, students who have a scheduled academic break can continue working unlimited hours."

The Liberals temporarily waived the 20-hour cap on work hours for international students during the COVID-19 pandemic in a bid to ease labour shortages.

""Working off campus helps international students gain work experience and offset some of their expenses. As international students arrive in Canada, we want them to be prepared for life here and have the support they need to succeed. However, first

and foremost, people coming to Canada as students must be here to study, not work. We will continue working to protect the integrity of our student program."

IRCC informed that recent studies conducted in the US and Canada have shown that there is a considerable decline in academic performance for students working more than 28 hours per week, and that working more than 24 hours per week increases the chances that a student will drop out of their program.

"As such, allowing students to work up to 24 hours per week will ensure they focus primarily on their studies, while having the option to work, if necessary," he said.

In developing this change, we looked at the needs of students, policies in other countries, as well as research that has shown that academic outcomes suffer the more a student works while studying. It also strikes the appropriate balance so students have the option to work without

compromising academic outcomes. More details will be shared in due course.

Canada is also developing new Recognized Institutions Framework to reward post—secondary institutions that set high standards for selecting, supporting and retaining international students. "We will continue to support and protect international students from financial vulnerability and keep protecting the integrity of the International Student Program," he said. In December 2023, the Government of Canada raised the cost-of-living threshold that students must meet to be approved for a study permit so they are financially

prepared for life in Canada and are not as

dependent on working.

International students who begin a college program delivered through a public-private curriculum licensing arrangement on or after May 15, 2024, will not be eligible for a post-graduation work permit when they graduate. Those who already started this type of program prior to May 15, 2024, will still be able to access a post-graduation work permit, provided they meet all other criteria.

Indo-Canadian Ontario Woman convicted of immigration fraud

An Ontario woman working in Edmonton as a fake immigration consultant has been convicted of defrauding newcomers of tens of thousands of dollars. On April 8, 2024, Maneet 'Mani' Malhotra, a resident of Ontario, pleaded guilty in an Edmonton courtroom to charging for immigration services without the legal authorization to do so. Malhotra was handed an 18-month conditional sentence, including six months of house arrest, and was ordered to pay \$148,000 in victim restitution.

In 2019, the CBSA began its investigation into Malhotra and her Edmonton-based



business, NAMI Immigration Inc., after a referral from the Government of Alberta's Temporary Foreign Worker Advisory Office.

BC United table bill to combat foreign interference in B.C.'s elections and universities

escalating concerns about foreign interference, Todd Stone, the Opposition House Leader, has introduced a Private Member's Bill aimed at bolstering British Columbia's defences against threats to democracy. interference poses a "Foreign significant threat to the integrity of elections, universities, democratic institutions, and processes. It's critical that we take action to ensure the political landscape of British Columbia remains under the control of its residents," Stone stated. "For years, existing gaps in our election laws have been overlooked by the NDP. This bill modernizes and strengthens our laws to better counteract foreign influences in our political and educational systems." The Control of Foreign Funding and Electoral Influence Act includes prevent foreign

interference, such as banning foreignfunded individuals and organizations from disseminating false or misleading information related to elections. The bill also bans contributions from foreign nationals, governments, or political entities for election-related activities, and forbids any collaboration with or acceptance of funds from foreign sources intended to influence electoral

"British Columbians are increasingly concerned about the risks of foreign interference and expect immediate action to address these risks in our electoral and educational systems," added Stone.

This bill represents BC United's third effort to safeguard British Columbia's democratic and educational institutions through private members' following two previous bills that the NDP government failed to bring to



Through their attorneys, Brar and Karanpreet Singh decided to appear again on May 21. However, the court has yet to decide on a new date for Kamalpreet Singh who has sought legal counsel, the Globe and Mail reported.

Pro-Khalistani protesters chanted slogans and held placards, outside the court, blaming the Indian government for the killing of their leader and Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara president Hardeep Nijjar. Some even carried signs featuring the faces of the three suspects and the words "Indian agents arrested."

One of the placards carried the photos of the killers along with picture of Indian PM Narendra Modi, and High Commissioner of India Sanjay Kumar Verma.

Moninder Singh, spokesperson of BC Gurdwara Council and a friend of Nijjar said, "Bhai Hardeep Singh's extrajudicial killing is not simply a matter of an isolated incident conducted by rogue elements within Indian intelligence. This is a matter of state responsibility in the context of a transnational assassination program targeting Sikh activists around the world. While investigators must pursue those government officials who directed the assassination, the Government of Canada must seriously reconsider its relationship with a hostile state that brazenly targets Canadian citizens and institutions."

The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) investigators with the assistance of members from the BC and Alberta RCMP and the Edmonton Police Service, arrested three men after 10 months of investigation for the murder of Hardeep Singh Nijjar who was shot to death in the parking lot of Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara in

IHIT also released photographs of a Toyota Corolla, believed to have been used by the suspects in the time leading up to the homicide, in and around the Surrey area

Three individuals were charged with first degree murder and conspiracy to

murder and conspiracy to commit murder in relation to the homicide: 22-year-old Karan Brar of Edmonton; 22-year-old Kamal-preet Singh of Edmonton; and 28-year-old Karanpreet Singh of Edmonton.

Surrey in June 2023.

IHIT released photos of the accused men in hopes of furthering its investigation. IHIT also released photo-

graphs of a Toyota Corolla, believed to have been used by the suspects in the time leading up to the homicide, in and around the Surrey area. Superintendent Mandeep Mooker said that the investigation does not end here. "We are aware that there could be others out there that played a role in this homicide and we remain dedicated to identifying and arresting each one of them. I would like to thank the Nijjar family, the citizens of Surrey and the members of the Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara Executive, for your patience and support throughout this investigation. I appreciate that the community still has questions, many of which we will not be able to answer at this time, as this investigation now proceeds through the courts system."

Assistant Commissioner David Teboul in a statement said, that the police cannot comment about the nature of the evidence collected by police nor can we speak about the motive behind the murder of Mr. Nijjar. "However, understanding this situation has attracted considerable and very broad public interest, I will say this matter is still very much under active investigation. I will underscore that today's

announcements are not a complete account of the investigative work currently underway. There are separate and distinct investigations ongoing into these matters, certainly not limited to the involvement of the people arrested today, and these efforts include investigating connections to the Government of India."

The police confirmed the arrested suspects were Indian nationals meaning they were not on PR or Canadian citizens. The Canadian officials including the immigration minister have not commented on the visa status of the killers, but according to many media reports they came to Canada on a student visa and had connections with India's notorious Lawrence Bishnoi Gang.

According to Global News, one of the suspects entered Canada using a study permit that he said took only days to obtain. In a video posted online in 2019, Karan Brar said he applied for a student visa through EthicWorks Immigration Services in Bathinda, in India's Punjab state.

He said he received his study visa days later. The immigration company posted the promotional video on its Facebook page, along with a photo of Brar, whom the company said was from the city of Kotkapura, north of Bathinda. "Congratulations Karan Brar for Canada study visa," the caption below the video read. "One more happy client from Kotkapura." Immigration Minister Marc Miller has declined to answer questions about how the suspects came to Canada, but online posts indicate that Brar arrived on a student permit three years before the killing.

BC to create special team to solve complex gang-related homicide cases

TICTORIA, BC: The BC government has announced creation of a new Integrated Gang Homicide Team (IGHT) will focus on investigating gang-related homicides and improving intelligence coordination related to gang activities.

The announcement comes as part of province's plan to combat gangs, fight organized crime, and stop criminals from bringing violence and toxic drugs into communities.

"Gang violence and organized crime impacts all of us, and we are co-ordinating with local, provincial and federal agencies to ensure we are taking the right steps to keep people safe and hold those responsible for gang-related activities accountable for their actions," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General. "This is a top priority for our government. We are continuing to



work alongside our policing partners to curb gang violence, and the development of this team is an important step forward in this collective responsibility."

The new team is part of B.C.'s comprehensive gun and gang strategy, and will leverage experts from agencies,

including B.C.'s Combined Forces Special Enforcement Unit (CFSEU-BC), the Organized Crime Agency of British Columbia (OCABC) and the RCMP's Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT). The new team will prioritize complex gang-related homicide files in order to hold individuals accountable and disrupt gang activity in the Lower

IGHT is expected to reach full operational capacity by late 2024 or early 2025. IGHT will have 18 positions, including 12 new positions within OCABC (five civilian support personnel and seven police), as well as five existing RCMP members from CFSEU-BC, and a team commander. All positions will be seconded into the RCMP-led IHIT and operate under the leadership of an existing IHIT member. IGHT will form part of IHIT and investigate priority gang homicide files in IHIT jurisdictions.

"For over 20 years, we have utilized an integrated policing approach, successfully investigating and prosecuting those responsible for the most egregious crimes, including members of organized crime groups who have, time and again, neglected public safety in furtherance of their own personal agendas," said Supt. Mandeep Mooker, officer in charge of IHIT. "Now in 2024, as the gang landscape evolves, so must our approach to keeping Canadians safe."

Since 2003, gang-related homicides in British Columbia have risen, climbing from 21% of B.C. homicides to 46% in 2023. Gang-related homicides present unique challenges due to evidence tampering and witness reluctance, making them more time-consuming and resourceintensive to investigate.

As of December 2023, IHIT reported 356 unsolved homicides. The establishment of the new Integrated Gang Homicide Team will strengthen investigative capabilities, enabling IHIT to redirect team members to focus on these cases.

Indo-Canadian Ontario Woman

It was determined that two clients paid Malhotra \$30,000 and \$45,000 to arrange employment in Alberta. Instead of receiving jobs,

they were forced into a scheme where they were required to pay for fraudulent pay

During the investigation, the CBSA discovered more incidents where Malhotra charged for immigration services that included fake job offers and forged documents. In addition, Malhotra did not submit the required official paperwork to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). It was determined that Malhotra did not meet the requirements of IRPA to provide immigration-related services as she was not a registered immigration consultant or a practicing

On December 17, 2019, the CBSA executed a search warrant at the offices of NAMI Immigration and found fraudulent immigration-related documents as well as additional client information. On April 21, 2023, charges were laid against Malhotra and on May 1, 2023, the CBSA arrested Malhotra at her residence in Mississauga, Ontario.

"The Canada Border Services Agency is committed to investigating and pursuing the prosecution of individuals who abuse Canada's immigration system. By dismantling fraudulent immigration schemes, we are protecting the integrity of Canada's borders and safeguarding potential immigrants from exploitation," said Janalee Bell-Boychuk, CBSA.



Surrey Council approves \$10.6M contract for 80 Avenue improvements

Surrey City Council has awarded a \$10.6 million contract to United Earth Contractors Corp. for improvements to 80 Avenue between 132 Street and King George Boulevard. This contract is the final phase of a multi-phased program to widen the Newton corridor from two to four lanes from 120 Street to King George Boulevard, reducing congestion and increasing road safety.

"Adding additional lanes and making it safer to walk and cycle along 80 Avenue is vital to meeting the transportation needs of our residents today and preparing for the future growth in Newton," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "This phase marks the completion of the City's widening of 80 Avenue to four lanes all the way from 120 Street to King George Boulevard. This project is a key component in enhancing the flow of goods along a major truck route and is part of Council's comprehensive \$300 million transportation improvements capital program."

Road improvements include:

- Repaving and widening the road from two to four travel lanes to reduce congestion
- Adding a new traffic signal at 134 Street to improve access and safety



A section of 80 Avenue that was widened to four lanes in 2023. Surrey Council has approved a contract to continue this road improvement and widening project to extend all the way to King George Boulevard.

- Adding a new pedestrian crossing at 133A Street to improve pedestrian access
- Adding multiuse paths on both sides of the street to make it safer to cycle and walk.

TransLink contributed \$932,000 towards the multiuse paths.

There will also be storm sewer upgrades done from 134 Street to King George Boulevard as part of this contract. Funding for this contract is available in the approved 2024 Transportation and Utilities Budget.

Dipping electoral numbers force BC NDP to reverse its radical " free drug" policies

Premier David Eby has announced a significant reversal in his radical "decriminalization" policy for drug possession. The B.C. government faced backlash over its ill-advised drug policies but refused to back down until electoral surveys predicted a decline in the NDP's fortunes.

B.C NDP had decriminalized the possession of small quantities of hard drugs, providing a rationale that this will remove the stigma from drug users leading to successful efforts to reduce overdose deaths.

Even before the BC Coroner's data busted NDP's irrational approach towards the drug problem, there was mayhem on the streets due to this extreme action. Decriminalization effectively took away the limited tools the police forces had to dissuade drug users from consuming drugs at public places. As a result, young children have been exposed to the harmful sightings of open drug consumption at playgrounds, where they have to dodge needles in their playtime!

A leaked Northern Health memo shocked British Columbians when it was discovered that the health authorities had instructed the staff to allow drugs inside the hospitals. This is not the first time that the woke NDP government has crossed a red line in its pursuit of virtue signaling and dog whistling.

Endangering the safety of patients and the health staff, which is already under stress, was bound to face a strong pushback from the community. While the healthcare workers are worried about their safety and the community is facing a crying need for better healthcare, new hospitals, health care workers, the B.C. NDP's priority is creating "safe" spaces for drug use inside every hospital in B.C.

Interestingly, whenever such extremist policies are promulgated by the woke NDP establishment, certain "evidence based" researches are cited to shut down criticism. People are never informed about the terms of reference of such research groups. A similar "evidence-based" research was cited at the time of the commencement of the "decriminalization" pilot program. However, the "researchers" never anticipated open drug use in restaurants and public transit. Who will hold such policymakers to account? Did the researchers account for the policing challenges while formulating this disastrous policy? Delta's Chief Constable Neil Dubord had written an open letter criticizing the drug decriminalization policies, insinuating that these policies have failed to bring down overdose deaths. Is the BC government listening to experts?

The B.C. government has finally requested Health Canada to end B.C.'s exemption under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, paving the way for the reversal of Decriminalization of drug use policies. The Acts and omissions of this government hold important lessons for the electorate. Public safety concerns, expert opinions and protests are insufficient for course correction, the only thing that torments this government is a survey predicting defeat in the fall election.

Canada introduces legislation to counter foreign interference

The federal government tabled a bill on Monday to implement a package of reforms to better combat foreign interference including the much-awaited foreign agent registry. The bill comes just days after a public inquiry said attempts by other countries to meddle in Canada's past two federal elections undermined Canadians' trust in democracy.

The CBC reported, "If passed, the bill would introduce new foreign interference offence, shake up how Canada's spy agency collects and shares intelligence and launch a long-anticipated foreign influence transparency registry." Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Public Safety, Democratic Institutions and Intergovernmental Affairs, and the Honourable Arif Virani, Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, announced the introduction Bill C-70, An Act respecting countering foreign interference.

"Our government has been clear - we will not tolerate any form of malign foreign influence on Canadian soil. An Act Respecting Countering Foreign Interference will modernize our toolbox to protect our citizens and democracy while upholding Canadian values and principles," he said. In a press conference, LeBlanc said that the many changes in the new 103-page legislation would

give Canada "new, modern tools" to combat foreign interference.

"Canada is a strong, open and free democracy. These strengths, however, can make Canada a target for those who wish to advance their interests to the detriment of our own," he told reporters.

The legislation would amend the CSIS Act, the Security of Information Act, the Canada Evidence Act and the Criminal Code to create new offences related to foreign interference.

Bill C-70 proposes to update existing laws to better equip the government to detect, disrupt, and protect against foreign interference threats against all people in Canada, including members of

diaspora, and marginalized or otherwise vulnerable communities. This includes proposed changes to the Security of Information Act, the

modernization of the 40-yearold Canadian Security Intelligence Service Act, and the sabotage offence in the Criminal Code. It also proposes amendments to the Canada Evidence Act to establish a standardized and streamlined regime for handling sensitive information in administrative proceedings in the Federal Court of Canada.

The CSIS Act is old and predates the modern internet. Amendments would address growing gaps caused by evolving threats

and technological advancements Safeguards have been built in and are strong - the legislation was developed to ensure that CSIS activities comply with the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. Proposed warrant powers, while new to the ¬CSIS Act, are not new tools; they are modelled on powers routinely relied on by Canadian law enforcement and intelligence agencies in other democracies. The threshold for accessing these tools is still high.

This bill also introduces the Foreign Influence Transparency and Accountability Act (FIT-AA), which creates a Foreign Influence Transparency Registry. Overseen by an independent Foreign Influence Transparency Commissioner, the Registry would promote transparency from people who advocate on behalf of a foreign principal (including a foreign state or stateowned business) and accountability from those who would do so in non-transparent ways.

Almost 200 people die in BC due to drug overdose in one month

ata released by the BC Coroners Service shows toxic drugs claimed the lives of at least 192 people in March, and at least 572 lives in the first three months of 2024.

The data reflects an 11% decrease in the number of lives lost when compared with March 2023 (215), when 6.9 people died each day from toxic drugs. In March 2024, 6.2 deaths per day were tied to the unregulated drug supply.

So far this year, about seven in every 10 of those who have died from toxic drugs were between the ages of 30 and 59. While nearly three-quarters of those killed have been males, it is worth noting that the rate of death among females is climbing year over year: 23 deaths per 100,000 in 2024, compared with 20.6 deaths per 100,000 females for all of 2023.

For British Columbians between 10 and 59, unregulated drug toxicity is the leading cause of death, accounting for more deaths than homicides, suicides, accidents and natural disease combined.

Since the public-health emergency was first declared in April 2016, at least 14,400 people in the province have lost their lives to toxic drugs.

Additional findings from the latest report include that Vancouver, Surrey and Nanaimo continue to experience the highest number of unregulated drug deaths in 2024;

By health authority, the highest number of lives lost to toxic drugs has been in Fraser and Vancouver Coastal health authorities (147 and 143 respectively), making up 51% of all such deaths in 2024;

In 2024, 84% of unregulated drug deaths in 2024 have occurred inside (47% in private homes and 37% inside social and supportive housing, single-room occupancy buildings (known as SROs), shelters, hostels and other indoor locations) and 15% were reported to be outside in vehicles, sidewalks, streets or parks; and Fentanyl has been detected in 85% of unregulated drug deaths that have undergone expedited toxicology testing.

It's time for a guaranteed livable basic income: NDP

OTTAWA, ON: NDP MP Leah Gazan (Winnipeg Centre), joined by advocates for a basic income, called on the Liberal government and all other parties to support her private member's bill to establish a guaranteed livable basic income (GLBI) in Canada.

According to a recent Statistics Canada report, the poverty rate across the country is going up. A GLBI would help lift people out of poverty by allowing them to afford their basic needs like groceries, rent and medication.

"Across the country, we are seeing increased homelessness and food bank usage due to decades of cuts and corporate greed going unchecked under Liberal and Conservative governments," said Gazan. "Poverty is a policy choice, and it's time that the Liberal government chooses to sup-

port all people in Canada. In a country as wealthy as Canada, no one should have to live in poverty—that's why a GLBI is needed now."

Gazan is proposing a GLBI for all

people living in Canada over the age of 17 regardless of participation in the workforce or an educational training program. Regional differences in the cost of living are considerations addressed in the bill.

Furthermore, the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls explicitly called for a GLBI in its Call for Justice 4.5 to prevent Indigenous women, girls and gender-diverse people from being in a vulnerable situation. "Women's organizations have been clear: if we want to tackle gender-based violence, we need a GLBI to provide women and gender-diverse folks with the financial resources they need to protect themselves from violence," added Gazan. "A GLBI will improve our social safety net. I call on all parliamentarians to join the NDP in support of this bill."

Business Extortions Reach US: FBI Sacramento Encouraging Indian Community to Report Extortion

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sacramento Field Office warned the public of an extortion scheme affecting individuals with familial or business ties to India.

The FBI informed that the field office was tracking several instances throughout its 34-county area of responsibility in which people were targeted for extortion and threatened with violence. "These criminal acts are believed to be underreported. The FBI and its law enforcement partners urge the public to report these crimes to ensure the individuals committing these alleged crimes face justice," said a release from the FBI which was issued in English, Hindi, Punjabi and Urdu languages.

"We are deeply concerned for the safety and economic security of our neighbors of Indian

descent who have been targeted," said Acting Special Agent in Charge Mark Remily, who leads the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "Criminals are targeting hard working, law-abiding business owners and are using thug tactics to extort them in clear violation of the law. Timely reporting of attempted extortion to the authorities will help law enforcement to identify and disrupt this criminal scheme, ensuring the safety and economic security of the community."


In recent extortion attempts, subjects demanded a large sum of money and threatened physical violence or death if the demand was not met. Individuals who disregarded the demands subsequently became victims of violence, to include targeted shootings at their residences and vehicles.

Anyone who believes they are in immediate danger should call 911. Threats of violence intended to extort victims for a specified sum can be reported to the FBI by calling the local field office, submitting a tip online at tips.fbi.gov, or calling 1-800-CALL-FBI (1-800-225-5324). The FBI can connect callers with language services to ensure clear communication for callers.

Since October, police in the Lower Mainland and other provinces has also recieved reports of small businesses facing threats through phone calls, WhatsApp messages, and letters, compelling them to provide monetary concessions. Surrey had 3 confirmed cases, with the cities of West Vancouver, Abbotsford, Edmonton (Alberta), and Brampton (Ontario) also confirming similar threats.









Journey to Pakistan: Reflections on partition and reunion

While visiting Pakistani Punjab, one can't help but think about the pre 1947 era when India was one unified country and Punjab was one of its most productive, powerful and prosperous provinces. Punjab's five rivers were a matter of great pride for every Punjabi.

Unfortunately, the partition in 1947 not only split people and families but also the rivers. While growing up I still remember going to our neighboring Sutlej River on Vaisakhi Day and swim in it. Similarly, I have passed over River Bias many times while going to pay obeisance at Darbar Sahib in Amritsar or traveling in that direction. However, it was the first time I had the pleasure of crossing over Rivers Ravi, Chenab and Jhelum at the same time while travelling to Islamabad,



Rawalpindi. Taxila and Panja Sahib. It was a very enjoyable spiritual experience to look at these historic rivers. After visiting various Gurdwaras and other historical places, we returned to Lahore. My wife Baldev and I were now looking forward to visit her ancestral home Chak 106 Pharala in Jarahnwali Tehsil in Faisalabad (formerly Lyallpur) district.

After enjoying our breakfast, we were well on our way to Chak 106 Pharala in the early morning. This place is less than two hours drive from Lahore. On the way, we passed through Chak105 Banga the place where Shahid Bhagat was born and raised. The government has preserved this historic monument.


Some of the roads around these villages were still unpaved and in rough shape. The crops were still growing in the vast rural area. The overall condition of these villages

was not that great. Compared to the Indian Punjab, the overall conditions in Pakistani Punjab in the rural area still need a lot of improvement. As soon as we arrived in Chak 106 Pharala, the villagers welcomed us with open arms. They were extremely loving, friendly, and respectful. A lot of them stayed with us for nearly three hours we were there. They showed us Baldev's old house, her haveli, the site of the village Gurdwara and a few other places.

The village officials -sarpanch/ lambardar and others shared their stories with us. Some of them mentioned the experience of their ancestors when they were forced to move from the Indian Punjab to the Pakistani Punjab.

An eighty-year-old told us that he was born in Pharala near Banga in East Punjab but moved as a child with his family to Chak 106 Pharala in West Punjab. It was exactly the opposite to my wife who was born in Chak106 Pharala in West Punjab but had to move to Pharala near Banga in East Punjab as a child with her family in 1947. These are very tragic stories of the partition. For us, it was a very emotional occasion. It was difficult to bid farewell to kind, loving, and

friendly villagers. On our way back, we stopped at couple of places to eat and rest. While returning to Lahore we had to go through a couple of toll plazas. This reminded us of the toll plazas in India. As we got closer to Lahore, the traffic iams started to build. At one of the toll plazas a truck had broken down and we had to wait for quite a while before the traffic got moving again. These traffic tie-ups, toll plazas, and the rural farms reminded us of our situations here in Canada and those in India. ICBC announces \$110 rebate to drivers, basic rates remain unchanged

ICTORIA - ICBC is providing a \$110 rebate to eligible drivers which it said was "through prudent financial management and better-than-expected investment income.

Additionally, basic rates will be maintained until March 31, 2026, marking six years in a row with no increases.

66Six years of stable rates and the fourth rebate for drivers comes as a result of years of work turning ICBC around so that it actually works for people," said Premier David Eby. "On average, drivers have saved \$2,000 in rebates and lower rates since our reforms to ensure that when auto insurance is properly managed, people in B.C. benefit.

Due to positive investment performance and responsible fiscal management, IC-BC's preliminary net income for the fiscal year 2023-24 is an estimated \$1.5 billion. The total amount of the rebate is \$400 million, equivalent to \$110 per eligible insurance policy. As the law now requires, the balance will stay with ICBC, helping to stabilize rates for drivers over the long term. The final, audited net income figure, along with a full financial summary of the fiscal year, will be released this summer.

All personal and commercial ICBC customers who had an active eligible basic insurance policy in February 2024 will receive the rebate, totalling roughly 3.6 million policies.

"ICBC is able to return \$400 million to drivers because of prudent fiscal management that puts people first, and our commitment in law that ICBC's surplus should go toward benefiting drivers instead of going to government coffers," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and



Solicitor General. "This rebate, alongside the decision to not increase basic rates for six years in a row, underscores the benefit of a public auto insurer. When private insurance companies make a profit, it's at the expense of, not for the benefit of drivers." An important barometer of ICBC's financial strength is its ability to absorb adverse risks and to still fulfil its obligations to policyholders, referred to as the minimum capital test (MCT). In 2015, the indicator for ICBC's basic capital fell below 85%, and by 2018, it had effectively reached 0%. Following the introduction of Enhanced Care, ICBC's financial position has significantly improved, and today, the estimate for ICBC's basic MCT is above 160% and projected to remain strong.

"To receive your rebate as quickly as possible, we encourage customers to update their addresses and sign up for direct deposit on https://icbc.com/ or through an Autoplan broker," said David Wong, IC-BC's new president and CEO. "Initial rebate payments will commence in late May, with ongoing processing until the end of

2024 Honda HR-VEX-L: Stylish, Sporty, and Aspirational

Auto Review By Veeno Dewan

The sporty 2024 Honda HR-V is a five-door compact CUV designed for drivers with active lifestyles or young families. The latest

second-generation HR-V is now based on the Honda Civic platform rather than the previous smaller Fit model, so is now longer and wider, Major changes include more cabin space, more rear seat legroom and one of the largest cargo areas in its class. There is an all-new high-tech digital instrumentation, a wider track, and a larger engine. Exterior changes add new LED Headlights and taillights and as standard matte or gloss black grille finishes.

The HR-Vs larger engine is a 2.0L four-cylinder DOHC I-VTEC unit making 158 hp at 6,500 rpm and 138 lb-ft of torque at 4,200 rpm. It's paired with a Real Time AWD with Intelligent ControlTM via continuously variable transmission (CVT) and arrives in both front wheel drive and AWD as on our EX-L trim as tested. Pricing starts at 28,370 for a front-wheel drive LX-FWD, the \$31,030 LX-AWD and up to \$37,130 for the EX-L Navi plus freight and taxes.

Key HR-V Features as standard include digital instrumentation, Standard 7-inch colour touchscreen with Apple CarPlay® & Android AutoTM integration. There is an available 9-inch colour touchscreen with wireless Apple CarPlay and Android Auto



integration (EX-L Navi). The EX-L Navi adds navigation system, 9inch display touchscreen, leather trimmed seats, steering wheel, and shift knob. EX-L Exterior add a black painted grille and body color front and rear parking sensors.

The HR-V interior features a bright, roomy cabin with Hondas typical neat fastidious design. Plastics, textiles, and trim material are uniformly of good quality and the dash is neat and orderly. There are more Civic styling cues such as the honeycomb design panel across the dashboard which cleverly hides the climate vents within it. Good to see there is some soft padded surfaces at the main touchpoints. Ergonomics are fine and the front seats are

comfortable enough. The floating bridge setup between the seats provides a bit of extra storage, and overall, the cabin has plenty of cubbies, large door pockets and a convenient storage area on each side of the transmission tunnel each with its own USB port for accessories. The rear cabin is well appointed and has more legroom thanks to the bigger Wheelbase. Downsides?- note that the HR-V offers dual zone climate control up front but has no air vents for the rear which is strange. More impressive is rear cargo volume with the 60/40 split rear seats up/down is 691L /1559L – best in class.

Safety is excellent on the Honda HR-V, with Standard Honda Sensing® system with new front

wide-view camera, new Traffic Jam Assist (TJA) and Traffic Sign Recognition (TSR) plus Standard knee and rear passenger side-impact airbags. The Honda Sensing which uses the wide-angle camera system to detect pedestrians, other vehicles, and even road signs and markings. Also, standard is a rear seat reminder, adaptive cruise control, lane keep assist, and low-speed follow system.

On the road the HR-V feels confident and sure footed. There is a smoother ride thanks to the HR-V's extended wheelbase and wider tracks that improves stability through the corners.

The steering is light and makes the CR-V engaging to drive, while the added ride height means the suspension makes light work of bumps and irregular road surfaces. It's stable and planted on the highway and one of the best parts about the HR-V is its comfortable ride. The CVT setup and calibration in this Honda is much better than in the competition and can cleverly simulate actual gearshifts and is most effective when in the sport mode. However, a few extra horsepower would not be amiss I think. The HR-V accelerates well, but with a full complement of occupants and cargo it could do with tad more pep.

Overall, the HR-V offers an enjoyable, no drama relaxed driving experience. The slightly raised suspension absorbs irregular road surfaces and there is good driver visibility all around. Its no slouch, but don't expect rapidly fast acceleration or overly sporty antics as the quest for better fuel economy has been dialled in by Honda's engineers it seems. Speaking of fuel economy, the HR-V is rated at 9.4 L/100 km in the city and 7.8 L/100 km on the highway and 8.7 combined.

To sum up, the HR-V is a competent, spacious, roomy, extremely safe crossover that offers more quality and value than a lot of the competition. It is a great alternative to the Honda CR-V If you are looking for something al little edgier. It excels in its active lifestyle or stylish family compact CUV role with panache. A great buy all around.




Heeramandi Actor Sharmin Segal's Throwback Reaction To Criticism


