

# Province, Surrey reach agreement on police transition; Province to provide \$30 million per year until 2029

SURREY, BC: The B.C. government and the City of Surrey have reached an agreement that will complete the transition to the Surrey Police Service (SPS) by providing oversight, accountability and cost mitigation for residents and businesses in Surrey.

"The people of Surrey have told both levels of government that they want us to be focused on keeping people safe," said Mike Farnworth, Minster of Public Safety and Solicitor General. "This agreement provides stability, certainty and safety for the people of Surrey. I look forward to working with the mayor and City of Surrey, the Surrey Police Service and



the RCMP to complete this transition as quickly as possible, while ensuring safety for Surrey residents."

Through the agreement, the Province will provide \$30 million per year to assist with

transition costs until 2029. The agreement also provides a financial guarantee of as much as \$20 million per year if SPS salary costs are higher than RCMP costs would be from 2029 to 2034 for actual costs.

The City of Surrey has agreed to fully support the transition and take all necessary steps to ensure the success of the transition to the Surrey Police Service. The city will continue working with partners to finalize transition planning documents and allocate adequate SPS budgets following the city's obligations under the Police

The City of Surrey has also agreed not levy a separate police tax for any costs relating to the police transition for a period of 10 years; and the city will provide SPS access to required space and operational needs including access to payroll,



# Sandokani Khol Narayana: Sahib Singh's Play on International Students Comes to White Rock

The ... students The influx of international Punjab from in recent years has sparked many discussions within the Indo-Canadian community. While the challenges faced by these students are frequently highlighted, solutions are seldom discussed. Sahib Singh, a renowned Punjabi theatre artist who previously brought attention to the caste system with his acclaimed play Lacchu Kabadiareturns with another thought-provoking production focusing on international students from Punjab.

Written and directed by Singh, "Sandokani Khol Narayana" narrates three distinct stories along with a central narrative about a retired school teacher passionate about education. This teacher opens a box filled with memories of his students. The main story revolves around an international student who goes to Canada for further studies.

In an interview with the LINK,

inspiration for this play. He said, "Over the past few years I have visited many countries. International students, their challenges and struggles were always part of my discussions with the local community. I feel there is lesser clarity about these students and the background they come from. This play seeks to understand the background of these students, their educational and cultural upbringing, and the work culture. When these students land in a completely different culture, an imbalance is inevitable."

Singh said that that the play is about the youth of Punjab facing numerous

challenges. "I aimed to address these issues through three different stories. The main story

is about the international student in Canada. The other stories involve students in Punjab, one grappling with communal strife and another dealing with the struggles of being a Dalit."

Singh says that not only international students but long-time residents of Canada should also come and watch the play. "Those who are settled here understand Punjab's culture and struggles. Sometimes, they feel current students have it easy, but these students face their own set of challenges, such as inflation and employment difficulties. Previously, one could work hard and dream of owning a house in Canada, but that is no longer the case."

Singh's plays are known to raise issues and concerns of today. Naam Likhari Nanaka, Samey di Daang,

and Gurpurab are just a few of the creations of Singh. He thinks that theatre is not about raising slogans or giving a message through activism, it is a place where an artist has a platform to stir the emotions of the audience and question the status quo of established beliefs.

When asked about the message of the play, Singh said that his intention is not to guide anyone in a specific direction. "The underlying theme is about the students—one international and two in Punjab. The play ends on a note of optimism and hope. It emphasizes that, despite the crisis, we can overcome it by introspecting and analyzing the situation, rather than playing the blame game."

## Two targeted shootings in busy Newton areas

Surrey's Scott Road and 72 avenue area is extremely busy. Especially during summer, the plazas and shops are busier with parents taking their kids for movies, shopping, and to the Strawberry Hill Library. However, the area has already been rocked by two shootings this week.

First shooting happened on July 5, 2024 at approximately 5:30 am when a male was shot in the parking lot of Home Depot on 7300 block of 122 Street.


The Surrey RCMP Serious Crime Unit conducted the investigation, and

investigators are working to determine all of the circumstances surrounding the shooting. Evidence-gathering is still underway, but initial indications are this was a targeted, isolated incident.

The second shooting happened on July 10 at 12:24 am, when Surrey RCMP responded to multiple reports of shots heard in the 12700-block of 66 Avenue. Frontline officers attended the area and conducted patrols.

While Frontline members were conducting the initial investigation on scene and patrolling the area, Surrey Memorial Hospital called Surrey RCMP to report a male attended the hospital and disclosed that he was shot. Officers attended the hospital and spoke with the victim. Evidence consistent with a shooting was then located in the driveway of a residence and on a vehicle.

Police believe this was a targeted incident as the victim is also known to police. "The victim has been uncooperative with investigators and sustained very minor injuries," police said.

# Premier David Eby is facing unfair criticism

Sometimes both the public and press make unfair criticism of our elected officials. I have been guilty of it as well.

The Vancouver Sun columnist Vaughan Plamer wrote a column last Saturday in which he was critical of Premier David Eby. The caption of the column reads: "Premier David Eby's centralized control may play a role in sud-

den cabinet resignations."

Palmer wrote that the resignations of three key ministers Bruce Ralston, Harry Bains and Rob Fleming was a surprise, because of the timing and because two had said they'd run again.

All three of them have been NDP MLA'S since 2005 and have served their constituents for almost 20 years.

Harry Bains is 72 and Bruce Ralston is 71. When should a politician resign? We see many politicians around the world who continue to run for office past 80. President Joe Biden is facing criticism for staying in politics past 80. It is dammed if you do and damned if you don't.

There are many factors that come into play when someone decides to retire. This is especially true of politicians because they want to make sure they are not seen as lame ducks if they announced their retirement too soon.

I am not sure what facts were considered by Rob Fleming before he announced not to seek re-election. However, I have discussed this with Harry Bains and know that his wife played in role in his decision. They had decided months ago that he would not seek re-election in October 2024. Just because he did not announce it months earlier did not mean that the decision was made in the last few weeks.

Similarly, I know from my sources that Bruce Ralston had decided a number of months ago not to seek re-election but chose not to announce it publicly. I have a feeling that all three Harry Bains, Bruce Ralston and Rob Fleming had conveyed their decisions to Premier

Eby many months ago.

I am not surprised that Bains and Ralston would think about retirement. Only a small percentage of people can make a commitment for another four years past the age of 70.

Bains said in a statement that, "it's time for someone else to continue the work we've begun."

Ralson in a statement to the Surrey Now-Leader said, "I've been at it almost 20 years, so I decided that it's time for the next phase of my life."

All three Bains, Ralston and Fleming have stated that they will campaign for the NDP in the next provincial election.

I do not know enough about Premier Eby or how he interacts with his cabinet ministers. I am certain that he did not have anything to do with the three ministers deciding not to run for re-election. If they were unhappy with him or the government, they would have said so. They had nothing to lose as they are leaving politics. There are also many other ministers and MLA's who have chosen to seek re-election.

There is a tendency amongst most of us to be cynical of the statements made by politicians. I feel in this case the columnist is being unfair to the Premier

# **Surrey Guru Nanak Food Bank** organizes Mega Food Drive



# **Surrey SFU New Medical School to** train family doctors starting Summer of 2026

ore family doctors will be trained faster as the new medical school at Simon Fraser University (SFU) moves forward with funding for space and operations, as well as a proposed three-year curriculum model and a founding dean.

"We're training a new generation of doctors with a focus on family medicine to provide the services we need in our communities," said Premier David Eby. "This investment in the first entirely new medical school in Western Canada in 55 years will mean more family doctors graduating each year to provide care for people.'

The interim site is at the existing building space at SFU's Surrey campus, as well as a leased space nearby. SFU will design,



renovate and equip the spaces to accommodate classrooms, labs, and faculty and staff office space. The Province is supporting the medical school through \$33.7 million in capital funding for interim space, alongside \$27 million in operational funding

English

through Budget 2024. This builds on a previous \$14 million for startup and planning.

The medical school focus on primary care and leverage the university's strength community engagement strong partnerships with the First

Nations Health Authority, Fraser Health Authority, other provincial health authorities and the practice community.

The proposed curriculum will follow a three-year, competencybased model, incorporating a minimum of 130 weeks of instruction. Collaboration, cultural safety and humility will be embedded throughout, along with First Nations and Métis knowledge systems and perspectives.

In May 2024, SFU's senate and board of governors formally approved the establishment of a school of medicine. The school is working toward candidate status with the Committee on the Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools, with the goal of preliminary accreditation

by fall 2025. Upon successful completion of planned accreditation stages within this timeframe, the school will have approval to recruit its first class to start in summer 2026.

On July 4, 2024, SFU's board approved Dr. David J. Price as the founding dean for the medical school. An alumnus of the UBC faculty of medicine, he practised comprehensive family medicine, including obstetrics and palliative care, in Vancouver for more than a decade. A nationally recognized leader in family medicine and primary care, he has held faculty and leadership roles in the department of family medicine at McMaster University since

"Taking on the founding dean role for Simon Fraser University's new school of medicine is both a huge honour and responsibility. I'm confident that our growing and diverse team is ready to tackle the job in creating a primary and community care focused medical school that all British Columbians will be proud of. The partnership and contributions of the First Nations Health Authority and Fraser Health among others will be critical to our success, and I look forward to developing and deepening those relationships," said Dr. David Price, founding dean, SFU school of medicine.

# Inderjit Singh Sandhu gets life sentence for killing wife

Lhusband of slain Kamaljit Sandhu was sentenced to Slife in prison without parole eligibility for 13 years on July

45 year old Kamaljit was located with life threatening injuries by police at her residence in the 2900-block of Eastview Street, in Abbotsford on July 28, 2022. Despite the best efforts of the responding officers and paramedics, Kamaljit Sandhu later sadly succumbed to her injuries. 48-year old Inderjit Singh Sandhu, Kamaljit's husband, was located on scene and taken into custody in relation to the homicide. Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) took conduct of the investigation and continued to work closely in partnership with AbbyPD and the BC Coroners Service to

advance the investigation. On April 19, 2024, Inderjit to second-degree murder. Singh Sandhu appeared in Abbotsford Supreme Court,

where he entered a guilty plea Kamaljit also known as Kam by her colleagues was a bank

employee. A GoFundMe Page was set up for Kamaljit Sandhu by Sean Kelly. Kelly wrote on the page, "On July 28, 2022, we lost one of the most caring, loving, kind and strong women I have met. I was privileged to work alongside Kam for the last year in a half at the Seven Oaks Branch of RBC. One of our expert front-line advisors, she led with care and empathy with all of our clients and patiently worked with the staff, helping to teach and mentor individuals. She was funny, sweet, and went out of her way to make you feel good about yourself and what was going on in your world. Her passing is a tragedy. Kam leaves behind two children. This fundraiser is created to generate funds to assist the family in any way. Please show your love and support with your donations."

# **Squamish woman** who traveled to Syria to join ISIS arrested and charged

Pacific Region RCMP Federal Policing Policing Integrated National Security Enforcement Team (INSET) have arrested and charged a 51-year-old woman in relation to terrorism related offences.

Kimberly Polman, a resident of Squamish, British Columbia, was charged for leaving Canada to Participate in the Activity of Terrorist Group.

These charges stem from an ongoing criminal investigation regarding allegations that the individual left Canada and traveled to Syria in 2015 to join ISIS. Polman was repatriated to Canada in October 2022 and was placed on a series of bail conditions. She has been subject to a Terrorism Peace Bond under s.810.011 of the Criminal Code since November 7, 2023.

"The success of this investigation is directly attributable to the work done by our dedicated investigators and the strength of our policing intelligence partnerships. Along

with our Canadian and International partners, the RCMP remains committed to combatting violent extremism both in Canada and abroad," said Superintendent Jag Dhot, Pacific Region RCMP Federal Policing INSET.

"Policing partners, local communities and families are all key in the successful identification, prevention and disruption activities, terrorist as well as individual disengagement from violent extremism."

Polman is scheduled to make her next court appearance on Friday, August 2, 2024 in Vancouver Provincial Court.

# Two additional suspects charged in connection to robbery of a jewellery store

n investigation led by Surrey An investigation less Crime Unit has resulted in charges against four people in relation to an alleged robbery at a jewellery store in Guildford earlier this year.

On February 18, 2024 at 6:23 p.m., Surrey RCMP responded to a report of shots fired at a jewellery store in the 15200-block of 101 Avenue, where one person sustained nonlife-threatening injuries.

In connection with the robbery, Michael Onischuk and Larissa Cowan were arrested in Calgary,

Alberta, on February 27, 2024. They were charged and remanded until their next court appearance.

Through further investigation two additional suspects were identified and arrested on April 28, in Edmonton, Alberta with the assistance of Edmonton Police Service (EPS) Emergency Response Team and Major Crime Unit.

Thirty-eight-year-old Jenna Interman, was charged with robbery using a restricted or prohibited firearm and aggravated assault. The other suspect was released pending further investigation.

On June 6, Calgary Police Service arrested 44-year-old, Rebecca Powless in relation to Surrey RCMP's ongoing investigation. Charges were laid against her, including robbery using a restricted or prohibited firearm, aggravated assault, and discharge a firearm with intent to wound/disfigure.

# **Surrey Council approves Design Contract for 72 Avenue Extension**

uring Monday night's Regular Council Meeting, Surrey City Council approved a \$744K contract to Aplin & Martin Consultants Ltd. to design the 72 Avenue Extension from 152 Street to 176 Street. The 72 Avenue Extension is a critical infrastructure project that will provide a new corridor for traffic, improve agricultural access, and enhance the overall safety of the area.

66I am thrilled to see this landmark project begin," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "The 72 Avenue extension, with an estimated cost of \$138 million, marks a major milestone in the City's history as the largest municipal transportation investment to date. This transformative project will have far-reaching benefits, not only enhancing traffic flow and alleviating congestion in the area, but also significantly improving the overall quality of life for our residents and commuters. The 72 Avenue extension will be a crucial artery in our regional



network, transportation connecting people and goods across our city and beyond. I am proud to say that my Council is taking a bold and proactive approach to shaping our future and ensuring Surrey remains a thriving hub for living, working, and doing business." The 72 Avenue improvements will see the construction of a four-lane road with two travel lanes in each direction, improved agricultural ditches, and wider shoulders to accommodate farm vehicles and cyclists. This scenario, based on traffic modelling, ensures adequate traffic capacity well into the future while addressing the needs of community.

The corridor is expected to have regional significance, providing a continuous connection between Highway 91 to

both transportation users and the farming Highway 15 and offering a desirable route into Langley and Maple Ridge. Given its importance for the movement of people and goods throughout the region,

# Province, Surrey reach agreement on police...

IT and other operational systems. "Surrey city council has worked hard to ensure that the provincial government would support the police transition beyond its initial \$150-million offer," said Brenda Locke, mayor of Surrey. "With the \$250 million now offered by the Province, Surrey council has accepted the provincial funding for the police transition. The new funds from the Province will help to lessen the financial impact of the transition to Surrey taxpayers. City council fully recognizes the service of the RCMP in Surrey. We express our gratitude for everything Surrey RCMP has done to serve and protect our community for the past 70 years with their exemplary service. Through integrated policing units, such as IHIT, RCMP will continue to support the people of Surrey. As we go through this process, council will be constantly working in the

best interests of Surrey taxpayers." The SPS will become the police of jurisdiction on Nov, 29, 2024. With this agreement, the city has appointed two leading experts in the policing field, Tonia Enger and Clayton Pecknold to represent the city at the Joint Implementation Table, alongside representatives from the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General, Public Safety Canada, the RCMP and the SPS. This table and the parties represented are leading the largest police transition in Canada.

The Surrey police board's budget for 2024-25 fits within Surrey's financial framework. The budget sets out a plan to hire 526 SPS officers by the end of 2024 making up approximately two-thirds of the city's authorized policing strength for 2024.

At this point in the transition, the SPS is already the second largest

municipal police department in the Province, after the Vancouver Police Department, with 431 sworn officers and support staff. On July 2, 2024, the SPS launched the first 10 SPS-branded vehicles into service and will deploy 20 more cars over the summer as it works toward becoming the police of jurisdiction. When the SPS becomes the police of jurisdiction on Nov. 29, 2024, the BC RCMP will provide transitional supports for the remainder of the transition period to ensure a seamless transition.

The city's current authorized policing strength is 785 officers and is scheduled to increase by 25 officers per year, according to the city's fiscal outlook to reflect the population growth of the Surrey. The full transition is targeted to be completed in late 2026.

# Punjabi Male arrested.

It is the second time this vear that Thind has been charged with extortion.

Dupinderdeep Cheema, a 36-year-old man from Brampton; Beant Dhillon, a 51-year-old man from Arundeep Brampton; Thind, a 39-yearold man of unknown address; Mustapha Alawiye, a 32-year-old man from Mississauga; Kymani Hassakourinas, a 32-year-old man from Mississauga were arrested and charged.

According to police, these men were involved in multiple extortions between December 2023 and May 2024 where they extorted victims by assaulting, threatening and discharging firearms.

It turns out Arundeep Thind was also arrested in early January this year when on January 26, 2024, a 32-year-old victim allegedly received a phone call and threatening WhatsApp messages demanding large sums of money. Thind was arrested when Peel police launched a task force in December into a number of extortion incidents targeting the South Asian business community. The police said he was held for a bail hearing and attended the Ontario Court of Justice in Brampton in February.

The Conservative Party of Canada led by Pierre Poilievre blamed increasing extortions and violence on the Liberal government's "reckless policies." He claimed that since Trudeau became Prime Minister, extortion is up 218 percent across Canada while violent crime has risen by 39 percent. "This is happening because the Liberal Government made it easier for gangsters and extortionists to get out of jail and re-offend. They did this by passing Bill C-5, which eliminated mandatory jail time for committing extortion with a firearm, and by passing Bill C-75, which makes it easier for repeat offenders to get back onto our streets."

The South Asian Business community has been rocked across Canada by extortion calls with maximum cases cropping in Lower Mainland, Brampton and Edmonton.

Extortions calls started as rumours in 2023 October. But a few months later, police confirmed that the South Asian businesses were indeed facing threats through phone calls, WhatsApp messages, and letters, compelling them to provide monetary concessions. The cases were confirmed in Surrey, West Vancouver, Abbotsford, Edmonton (Alberta), and Brampton (Ontario).

The Vedic Hindu Cultural Society of BC and led by Satish Kumar, President of Society and Lakshmi Narayan Temple also organized a big forum in January of 2024 to bring Canadian politicians and law enforcement agencies together to raise awareness about these threat calls.

The primary focus of the forum was to urge victims to report extortions, explore the modus operandi of these incidents, and deliberate on the measures taken by local police and government officials to combat this unusual crime. However, a complication in BC's judicial system, where charges must be approved by the Crown, was identified as a contributing factor to delays.

In February, a nation-wide alliance of various police departments across Canada was put in place to help coordinate and advance a series of threat/ extortion investigations. Peel Regional Police quickly put together our Extortion Investigative Task Force (EITF) for the sole purpose of protecting community and to hold those responsible, accountable.







# **Record number of MPs with Punjab roots enter UK's House of Commons**

record number of Pun-Ajab-origin politicians entered the UK's House of Commons last Friday as the Labour Party registered a historic victory in the parliamentary elections. The count stood at five in 2019.

Of the 12 MPs, which includes six women, 11 belong to the Labour Party while Gagan Mohindra is from the Conservative Party. The prominent faces include Preet Kaur Gill from Birmingham Edgbaston, Seema Malhotra from Feltham and Heston and Tanmanjeet Singh Dhesi from Slough.

The trio have their roots in Jalandhar. Seema has won for record fifth time while it's third term for both Gill and Dhesi. Gill is said to be a



frontrunner to be a minister in the new UK cabinet. "An honour and a privilege to be re-elected again as an MP for Birmingham Edgbaston. Thank you to everyone who put their trust in me. I will continue to serve the people and place I love," Gill wrote on X. Her father Daljit Singh was the longest-serving president of Guru Nanak Gurdwara at Smethwick, which was the first Sikh shrine in the UK.

Gill was elected as a councillor for Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council in 2012 and re-elected in 2016. In 2017, she was give the ticket by the Labour Party from Birminghan Edgbaston and she became the first woman British-Sikh MP.

Dhesi, who is the first turbaned Sikh MP in the UK, posted on X, "Huge honour to be re-elected by the good people of #Slough as their MP. They voted for change, unity and progress,

which is what I will work hard to deliver."

Dhesi's father Jaspal Singh Dhesi is the former president of Guru Nanak Darbar Gurdwara at Gravesend, the largest Sikh shrine in the UK. He was first elected as a councillor to the Gravesham Borough Council in 2007. He later went on to become the Gravesham Mayor between 2011 and 2012. He lost his MP poll from Gravesham in 2015, but won in 2017, 2019 and 2024 from Slough.



# **2025** Mazda CX-70 PHEV GT- Aspirational SUV Impresses!

The new 2025 Mazda CX-70 is not really new, it is based on the stellar Mazda CX-90 SUV but without the third row of seats. Still, it is as luxurious and refined as the CX-90, transporting five people in roomy comfort. There are only minor differences. as well, with a deleted third seats and slightly different grille wheels and bumpers, plus blacked-out exterior trim. For 2025 added features include Amazon Alexa integration, and an underfloor storage compartment in the cargo area. It is a handsome, sporty vehicle with smooth unpolarizing lines.

The CX-70 is available with the standard e-Skyactiv G 3.3L turbo engine with 280 horsepower and 332 lb-ft of torque. The electrified powertrain options include two versions of the MAZDA e-Skyactiv G 3.3L inline-six turbo with 48-volt M-Hybrid Boost, and e-Skyactiv PHEV powertrain. All three choices are joined to an eight-speed automatic transmission and standard i-Activ all-wheel drive. Towing is rated at

a maximum capacity of 5,000 lbs when suitably equipped. There is also a high -output e-Skyactiv G 3.3L turbo engine producing an impressive 340 hp and 369 lb-ft of torque with premium fuel.

We tested the e-Skyactiv PHEV version of the CX-70 which features an electric motor powered by a 17.8-kWh battery pack paired with a 2.5L four-cylinder. This combination produces 323 hp and 369 lbft of torque on 93 octane fuel. Mazda says the CX-70 PHEV can travel up to 50 kilometres on electric power and return an energy consumption rating as low as 4.2 Le/100 km. Th e PHEV equipped with the right tow package can tow up to 3,500 lbs.

Pricing for CX -70starts at \$49,750 for the GS-L, \$54,350 for the GT and \$58,300 for the GT-P and tops out at \$62,300 for the Signature. PHEV pricing starts at \$58,750 for the PHEV GS-L, with the PHEV GT as tested coming in at \$63,350.

The CX-70 comes well equipped as standard with a 12.3-inch infotainment system with Mazda's latest operating system, but no touch screen, there's a control knob and a hard button on the center console that operate the display. Apple CarPlay and Android Auto capabilities are standard, and there is also the option for Amazon Alexa connectivity integration. A 12.3-inch digital gauge display and a head-up display are both optional.

Premium trims and above come with a 12-speaker Bose stereo system, quilted Nappa leather upholstery and leather-wrapped steering wheel, plus suede trim on the dash. Options include the high line Signature version with the 12.3-inch digital gauge display with a head-up Active Driver Display, Mazda Connect central infotainment display with touch control and other extras.

The CX-70 interior is rich in appearance and quality of materials and offers a sharp highly effective look combining



sport and comfort. High points include a roomy interior, features laden technology, excellent safety Features and a high -quality cabin and comfort area for six-footers both front and back. The trunk on the CX-70 has 1,131 litres behind the second row and 2,147 litres when the second row is folded flat. There is s another 30 litres of hidden storage under the floor where the third row of seats on

the CX-90 Would have been.

The PHEV version, which costs about the same as the high output, is quick when needed. It can be set to drive exclusively on electric power, It can also drive solely on gas power to recharge or conserve the battery.

On the road, the CX-70 performs well wit decent acceleration and good handling. The all-wheel drive system has a rear

tuned bias with Mazda's "kinematic posture control" that acts on the rear suspension, - its automatic systems that will apply braking to select wheels if the sensors detect lift at the rear of the CX-70 on corners and acceleration. As more immigrants come to Canada searching avenues for a better life, the



society naturally becomes more multicultural and diverse. At the same time, the government is committed to a policy to achieve quality in economic, social, cultural, and political life. Multiculturalism can lead to many great outcomes, including racial and ethnic and linguistic harmony, which simply means that people from distinct cultures get along well together. Canada takes the concept of multiculturalism a step further with the importance it attaches to individual freedoms.

Diversity is Canada's strength. In one of his addresses, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said, "Canada has learned how to be strong not despite our differences, but because of them, and going forward, that capacity will be at the heart of both our success and of what we offer the world. Our commitment to diversity and inclusion is not about Canadians being nice and polite – though of course we are.

In fact, this commitment is a powerful and ambitious approach to making Canada and the world a better and safer place." About one-fifth of Canadians were born elsewhere. In Toronto, the largest city, more than half were born outside Canada. The country has shown that inclusive diversity is a strength that can vanquish intolerance, radicalism, racism, and hate. Canadian policy refuses to see a contradiction between individual liberty and collective identity. On the contrary, it has created a society where both thrive and mutually reinforce one another. Here the cooperation and understanding among various religions and communities is exemplary. In times of adversity, all come together.

It is not that Canada has not committed mistakes in the past on account of ethnic and racial grounds, but it has recognized, accepted, and rectified those wrongs by The Charter of Rights and Freedoms, The Multiculturalism Act, The Official Languages Act and welcoming Muslims, Jews, Sikhs, Hindus and Buddhists to practice their religion as they choose. Refugees from politically ravaged countries are welcome into Canada with open arms.



The Canadian Bill of Rights of August 1960 was a bold step in the protection of human rights. 

Makwana was served a notice under Section 41-A of the CrPC on June 26 and was directed to join the probe on June 30, but she didn't comply.

The social media influencer had claimed that when she practised 'shirshasana' in the parikrama on June 21, she was never stopped by anyone, including the SGPC's task force.

She had also questioned that how could she, as a first-time visitor from Gujarat, be aware of the 'code of conduct' of the Golden Temple.

SGPC chief Harjinder Singh

Dhami had revealed that Makwana had submitted an apology letter to them and the Akal Takht secretariat, but her act was not pardonable, especially keeping in view her aggressive behaviour.

SGPC secretary Partap Singh said the issue pertained to misconduct and religious was referred to the Amritsar administration after objections were received from several devotees. The SGPC had also suspended two of its staffers and penalised third staff member, besides transferring him out of the city.

# Sikh community support for Trump is 4 times more than what it was in 2020: Indian-American Jasdip Singh

Observing that the June 27 presidential debate did have some impact on the popularity of Donald Trump, the head of "Sikh Americans for Trump" has said the former president's victory will depend on whether the election is free, fair, and legal. "I think our community is very much in support. I have seen a lot of support in favour of President Trump. We are raising funds for President Trump. We are going to the convention soon," Maryland-based community leader Jasdip Singh Jassee, head of "Sikh Americans for Trump", told PTI ahead of the Republican National Convention (RNC) in Milwaukee next

Republican delegates from across the country, during the four-day RNC convention in Milwaukee, would formally nominate Trump as their presidential candidate for the November 5 general election. Incumbent President Joe Biden is the presumptive nominee of the Democratic party.

"We will be mobilising our team nationwide this time, even on the West Coast, in New York, Texas, in support of President Trump," said Jassee, who has been appointed on the finance committee for President Trump, the Trump 47.

"We all knew about President Biden's issues that he had for the last four years, but it was very interesting to see ... for the American public and media, to see it during the debate how much President Biden has declined his mental capacity

and his thought processes, which was very evident throughout. But somehow, the American media was kind of controlling it and not letting the people know about it," he said in response to a question.

"So right now, we see that the debate did have some impact on President Trump's popularity, but the country's overall situation, such as inflation, illegal immigration, a disorderly border at this time, the infrastructure, the violence and the crime that is happening in America, and also zero foreign policy where America is not a leader anymore," he observed.

"All of this has had an impact on Biden's campaign in addition to his debate performance and his physical and mental capacity. But again, the key issue is what



President Trump said in the debate when he was asked a question, will you accept the verdict? He said if it is a fair, legal, and honest election, yes, I will. So again, the key is, if this election is going to be fair,

#### n July 3, 2024, Agassiz RCMP members were training on Harrison Lake where they noticed a group of people on flotation devices who had been pushed away from shore by the wind. Exhausted from swimming, the Members utilized a throw line to tow the group to safety.

Water recreation can be a lot of fun, but it also presents certain risks, especially when spending the day in the hot sun. Pool floats, inflatable rafts, and children's water wings are not safety devices. While they reduce the effort required for swimming, they do not eliminate the risk. Swimmers are reminded of the following safety guidelines:

- Wear a Personal Floatation Device (PFD): This is especially important for non-swimmers and children.
- · Understand the differences between natural water and pools: Being water competent in natural water requires additional knowledge and skills.
- Check the weather: Changes in temperature and wind can quickly increase swimming difficulty.
- Know your environment: Fast-moving currents, waves and rapids can be dangerous even in shallow water. Dropoffs, dams, underwater obstacles, rocks and debris can all present unexpected
- Be aware of cold-water risks.
- · Avoid alcohol while participating in water activities.

"I urge everyone to prioritize safety while enjoying our beautiful lake," says Sergeant Andy Lot, Detachment Commander with the Agassiz RCMP. Always wear

a lifejacket, stay within designated swimming areas, and keep an eye on changing weather conditions. Let's work together to ensure that everyone's time on the water is both safe and fun.

According to the BC Coroners Service, between 2008-2012:

- 58.7 per cent of drowning deaths occur between May and August
- 81.1 per cent of drowning victims were
- Alcohol and/or drugs were contributing factors in 40.2 per cent of drowning deaths
- People between the ages of 20-29 were most likely to be victims of drowning

Of the 397 deaths, just over 50 per cent (200) were involved in recreational activities such as swimming and boating, 44.1 per cent (175) involved falls into water, motor vehicle incidents where vehicles landed in water or deaths in bathtubs; and 5.5 per cent (220) were occupational.

Whether you are in a canoe, kayak, SUP or inflatable tube, if you're getting from Point A to Point B, you're navigating and must carry mandatory safety equipment as outlined by Transport Canada's Small Vessel Regulations.

This includes:

- · A correctly fitted Personal Floatation Device (PDF)
- A buoyant heaving line
- A whistle

Here are a few simple safety tips to remember:

- If you cannot swim, stay out of the water and seek the shade instead.
- Wear a personal flotation device. Tragedy can strike in an instant. Don't assume that you will have time to put on a lifejacket.
- Watch your speed. Don't race to the lake and don't race on the lake. Speed is a major contributor to incidents on the roadways and on the water.
- Do not put your feet in fast moving water that is deeper than the length of your arm. If a foot becomes entrapped by rocky

bottom in deep water, the current will and when you expect to return. eventually push the swimmer over face first into the water.

• If you are going to a less-traveled area, let someone know where you are going

• Always remember that alcohol and water don't mix. Impaired driving laws are the same for operating a boat as they are for a vehicle.
