

Public Notification: Two BC Gang Members To Live Within West Abbotsford After Bail

The Abbotsford Police Department has issued a public notification about Anmol Sandhu and Navpreet Dhaliwal who are connected to the ongoing BC Gang Conflict and present a significant public safety risk. The police were notified on July 31, 2024, that the two were released from custody on Bail until trial. The police said that they will be residing within west Abbotsford. Abbotsford "The Police Department recognizes the public safety risk these two men present and is issuing this public notification to keep the public informed. We take public

safety seriously and ensuring the safety of the community in and

around the areas where these two men reside. The monitoring of these men will be led by the Abbotsford Police Department's Gang Crime Unit, assisted by our Criminal Investigative Branch and Patrol officers," Sergeant Paul Walker, Abbotsford Police Department, said.

In late 2022, the Abbotsford Police Department's Drug Enforcement Unit initiated a large-scale drug trafficking investigation focusing on the activities of two Abbotsford SANDHU residents. and DHALIWAL.

police recently Edmonton arrested six more people and issued Canada-wide warrants for a seventh in the extortion series known as Project Gaslight.

The police said they were investigating 40 incidents related to the extortion series, with the latest incident on

Friday, July 26, 2024, involving an arson at an apartment building in the Cavanagh neighborhood.

One female, Jashandeep Kaur, 19, and five males, Gurkaran Singh, 19, Manav Heer, 19, Parminder Singh, 21, Divnoor Asht, 19 and a 17-year-old male

are all facing a host of serious criminal charges.

Canada-wide warrants have also been issued for Maninder Singh Dhaliwal, 34, who is believed to be the leader of criminal organization the responsible for the extortions.

Tragic Trend Of Fatal Crashes: Two Siblings And Cousin From Punjab Die In Car Crash In Moncton

Tew Brunswick RCMP informed in a N release that a 19-year-old man and two 23-year-old women, all from Moncton, died as the result of a single-vehicle crash in Mill Cove, N.B. on July 27.

The police have yet to reveal the identity of the deceased. Local South Asian Community in NB identified them as Navjot Somal aged 19 years, Harman Somal and Resham Judge aged 23 years.

Indians in Halifax, group dedicated to local Halifax community, wrote on its Facebook page, "It is with a heavy heart that we inform you all that Navjot Somal, age 19, Harman Somal and Rasham Judge, age 23, all residents of Moncton, New Brunswick, have died been involved in a car accident. Due to this accident, a wave of grief has spread throughout the community. We pray to God to give strength to the family to bear

"My brother came from India a few months ago on a study permit, sister are working in Day Care in Moncton, they Died Yesterday in car accident near Oromocto. New Brunswick. The family needs funds to send their body back to India," Rajpreet wrote.

The police said the crash is believed to have occurred when the vehicle, traveling Westbound, lost a tire causing the driver to lose control and left the highway. The three passengers were ejected from the vehicle and died at the scene as a result of their injuries.

The driver was transported to hospital with what are believed to be non-life-threatening injuries. Members of the Jemseg Fire Department, Ambulance New Brunswick, and a RCMP collision reconstructionist also attended the scene.

Hitkaran Johal Killed In Targeted Shooting In South Vancouver

25-year-old man, with al-Aleged gangland links, was identified as the victim of a shooting on July 27th night in Vancouver.

In a release Vancouver Police Department (VPD) identified the deceased as Hitkaran Johal, who died at the scene of the collision.

Police were called to East 63rd Avenue and Inverness Street just before 9 p.m. on July 26 for reports of two men shot in a vehicle, which then collided with two other vehicles. One man was taken to hospital for non-life-threatening injuries.

injuries. As police probe the overnight homicide, they said they believed the "shooting was targeted and there is no ongoing public safety risk at this time".

He has been competing in powerlifting since 2016 and has accumulated an impressive resume. In addition to his latest win, he won gold in both 2017 and 2018 at the Western Powerlifting Championships. I was also placed 4th in powerlifting in the country in 2018.

However, Sharma's strength is just not limited to lifting weights. The COVID-19 pandemic saw our champion and their sponsor, Supplementking, stepping up to support healthcare workers. Together, they provided essential food sup-

Surrey RCMP seize firearms after video of people dancing with guns in Surrey Wedding goes viral

Several firearms have been seized after a video surfaced online showing a group of people dancing with firearms.

On the morning of August 1, 2024, Surrey RCMP became aware of a video circulating on social media and it was alleged that the video of the group of people dancing with firearms was filmed in Surrey.

Surrey RCMP South Community Response Unit (SCRU) took conduct of the investigation and later in the day confirmed the address where the video may have been filmed. A Criminal Code investigation was initiated and contact was made with the property owner.

On August 1, 2024 at approximately 5:30 pm time, SCRU seized several firearms from the property owner.

The investigation continues in order to identify the individuals in the video. SCRU will be reaching out to multiple partner agencies to advance the investigation.

"We understand this incident was extremely alarming to the community at large," says Superintendent Harm Dosange, Community Services Officer for the Surrey RCMP. "Public safety is our top priority and our officers worked quickly to seize the firearms in question."

Translink Will Be Forced To Cut Services By 50% If Funding Is Not Found: Report

TransLink released a new report this week detailing potential future transit service cuts that would be necessary at the end of 2025 if a new transit funding model is not established. According to the report, TransLink could cut bus services by 50%, and cancel 145 routes plus the NightBus service. In addition, SkyTrain and SeaBus cuts are part of the plan with the possibility of the WestCoast Express

being eliminated if there isn't revolutionary budget planning for TransLink beyond 2025 between the provincial and federal governments.

TransLink is facing a funding gap of approximately \$600 million each year -a shortfall in the budget to operate current transit service levels throughout the region. Without funding, TransLink faces the prospect of

cutting transit services to balance its budget. TransLink recently announced \$90 million in corporate cost-efficiency and revenue measures to help reduce the funding gap.

According to Translink if a solution is not found next year, potential cuts to transit services could include: Cutting bus service in half, including cancelling up to 145 bus routes and all NightBus services; reducing SkyTrain and SeaBus services by up to 30 per cent; eliminating West Coast Express; reducing HandyDART by 35 per cent; eliminating the Local Government Funding Program which invests in road maintenance and local infrastructure upgrades.

These substantial reductions to transit service would significantly impact the entire Metro Vancouver region. More than half a million people will no longer be living within walking distance of a transit stop, disproportionately impacting those who are low-income, visible minorities, shift workers, youth, and seniors.

There would be almost no transit services operating in Langley, White Rock, South Delta, Port Coquitlam, Maple Ridge, Pitt Meadows, and much of the North Shore.

Tens of thousands of more cars would be added to the already-congested streets and bridges, with congestion worsening by 20%.

Employers in health care, childcare, hospitality, construction, and major industries would face the prospect of employees who can no longer make it to work.

Surrey Board of Trade raised alarm bells at this potential TransLink Service cuts and the impacts it will have on the people of Surrey. "Surrey is already lacking when it comes to transit and transportation needs," said Anita Huberman, President & CEO, Surrey Board of Trade. "If the provincial and federal governments don't realize that transportation is economic infrastructure and take action immediately on a sustainable funding plan, Surrey's economy – in addition to the Metro Vancouver region and provincial economies will be severely compromised."

On July 29, 2023, at approximately 12:38 a.m., Surrey RCMP responded to a report of a pedestrian hit and run collision in the 8200-block of 128 Street. The pedestrian, 31-year-old man, was а transported to hospital where he later succumbed to his injuries. Prior to the arrival of police, the victim was assisted by several good Samaritans. Members Dear of the Community,

We are reaching out to you today with a plea that comes from the deepest part of our hearts.

A year ago, on July 29, 2023, our beloved, Zachary Frise, was tragically injured in a hit-andrun accident. He succumbed to his horrific injuries on July 30, 2023. The pain and grief of losing him has been unbearable for our entire family. Not a day goes by that we don't miss his bright smile and charismatic personal-ity. There

will always be a heartache that can never be healed. Zachary was a wonderful and loving Son, Daddy, Husband, Brother, and friend. His loss has left an irreplaceable void in our lives. We are desperate for answers and for justice. We have been living in a state of anguish, knowing that the person responsible for this tragedy is still out there. We are writing to you today to implore anyone who might have witnessed the accident or who might have any information to come forward.

Even the smallest detail could be crucial in helping us find the person responsible for Zachary's death. Your information could provide us with the closure we so desperately need and help ensure that justice is served.



Sikh Refugees of 1987 Express Gratitude to the Communities in Halifax and Charlesville

On July 12th, 1987, a cargo ship carrying 174 passengers arrived on the shores of Nova Scotia, bringing Sikhs from India. These individuals had boarded the ship in Rotterdam, embarking on a journey that would forever change their lives. This event marked a significant shift in Canadian immigration policy and brought attention to the plight of Sikhs in India under an oppressive regime of that time, a situation some argue persists today.

Most passengers were Sikhs fleeing India due to political unrest in the late 1970s and early 1980s, culminating in Operation Blue Star. Following Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's assassination by her Sikh bodyguards in 1984, anti-Sikh violence escalated, resulting in thousands of extrajudicial killings. Many Sikhs sought refuge abroad to escape persecution.

Amidst this backdrop, many young Sikhs fled to Europe. While in Europe, they learned of an opportunity to voyage to Canada and made arrangements. With hopes raised by Canada's acceptance of Tamil refugees in Newfoundland in August 1986, they decided to set sail. However, details about the voyage were scarce, and passengers were unaware of the ship's conditions or provisions. The ship was an old cargo vessel and refugees had to stay in the hull without adequate rest or sanitation facilities.

The journey was harsh, with rough Atlantic waters and rust falling from the hull. Passengers prayed continuously during the 19-day trip for safe arrival in Canada. When the ship's engine failed, one of the passengers with engine

experience managed to restart it. Food ran out and for the last four days, refugees survived on one water bottle each per day. On July 12, 1987, the ship approached Nova Scotia under dense fog. Instead of docking, refugees were told to use a marine evacuation slide to reach the shore. Fortunately, the waters were shallow upon disembarking, minimizing injuries. Refugees locked arms and walked through shallow, muddy waters to the shore. After gathering for prayer and waiting for the cargo ship to re-enter international waters as instructed, they moved further inland and met a pickup truck driver who confirmed they were in Canada. Cold and hungry, they followed Highway 3 to Charlesville, sitting in front of Vernon and Tim Malone's home. The RCMP and Fire Department were called. Despite official advice not to interact, the Malones and the community helped feed the refugees, providing their first meal in days with peanut butter sandwiches. In a gesture of humanity, the people of Charlesville emptied their refrigerators to help.

The refugees were then taken to the Woods Harbour Firehall and later to a local military base for processing. The Maritime Sikh Society in Halifax provided food and assistance. News of the refugees' arrival spread across Canada, sparking a debate about their fate. Many Canadians felt that illegal entrants should be sent back, fearing Canada could become a haven for refugees. Others were concerned about the breach of Canada's borders. However, the Canadian Sikh community organized to support the refugees, hiring law firms and advocating for their stay. There was a sentiment to avoid another incident similar to the Guru Nanak Jahaz (commonly referred to as the Komagata Maru) of 1914.

The Canadian government's stance was a stark contrast to the Tamil refugees that arrived only one year earlier when PM



Brian Mulroney's comments silenced his critics stating, "we are not in the business of turning away refugees." However, during this incident, the PM ordered an emergency recall of Parliament to decide on the fate of the refugees with a strong desire to send them back.

The World Sikh Organization (WSO) took a leading role in the next steps. Sardar Gian Singh Sandhu, President of WSO Canada, liaised with government officials to find a solution for the release of the refugees. Working with lawyers hired by WSO, the Canadian government made an unprecedented decision to allow the refugees to stay in Canada if bonds were placed for each individual. Lawyers for the WSO initially offered a blanket bond of \$600,000 for all refugees, but this was refused. Instead, individual bonds were set based on perceived risk levels. This decision was influenced by the fact that one of the refugees had been deported from Canada previously. Additionally, some statements provided by the refugees in an effort to highlight their plight revealed affiliations with organizations in India opposing the government. Rather than supporting their case, these were seen as unfavorable and heightened

security concerns.

Renowned lawyer David Gibbons and local lawyer Lee Cohen worked on an amicable solution to keep the refugees in Canada. Recognizing the strong Sikh communities in Vancouver and Toronto, the WSO sought assistance from local communities to post the required bonds. The Western Regional office, led by Sardar Daljit Singh Sandhu and Sardar Surindar Singh Jabal and the Eastern Regional office, led by Sardar Inderjit Singh Bal and Sardar Harbajan Singh Pandori, reached out to the community for help. Although community members had no prior relationship with the refugees, bonds were posted for all 174 individuals. The total cost for bonds alone was \$750,000, with overall costs exceeding \$2 million.

It is important to note that not all passengers were Sikh; one woman was of Turkish descent, and a few others were of Hindu and Muslim backgrounds. However, the Sikh community posted bonds for all, irrespective of religion or background.

Sikh refugees contributions in Nova Scotia

Over the years, the Sikh refugees who arrived in Nova Scotia in 1987 have made significant contributions to Canadian society. They have become an integral part of the multicultural fabric of Canada, enriching it with their unique cultural heritage, values, community service and traditions. Their contributions span various sectors. Some have become successful entrepreneurs, establishing businesses that contribute to the local and national economy. These businesses range from small enterprises to large corporations, creating jobs and fostering economic growth. In addition, members of their families have excelled in professions such as medicine, engineering, law and academia; bringing their expertise and dedication to their respective fields.

During the Both men investigation, multiple search warrants were executed at several residences in Abbotsford and Surrey, resulting in almost six kilograms of fentanyl, two kilograms of cocaine, heroin, methamphetamine, morphine, large amounts of cash and firearms being seized. As a result of additional evidence

investigation, the Abbotsford Police Major Crime Unit initiated "Project High Table," focusing on SANDHU and DHALIWAL as investigators believed they were conspiring to commit murder. On February 21st, 2024, Anmol SANDHU and Navpreet DHALIWAL were arrested and charged with two counts of

being obtained during the drug Conspiracy to Commit Murder and remanded into custody. Further charges of Trafficking a Controlled Substance and Firearms offences have also been laid.

> On July 31st, 2024, the Abbotsford Police Department were notified that Anmol SANDHU and Navpreet DHALIWAL were released from custody on Bail

until trial.

Anmol SANDHU and Navpreet DHALIWAL have been provided with a series of court-imposed bail conditions that consist of: Electronic Monitoring, House Arrest, Not to possess weapons defined by the Criminal Code, Variety of No contact orders, Prohibited from communicating on any social media platform,

Prohibited from owning or possessing a cellular telephone. Should anyone observe SANDHU or DHALIWAL in violation of any of their court-ordered conditions, or has information that would assist police with their investigation, is asked to contact the Abbotsford Police Department at 604-859-5225 or 9-1-1 in case of emergency.

Edmonton Police issue Canada-wide warrant for leader of extortion...

On Thursday, July 25, 2024, EPS and RCMP officers executed search warrants at six locations in southeast Edmonton relating to Project Gaslight. Police also arrested and charged five males and one female believed to be involved in the extortion scheme that was targeting South Asian business owners in the Edmonton area.

Jointly and individually, the seven accused are facing a total of 54 charges, including extortion, arson, intentionally discharging a firearm, break and enter, assault with a weapon, as well as a number of charges linked to committing an offence for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in association with a criminal organization.

Maninder Singh Dhaliwal's whereabouts are unknown, but police are working with federal counterparts to locate him. Investigators believe he may have altered his appearance since the photo above was taken.

Anyone who has information about Dhaliwal's whereabouts is asked to contact police immediately at projectgaslight@edmontonpolice.ca or 780-391-4279. Anonymous information can also be submitted to Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477 or online at www. p3tips.com/250.

"From the standpoint of sheer volume of information our investigators reviewed, this was likely one of the largest investigations in the history of the EPS, resulting in substantial charges for all accused," said Acting Inspector David Paton, with the EPS Organized Crime Branch. "We believe that the individuals identified today represent the core members of this criminal network; however, we know Dhaliwal is actively recruiting other young people and we want parents, specifically from the South Asian community, to be aware and to have conversations with their young adults about the extortions and arsons that have been taking place."

"The RCMP National Coordination and Support Team (NCST) has been monitoring the significant progress

made by the Edmonton Police Service and the efforts underway by the other BC, Alberta, and Ontario law enforcement colleagues working to address similar types of extortion and violence investigations in Canada," said Superintendent Adam MacIntosh, NCS Team Leader. "We continue to share information and intelligence and leverage additional resources and supports as we collectively work to identify, arrest and deter those individuals and criminal organizations targeting our communities."

The EPS has laid charges in 26 of the 40 reported incidents related to this extortion series.

Sikh Refugees of 1987 Express Gratitude to the Communities in Halifax...

In July 2024, to commemorate and recognize those who helped them 37 years ago, the refugees organized a caravan from Halifax to Charlesville adorned with Canadian flags as a recognition of the Canadian Government's decision to allow them to stay. It also symbolized how they are proud Canadians today. Those that supported the refugees in their time of need were recognized, including local residents of Charlesville, Sikh Societies and Gurdwaras, community members, lawyers and Canadian Government officials.

Additionally, the refugees of 1987 established an annual scholarship for a child attending university from Charlesville, donated funds to the local community center and fire department, offered to pay for books for the local library and planned a monument to establish a park where the cargo ship stopped. Their story is one of gratitude wrapped in advocacy and activism. There was a commitment to support the community that supported them.

Canada continues to embrace As multiculturalism, the experiences of the Sikh refugees in Nova Scotia serve as an inspiring example of successful

integration and mutual enrichment. Their story underscores the importance of providing refuge to those in need and the profound impact that such humanitarian efforts can have on both individuals and society as a whole.

In response, two organizations focused on international students and India-Canada relations have united to address these issues. BC Conservatives Outraged Over Dropped Charges for Alleged Child Molester

VANCOUVER, BC: A Victoria provincial court judge said that "unacceptable" delays in B.C.'s court system forced the staying of a criminal charge against a man accused of sexually assaulting a six-year-old girl.

The Conservative Party of British Columbia in a statement said the court's decision highlights "a severe failure in the administration of justice under David Eby's leadership." The Party is calling for urgent measures to address the resource shortages in the

provincial court system and ensure that such tragic failures do not happen again. Justice must be served, and the rights of victims must be protected.

In a scathing ruling, Victoria provincial court Judge Mayland McKimm found that "unacceptable" delays, including problems scheduling a semi-retired judge, pushed the trial beyond the 18-month limit set by the Supreme Court of Canada. The delays resulted in the stay of charges against the accused, despite the

severity of the allegations. John Rustad, Leader of the Conservative Party of British Columbia, expressed deep concern: "Ensuring our courts run smoothly is a provincial responsibility-onethatDavidEby has failed at. The administration of justice in British Columbia is in shambles, and this recent case is a devastating example of the consequences."

The Conservative Party of British Columbia emphasizes that while laws are written in Ottawa, the administration of justice is a provincial responsibility.

The failure to provide enough Crown prosecutors, Sheriffs, and Judges is a clear dereliction of duty by the current provincial government.

In 2016, the Supreme Court of Canada, through R. v Jordan, clearly defined the Charter right to a speedy trial. However, despite this landmark ruling, the NDP government has failed to allocate the necessary resources to uphold these rights and ensure that justice is served.







Game Change: Invigorated young Democrats give Harris slight lead over Trump

Four-in-five believe this to be 'one of the most important elections' in American history


whirlwind month in politics Aappears to have catalyzed presidential race, with the reports that Kamala Harris has the support of enough delegates to receive the Democratic nomination formally at the party's national convention, which begins on Aug. 19. After President Joe Biden announced he would step aside, his vice president will step up and face former President and Republican nominee Donald Trump for the highest office in the nation.

New data from the non-profit Angus Reid Institute finds Harris energizing the Democratic campaign and entering with a slight overall advantage in vote intent. Currently 44 per cent of American registered voters say they would support her bid, a two-point edge over Trump. Key at play are racial and generational dynamics.

The Harris vote is younger and more diverse, with a massive advantage among non-white would-be voters (56% to 25%) and those younger than 35 years of age (50% to 32%). For Trump, the white vote is stalwart in his favour, as he generates a 14-point advantage over Harris (51% to 37%). While he trails among 18- to 34-year-olds, and is tied among the 35 to 54 group, he holds an eight-point edge among those 55 years of age and older (49% to 40%).

Aside from the battle of personalities, the vast majority of Americans (82%) say this election is one of the most important in the nation's history, while half say is about the issues. For Harris voters this means the future of democracy, reproductive rights, and the battle against climate change. For Trump voters, priorities are the economy, inflation, and security along the southern border.

One key priority for Harris in the coming weeks will be to galvanize voters around one of two ideas – that she is the better qualified candidate, or that she is a bulwark against a worse option. Currently, half of her supporters say they'll vote for her because they like what she stands for, while half say they simply want to block Trump. For Trump supporters, 87 per cent say they support him because of what he stands for, a defining difference between these two similarly sized groups. Asked which leader is better on a host of key issues, Trump holds advantages on economic issues like taxation and inflation, as well as southern border security. Harris is seen as better on reproductive rights, climate change, and upholding democracy. Notably, the candidates are within five points of each other on job



creation (46% Trump, 41% Harris). Asked about "mass deportation" of southern border migrants, half of Americans support this idea. One-in-five Harris voters (21%) would support this, compared to 87 per cent of Trump voters. Harris voters are twice as likely (69% to 31%) to say that they believe the November election will be contested in a free and fair fashion compared to Trump voters.

Surrey City Council approves motions to Increase Housing Supply, Streamline Commercial Development

S urrey City Council is taking steps to address the city's housing crisis by approving three key motions aimed at increasing affordable housing and streamlining the development process. Under Council's direction, staff are now exploring a variety of options to reduce red tape and increase housing supply.

"These motions are a significant step forward in addressing Surrey's housing crisis," said Surrey Mayor Brenda Locke. "Council's commitment to addressing the housing crisis is not just about providing more homes, it's about creating a community where everyone has access to affordable, sustainable, and inclusive living options. The approval of these motions is a testament to our dedication to innovation and collaboration."

The motions, introduced by Councillor Pardeep Kooner, demonstrate a commitment to solutions that prioritize affordability, accessibility, and sustainability.



The three motions direct staff to:

• Explore an alternative permit-issuing process to expedite building permits for minor interior renovations in eligible commercial buildings. This move is expected to reduce red tape and make it easier for businesses to improve their properties, creating a more vibrant and attractive downtown area.

• Review single-family residential zones to accommodate three-level homes with

suites, potentially with flat roofs and improved permeability on the lot. This initiative will help increase the supply of affordable housing options in Surrey, particularly for families and young professionals.

• Investigate the possibility of incorporating suites in townhouse zones near public transportation hubs. This move will provide more affordable housing options for residents who rely on public transportation and reduce the need for lengthy commutes.



Support available for tenants, landlords as action taken against rental property brokerage

VICTORIA - The B.C. Financial Services Authority (BCFSA) has taken urgent action to protect the interests of tenants and landlords of approximately 350 properties in B.C. by freezing the bank accounts and suspending the licence of Vancouver-based rental property brokerage firm Rent it Furnished Realty.

While there are no immediate impacts to existing tenancy agreements, B.C.'s Residential Tenancy Branch (RTB) is ready to help landlords and tenants with concerns and questions

about measures they can take and laws in place to protect their interests. Tenants and landlords are urged to make themselves aware of their obligations or rights under the Residential Tenancy Act.

People with questions should call the Residential Tenancy Branch between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. at 604 660-1020 on the Lower Mainland, 250 387-1602 in Victoria, and 1 800 665-8779 elsewhere in B.C., and visit: www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/ housing-tenancy/residential-tenancies/during-a-tenancy/paying-rent (https://www2. gov.bc.ca/gov/content/housing-tenancy/residential-tenancies/during-a-tenancy/paying-rent)

Landlords and tenants should be aware during this time that:

* Landlords are not permitted to evict a tenant for non-payment of rent or non-payment of deposit if it was paid to Rent it Furnished as per the tenancy agreement.

* Landlords will not have access to money managed on their behalf by Rent it Furnished accounts and are advised to take the necessary steps to change their rental payment arrangement, according to the terms of their tenancy agreement. This could include seeking an alternative licensed rental property management brokerage to set up alternative accounts.

* Tenants are advised to contin-





For 2024 Ford refreshes its flagship fullsize Expedition SUV, with more tech, features, and off-road capability. The threerow Expedition comes in regular length or as the extended-wheelbase Expedition Max, with similar passenger space but more cargo room. New changes include revamped colour choices, minor interior tweaks and One-pedal driving for off-road use on the Timberline model.

Power is courtesy of a high output 3.5-liter twin-turbo EcoBoost V6 engine borrowed from the F-150 Raptor, making a class leading 440 hp and 510 lb-ft of torque. Four-wheel drive is standard. The Expedition can tow up to 9,200 lb and carry a payload of up to 1,758 lbs when equipped with the available Heavy-Duty Trailer Tow Package.

The 2024 Ford Expedition model comes in a number of models. Pricing ranges from \$77,915 For the entry XLT to \$109,640 for the extended MAX Platinum version. The price for the mid-range Limited and King Ranch trim (As tested) starts at \$106,285 depending on if you go for the stretched MX versions. The top dog Platinum is priced at \$107,245. The Timberline series has the best available ground clearance in its class and is aimed at the outdoor set with its 33-inch tires a heavy-duty skid plate from the Ford Raptor, and a twospeed transfer case transmission.

Interior wise, there is a smart, refined look with nice soft-touch surfaces. Luxurious leather drapes the seats and fit and finish is excellent with plenty of storage. The available panoramic sunroof spans two rows of seats and its huge size allows for a bright and airy interior. The Expedition offers the ultimate in interior room and flexibility. The second-row seats can be configured as optional captain's chairs on some models which are heated, and can slide fore, d aft, recline. The third-row seats are standard,

which makes the roomy Ford Expedition a true eight-seater. There is separate climate control zone for the rear. Note that the third row is probably the most spacious in this class and also reclines.

We tested an upper -mid King Ranch® Edition in an eye-catching "Wild Green" paint, 22inch polished wheels, heavy duty towing package, and the road preview system driving assist aid. The King Ranch model has the fancy Del Rio Full Leather Seating Surfaces that feature front captain's chairs both at heated and ventilated with 10-way power.

These include power lumbar and power recline. The second row has power-folding and heated seats with armrests and a tipand-slide feature. As well as the distinctive interior the King Ranch has the larger 15inch touch screen display from the F-150 Lightning.

Technology includes Ford's BlueCruise. This driver aid utilises adaptive cruise control, stop-and-go, lane-centering and speed-sign recognition to allow true hands-free driving when activated on more than 160,000 kilometres of pre-qualified sections of divided highways throughout North America, called Hands-Free Blue Zones.

Every 2024 Ford Expedition comes with standard and available driver-assist features. These include Road Edge Detection, Intersection Assist: and Reverse Brake Assist. The Expedition also has an impressive list of safety features that are mostly included in the Ford Co-Pilot360 suite. The adaptive cruise control system comes with stop and go, there's blind-spot warning with rear-cross traffic alert, and evasive steering assist.

On the road, as expected, the Expedition offers a smooth ride thanks to independent rear suspension. I was surprised to find the Expedition quite easy to park thanks to a



relatively tight turning circle. Of note is the new BlueCruise system which provides hands-free highway driving. Instead of requiring that a driver touch the steering wheel occasionally, it uses a camera to monitor the driver's face to make sure eyes remain on the road. The new Active Air Dam feature improves aerodynamics, deploying at speeds above 63 kph then automatically retracting at lower speeds for city driving and parking. That powerful engine and smooth transmission deliver effortless relaxed highway cruising. Fuel economy

is not miserly at L/100km 12.9 combined - 14.8 city, 10.6 highway, but at least it better than a ga guzzling V8. Not much to complain about, the big SUV is roomy and comfortable and come at cost especially as you move up the model range. It is also massive, a bit excessive for the urban grind, but vastly superior to almost anything for long distance highway cruising if you tow or haul and need 8-passanger seating where it knocks it competitors out he park.

In summing up, the latest generation Expedition is very impressive. It offers a comfortable ride, a roomy cabin with all the comfort and luxury you could want. 



Monsoon Mayhem: Landslides in Kerala's Wayanad claim hundreds of lives

The devastating series of landslides in Kerala's Wayanad district has claimed the lives of at least 132 people and injured over 200, with the toll expected to rise as rescuers search through the debris, official sources said this week.

The disaster, which is the worst the state has seen since floods in 2018, has left behind a trail of destruction in its wake.

Pictures show uprooted trees, flattened houses and broken bridges submerged in muddied waters.

The intensity of the landslide was so high that it split the Iruvanipuzha river, which flows through the area, into two.


The landslides occurred around 2 am and 4.10 am on Tuesday catching people offguard while they were sleeping, leading to a high number of casualties.

Harrowing scenes of dead bodies in sitting and lying positions inside destroyed houses could be seen as rescue operations resumed in the landslide-devastated Mundakkai hamlet on Wednesday morning.

The rescuers could reach many inland areas, which were totally cut off on Wednesday morning only.

According to visuals aired on TV channels, at one place, Army personnel could be seen breaking the tin roof of a house that was completely submerged in mud and using ropes to reach inside to retrieve the bodies of those trapped there. A local man, who went inside one such house, said he saw mud-covered bodies in sitting positions on chairs and lying down on cots.

"The deceased persons might be sitting or lying down when the tragedy struck them in the small hours of Tuesday," he said.



Meanwhile, Wayanad district authorities started collecting data to determine the number of people missing following the massive tragedy.

A special team at the District Emergency Operation Centre is compiling data on the number of people residing in the area, those found after the landslide, and the number of persons missing, a district administration official told reporters.

The official said data on individuals is being collected by reviewing ration card details and other government documents. Members of several families have reported that their loved ones remain untraced.

The massive Wayanad landslides that levelled houses and buried lives underneath them have also scarred the survivors for life.

With their near and dear ones gone and staring at an uncertain future, survivors recount their most traumatic experience ever that unfolded in the wee hours of July 30.

Speaking to PTI, Pranjeesh, a survivor from Mundakkai, said he heard a loud

noise and the landslide occurred four times.

"Around 12.40 am, the landslide occurred. We heard a huge sound. Three members of my family were lost in the landslide that passed right in front of my house. Now, we are in a camp and safe. We are eight people. My mother's sister and her family were left behind," he said.

Prasanna, from Chooralmala, was in tears

Kurian visited the people affected by the landslide in Wavanad.

"The situation is being monitored by the central government at the highest level. The Honourable Prime Minister is monitoring the situation and has deputed me to visit the affected areas.

"Both control rooms of the Ministry of Home Affairs are monitoring the situation 24x7 and providing all possible assistance



when she recounted her experience. The woman witnessed her sister and her family being swept away by the muddy water.

"I could only help my father. I carried him and ran towards the forest. I couldn't help my sister. I couldn't save her. Two of the children ran outside and got washed away. I could hear them screaming. Our house got washed away," Prasanna, in her late 40s, recounted the ordeal.

Union Minister George Kurian has said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi is closely monitoring the landslide situation in Kerala's Wayanad district, with the central government assuring all possible assistance to the state for the rescue efforts of those affected by the tragedy.

to the state," he is quoted as saying in a press release here on Wednesday.

The Chief Minister's Office said that the Army will construct a Bailey bridge for rescue operations in Wayanad's Chooralmala.

Massive landslides triggered by torrential rains struck Mundakkai, Chooralmala, Attamala, and Noolpuzha hamlets in the early hours of Tuesday, killing several people, including women and children.

Former Wayanad MP Rahul Gandhi termed landslides in the Kerala district a "national disaster" and sought a comprehensive action plan even as the administration said 190 persons had been confirmed dead and more than 200 missing.





More people eligible for BC training grants

"City Council is sending a clear message that there is zero tolerance for

illegal construction in Surrey,' said Mayor Brenda Locke. "Illegal construction not only poses serious safety risks, but also erodes the integrity of building regulations. The legal measures we have taken will protect neighborhoods, future homeowners and uphold the standards that make Surrey a safe and vibrant place to live for all. I would like to thank the

Illegal Construction Enforcement Team for their diligent efforts in this critical work."

The notice on title is a result of a Special Council Meeting on July 24, 2024, where Surrey City Council voted unanimously in favour of filing the notice on title to the property. The notice will alert potential buyers, lenders, and insurers about the illegal construction and the potential risks associated with the property.

A notice on title under Section 57 of the Community Charter is a legal measure used by a city to inform the public, including potential purchasers, about unauthorized structures on a property that were built without the necessary building permits or inspections. It serves several purposes, including:

Encouraging Compliance: It encourages owners to bring their property into compliance with the City's Building Bylaw, to ensure homes are built to the minimum health and safety requirements. The legislation provides that the notice will be removed once compliance is achieved.

Transparency and Awareness: It acts as a warning about unauthorized



structures, protecting prospective buyers and informing the public.

Enforcement and Accountability: It emphasizes the City's commitment to enforcing its Building Bylaw by holding property owners accountable for illegal construction activities.

The City of Surrey's Illegal Construction Enforcement Team, established in 2022, is dedicated to enforcing the City's bylaws and targeting residential construction that is done without permits, inspections, or compliance with safety standards. The City of Surrey has also increased fines for illegal building activities and sought compliance through court action.







Translink Will Be Forced To Cut Services By 50% If Funding Is Not Found: Report

In response to the alarming announcement of potential budget cuts to TransLink, Delta Councillor Dylan Kruger called for an emergency meeting of Delta City Council. "This is an existential crisis for Delta and our entire region," said Kruger. "If these cuts are allowed to proceed, the impact on the daily lives of tens of thousands of residents will be devastating. Council must act urgently demand better solutions from senior to government."

If the cuts proceed, Delta will lose almost every

one of its major bus routes, including the 310, 314, 391, 601, 602, 603, 604, 606, 614, 618, and 640. Thousands of Delta residents rely on bus service for their daily needs. Many of these residents have no other means of transportation to get to their place of work, their school, to attend medical appointments, and to buy groceries.

"Access to reliable public transportation is not just a convenience, it's a lifeline," said Kruger. "Entire livelihoods are at stake. It's time to demonstrate strong leadership and

take action to save public transportation in our community."

Kruger has called for a special council meeting under section 126 of the Community Charter to deal with this urgent matter, where Kruger will table an emergency motion.

John Rustad, Leader of the Conservative Party of British Columbia, blamed the chronic financial mismanagement and structural deficits plaguing TransLink under the current NDP government. He said "The residents of Surrey have borne the brunt of TransLink's

financial mismanagement. Overcrowded bus routes and delayed projects are unacceptable. The NDP's inability to deliver on promises is evident. Despite promising the Surrey-Langley SkyTrain project in October 2020, construction only began in late June 2024, with major work delayed until late 2024. Moreover, TransLink executives reversed their pay cuts once provincial bailouts were secured, despite public declarations to the contrary. This lack of accountability and respect for taxpayers is unacceptable."
