

Tragic Trend Of Fatal Crashes: Sandeep Cheema, Father Of 2 Young Girls, Dead In Crash Along Highway 17

When Sandeep left home for work on July 16, he told his daughters, Sargun (6) and Mehar (2), and his wife, Manjeet, that he would be back soon. Little did he know that he would never return. Just one turn away from finishing his shift, he tragically lost his life in a crash.

Sandeep Singh Cheema, 41, a Surrey resident was the victim of the two tractor trailers crash along Highway 17 and and 116 Avenue this week.

Sandeep's death is a heartwrenching blow, as highlighted in a fundraiser aimed at



supporting his bereaved family. The fundraiser notes the poignant detail that Sandeep's father too had lost his life in a

car crash in 2012. The Surrey RCMP informed that July 16, 2024, at approximately 8:10 pm there was a report of a collision involving two tractor-trailers along Highway 17 and 116 Avenue.

One of the drivers, a 41-yearold man, was taken to hospital with serious injuries. The driver and passenger of the other tractor-trailer, a 44-yearold man and 64-year-old man, were also taken to hospital for further assessment and since have been released.

BC, Alberta Burning In Wildfires: Jasper Turns To Ashes



B.C. continues to see more wildfires. The BC wildfire service informed that there were 423 active wildfires as of Thursday morning, and 23 started in the last 24 hours. About 80 percent of the fires were started by lightning, and about six percent were caused by humans. The BCWS says a recent thunderstorm brought 58,000 lightning strikes, and they expect to see new fire starts from those over the next few days. A wildfire has reached the Jasper town site in Alberta, Canada, too. Parks Canada confirmed multiple structures in the mountain town are impacted. IHIT Requests Public Assistance In Homicide Of Jatinder Michael Sandhu



On the 8th anniversary, Michael Sandhu's family continue to remember him as the eldest brother of three siblings, a beloved son, with a heart of gold.

The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) continues to request public assistance in the homicide of Jatinder Michael Sandhu, in what is now classified as an unsolved case.

On July 23, 2016, the Surrey RCMP responded to a shooting

90A Avenue. First responders found two victims suffering from gunshot wounds. One victim sustained survivable injuries. The other victim was 28-year-old Jatinder Michael Sandhu, who was transported to hospital, but succumbed to his injuries.

Surrey RCMP release video of South Asian male wanted for Stranger sexual assault in Newton

Currey RCMP has released a video of • The South Asian male who is wanted in a stranger sexual assault investigation. According to police on July 20, 2024 at 03:15 am, police was called to a report of a stranger sexual assault in the 14100-block of 91 Avenue. The victim reported that she was woken up by a man groping her in her residence. The victim screamed for help and the suspect fled. In order to advance the investigation, Surrey RCMP is releasing a video of a person of interest. The person of interest is described as a South Asian man in his early 20s, 5'7 to 5'10 tall, average build, with a dark moustache and medium length



beard, wearing an orange turban, long dark coloured shorts with a white stripe

down the side, a dark blue t-shirt and flip flops. This individual may go by the name Akash.

"Surrey RCMP Special Victims Unit has a dedicated team of investigators actively canvassing in the neighbourhood to identify this man," said Sgt. Tammy Lobb, Surrey RCMP Media Relations Officer. "We are asking the public to contact police if they recognize this individual or they are familiar with a man matching this description who may go by the name Akash."

Soccer coach Jasmin Mander along with other staff sent home from Paris Olympics after drone scandal

wo Canadian women's soccer team staff members have been sent home amid allegations of recording New Zealand team soccer practice with drone on the eve of the 2024 Olympics.

Joseph Lombardi and Jasmine Mander are the two staff members who have been officially removed from the team according to a Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) media statement.

In an initial press release COC said, "The Canadian Olympic Committee was made aware that a non-accredited member of the Canada Soccer support team was detained by French authorities in Saint-Étienne following a complaint by New Zealand Football on July 22nd. The staff member is believed to have been using a drone to record the New Zealand

women's football team during practice."

The COC said that it would provide update after reviewing next steps with the IOC, Paris 2024,

Canada Soccer, and FIFA. The COC informed later, "Following its review of the July 22 drone incident in Saint-Étienne, and upon learning of a

second drone incident at a July 19th New Zealand practice, the Canadian Olympic Committee has imposed the following sanctions and consequences Joseph Lombardi, an unaccredited analyst with Canada Soccer, is being removed from the Canadian Olympic Team and will be sent home immediately. Jasmine Mander, an assistant coach to whom Mr. Lombardi report sent, is being removed from the Canadian Olympic Team and will be sent home immediately," the release said.

The statement also said that COC has accepted the decision of Head Coach Bev Priestman to remove herself from coaching the match against New Zealand on July 25th. Also Canada Soccer staff will undergo mandatory

ethics training.

Women's Canada Soccer's National Team Head Coach Bev Priestman said in a statement: "On behalf of our entire team, I first and foremost want to apologize to the players and staff at New Zealand Football and to the players on Team Canada. This does not represent the values that our team stands for," Priestman said. "I am ultimately responsible for conduct in our program. Accordingly, to emphasize our team's commitment to integrity, I have decided to voluntarily withdraw from coaching the match on Thursday. In the spirit of accountability. I do this with the interests of both teams in mind and to ensure everyone feels that the sportsmanship of this game is upheld."

Free replacement documents and measures for people affected by the 2024 wildfire season

Last year, Canada experienced the worst wildfire season on record, which threatened the health, safety and economic stability of people in Canada and their communities. Canada's climate

is warming twice as fast as the global average.

As our climate continues to change, extreme hot temperatures will become more frequent and more intense due to climate



change. This will increase the severity of heat waves and contribute to increased drought and wildfire risks. The Government of Canada is committed to supporting those affected across the county and assisting provinces and territories with their emergency responses.

Marc Miller, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, announced special measures for people affected by wildfires. Canadian citizens and permanent residents directly affected by wildfires can get free replacement documents. These include permanent resident cards, Canadian citizenship certificates, Canadian passports and other travel documents that are lost, damaged, destroyed or inaccessible due to wildfires. Additionally, people in Canada affected by wildfires who are employer-specific work permit holders will have the ability to transition to an open work permit.

These special measures are in effect until November 30, 2024. This will give people the time they need to determine which documents need to be replaced or to sort out temporary status issues, while focusing on their families, their homes and their communities.

International students, temporary foreign workers and other visitors directly affected by the wildfires, and whose status will expire by November 30, 2024, are also eligible to restore or extend their status in Canada, or to replace a status document, free of charge. This means that temporary workers who are unable to work because their workplace is closed due to the fires will be able to extend their status. In addition, international students can extend their study permits if their classes are delayed or cancelled and finish their studies without penalty.

Additional measures have been put in

place to exempt foreign emergency services personnel entering Canada to help fight wildfires from paying application fees and biometrics fees. This proactive measure serves as both a gesture of gratitude and a means to facilitate their critical work.

More information about who is eligible, how to apply, and what replacement documents are covered under the special measures is available on IRCC's website. "We remain steadfast in our efforts to support those affected by severe wildfires. Our measures will simplify the process for Canadians, permanent residents and temporary residents to replace lost documents. To the first responders and firefighters across the country, as well as the foreign emergency support personnel entering Canada to assist in the response, we extend our heartfelt gratitude for your bravery and dedication in protecting our communities," said Miller.

Resolution presented to demand "Komagata Maru" be restored to its original designation, "Guru Nanak Jahaz"

It came two days before the 110th anniversary of the forcible return of a Japanese vessel carrying more than 350 Indian passengers from Vancouver's harbour.

Widely known as the Komagata Maru, the ship was chartered by Gurdit Singh under the name Guru Nanak Jahaaz. Being a practising Sikh, Singh chose to name the ship after the founder of the Sikh religion. Even otherwise, Guru Nanak himself was a great traveller.

Those who came on the ship to Vancouver were turned back under racist immigration laws for which the Canadian government has already apologized in Parliament. Those passengers came to this part of the world as British subjects.

The entire episode is largely known as the "Komagata Maru incident". So much so, the memorial carrying the names of the



passengers and their huge picture is named as such at Harbour Green Park where the Sunday event was held. The organizers read

out resolutions asking for the amendment to the name of the vessel. They also released an autobiography authored by Gurdit Singh, which identifies the ship as Guru Nanak Jahaaz.

The book's editor, Gurdev Singh Sidhu, was in attendance. He acknowledged that Sikhs need to reclaim their history.

The resolutions were read out in English, French and Punjabi. While famous author and veteran Sikh activist Gian Singh Sandhu read out the resolutions in English, Sahib Kaur Dhaliwal and Bhupinder Singh Malih read them out in French and Punjabi, respectively.

Gurdwaras endorse Komagata Maru's demand.

An Indigenous activist from Musqueam band Cecilia Point opened the event with a traditional song. Among the elected officials who spoke were the members of Parliament from Surrey-Newton, Sukh Dhaliwal, Education Minister Rachna Singh, and Comm. Jas Virdi of the Vancouver Park Board.

A well-known Punjabi-language media personality, Gurvinder Singh Dhaliwal, was the master of the ceremony and Raj Singh Bhandall and Tajinderpal Singh Director of Guru Nanak Jahaaz Heritage Society were the main organisers of the event.

Representatives of different gurdwaras in Metro Vancouver were also present and endorsed the demand. In an era of reconciliation and decolonization, the Canadian government needs to look into the issue deeply and address it. Especially considering that Guru Nanak was a symbol of inclusion and social justice who challenged power and stood up for the underdog.

Jason Richard Gill of Surrey stabbed during a fight

 \mathbf{J} ason Richard Gill, a 47-year-old resident of Surrey died after an altercation with another person. The police say that Gill was stabbed during the fight.

The incident occurred on July 23, 2024, at approximately 11:50 p.m. Surrey RCMP responded to a complaint of a fight in the 6600 block of King George Boulevard, Surrey. First responders, attended and located a man suffering from multiple stab wounds. Despite life-saving efforts from both officers and British Columbia Emergency Health Services (BC EHS), the man succumbed to his injuries on scene.

Witnesses reported seeing a suspect male, fleeing the scene.

IHIT investigators have identified the victim as 47-year-old Jason Richard Gill, from Surrey, and are releasing his name in hopes of advancing the investigation.

IHIT says this incident is not believed to be linked to the BC Gang Conflict.

The preliminary investigation suggests



that the two individuals were engaged in an altercation resulting in the victim being fatally stabbed. It is unknown if the two parties were known to each other or the motivation for this tragic incident.

The suspect seen fleeing the area is described as a white male, 6 feet tall, who was clean shaven and had short, sandy colored blonde hair.

"We are in the early stages of the investigation, and investigators are working to determine the motive," said Corporal Esther Tupper of IHIT, "If you saw a male matching the suspect description in the area around the time of the homicide, please contact IHIT immediately." IHIT is seeking witnesses, dash camera or surveillance video in the area of the 6600 Block of King George Boulevard, Surrey between July 23, 2024 at 11:00 p.m. and July 24, 2024 3:00 a.m. If you have any information, please contact the IHIT Information Line at 1-877-551-IHIT (4448) or by email at ihitinfo@ rcmp-grc.gc.ca.

Missing Wenyan Michael Zhao found deceased in Port Kells

Michael Zhao of Langley was reported missing by his family on the evening of July 18, 2024. He was last seen in the 5900-block of 206 Street, Langley BC.

On July 19, 2024 at 5:30 am, Surrey RCMP located a deceased person in the 17900-block of 99A Avenue and identified him is Zhao to further the investigation.

The death is deemed suspicious at this time and IHIT was taking conduct of investigation.

At this stage, based on initial observations and information collected, investigators believe this to be an isolated incident. the B.C. Gang Conflict. speaking Canvassers are with family and friends of Michael Zhao and are constructing a timeline of his activities. Michael Zhao was last seen leaving the area of Willowbrook Mall in Langley at around 9:44 p.m. He was last seen wearing a tan / brown coloured t-shirt with "Nike" on the front in white writing, dark shorts with tan trim along the bottom, and sneakers.

"This remains a suspicious death," said Corporal Esther Tupper of IHIT, "investigators are still working diligently to

build a timeline of Michael Zhao's movements on the evening he was last seen alive." IHIT investigators are looking information regarding for the movements of Michael between 9:00 p.m. on July 18. to 5:30 a.m. on July 19, 2024. CCTV footage from the Willowbrook Mall area is being released to help identify potential witnesses. Brampton's Inderpal Dhillon arrested with 17 others for violent Home Invasions, robberies and Carjackings

Peel Region Police of Ontario initiated Project Warlock in response to the concerning escalation of home invasionstyle robberies, armed robberies, and carjacking's occurring within Peel Region and throughout the Greater Toronto Area (GTA). Police this week announced that they made numerous arrests, executed multiple search warrants, and laid a significant number of charges.

An Indo Canadian man Inderpal Dhillon, a 26-year-old from Brampton, was part of the arrests. Police said that Dhillon at the time of his arrest was an employee of ServiceOntario is charged with breach of Trust by Public Officer (X2).

All together 18 individuals arrested, 150 Criminal Code



Offence charges laid, 17 violent home invasions, armed robberies and carjackings solved 12 stolen vehicles recovered, valued over \$1,200,000.00,

Over \$55,000 worth of stolen property recovered, Over 60 warrants executed, search Seizure of four prohibited firearms, one with obliterated serial numberand Seizure of two imitation firearms.

Between November 2023 and January 2024, eight robbery incidents occurred in Brampton. Of these eight incidents, there were three home invasions, two involved firearms. There were two robberies involving firearms and three knife-point robberies. In addition, a series of carjackings occurred over a weekend in March 2024. These included five carjacking's across the Greater Toronto Area (GTA), in both Peel Region and York Region, involving multiple luxury vehicles.

Mandeep Singh of Mississauga arrested for fatal crash that killed 15 year old pedestrian

Deel region police in Ontario **I** have arrested and charged a 36-year-old man, as a result of a fatal collision investigation.

On Friday, July 12, 2024, at approximately 8:14 p.m., Peel Regional Police attended the area of McLaughlin Road and Horwood Drive in Brampton for reports of a violent collision. Investigation revealed that a collision occurred between two vehicles at this location and following the collision, one vehicle spun, mounting a sidewalk, striking and killing the victim who was walking in the area. The deceased victim was a 15-year-old resident from Brampton.

On Friday July 12, 2024, MCB investigators arrested Mandeep Singh, a 36-year-old man from Mississauga who was charged with following criminal offences:

-Failure or Refusal to Comply with Demand - Accident Resulting in Death (Alcohol)

-Dangerous Operation Causing Death

-Operation while Impaired Causing Death

He will appear before the Ontario Court of Justice for his special bail hearing on Friday, July 26, 2024.

Investigators are asking anyone who witnessed the collision, or who may have dash camera footage to call investigators with the Major Collision Bureau at (905) 453-2121, ext. 3710. Police later informed that the 41-yearold man had succumbed to his injuries. The police did not identify the victim, but local community members and media identified him as Sandeep Cheema.

A fundraiser was created by Kiran Singh brother in law of Cheema. In the fundraiser, Singh mentions that Sandeep passed away "as a result of a horrific head-on collision that occurred on July 16th, 2024, when a speeding semi-trailer drove through a red light as Sandeep was about to turn into his workplace to park his semi-trailer truck for the night and head home to his wife and daughters."

Sandeep was one turn away from finishing his shift, and reuniting with his family. After fighting for his life for several days in the ICU, Sandeep succumbed to his injuries, leaving his baby daughters and wife behind.

Sandeep immigrated to Surrey, BC, in 2012 after his father passed away in a car crash in 2012, and his mother passed away a few months after in 2013. After

becoming a husband in 2016, and a father shortly after, he began his new life with his new family. But that happiness would be short-lived.

"While Sandeep might be gone, his infectious spirit and his love for life are survived by his daughters and his wife. Sandeep's organs have also been donated so someone else's life can be

saved. As his family navigates this irreparable and heartbreaking loss, we ask you for your support. Your generous contributions will help the family repay his debts, provide support for their housing needs, and keep them afloat for a while. Your support will ensure that the family can honor Sandeep's memory and heal with a little less monetary strain,"

mentions the fundraiser. Sandeep's death is another reminder for all those out there on roads with reckless

driving. He was not the only person who has met with the ill fate. The BC highway patrols and various police departments in BC reported multiple accidents on the roads of BC. These were not just accidents, they were fatal that did not spare old, young or even the infants.

BC Coroner's Service reported that between Friday, July 5, and Wednesday, July 10, 2024, there were 19 accidental motor-vehicle-related deaths reported to the BC Coroners Service (BCCS). Twelve of those deaths occurred during three incidents reported in the Interior Health Authority. "This week has been marked by several fatal motor vehicle incidents on highways throughout British Columbia," said a release from the Coroner's Service.

'Exposes double standards': India on Canada charging two persons for online threats against PM Justin Trudeau



India has asked Canada to take action Lagainst anti-India elements operating from its soil. The comments by Indian External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal came when asked about reports that Canada has charged two persons for threatening on social media to kill Prime Minister Justin Trudeau but such actions are missing against those threatening Indian leaders and diplomats, PTI reported.

The RCMP Federal Policing Integrated resident of Edmonton, was charged with National Security Enforcement Team (INSET), Northwest Region this week arrested and charged two individuals for uttering threats against several public figures in two separate investigations.

On May 10, 2024, INSET received information that a user of the social media platform "X", formerly known as Twitter, had allegedly posted threats to kill Prime Minister Justin Trudeau. On June 6, 2024, Mason John Baker, 23, a resident of Calgary, was charged with uttering threats against a person contrary to section 264.1(1)(a) of the Criminal Code.

On June 7, 2024, INSET received information that a YouTube account user had allegedly posted threats to kill Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland and New Democrat Leader Jagmeet Singh. On June 13, 2024, Garry Belzevick, 67, a

three counts of uttering threats against a person contrary to section 264.1(1)(a) of the Criminal Code.

The RCMP said in a release, "The RCMP is mandated to investigate criminal offences arising from terrorism, espionage, cyber attacks, nuclear security risks, foreign influenced activities, incidents involving the security of an Internationally Protected Person (IPPs), the unlawful release of national security information and terrorist financing."

As part of its protective mandate, the RCMP is responsible for safeguarding designated Canadians and select foreign diplomatic personnel residing in Canada, as per Article 22 of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations, as well as visiting IPPs.

"The security environment in which public figures operate continues to evolve both within Canada and abroad, and we

recognize this is a time for increased vigilance," the press release mentioned.

"In the digital age, where so many interactions occur online and are perceived to be anonymous, there is a belief that virtual actions and words do not have consequences. When these virtual actions or words cross the boundaries of Charterprotected speech and constitute criminal activity, police will investigate thoroughly to hold those responsible accountable," said Insp. Matthew Johnson, Acting Officer in Charge of RCMP Federal Policing INSET, Northwest Region.

Following the news India's external affairs ministry called it double standards of Canada. "We have seen these reports. When a democracy adopts different yardsticks to measure or implement the rule of law and freedom of expression, it only exposes its own double standard," said Indian External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal. "We

expect Canada to take action against anti-India elements who have repeatedly threatened Indian leaders, institutions, airlines and diplomats by violence," he said. Recently Chandra Arya, Nepean MP in the Canada House of Commons, wrote on X that separatist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun released a video demanding that Arya and his Hindu-Canadian friends go back to India after he condemned the vandalism of the Hindu temple and other acts of violence by Khalistan supporters in Canada.

Bank of Canada lowers interest rate to 4.50 percent

The Bank of Canada lowered its overnight lending rate this morning by 25 basis points from 4.75 to 4.5 per cent. In the statement accompanying the decision, the Bank noted that growth in the Canadian economy has picked up but is still below long-run potential, meaning the economy has growing excess supply.

The Bank points out that weakness in the economy is

being felt both in household consumption and the housing market, and the labour market is softening. While growth is expected to increase in the second half of 2024 and in 2025, current levels of excess supply will continue to put downward pressure on inflation. As such, core inflation is expected to slow to 2.5 per cent in the second half of this year and ease further in 2025 while total CPI inflation

settles near its 2 per cent target in 2025.

Easing Canadian inflation combined with weakness in the labour market is providing a clear signal to the Bank that monetary policy is too tight, and the right course of action is to gradually lower its policy rate back to a neutral stance.

This means, contingent on inflation remaining on its 2 per cent trajectory, that we should expect further rate cuts this year and next, with an ultimate destination of 2.75 per cent. The historical average spread between the Bank's overnight rate and 5-year fixed mortgage rates is about 210 basis points.

"With most lenders now offering between 4.85 and 5 per cent, fixed mortgage rates have essentially already priced in the majority of expected rate easing though we could see

fixed rates ease a bit further. With these last two rate cuts, the Bank of Canada has undone the rate-hikes we saw this time last year which had halted a growing recovery of home sales activity. We expect to see at least a moderate uptick in home sales going forward, with activity returning to seasonal norms by the end of this year," said Brendon Ogmundson, Chief Economist

Canadian passport ranks 7th among passports rankings; Singapore Recrowned Most Powerful Passport

C ingapore reclaimed its title as the world's Dmost powerful passport in the latest ranking published on the Henley Passport Index.

The ranking--published by London-based immigration consultancy--Henley & Partners, uses the data from the International Air Transport Association to rank 199 passports' access to 227 travel destinations. The Henley Passport Index compares the visa-free access of 199 different passports to 227 travel destinations. If no visa is required, then a score with value = 1 is created for that passport.

So having a Singapore passport also means getting visa-free entry to a record 195 global destinations.





United Truckers Association endorses Commissioner's new licensing plan

The United Truckers Association ("UTA) is speaking out regarding this past weekend's protest by the Port Trucking Association ("PTA") against the new requirements to obtain a container trucking licence that were recently introduced by the BC Container Trucking Commissioner.

More specifically, the UTA continues to oppose unlicensed illegal fleets that have been taking away work from legitimate Independent Operators ("IOs") for the past decade.

The companies that took part in the protest are supportive of using such trucks so they can pay rates that are less than those that are legislated and enforced by the Commissioner's office.

"Claims that these illegal fleets are "affiliates" of the protest participant licence holders is a false narrative that only attempts to justify schemes to bypass the rules that the entire drayage industry must abide by," according to UTA spokesperson Gagan Singh.

"The BC Container Trucking Act introduced a regulated system of pay for both on- and off-dock container moves," explains Singh.

"While the fact it took 10 years for the Commissioner's office to crack down on the use of these illegal fleets is disappointing, the UTA is very supportive of the new rules, which will finally return the work that our members are entitled to."

Any company that cannot earn a living playing within the rules should not be moving containers in the industry. The 2014 Port of Vancouver truckers strike took place as a response to an epidemic of undercutting and bribes, which created an unequal marketplace where honourable businesses couldn't compete.

Nothing for Punjab in Union Budget, say Congress, Akali Dal

he opposition Lok Sabha members from Punjab have criticised the Union Budget as being discriminatory to the state. Congress' first-time MP and its chief in Punjab, Amrinder Singh Raja Warring alleged that the Union Budget discriminated against Punjab which needs to be stopped.

"#Why no mention of Punjab in the budget?" he asked.

He said in a post on his X handle: "Disheartened to hear FM @nsitharaman budget proposals. Punjabis had high hopes from the @ narendramodi led union government. The FM chose not to mention Punjab even once throughout her speech. The Country's food bowl deserves special grants for our infrastructural needs but @BJP4India continues to ignore Punjab."



Shiromani Akali Dal's lone voice in Parliament, Harsimrat Kaur Badal said the Union Budget will go down as a "Sarkar Bachao" Budget.

She said the Budget was tailor-made for two NDA allies in Bihar and Andhra Pradesh even as farmers, the poor and youth across the country were ignored. "There

is nothing for Punjab in the sixth continuous Budget since Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) exited the NDA alliance and government. Those who joined the BJP to further their own interests in the name of 'solving Punjab's issues' must now answer why the state is facing consistent discrimination at the hands of the Centre," she added.

2024 Polestar P2 EV Dual motor --- Performance is Standard!

Review by Veeno Dewan

Polestar is a Swedish premium brand competing with the likes of Tesla and Audi, with a focus on quality, performance, and cabin design. We were lucky to gain a test drive in the new Polestar P2 Crossover, an arresting All-Electric fastback-style five door hatchback with hints of Volvo in the design language For 2024, the Polestar P2 EV has mild revised styling touches, new electric motors, faster charging, and more as standard features. The 2024 Polestar 2 now has a rear-wheel drive biased for the all-wheel drive (AWD) version. The previous traditional-style grille is replaced with a solid horizontal "SmartZone." Panel.

There is also more interior and exterior design options such as fresh paint colors, new wheel designs, ventilated Nappa leather or vegan derived upholstery, Light Ash wood trim, removable sunshade for the panoramic glass roof, Advanced cabin filter and upgraded interior particulate matter sensor and new in-car apps are also part of the package.

There are two versions of the Polestar P2 in terms of drivetrain with new electric motors. The dual-motor model as tested features a combined 408 horsepower and all-wheel drive with extremely fast acceleration. Those dual motors put out a combined 421 hp, along with 546 lb-ft of torque wit ha zero to to 100 km/h in 4.5 seconds.

The dual-motor version uses a 78-kWh battery with 155 kW charging speed and is rated with driving range of 444 km with 19-inch wheels; 428 km with 20-inch wheels; and 397 km with the Performance pack's performance tires. The optional Performance Pack offered to the Dual Motor models offer increased horsepower bumping to 476 hp, along with flashy gold painted Brembo brake calipers, and special Öhlins Dual Flow Valve adjustable shock absorbers and gold cosmetic seat belts and accents here and there.

All Polestar 2 models have a 907-kg (2,000-lb) tow rating. The Polestar features a 78-kWh battery that allows 155 kW DC fast charging. Recharge times 10 to 80 per cent in an impressive 35 minutes.

Canadian pricing for the 2024 Polestar P2 Single Motor starts at \$57,450, including the \$2,300 destination fee. The Polestar 2 Dual Motor starts at \$65,450, including the destination and adds adaptive cruise control, emergency front and rear braking, and LED fog lamps . Both models are eligible for the full \$5,000 federal rebate, along with up to \$4,000 in British Columbia.

The Polestar interior also smacks of high quality Scandicool Volvo. A fixed panoramic sunroof makes the light interior even more airy and there is a fairly roomy cabin overall. There is the same neat, minimalist, style dash, with few hard controls or buttons. The touchscreen operates and adjusts most functions.

The Polestar is truly green too, and features eco technology such as recycled materials in interior textile surfaces. Technology is high with an Android based Automotive operating system, Google Play and Google Assistant integration and the 13-speaker Harman Kardon Premium sound system. The rear is beautifully finished with comfortable seats and the Polestar offers 405 liters of cargo space, including the addi-



tional 41 liters under the false floor. cargo space in the trunk. Space expands to 1,070 litres when the rear seats are folded. The 2024 Polestar 2 is rated to tow 3,000 lbs. On the road, the 2024 Polestar P2 has the typically intoxicating instant acceleration of all EVs from a standing start. It is very fast, with blinding acceleration thanks to the dual motor AWD setup. There are some downsides, its not super agile and the Dual motor model packages are pricy. The single motor is a good compromise, Also some may find the all black, hard -edged interior design a bit spare and severe in execution.

Still the Polestar P2 is a premium hatchback that can stand against rivals such as the Tesla Model 3, Audi Q4 E-Tron, and Volkswagen ID.3. If you like Volvo's you will not be disappointed with the Polestar. It is a cut above the competition for sure. 2024 Polestar P2 Dual Motor - Priced from \$56,250, including the \$2,300 destination fees. Options extra.







Channi vs Bittu: 'Deshdrohi' charge on ex-Punjab CM after war of words in Lok Sabha

he Indian House of Parliament, this week, witnessed a heated altercation between Congress leader & former Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi, and Union Minister Ravneet Singh Bittu, who recently switched from the grand old party to the Bharativa Janata Party (BJP).

The war of words between Channi and Bittu also led to brief adjournment of the House. Moments later, Bittu released a video message and accused the former of misleading and misguiding the nation.

Bittu, the Union Minister of State for Railways and Food Processing Industries, said that the former Punjab chief minister was utterly wrong in claiming that the farmers were booked under NSA. He termed it an outrageous



ploy to demean and mock the farmers.

Today, a former Chief Minister (referring to Channi) behaved in an antinational manner and misled the world through the Lok Sabha. He claimed that the NSA was imposed on the farmers, which is not the case. It was against the radical forces (Amritpal Singh) which wanted to break Punjab away from India," he pointed out. Bittu also slammed the Congress leadership for backing Channi in the House. "While he spoke, the Leader of the Opposition (LoP) Rahul Gandhi was sitting there, enabling these statements," he said.

Earlier, during a discussion on the Union Budget, Channi hit out at Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government and listed out 'instances of undeclared

Emergency'. "This government not treat all citizens equally. does They are only concerned with staying in power. The BJP is responsible for a financial emergency in the country. They only talk about past Emergencies, but today, there is an undeclared Emergency," Channi said.

He also advocated for Amritpal Singh, a pro-Khalistan leader and MP from the Khadoor Sahib Lok Sabha constituency, who has been imprisoned under the NSA. He argued: "Twenty lakh people elected an MP, and he (Amritpal Singh) is being imprisoned under the NSA. Freedom of speech is being suppressed, and the people of his constituency cannot voice their concerns in this House. This is also an Emergency."

The heated face-off between Channi and Bittu also drew the attention of lawmakers.

During the discussion on Union Budget, Channi referred to the assassination of Bittu's grandfather and former Punjab CM Beant Singh. The alleged personal remarks left the Union Minister infuriated, who shot back by saying, "my grandfather sacrificed his life for the nation and not for Congress party".

Harbhajan Singh bats for direct flights to US, Canada from Amritsar

day after AAP Rajya Sabha member AVikram Sahney raised the issue of launching direct flights to Britain and Canada from Amritsar and Chandigarh airports in the Upper House, former India cricketer Harbhajan Singh, also an AAP Rajya Sabha MP, called for an expansion of the airport in the holy city. In an exclusive chat with the IANS, the former off-spinner with more than 400 Test wickets, said, "We have told the government that airports are being constructed throughout the country. However, Amritsar's airport is small and

needs expansion.

"Currently, it only has domestic flights, with one or two international flights. We want a section for the United States and Canada to be opened there."

Replying to Sahney's demand in the Upper House on Wednesday, Minister of State for Civil Aviation, Muralidhar Mohol, said that granting points of call to the designated carriers of foreign countries depends on the benefits to the Indian aviation sector, the presence of the Indian diaspora in the country,



and the future plans of Indian carriers. Talking on the issue, Harbhajan said, "It is Punjab from where the majority of travellers go to Canada or America. If a direct flight goes from Punjab to America or Canada, it will save the people of Punjab a lot of expense.

"Now they first come from Punjab to Delhi and as a result, the cost increases due to extra travel and lodging. In such a situation, if the Amritsar airport is expanded and the number of flights is increased, it will be a great convenience for the people of Punjab."

Your roommate sitting on your bed is not a 911 emergency

Surrey RCMP is issuing a reminder to call 9-1-1 for potential and unfolding emergencies only. An emergency is any situation that requires immediate assistance from a first responder (police, fire, ambulance services).

In 2023, Surrey RCMP received 103,627 911 calls of those calls 72,343 calls were abandoned 911 calls. Abandoned 911 calls increased by 26% in 2023. In many instances the 911 was not used for its intended use. 25-30% of the 9-1-1 calls received each day are false Misusing 911 and abandoned 911 calls requires dispatchers and police officers to divert their attention and resources from something that could be a real emergency.

When you call 911, a dispatcher will ask if you need police, fire or ambulance and for which city. If you are unable to speak English, you can let the dispatcher know which language you prefer and they will do their best to find someone who speaks the same language. For example, you could say police, Surrey, and speak Mandarin.

How you can help avoid false 911 calls: Lock and store your phone properly

Don't let children play with phones – even without a SIM card they can call 911 by accident

Dial slowly and carefully when making international calls

If you do call 911 accidentally, stay on the line and answer questions from the call taker, otherwise, we will need to call you back or attend in person.

The following are not the reason to call 911:

You are looking for the non-emergency number

You need help moving

You don't know the bus schedule and or you missed the bus

Your roommate sat on your bed

Your roommate burned dinner

Your fast food order was not what you



ordered

You dropped your air pods in the bushes and you need the police to retrieve them A loud truck drove by your house and woke you up

Kids playing sports in a cul-de-sac Did not want to wait on non-emergency line.

Examples of when to call 911:

Someone's life is in danger or there is an immediate threat to person or property. A crime in progress, shots fired, stabbing, robbery, arson/fire, and break and enter.

When a serious crime has just happened and the suspect may still be near and/or return to the scene.

When there is a good chance of arresting a suspect or preventing a serious crime. Examples of non-emergency situations: When a crime that has already been committed and no suspects are present (e.g., theft from vehicle or home, vandalism, fraud)

Suspicious activity or circumstance or less serious nuisance behavior

A hate crime or hate incident, including those with no immediate safety risks, no physical evidence, and no identifiable suspects

When you want follow-up information on a report you have previously made (Have your police file number available) Online crime reporting is available if:

you have no witness nor suspect you have lost something that costs less than \$5000

someone has stolen something from you that costs less than \$5000

someone has vandalized your property or vehicle and it will cost less than \$5000 to repair it

there are no items involving personal identity, firearms, licence plates or decals

you want to report a driving complaint that is not in progress







During one of the home invasion incidents, a victim sustained a serious gunshot wound to the lower body that required medical attention. Investigators linked these incidents together through extensive video canvasses, physical evidence and forensics leading to the creation of Project Warlock. The investigation focused on an identified organized criminal network based in Brampton and Mississauga. "Violence like this terrifies and shatters the sense of safety of residents and their families," said Chief Nishan Duraiappah.

Our community is not a place for this type of criminality and Peel Regional Police will do everything to seize illegal firearms, arrest those who are terriozing residents and deter criminality."
