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28-year-old Yuvraj Goyal killed in Surrey; four arrested

SURREY, BC: Police in Surrey have arrested four men in connection to the shooting death of 28-year-old Yuvraj Goyal on June 7th. Police said initial evidence suggests this was a targeted shooting, investigators are working to determine the reason that Goyal, "a community member with no history of police contact, was killed.'

Goyal was shot dead at the 900-block of 164 Street, Surrey, BC on June 7th at approximately 8:46am. The police located him dead on the crime scene. Shortly after police were advised of a vehicle fire in the 18500-block of McMillan Road, Surrey.

Harkirat Jhutty of Surrey, and 20-year old Keilon Francois of Ontario,. All four have been charged with first-degree murder, for the shooting of

According to Indian media reports, Yuvraj was from Ludhiana and only child of his parents. He was working at a car dealership. Global News reported that Yuvraj was on the phone, talking to his mother. He disconnected the phone at 8:45 a.m., and the shooting happened at 8:46 a.m.

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

New legislation to eliminate Canadian work experience requirement for internationally trained professionals seeking work in Canada

Vancouver, BC: BC has introduced the International Credentials Recognition Act to help internationally educated professionals have a more streamlined, efficient and transparent process to get their credentials recognized in B.C.

The International Credentials Recognition Act will come into effect on July 1, 2024, after significant consultation with 18 regulatory bodies, led by the parliamentary secretary for international credentials. The Act will ensures fair fees for all applicants, eliminate redundant English-language tests, and introduce new transparency requirements. The Province of BC will appoint a Superintendent of International Credential Recognition to oversee compliance with the new regulations.

The act will require regulatory bodies to reduce red tape and remove barriers in 29 professions and make it easier, more transparent and quicker for those qualified professionals to pursue and achieve credential recognition, no

matter where they were trained. One major change is eliminating the catch-22 of unnecessary Canadian work experience requirements for experienced internationally trained professionals. The catch-22 was that a person needed work experience to work in Canada, but couldn't work in Canada because of the lack of Canadian work experience. The removal of Canadian work experience requirements for regulators who require it will come into effect on July 1, 2025. The ministry is working with regulatory authorities to understand current approaches and identify any existing Canadian work experience requirements that would be prohibited under the new regulations. ans, paramedics, early childhood educators, teachers, biologists, land surveyors, architects and

"The Premier gave me the task to get the International Credentials Recognition Act across the finish line, and I'm happy to say we've done it," said Ravi Parmar, Parliamentary Secretary for International Credentials. "For too long, skilled professionals from around

the world have come to our province hoping for a better life, only to find roadblocks in their way. But now, with these regulations, we're changing that. It means simpler, fairer rules so these professionals can start working in their fields faster, providing the services our communities need." The act will also enhance fairness by requiring regulators under the act to charge similar fees for international and domestic applicants, eliminating redundant English-language testing requirements. There is also required accountability and transparency to the public through new data collection and reporting requirements, and enforcement tools to ensure compliance with the act.

The Province will be appointing a superintendent of international credential recognition. The superintendent will oversee the fair recognition of international credentials, addressing any systemic or procedural issues. Additionally, they will have the authority under the act to issue orders for

compliance and impose administrative penalties as needed.

"It is time to do a re-set of how we envision an inclusive and prosperous economy that benefits everyone. The International Credentials Recognition Act is an important milestone for our province as it seeks to further eliminate barriers in various past models through thoughtful consultations and provides a renewed optimism that when we work collectively together, we can indeed forge a path forward for the betterment of all British Columbians," said Neelam Sahota, CEO, DIVERSECity.

Patrick MacKenzie, CEO, Immigrant Employment Council of B.C. (IEC-BC), said, "Employers have struggled for decades to recognize the skills and credentials immigrants bring to British Columbia. The International Credentials Recognition Act is an important step in helping B.C. businesses fill critical needs in their workplaces,

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Surrey Mayor accepts decision on policing; lays out future path for transition

The year long saga over policing transition in Surrey is finally over. Surrey Mayor Brenda Locke, has accepted the decision on policing transition in Surrey after the judicial review. At Monday's

Regular Council Meeting, she accepted the decision of the judicial review, she said she does not believe that "the provincially mandated transition is in the best interests of the residents and taxpayers of Surrey." The Solicitor General has set Nov. 29, 2024, as the date when the Surrey Police Service will be the police of jurisdiction in Surrey. She said, "To be clear, we are in the infancy stages of this transition in terms of planning and confirming proper costing for taxpayers."

To ensure there is transparency and checks on spending on what she called "provincially legislated police transition", she discussed next steps in transition.

She informed that a team of experts assembled by the City Manager will work with the province, the federal government, Surrey Police Service/Board and the RCMP to ascertain the progress to date and ensure the best interests of the City are represented at the table.

"The judicial review validated the City of Surrey's concerns surrounding the accuracy of transition costs. What had been long touted as an additional cost of \$30 million per year is on the low end. As cited in the province's Deloitte Report, the added cost is more in the range of \$75 million, based on a stated requirement by the Surrey Police Service of at least 900 officers and an additional 58 officers for integrated teams. This critical information only came to light through our recent litigation. I expect the Province will cooperate in good faith

with the City of Surrey to determine the actual costs of the transition and for the Province to compensate the City for the added costs," she added.

Locke said that beginning in September progress on the transition will be reported at each council meeting where councillors will have a chance to ask questions. "These immediate actions the City of Surrey is taking will go a long way to finally providing transparency and clarity on what this transition means for the future of policing in Surrey. City Council will work over the summer to ensure that this process is expedited, and I expect that the Province, the Surrey Police Service executive and the Surrey Police Board will do likewise," Locke said.

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

Is BC the place to be? Amid affordability woes, one-in-three residents "seriously" consider leaving the province

British Columbia is a famously beautiful place to live, but a rising cost of living including unaffordable housing may be enough to send some residents searching for other pastures, even if they're not quite as green.

New data from the non-profit Angus Reid Institute finds residents across the province, indeed, at least half in every region, saying that the BC NDP is not focusing enough on addressing their own housing needs. This is an issue that has been seemingly intractable for two decades, and though new housing supply has been a significant focus in recent years, and B.C. now leads the nation in housing starts per capita, residents continue to face evident challenges. The group most likely to say this are 35- to 54-year-old men and women, those most likely to have children as an added variable in these equations. Potentially compounding these issues is

number of British Columbians, the Angus Reid Institute asked residents how they feel the BC NDP has handled a key aspect of overcoming these challenges: business investment. The COVID-19 pandemic hit the province hard, and subsequent inflation and higher interest rates have evidently slowed investment after a two-year spike in 2021 and 2022. Slow economic growth is expected this year, though some predict investment will pick up again in 2025. Amid a weaker economic forecast, S&P Global downgraded the province's credit rating from AA to AA- this spring. The consequences of these challenges,

particularly when it comes to housing, are that many British Columbians say they may leave. In 2023, for the first time in more than 10 years, B.C.'s had a negative net interprovincial migration – that is the number of people who moved to B.C. from other provinces minus those who left for elsewhere in the country. Despite this outflow, the province's population still grew, but the exodus of British Columbians to other provinces is perhaps emblematic of the affordability challenges the province faces. A study released in Nov. 2023 showed that B.C. had the highest cost of living of any province in the country. More than one-third (36%) British Columbians say they are contemplating leaving the province because of the high cost of housing, while a majority (54%) say that is not a consideration. Those in the Lower Mainland (42%) and Interior (41%) are more likely to say they are seriously thinking of leaving the province than those in Metro Vancouver (36%) and on the Island or North Coast (22%).

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slower economic growth. After a post-COVID-19 peak in 2021 and 2022, investment levels have dropped in the face of higher interest rates and aren't expected by experts to rise significantly again until 2025. With this as a backdrop, and a recently downgraded credit rating in the news, many British Columbians are critical of the BC NDP's focus on encouraging investment. More than two-in-five (44%) – rising to half among those with annual household incomes higher than \$100,000 (52%) – say the government should focus more on this aspect of the economy.

Two-in-five said more focus is needed on business investment. With economic issues like inflation, jobs, and government spending all important to a significant

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

BC United drops Asad Gondal as **Candidate for Surrey North**

wo days announcing Asad President Gondal, of the B.C. Muslim Association, as candidate from Surrey North, the party's leader Kevin Falcon dropped Gondal as the candidate.

The cancelation of Gondal's candidacy came after online backlash to some of previous Gondal's

statements on the war in Gaza and on 2SLGBTQ+ issues, CBC reported.

"Prior to Mr. Gondal's nomination, he shared opinions that are inconsistent with our party's view on the situation in Gaza and inconsistent with our support for B.C.'s LGBTQ+ community," Falcon's statement said.

Falcon said in his statement about Gondal's dismissal that the former candidate shared his opinions "in correspondence he signed on behalf of the BCMA, while representing his community."



"In light of those statements, I spoke with Mr. Gondal today to confirm his willingness to adhere to our party's long-standing position on these issues," Falcon's statement said. "However, he informed me that he cannot change his values and principles, including disavowing earlier statements made while president of the BCMA."

"Given Mr Gondal's decision to not adhere by our Party's position on these policies, I have terminated his candidacy effective immediately. I accept full responsibility and apologize to anyone who may

have been offended," Falcon added.

BC United has not yet named a new candidate for Surrey-North.

BC United candidate Caroline Elliott issued her own statement on the termination, saving she "appalled" to read Gondal's statements.

"While I have long defended free speech and even as I

continue to vigorously defend it there is a role for political parties to select candidates based on the degree to which they align with the party's principles," said Elliott. "A candidate rejected by one party is welcome to join another or even start their own."

According to a report in CityNEws, Elliott claimed that Gondal had referred to the war in Gaza as a "genocide" and advised "those who struggle with same-sex attractions" not to act on their "involuntary urges" and "repent."

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Conservatives Demand RCMP Investigation of Liberal Government Mismanagement of Technology Fund

Conservative Leader Pierre Poilievre wants an RCMP investigation after an auditor general report found mismanagement of a sustainable technology fund. On Monday, Conservatives introduced a motion for a potential RCMP investigation calling on the government and the Auditor General to hand

over all documents related to Sustainable Development Technology Canada (SDTC). The Conservative motion was adopted on June 10.

All federal parties except for the Liberals passed the non-binding motion. In a statement, the Conservative Party of Canada said Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has turned the SDTC into "a slush fund for organizations connected to Liberal insiders." The motion comes a week after a jawdropping investigation from Auditor General Karen Hogan was tabled in the House of Commons, revealing tens of millions of dollars were allegedly mishandled by SDTC. "Last week, the Auditor General revealed the shocking truth of the extent of Liberal Corruption through her report on the Sustainable Development Technology Canada (SDTC). This showed that Trudeau had turned this organization into a slush fund for organizations connected to Liberal insiders. In total, \$123 million worth of contracts were found to have been given inappropriately, while \$76 million was given to projects where there was a connection to the Liberals' friends appointed to roles within SDTC.

On top of this, \$12 million was given to

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projects that were both ineligible and had a conflict of interest. The Auditor General also discovered that long-established conflict of interest policies were not followed in 90 cases. In one instance, Trudeau's handpicked SDTC chair siphoned off \$217,000 to her own company," said

Conservative Party Leader Pierre Poilievre. The report found, "significant lapses in Sustainable Development Technology Canada's governance and stewardship of public funds." The foundation awards funding to support new technologies that promote sustainable development under 4 streams—Start-up, Scale-up, Ecosystem, and Seed. For its part, Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada did not sufficiently monitor the compliance with the contribution agreements between the foundation and the Government of Canada.

The report found that "the foundation awarded funding to projects that were ineligible, that conflicts of interest existed in some instances, and that certain requirements in the Canada Foundation for Sustainable Development Technology Act were not met."

The report said that the foundation awarded funding to 10 ineligible projects of 58 examined. These 10 projects were awarded \$59 million even though they did not meet key requirements set out in the contribution agreements between the government and the foundation.

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Surrey Police says More Experienced Officers Hitting city's Streets

Surrey Police Service (SPS) says that it is continuing to hire and deploy more police officers leading up to November 29, 2024, when SPS will take over policing and law enforcement for Surrey. This week, SPS is deploying nine more experienced police

officers, coming from both municipal and RCMP agencies.

In this deployment, six experienced Constables and two Sergeants will be deployed to the Frontline and one Constable will join Traffic Services. In total, 225 SPS officers are deployed into eight different units.

As the policing transition progresses, it will be important for SPS officers of various ranks, including Staff Sergeants, Inspectors and Superintendents, to be part of subsequent deployments to provide the leadership and depth of supervision and



experience needed to smoothly transition policing to SPS. In addition, officers with investigative skills and other specialized skill sets will also be important additions to deployments in the coming months. Frontline policing is an important part of policing, but many other sections and units are necessary for a policing service to deliver comprehensive public safety to a community.

"We are moving forward with a specific view to becoming the police of jurisdiction in Surrey this November," says Chief Constable Norm Lipinski.

Police warn public about "money mules" scam

The Pacific Region RCMP Federal Policing program's Integrated Market Enforcement Team (IMET), and the B.C. Securities Commission (BCSC) have delivered warnings to 10 suspected money mules to combat offshore investment fraud that targets British Columbians.

During a joint operation on May 29 investigators hand-delivered warning letters to people suspected of transferring funds on behalf of criminals. The use of money mules is a common money laundering tactic, helping criminals move their ill-gotten gains by concealing the identity, source and destination of funds. People who move money for criminals can be criminally charged for possession or laundering the proceeds of crime. If part of an investment fraud scheme, moving money for others can also lead to allegations of misconduct under B.C.'s

The BCSC identified the suspected money mules after uncovering information that they sent or received money or cryptocurrency that was obtained from

Securities Act.

victims of investment fraud.

Criminals use a variety of tactics to recruit people to act as money mules, often offering a portion of the transferred funds as payment. The criminals may lie about their identity, promise job offers, start an online friendship or romance. The criminals may ask people to process payments, transfer funds or re-ship products to move money from investment fraud victims to the fraudsters.In some cases, the individuals may not realize they are transferring money on behalf of criminals, and they may also be victims of an investment scam themselves. Money mules may think they are helping out a friend or romantic partner, or performing a task for an online job. If money mules continue to send or receive funds on behalf of criminals after being warned not to do so, they could be charged with criminal or regulatory offences.

The RCMP and BCSC will continue collaborating as part of a broader strategy to combat online investment fraud by identifying, disrupting, and dismantling the



domestic elements of criminal networks that are often based overseas and target victims in Canada and other countries. Tips for the public:

If you were asked to help transfer money by an online friend, romantic partner, or someone offering you easy money, you may have been talking to a money mule recruiter. Here are steps you can take to protect yourself from becoming an unwitting money mule:

Don't move money on someone's behalf if you haven't met them in personIgnore unsolicited email or social media messages that promise quick money for little or no work

Be skeptical if you're asked by an employer to receive money in your bank account and then process or transfer it as part of your job

If you have already received money or crypto assets from a person you met online, or suspect you have been the victim of investment fraud, immediately notify your bank or credit union, and report it to the BCSC, or the RCMP.

As organised crime groups increasingly target the most vulnerable members of our society through investment scams, the RCMP Financial Integrity program has partnered with the B.C. Securities Commission to combat this crime trend through a multi-pronged strategy. In addition to conducting a series of joint enforcement actions against these criminal networks, we are working to strengthen our first line of defence by providing education and resources to members of the public, along with strategies to avoid becoming a victim of fraud.

Ibrahim Ali sentenced to life in prison for murder of 13-year-old Burnaby girl

On July 19, 2017, the city of Burnaby was shaken, after the body of a 13-year old girl, was found deceased in Central Park. The victim had been reported missing less than two hours prior from her home in Burnaby. The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team ("IHIT") took conduct of the investigation and continued to work closely with the Burnaby RCMP, supported by the BC RCMP's Integrated Teams and policing resources from all over the Lower Mainland.

IHIT conducted an exhaustive investigation utilizing a full array of conventional and non-conventional techniques to identify and eliminate over 2000 persons of interest in relation to the murder.

Through forensic evidence, 34-year-old Ibrahim Ali was determined to be the sole suspect. Ali was arrested on September 7, 2018, and was charged with the 1st degree murder, for which on December 8, 2023, he was found guilty.

On June 7, 2024, Ali was sentenced to imprisonment for life, without parole eligibility for 25 years.

"This complex was a investigation that had a profound effect on the entire province," says Superintendent Mandeep Officer-in-Charge Mooker, of IHIT. "It's a result of the unwavering dedication of the investigative team, supported by all of IHIT and the BC RCMP, whose relentless pursuit of the evidence led them to using cutting-edge forensic technology, which brought us to today's successful conclusion."

Kuwait fire tragedy: Dozens of Indian workers dead in Kuwait labour camp fire

Mbroke out in a building housing workers in Kuwait early on Wednesday, officials said.

At least 35 bodies were still inside the building after the fire was put out, head of the criminal evidence department at the Interior Ministry, Major General Eid al-Owaihan, said.

The Health Ministry said at least 43 people have been transferred to hospitals for treatment and four have died.

Search teams continue to inspect the building to look for other victims and investigations are ongoing into the reason behind the fire.

Local media said the fire broke out in a sixfloor building overcrowded with workers in al-Mangaf area, south of the capital.

ore than 35 people died when a fire Thirteen of the 14 Keralites, who died in that my brother would be safe, a deadly fire that devastated a building but it was not. We got the news in Kuwait's southern city of Al-Mangaf, have been identified.

> The fire that broke out in a labour camp in Kuwait killed 49 employees attached to a Keralite-owned company. The families on receiving the information were devasted.

> "My son was a teacher at an engineering college here and it was only last month that he went to Kuwait. He got his salary on the 5th of this month and it was transferred the same day to us. We spoke to him on Tuesday night also," said a grieving father, George Pothen at Pathanamthitta.

> "When the news of the fire came on TV, I knew it was the same company where my brother worked. We tried to believe

that he passed away when his name was flashed on the TV channels. We are yet to tell the news to our aged mother," grieved a woman.

Stephin Abraham, 29, who lived in Pampady in Kottayam, was an engineer and had been working in Kuwait for the past six years.

"He was my tenant for a few years and was building his own home. He was here six months back to see the progress of his house," said the landlord.

The company is owned by K.G. Abraham, a Keralite who has varied business interests in the Middle East and also owns a five-star hotel in Kochi.

The fire broke out in the building around 4.30 a.m. on Wednesday. According to sources in Kuwait, the



toll could have been higher. Around 18 employees, who resided in the ill-fated building, had left the building around 4 a.m. to take up their morning duties.

Newly sworn-in Union Minister of State George Kurian said that a MoS Kirthi Vardhan Singh has already left for Kuwait to coordinate the efforts of the Indian Embassy to bring back the bodies of those who lost their lives.

Speaking with The Tribune, Singh, the owner of Namaste India restaurant, expressed excitement at the opportunity of serving people from India in Italy.





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
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

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NDP MP Don Davies introduces motion to recognize and prohibit caste-based discrimination

Vancouver, BC: NDP MP Don Davies (Vancouver Kingsway) introduced a motion in Parliament to recognize and prohibit caste-based discrimination in Canada this week. The motion calls for changes to the Canadian Human Rights Act to add caste as a prohibited ground of discrimination, acknowledging the severe social and economic exclusion faced by Canadians in communities across the country.

"Caste-based discrimination is a part of the lived experience of many Canadians and ought to be explicitly recognized and prohibited under the Canadian Human Rights Act," said Davies. "Due to the tireless efforts of advocates, some institutions have recognized caste-based discrimination as a human rights violation as an inferred ground of discrimination. It is time we made this explicit and send a clear message that this is not tolerated in our society."

At a press conference unveiling the motion on Friday, Davies was joined by Manoj Bhangu, who won the first case of caste discrimination at the British Columbia Human Rights Tribunal. Davies was also joined by Jyotika Jasuja, cultural events coordinator for the Chetna Association of Canada, and Jai Birdi, executive director of the Chetna Association of Canada.

"Millions of people worldwide still face appalling and dehumanising discrimination based on caste and similar systems of inherited status," said Bhangu. "Caste discrimination remains prevalent in Canada and we must take immediate action to address it."

"Explicitly banning caste-based discrimination under Canadian human rights law would mark a significant step forward," added Jasuja. "It represents an important acknowledgement that the problem exists here in Canada and would allow people to seek legal recourse if they face discrimination."

"We must work together to build a casteless society where individuals can live in harmony with each other regardless of differences," said Birdi. "We implore MPs to reach across party lines to add caste as a stand-alone category to the Canadian Human Rights Act." "Caste-based hatred and discrimination have no place in Canada," concluded Davies. "I call on all Parliamentarians to support this important human rights initiative."

The motion will further strengthen the work being done in North America to create awareness about caste based discrimination. The City of Seattle made history on February 21st, 2023 by becoming the first US city for passing a law that bans castebased discrimination in businesses and other public settings. The initiative was led by Seattle Councillor, Kshama Sawant.

Chetna Association of Canada, a community-based organization has been raising awareness about casts-based issues in Canada since its establishment in 1999. The Association has been actively engaging Lower Mainland cities



and the provincial government to support awareness campaigns. "Burnaby, Surrey, and the Province of BC have proclaimed April 14 - Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Day of Equality since 2020."

The University of British Columbia is also working on a big project under Dr Anne Murphy and Dr. Suraj Yengde that investigates Dalit (those deemed "untouchables" in the caste system of South Asia) individual and community histories within Canada's past and present.

Sikh face Ravneet Bittu inducted into **Indian cabinet despite losing Lok Sabha polls**

hree-time former Congress MP and Sikh face Ravneet Singh Bittu(48) was inducted as minister of state in in the Narendra Modi-led National Democratic Alliance(N-DA) government despite tasting defeat in the Ludhiana Lok Sabha constituency. The induction of ex-Congress MP from Ludhiana, grandson of slain former Punjab chief minister and Congress stalwart Beant Singh, into the new Modi-led Union ministry as the Minister of State (MoS) within three months of switching to the BJP - and despite losing the Lok Sabha polls - has signalled a new approach of the ruling party towards Punjab

The 2024 Lok Sabha election was the first general election in two decades that the BJP contested alone in Punjab. The BJP had been a junior alliance partner of the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) in Punjab.

Bittu was defeated by Punjab Congress chief Amarinder Singh Raja Warring in Ludhiana in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

Despite the loss, the BJP believes, Bittu is among the popular leaders who are likely to make an impact on the party as it goes it alone in Punjab.

Bittu was chosen over other prominent BJP

leaders like former MP Preneet Kaur and ex-diplomat Taranjit Singh Sandhu, whose defeats from the Patiala and Amritsar Lok Sabha constituencies, respectively, left a section of the state BJP shocked. The incumbent Ludhiana MP, Bittu himself lost on the BJP's ticket to his former colleague Amrinder Singh Raja Warring, the state Congress chief.

Amritpal Singh, 'Waris Punjab De' chief, who is in Dibrugarh jail under terror charges from Khadoor Sahib by a margin of 1,97,120 votes, the highest in Punjab.

Sarabjit Singh, son of former Prime Minister



Indira Gandhi's assassin, won the Faridkot Lok Sabha seat by a margin of 70,053 votes. The inclusion of Ravneet Singh Bittu in the Prime Minister's Narendra Modi-led Union ministry is therefore significant for the BJP as it tries to grow in Punjab. It is also symbolic amid the victory of the Khalistani sym-

Key ministries remain with BJP ministers in new Indian government

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Prime Minister ■ Modi has retained all key cabinet ministers in their portfolios in the new government, signalling that he still calls the shots despite having to rely on coalition allies for a majority in parliament.

He chaired the first meeting of his Union Cabinet this week and allocated portfolios to ministers a day after taking oath in a glittering ceremony at Rashtrapathi Bhavan. Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) fell well short of the majority mark on its own in the election that ended this month, but the government announced there will be no change in personnel at the four senior-most ministries - finance, home affairs, defence and foreign affairs. The party also retained other key ministries like

Only 5 out of the 30 cabinet seats were given to the allies, in ministries including civil aviation, food processing, steel, animal husbandry, and small and medium enterprises.

The BJP won 240 of the 543 seats in the lower house of parliament in the election. The alliance it leads won a total of 293 seats, crossing the majority mark of 272 seats.

Aside from BJP, the two main constituents of the ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA) are two regional parties focused on getting funds for their states, Andhra Pradesh in the south and Bihar in the east.

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

The front fascia is highlighted by a diamond pentagon grille, next generation Acura Jewel Eye ED headlights and the cool front wing-shaped lower air curtain ducts inspired by the NSX Supercar. It is a very dynamic sporting look. Acura's best-selling CUV has no major changes for 2024. There is one engine choice only, a turbocharged 272-horsepower 2.0-litre VTEC 4-cylinder unit that is one of the most powerful in its class. It's paired with a smooth and responsive 10-speed automatic with standard Sequential SportShift paddle shifters. 



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New air ambulances are taking flight in B.C.

 $R^{\rm ICHMOND} - {\rm Patients} \\ {\rm requiring \ emergency \ travel}$ for medical care will benefit from a new state-of-the-art fleet of air ambulance airplanes.

"When someone you love is critically ill or injured, they deserve the best and fastest care possible," said Premier David Eby. "Throughout this vast province, we are building new hospitals, cancer-care clinics and urgent primary care centres. By deploying new air ambulances, we are ensuring patients get the quality care they need quickly." BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) is replacing its existing



fleet with 12 new Beechcraft King Air 360CHW air ambulances. Nine of the airplanes will be in regular operation and three will be backups. The first of these new airplanes went into service on May 1, 2024. This is possible due to a provincial investment of \$673 million over 10 years.

Air ambulances allow patients to be treated by highly trained

paramedics while they are being transported. These airplanes are the fastest way to travel to a health-care facility, especially for patients in hardto-reach areas. These aircraft are used both in emergency medical response and to transfer patients between health-care facilities.

The new aircrafts have several features that will benefit patients across the province, including the ability to land on gravel runways; expanded capabilities for specialized care; improved patient and paramedic safety through power

stretcher compatibility; and uniform layout and design that will improve patient outcomes and expanded flight crews.

Air ambulances will remain stationed in their current locations with three airplanes each in Vancouver and Kelowna, two in Prince George and one in Fort St. John.

These new air ambulances build on historical progress to improve ambulance services for patients by adding more paramedics, adding more vehicles and updating fleets of vehicles used by paramedics.

New Rules in BC set minimum pay for gig workers

7ICTORIA, BC: province says workers in B.C. who make money through apps, such as Uber and Skipthe-dishes, will now get a set minimum wage and better protections.

The Province has finalized regulations to provide fairness, minimum-wage measures and basic protections for appbased ride-hailing and delivery workers in British Columbia.

The regulations, a first in Canada, will come into effect on Sept. 3, 2024. They will apply to those who work for apps such as Uber, Lyft, Uber Eats, SkiptheDishes, DoorDash and others.

"All companies should be challenges of gig

providing basic fairness like minimum wage for their workers," said Harry Bains, Minister of Labour. "Everyone working hard to support their families should have basic protections so if they're injured on the job, they won't lose their homes. That is what we are doing with these regulations - providing fair pay and basic protections for these workers."

regulations final are a product of years of engagement with workers. platform companies, labour organizations, business associations, the public and others. They create balanced solutions to the unique work,



addressing workers' priorities while ensuring app-based ridehailing and delivery services remain available and affordable in B.C.

"Too many workers in this industry are putting in long hours and being paid less than the minimum wage," said

Janet Routledge, Parliamentary Secretary for Labour. "At the end of a shift, after paying their vehicle expenses, these workers are barely ahead of where they started. The new protections are going to change that."

"Inflation is high and it's hard to afford everyday things my family needs. The security of a minimum wage will be gamechanging for me. What also stands out is the peace of mind my family and I will have in knowing that if I'm ever injured on the job, I will have workers' compensation coverage," said Sandeep Singh Chhina, fulltime app-based ride-hailing and delivery worker.

The regulations address the top concerns raised by workers, including:

Low and unpredictable pay: The regulation sets a minimum wage for engaged time, and a minimum perkilometre vehicle allowance to compensate workers for their vehicle expenses. B.C. is establishing a minimum wage of \$20.88, which is 120% of B.C.'s general minimum wage (currently \$17.40) and apply it to engaged time. Engaged time begins when a worker accepts an assignment through its completion. Engaged time does not include the time spent waiting between assignments.

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day: Richmond Cop Sonny Virk reminds community of responsibility towards seniors

In recogn ition of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day on June 15, 2024, RCMP reinforced its Richmond commitment to protecting our senior citizens through dedicated initiatives and continuous community engagement. Spearheading efforts is Corporal Sonny Virk, Elder Abuse Liaison from the Richmond RCMP Vulnerable Persons Unit (VPU), who plays a pivotal role in proactive approach to safeguard our elders from abuse and neglect.

RCMP Elder Abuse Liaisons have the role of developing relationships with local agencies who have the primary mandate to investigate elder abuse. Detachments may run parallel Criminal Code investigations and/or may assist designated agencies in their investigations.

"The prevalence of elder abuse, encompassing physical, emotional, and financial harm, remains a significant concern. The VPU is dedicated to fostering a safe environment for all seniors, supported by tailored programs and resources designed to empower and protect one of the most vulnerable segments of our community," said Corporal Virk.

Protecting our elders is not just a policing priority, it is a community responsibility, stated Cpl. Virk. "Through collaboration with local agencies and leveraging our specialized training, we are making strides in preventing abuse and ensuring that seniors live with the respect and security they deserve.

Key initiatives and partnerships:

-Educational workshops seminars: Regular sessions are held to educate seniors about the risks of financial scams, physical abuse, and emotional manipulation. These workshops are crucial in empowering seniors to recognize signs of abuse and seek help.

-Collaborations with local health

authorities: Working closely healthcare partners to identify and address cases of elder abuse.

-Community outreach: **Programs** tailored to maintain regular contact with seniors, ensuring they have access to necessary resources and support.

-Identifying self-neglect: working with front line, neighbours, and community partners on identifying and then supporting our elders who may require extra care.

BC United promises free shingles vaccine

7ANC OUVER, BC: BC United Leader Kevin Falcon announced that a BCU government would make the shingles vaccine available to all British Columbians over the age of 50 at no cost. "For years, BC United has been calling for a program to provide the shingles vaccine for free, as has B.C.'s independent Senior's Advocate in a report released earlier this week," said Falcon. "In the middle of an affordability crisis, countless seniors face serious financial barriers to accessing the shingles vaccine, which costs approximately \$160 per dose. BC



United will ensure all seniors receive the health care they deserve, and introduce a program to provide, at no cost, the shingles vaccine, which can prevent a painful and debilitating illness.'

Nearly one in three Canadians develop shingles in their lifetime, with those aged 50 and older being particularly susceptible. Unlike in B.C., the vaccine is publicly funded in Ontario, Yukon, Northwest Territories, Prince Edward Island, Alberta, and Ouebec.

BC United's initiative aligns with proposals from Dan Levitt, the new B.C. Seniors Advocate, as well as recommendations from the National Advisory Committee

on Immunization (NACI) as vital way to address a significant health risk.

"At a time when one in five British Columbians don't have access to a family doctor, this program would also importantly result in eliminating hundreds of thousands of physician visits for shingles cases each year," concluded Falcon. "We could easily fund this common sense initiative with a simple rollback of the millions of taxpayers dollars that have flooded into the now bloated Premier's Office, with political advisors and communications staff, under the NDP."

HT City is in possession of the defamation notice, which was sent to him on June 12. 

In 2018, the City of Surrey decided to transition from the RCMP to its own municipal police service. The Province of BC approved this change, Surrey Police Service (SPS) was established in 2020, and work began on the transition from the RCMP to SPS.

Phase 1 of the transition began in 2021, with a blended SPS-RCMP policing model. SPS officers are regularly integrated into the Surrey RCMP detachment, while RCMP officers are redeployed to other RCMP detachments/units. During this phase, SPS officers work under

that joined SPS before them, want RCMP, which is the current police

Phase 2 of the transition will begin on November 29, 2024, when SPS will become the police of jurisdiction, taking over responsibility for policing and law enforcement in Surrey. The RCMP will provide support to SPS until the transition is complete.

To-date, SPS has hired 367 police officers and 60 civilian employees. SPS is the second largest municipal police agency in BC and will grow to have 860 police officers by the end of 2027 (as per the City of Surrey's Five-Year Financial Plan), and hundreds of civilian staff.

These new worker protections represent a starting point in addressing the challenges associated with this relatively new way of working. Following implementation, the ministry will monitor the sector to see if adjustments are needed in the future.

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
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
