
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Shots fired at Port Kells residence linked to extortions targeting South Asians

One more confirmed case of extortion has emerged in Surrey where a South Asian member of the community was threatened to give money to extortionists.

The Surrey RCMP reported that on August 10, 2024 at approximately 3:11 am, shots fired were fired at a residence in the area of 88 Avenue and 192 Street. Evidence consistent with a shooting was located at the scene along with evidence of an attempted arson.

The next day the person living at the same address received a demand for money, which, the police said was "consistent with extortions targeting the South Asian community."

Surrey RCMP believes this incident may be linked to the extortion series.

"Thankfully no one was injured during this incident," says Surrey RCMP Media Relations Officer, Sgt. Tammy Lobb. "The Surrey RCMP Serious Crime Unit has conduct of the investigation and in order to advance the investigation, we are

releasing a photo of the two suspects we believe are involved as well as a photo of the vehicle they allegedly used in commission of the offence," said Sgt. Lobb.

The vehicle, a Kia Rio 5, was recovered on August 12, 2024 and investigators have determined it was stolen from a business complex in Newton.



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persons and properties believed to be involved in the production, and trafficking of MDMA.

On August 17, 2022, the CLEAR team, with the assistance of other RCMP units, executed 4 search warrants on properties located in the cities of Maple Ridge and Coquitlam, BC. As a result, police arrested 5 people on scene and located a large sophisticated economic-based synthetic drug lab that was capable of producing multikilograms of MDMA per cycle.

BC Police bust superlab producing illicit synthetic drugs


Charges have recently been approved against 5 BC men in relation to a complex multijurisdictional investigation. Balbinder Johal, Dennis Halstead, Shawn Cappis, Richard Waugh, and **Christopher Alves have been** charged with multiple offences.

RCMP Federal Policing say that five men have been charged following an investigation that resulted in the dismantling of a large and sophisticated synthetic drug lab. The investigation led to the search of 4 properties which resulted in the locating and dismantling of a large sophisticated synthetic drug lab, and the seizure of 49 kilograms of MDMA (Ecstasy).

In the spring of 2022, the RCMP Pacific Region Federal Policing Program began an investigation that led to the identification of multiple

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Canada boosts programs to attract French-speaking international students and immigrants

CHURCH POINT, NS: Canada has announced plans to redouble its efforts to welcome French-speaking newcomers. Marc Miller, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, announced that the new Francophone Minority Communities Student Pilot (FMCSP) program will be launched on August 26, 2024, in partnership with designated French-language and bilingual post-secondary learning institutions (DLIs).

Minister Miller also announced the addition of 10 communities to the Welcoming Francophone Communities (WFC) initiative. There 10 new communities are Nanaimo (British Columbia), Red River (Manitoba), Chéticamp (Nova Scotia), Belle-Baie, Caraquet and Restigouche West Region (New Brunswick), Prince Albert (Saskatchewan) and Cornwall, as well as Cochrane District (Highway 11 corri-



dor) and London (Ontario).

The Minister made these announcements on the occasion of the Acadian World Congress, in Nova Scotia.

"Promoting French is of prime importance to us. By welcoming Francophone immigrants and supporting them in their integration process, we contribute to the revitalization of these communities, while meeting their skilled workforce needs. We are all the more determined to help more Francophone international students come to Canada and build a future in our dynamic Francophone communities, while contributing to the development of the French-speaking world," he said.

The participants in the FMCSP program are not bound to provide a provincial attestation letter or territorial attestation letter with their study permit application. They will have to present a letter of acceptance from a participating post-secondary DLI that confirms they may participate in the pilot program. A maximum of 2,300 applications will be accepted for processing in the first year of the pilot program. The spouses or common-law partners of the principal applicants may also come to Canada under the pilot program and eventually apply for permanent residence.

French-speaking international students exist in Africa, the Middle East and the Americas, and that the study permit approval rate in these regions has been low in the past. Thanks to the new pilot program, we will make access to Canada's International Student Program fairer for a wide range of international students," he said

The pilot program is a flagship measure of the Policy on Francophone Immigration announced earlier this year and will benefit FMCs by helping them attract and retain international students. To improve the approval rate, students and their families will be exempted from having to demonstrate that they will leave Canada at the end of their temporary stay. In addition, the required financial threshold will

BC Conservative party demands full audit of Surrey Langley Skytrain project after Province announces updated cost

The members of the BC Conservative Party are demanding immediate accountability and a full audit of the Surrey-Langley Skytrain after Province announced that all three contracts have been awarded for the project and said that the project will now cost almost \$6 billion.

In a release the province mentioned that the cost of the project, now \$5.996 billion, has been updated in response to market conditions, including rising inflation costs and key commodity escalation, supply-chain pressures and labour-market challenges.

According to John Rustad, leader of BC Conservative party that \$6 billion cost is an outrageous 50% increase from the original \$3.94 billion estimate. Worse still, the project's completion has been delayed to late 2029, a full year beyond the already

delayed timeline. "This \$2 billion blowout is an absolute disgrace. It's a direct result of this government's gross incompetence and inability to manage even the most basic aspects of a major infrastructure project. British Columbians should be outraged. The NDP has failed our province on every front—from affordability to accountability." Major construction on the first rapid-transit project south of the Fraser River in 30 years is expected to begin in 2024, with guideway, stations, and systems and trackwork contractors now in place. Once complete, people in the region will be able to travel between Langley City and Surrey Centre in approximately 22 minutes and between Langley and downtown Vancouver in just more than an hour.

SkyLink Guideway Partners (SLGP) will



design, build and finance the elevated guideway and associated roadworks, utilities and active transportation elements. South Fraser Station Partners (SFSP), which will build the eight new stations and Transit Integrators BC (TIBC), which will design and build the systems and trackwork.

Elenore Sturko, MLA for Surrey South and Conservative Party of British Columbia candidate for Surrey-Cloverdale, echoed Rustad's criticism and highlighted the impact on her constituents in Surrey-Cloverdale: "This is not just a mismanagement issue; this is a betrayal of the public's trust. Residents of Surrey and Langley are being forced to shoulder the burden of this government's failure. Delays, broken promises, and skyrocketing costs—this is what happens when the NDP is in charge. It's time for real leadership that will prioritize people over political games."

Rustad and Sturko are demanding immediate accountability and a full audit of the project. They are calling on the government to explain how it allowed costs to spiral out of control and why British Columbians should continue to foot the bill for its failures.



Punjabi Music Star AP Dhillon Strikes Deal With Republic Records

Shining as a leader in the Punjabi music scene, acclaimed singer, rapper, and producer AP Dhillon has signed to Republic Records in alliance with Universal Music Canada. He unveiled his new single and video, which marks the first release under this newly minted partnership, "Old Money," out now.

The deal is being described as a "groundbreaking deal" with Republic Records in alliance with Universal Music Canada.

Republic said on Monday (August 5) that the India-born, Canada-based superstar "becomes the first-ever India-born singersongwriter, rapper and record producer of Punjabi lineage" to join the label's roster.

A recent report on the Canadian streaming market from former Spotify Chief Economist Will Page noted that Punjabi is "the fastest growing musiclanguage in Canada right now, thanks to the success of artists like Ikky, Karan Aujla, and AP Dhillon."

Elsewhere in the market, August last year, Warner Music Canada and Warner Music India launched 91 NORTH RECORDS, a JV led by artist and producer Ikky (Ikwinder Singh) aimed at supporting artists of South Asian heritage.

Dhillon's first release on Republic will be Old Money, a new single and video that will arrive on August 9, 2024. Two weeks later, on August 23, 2024, a new album, The Brownprint, will follow.

The 31-year-old Dhillon moved to Canada in 2015 for his post-graduation course in Business Administration and Management. According to one report, for about four years, he did odd jobs like working at gas stations and convenience stores, a detail that also features in his 2020 hit "Brown Munde."

Dhillon has co-produced the majority of The Brownprint, with DŹŁ (Future, Central Cee), Luca Mauti (J.Cole, Eminem) and AzizTheShake (BIA, Central Cee) also contributing to the upcoming album.

Reflecting on the deal, Monte Lipman, Founder & Chairman, Republic said: "AP Dhillon is not only an incredible artist who continues to defy gravity in real


time, but a shrewd visionary with a global reach that has already sparked a cultural revolution."

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B.C. Announces New Programs And Funding To Support Tree Fruit Growers

PENTICTON, BC: Ever since the BC Tree Fruits Cooperative announced its sudden decision to close its operations, BC fruit growers were left in a lurch. The BC government announced three new or updated financial supports and changes to help stabilize their bottom line and overcome significant challenges posed by extreme weather, market instability and the recent closure of the BC Tree Fruits Cooperative.

The Cooperative is responsible for promoting, picking, transporting, packing and delivering fruits like apples, cherries, pears and apricots. "On July 25, 2024, the Board of Directors determined that due to extremely low estimated fruit volumes and difficult market conditions, the cooperative would not be able to effectively operate the business and provide pool returns to growers," the cooperative said in the letter. The Province is enhancing its AgriStability program to raise the AgriStability compensation rate to 90% and double the compensation cap for all farmers for the



2024 program year. This will provide an estimated \$15 million in immediate relief to farmers in need. This enhancement will help stabilize farm income and help farmers manage the increasing risk due to extreme weather. Late enrolment will also be available for producers not enrolled in the AgriStability program.

The new Tree Fruit Climate Resiliency

program will provide \$5 million to help tree-fruit farmers buy equipment and pursue projects that were not eligible under previous programs. This will strengthen farm resilience and preparedness for extreme weather. This program will build on the successful extreme weather preparedness program and recognizes the effect of climate-change events on the tree-fruit sector during the past few years.

"Locally grown fruit is loved across B.C., but for the last few years, farmers and the industry as a whole have faced unprecedented challenges," said Premier David Eby. "From extreme weather driven by climate change to the closure of the processing co-operative, growers need support if they are going to be able to survive and thrive in the future. We're taking action now at the provincial level, and also championing important changes needed from federal government. Farmers need all levels of government to pitch in during this critical moment."


Sukhpaul Bal, president, BC Cherry Association, said: "The BC Cherry Association is pleased with today's announcement by the B.C. government.

Extreme weather events over the past five years have been devastating for agriculture in B.C., and As resilient as farmers are, this support recognizes these sudden changes in climate go far beyond what they can handle. Moving forward, British Columbia can and should be a leader in food production, but we recognize this needs an agricultural strategy that re-examines the entire food system and an unprecedented investment in agriculture. Finally, we would like to thank and acknowledge ministry staff for working tirelessly with industry leaders in providing this immediate support and we look forward to working collaboratively on long-term, sustainable strategies and solutions."

To support the longevity and sustainability of the sector, Premier Eby and Alexis have directed the Ministry of Agriculture and Food to begin developing, in consultation with industry, options for a one-time fund with an emphasis on smaller producers.

"We are appreciative of the Province's actions to support the tree-fruit sector, which has been grappling with significant challenges for the past four years," said Peter Simonsen, president, BC Fruit Growers Association. "The enhancements to the AgriStability program and the introduction of the Tree Fruit Climate Resiliency program are positive steps toward stabilizing our industry, and we are particularly encouraged by the development of a one-time Climate Change Response Fund that can provide immediate relief to our farmers who are on the front lines of climate change. However, we must remember this is just the first step in a long journey. There is much more work to be done to ensure the sustainability and growth of our sector. We look forward to working closely with the Province and all levels of government to ensure the longevity of the B.C. tree fruit sector."

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Edmonton Police seek assistance locating suspect vehicle in double homicide of Harpreet and Gavin Uppal

 $E^{\text{dmonton Police Service}}_{\text{(EPS) Homicide detectives}}$ seeking the assistance locating a suspect vehicle that is related to the deaths of a father and son at an Ellerslie area business in 2023.

Police are actively searching for a green 2005-2007 Nissan X-trail that investigators believe is linked to the November 2023 shooting deaths of Harpreet Uppal, 41, and his son, Gavin Uppal, 11. The vehicle is noted to have distinctive damage along the passenger side, including a horizontal dent along the rear bumper and a distinctive rust spot over the rear passenger tire. Images of the vehicle and damage are included below.

Harpreet Uppal and his son Gavin Uppal, father and son,



were shot to death on Nov. 9, 2023 outside of a business in the area of 50 Street and Ellerslie Road. A third vehicle occupant, another 11-year-old boy not related to Uppal or his son, fled the vehicle immediately after the shooting and was not physically

According to media reports, Harpreet Uppal was a "higherlevel figure" in Edmonton's organised crime scene. "Mr. Uppal was very well known to us, very high up in the gang drug world," said Edmonton

Police Acting superintendent Colin Derksen at that time. "We had worked very hard over the years to try to warn and give him opportunities to step out of that lifestyle, and keep him and his family safe."

It was reported to police that the suspects arrived in a black BMW SUV. The two then exited their vehicle, ran towards Uppal's white SUV, fired a weapon and fled the scene. Detectives determined that the shooting was targeted, and Mr. Uppal's 11-year-old son was intentionally murdered.

A short time after the shooting, police were notified of a vehicle fire in the area of 34 Street and Township Road 510 (north of Beaumont).

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BC United Announce Large Income Tax Break For Middle Class If Elected

VICTORIA, BC: BC United leader Kevin Falcon announced this week that if elected, a BC United Government would eliminate the provincial income tax on the first \$50,000 earned by every British Columbian which he called "largest middle class tax cut in BC's history."

"BC United will implement the largest middle class tax cut in B.C.'s history by eliminating the provincial income tax for 60 percent of British Columbians. This historic tax cut will put an average of \$2,050 back into your wallet, helping you afford essentials like food, gas, and kid's extracurricular programs," said Falcon.



It's the biggest policy proposal announced so far by the official Opposition, as B.C. United continues to lag behind the B.C. Conservatives in opinion polls.

For the first time in more than a decade, more people are leaving B.C. than moving to the province. This historic tax cut will put more money back into the pockets of students, families, and seniors. "The tax cut is projected to cost \$5.4 billion annually, about 1 percent of B.C.'s nominal GDP. However, the expected increase in economic activity, consumer spending, and job creation is anticipated to offset a significant amount of the revenue loss," Falcon said.

"Completely eliminating income tax for 60 percent of British Columbians in the middle of this NDP affordability crisis will ensure our children, nurses, doctors, and families can actually afford to live in our province again," added Peter Milobar, BC United Shadow Minister for Finance and MLA for Kamloops North-Thompson.

The first \$50,000 of income will be taxfree by increasing the Basic Personal Exemption. Taxpayers will save up to \$2,050 annually with this change. Over 2.4 million British Columbians will pay no provincial income tax.

Former Attorney General Wally Oppal Raises Concerns **Following Financial Regulator's Punitive Action**

7ANCOUVER, BC: BC's former attorney general is raising concerns about a recent decision by the province's financial regulator that he believes could have implications across the sector.

Acting as legal representative for Rent It Furnished, Wally Oppal said the BC Financial Services Authority (BCFSA) suspended his client's licence and froze trust accounts under an unfair urgent order.

The July 25 order itself stated the BCFSA had zero evidence of a public complaint, nor evidence of misappropriation of trust funds. Prior to issuing the order, the BCFSA also didn't give Rent It Furnished an opportunity to defend itself.

Rent It Furnished is a Vancouver-based company that provides furnished rentals and property management services in Vancouver, Toronto and Montreal.

The order was rescinded August 9 following an urgent legal hearing that included results from KPMG's third-party forensic audit, which Rent It Furnished commissioned to vindicate itself. BCFSA said in a release, "BCFSA varied the Urgent Order suspending RIF's licence and rescinded the Urgent Order freezing the brokerage's trust accounts, which allows RIF to resume providing rental property management and real estate services and disperse funds to its clients. An Urgent Order remains in force and requires RIF to provide monthly trust reconciliations to BCFSA until its disciplinary hearing, scheduled for November 12, 2024." "The BCFSA has a legitimate role to

protect the public, but this suspension didn't fit the circumstances and caused widespread disruption to the business and members of the public who depend on it," said Oppal, who served for almost 25 years as a BC Supreme Court & Appeals Court Justice before becoming attorney general. "While Rent It Furnished had some administrative issues, the order was unnecessarily punitive, especially



considering the business is classified an essential service. I am pleased the BCFSA took a second look and rescinded it."

Founder and CEO Erika Weimer agrees there were issues with how reports were being reconciled and generated on the company's automated systems, but she and her

staff were working actively with the BCFSA to resolve the issues when the order blindsided them.

"I am still numb from what happened because there was zero evidence of misappropriation of trust funds, which we fought relentlessly to prove," said Weimer, who started the company 15 years ago. "Though the suspension was brief, thousands of our landlords and tenants were disrupted and had to seek temporary assistance outside of our company to pay and receive rent, and we were forbidden from tending to building maintenance emergencies."

Rent It Furnished resumed operations and staff is working diligently to process rent transactions between landlords and tenants and tend to maintenance emergencies.

Rent It Furnished still faces a disciplinary hearing scheduled for November 12 to 14, and until then, is required to provide the BCFSA monthly trust reconciliation accounts.



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19 Year Old Burnaby Man Charged With Multiple Offences After Sextortion Investigation

Acharged in relation to the alleged online sextortion of multiple teenage victims after a cross-country investigation led by Burnaby RCMP's Child Abuse and Sexual Offences (CASO) Unit.

The investigation began after several victims located in Nova Scotia, Quebec and Ontario reported to police that they were being extorted online after sharing explicit images with someone they met on social media platforms. The suspect then allegedly demanded money under threat of sending images to the victims' social networks.

A Burnaby resident was identified as the suspect, and Burnaby RCMP's CASO

19-year-old Burnaby man has been Unit began investigating in December 2022. On January 26, 2023 a search warrant was executed at a home in Burnaby.

> On July 11, 2024, Anwer Jelassi of Burnaby was charged with 23 offences. Jelassi is subject of a number of courtordered conditions, including not to contact any victims, not to have contact with anyone under the age of 16, and not to access social networking or dating sites, including TikTok, Instagram, Snapchat, Bumble, and Tinder. Anyone with information to indicate Jelassi is breaching his conditions is asked to call Burnaby RCMP at 604-646-9999 and quote file 22-18157.

The majority of charges relate to victims between the ages of 15 and 18 who reported incidents to police in their jurisdictions. Their identities are protected by a publication ban.

We would really like to commend these victims for coming forward and reporting these incidents to police, said Cpl. Max Gagné with Burnaby RCMP's CASO unit. Their bravery in stepping forward and telling someone has allowed us to advance this investigation, which has now resulted in criminal charges.

Burnaby RCMP would like to thank the law enforcement partners who assisted in the investigation, including the BC Integrated Child Exploitation Team

There continues to be an increase in sextortion cases in Burnaby and across Canada, though they are believed to be widely unreported.

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B.C. Residents Face The Highest Rate Of Unaffordable Housing In Canada: Report

B.C.'s Human Rights Commissioner launched a report this week that highlights significant inequities and injustices affecting B.C. residents. The report British Columbia. Rights in Focus: Lived Realities in B.C. takes a focused look at 10 key systems impacting human rights in BC.

The systems selected for the report are those that most impact B.C. residents' social, economic and political lives. The Rights in focus include housing, adequate standard of living, education, health, fair treatment in public spaces, employment, treatment in criminal justice, treatment in family spheres, treatment by the child welfare system and a clean, healthy and sustainable environment.

"Across B.C., there are inequalities in the systems we interact with every day or when we are in need of extra support—from schools to workplaces; from hospitals to courthouses," said Commissioner Kasari Govender. "Such inequities impact all of us, but impact

marginalized people and communities in particular. We must ensure that we place human rights considerations at the centre of key issues concerning housing, climate, child protection, criminal justice and public health because these systems are instrumental in either protecting or undermining our human dignity and rights entitlements."

.C. residents face the highest rate of unaffordable housing in Canada. As a result, homelessness and encampments are on the rise: the 2023 homeless count identified 31 per cent more people experiencing homelessness when compared with 2020/21.

Everyone has the right to adequate housing: housing that is safe, affordable, accessible, culturally appropriate, legally secure and in good repair. All levels of government are obligated to take steps, to the maximum of their available resources, to realize the right to housing. Yet there remains an alarming, widening gap between this standard and the reality in British Columbia. In fact, B.C. residents face one of the world's most inaccessible housing markets. As a result,

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homelessness and encampments are on the rise: the 2023 homeless count identified 31 per cent more people experiencing homelessness when compared with 2020/21. While the housing crisis affects everyone, its impacts are particularly severe for marginalized people.

The right to an adequate standard of living: About one in nine B.C. residents lives in poverty. Moreover, after years of decline, the poverty rate rose from 7.6 per cent in 2020 to 11.6 per cent in 2022.

The right to education: In B.C., there are large differences between groups in educational outcomes. 92 per cent of all students complete secondary school in six years, but only 78 per cent of students with disabilities, and 75 per cent of Indigenous students.

The right to fair treatment in employment: One in 10 respondents to a poll conducted for our Office reported experiencing discrimination based on their identity when applying for a job in B.C. This is consistent with other research that shows that people from marginalized identity groups are less likely to be employed, work in secure jobs or hold managerial roles and they earn less for their work.

The right to health: Many people lack access to basic care, including 17 per cent who are without a regular health care provider. Both the COVID-19 pandemic and the toxic drug crisis have placed unprecedented additional demands on an already stretched health care system.

The right to fair treatment in public spaces: One in five Canadians, including 29 per cent of racialized people, have experienced some form of hate, harassment or violence online. Hate incidents rose dramatically during the COVID-19 pandemic, and again in response to recent violence in Gaza. This rise is reflected in police-reported hate crimes, but also in the many incidents not reported to police

The right to fair treatment in criminal justice: Indigenous and racialized people, as well as people with mental health or substance use (MHSU) disorders, are at severely increased risk of interactions with the criminal justice system. For example, on any given day in 2023, about 1,829 individuals were in B.C. correctional centres and over one-third (662) of them identified as Indigenous.

The right to fair treatment in the family sphere: Regardless of employment status, women spend more time than men on childcare and household chores. This additional domestic burden is compounded by lower pay in the workforce, together increasing economic vulnerability and making it hard to leave abusive relationships.

The right to fair treatment by the child welfare system: The number of children and youth in care (CYIC) has decreased in recent years, but the child welfare system disproportionately affects children from marginalized families, particularly those who are Indigenous, experiencing poverty or living with disabilities. For example, despite making up only 10 per cent of the population, 68 per cent of CYIC are Indigenous.

All human rights depend on a clean, healthy and sustainable environment: The harm falls disproportionately on marginalized people, who have contributed least to the crisis and whose rights are already least secure. This was evident in recent years as unprecedented flooding, heat waves, and wildfires destroyed biodiversity, lives and property across the province.






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
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

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RCMP Constable Pancharatnarajah: a journey of courage and advocacy

Richmond RCMP continues to celebrate the 50th anniversary of women in the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. This milestone represents a significant achievement in the history of diversity and inclusion within the RCMP. As part of this commemoration, we are featuring a series of profiles of RCMP members serving the Richmond detachment, highlighting their diverse ranks, roles, and backgrounds.

Constable Pancharatnarajah (Panch) is a dedicated and compassionate RCMP officer with four-and-a-half years of service. She recently joined the Richmond RCMP Special Victims Unit (SVU), a unit tasked with investigating some of the most sensitive and impactful crimes within the community. The SVU's mandate includes investigating crimes related to physical and sexual abuse of children, child luring, and the possession, making, and distribution of Child Sexual Exploitation Material (CESM). The unit works closely with BC integrated Child Exploitation (BC ICE) and US

Homeland Security to ensure thorough investigations and the protection of vulnerable individuals. In her role, Cst. Panch conducts interviews and monitors statements with children under 14 years old, providing critical support and advocacy for the youngest victims in our community.

Cst. Panch is also an appointed director on the board of Out on Patrol, an organization for 2SLGBTQI+ law enforcement officers.

What inspired you to join the RCMP?

Growing up, I always dreamed of becoming a police officer. Through my lived experiences as an 2SLGBTQI+ South Asian woman and Tamil immigrant, a police officer was not in the equation growing up. My parents didn't have that dream for me, as being a police officer back home was considered a 'man's job.' Additionally, growing up in a South Asian household in Scarborough, Ontario, police officers were often disliked and viewed as being racist and violent towards our community. It took me a long time to finally decide to pursue my dreams and apply to the RCMP.

I joined the police force to break down barriers within my culture, and within the force itself. I wanted to show Tamil women that they should always follow their dreams, never stop believing, and not allow others to decide their fate. I wanted to show Tamil women that they do not need to sit at an unenjoyable desk job that is expected of them. And importantly, I wanted to show Tamil and South Asian women that even though policing has historically been viewed as a man's job, we can and must break those barriers and achieve anything we put our minds to.

What motivates you to continue serving in law enforcement?

What motivates me to continue serving law enforcement is seeing a difference in people's

faces and thought processes when they learn that I am a police officer. Witnessing their joy when they see a South Asian woman in a uniform gives me the motivation to wake up every day and do what I do. Growing up, there was no representation of South Asian women, especially Tamil women, in law enforcement. If I can be the representation or a role model for other South Asian women, then I know I did something right.

What challenges have you faced in your career, and how have you overcome them?

My intersectional identity as a woman, lesbian, Tamil, and visible person of colour has produced unique challenges. When meeting new members or coming into a new detachment, there are always challenges in ensuring that people are comfortable with my sexuality or their ability to pronounce my name. Luckily, I've only encountered 1 or 2 instances where I was uncomfortable with comments



addressed to me by fellow members, and I have been able to address this within the workplace. I have also faced some harsh interactions during calls, including comments from fellow racialized people accusing me of betraying people of colour for wearing my uniform, and from men of colour for not being a traditional South Asian woman by being a police officer. Speaking to the South Asian community about why I became a police officer has been rewarding work for me.

Can you share a memorable experience from your time with the RCMP?

In 2023, my colleagues informed me of a non-profit organization called Out on Patrol. This organization is made up of 2SLGBTQI+ members of law enforcement, with a focus on community outreach, charitable work, and education. My most memorable experience was being invited to join the Out on Patrol booth at Kelowna Pride during my time with the Kelowna detachment. We set up a tent in Kelowna Park, alongside other vendors, which allowed us to connect with the community. Out on Patrol has had a massive impact on the Kelowna community, garnering significant positive feedback. After moving to Richmond RCMP, I had the privilege of joining Out on Patrol as a board member.

What advice would you give to young women considering a career with the RCMP?

Don't let anything or anyone stop you from following your dreams. Not your sexuality, your cultural norms, the colour of your skin, or your gender. Keep going.

Duties on Canada's softwood lumber exports cannot be justified: Bruce Ralston

The United States recently an-I nounced an increase in tariffs on Canadian softwood lumber from 8.05 percent to 14.45 percent, which will devastate Canada's forestry sector and the thousands of jobs that depend on it. In a statement Canada's Minister of Export Promotion Mary Ng said, "Baseless and unfair U.S. duties on softwood lumber unjustifiably harm consumers and producers on both sides of the border. This latest measure will negatively impact workers and their communities U.S. consumers and businesses that need Canadian lumber will bear the burden of these duties, making housing even less affordable for Americans."

The U.S. Department of Commerce initiated the fifth administrative reviews of its softwood lumber AD and CVD duty orders on March 14, 2023. It issued the preliminary results of these reviews on February 1, 2024. It issued its final results on August 13, 2024. The new combined duty rate that will apply to most softwood lumber exports is 14.54% compared to the previous rate of 8.05% from the fourth administrative reviews.

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

New for 2024, there is an exterior redesign, a longer wheelbase, and a roomier interior with a third-row seating option. The exterior redesign is a slab sided with sharply defined wheel arches. It looks good from any angle A cool feature is a small locking handle on the C-pillar for getting access to roof racks.

entry models are powered by a 1.6L four-cylinder hybrid setup, with 231 hp and 271 lb-ft of torque and six speed transmission. The top the XRT and Ultimate Calligraphy trims use a 2.5L turbo-four cylinder with 277 horsepower and 311 pound-feet of torque coupled to a an eightspeed automatic AWD transmission.

In terms of pricing, the 2024 Hyundai Santa Fe starts with the well-equipped Preferred: \$40,999, Preferred with Trend package: \$44,999, XRT: \$46,999, Luxury: \$49,999 and the Ultimate Calligraphy at \$53,499. As standard feature include: a wireless phone charger, dual-pane sunroof, leatherette seats digital gauge cluster, as well as a digital key allowing access via a smartphone or smartwatch. 



Doctor's Rape And Murder In Kolkata Sparks Protests Across India

I following the rape and murder of a junior doctor during her 36-hour shift at a state-run hospital in the eastern city of Kolkata.

The 31-year-old postgraduate trainee was found dead in a seminar hall of the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in state capital Kolkata on 9 August. An autopsy confirmed sexual assault.

A suspect has been arrested, a civil volunteer named Sanjay Roy, who is associated with the Kolkata police. The federal Central Bureau of Investigation has overtaken the case amid calls for an unbiased and transparent inquiry.

assive protests have erupted in India Doctors say the circumstances of the rape point to the vulnerability of medics left without proper protection and facilities. Though police have detained a man who worked at the hospital helping people navigate busy queues, state government officers have been accused of mishandling the case.

> Services in government hospitals were affected and thousands of patients suffered after doctors launched a strike against workplace violence. Indian doctors have called for a nationwide shutdown of hospital services.

> The Indian Medical Association (IMA), the country's largest grouping of medics



with 400,000 members, said the 24hour shutdown would be implemented on Saturday, affecting most hospital departments except for essential services. Hundreds and thousands of women across the country poured on to the streets at midnight demanding justice for the junior doctor as they participated in "reclaim the night" marches.

"Doctors, especially women vulnerable to violence because of the nature of the profession. It is for the authorities to provide for the safety of doctors inside hospitals and campuses," the IMA said in a statement issued on Thursday on X.

The South Asian Business community has been rocked across Canada by extortion calls with maximum

cases cropping in Lower Mainland, Brampton and Edmonton.

Extortions calls started as rumours in 2023 October. But a few months later, police confirmed that the South Asian businesses were indeed facing threats through phone calls, WhatsApp messages, and letters, compelling them to provide monetary concessions. The cases were confirmed in Surrey, West Vancouver,

Abbotsford, Edmonton (Alberta), and Brampton (Ontario).

According to media reports in Canada and India, various gangs from India were behind these extortions, Canadian police departments did not confirm anything at the beginning.

One news outlet reported that in an extortion incident in Abbotsford, the "suspects are believed to be associated to the Lawrence BISHNOI gang based in India according to the memo, adding that the extortion appears to target affluent members of the South Asian community." The police too did not rule out international

involvement but did not confirm anything since it is still under investigation.

The Edmonton Police officials later also publicly confirmed that the series of arsons, shootings and extortions affecting local South Asian community in Edmonton since October 2023 were being conducted by local individuals directed by a suspect in India.

Inspector Lance Parker of organized crime branch of Edmonton Police said in a press conference this week. "At this time, we believe the series has been committed by a group of local individuals being directed by a suspect in India."

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Surrey Mayor Proposes Higher Fire Safety Penalties to Address Escalating Risks During Summer

Surrey Mayor Brenda Locke introduced a Notice of Motion directing staff to conduct a review of financial penalties for violations during open fire bans. The motion aims to ensure public safety by increasing and potentially doubling fines for violations of fire safety regulations, which include the discharge of fireworks, when an open fire ban is in effect.

"By taking this step, we are sending a clear message that the safety of our community is our top priority," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "During summertime and heatwaves, we must equip ourselves with the necessary tools to protect our environment and residents. It's essential that everyone understands the serious consequences of violating these regulations, as they directly impact our

ability to keep our city safe."

Staff will prepare a report for Council's consideration on the potential of increasing financial penalties.

Since May 1, Surrey Fire Service has responded to over 403 brush and grass fires, most of which were caused by human activity. Enforcement of fire regulations is being enhanced in City parks and Bylaw Services will be working closely with the Surrey RCMP and Surrey Fire Services to ensure a coordinated response.

Contravention of By-laws can come with significant financial penalties, including up to \$5,000 for the use of fireworks and up to \$2,000 for campfires, plus the costs of prosecution. Individuals may also face a penalty of up to \$2,000 for smoking or setting a fire in City parks.



In 2023, the City of Surrey issued 30 tickets related to the fire season: 11 for unlawful burning, 11 for smoking where prohibited (parks), and 8 for unlawful fire. This year, the City has issued a total of 15 tickets: 10 tickets for unlawful burning, 3 for smoking where prohibited (parks), and

2 for unlawful fire.

Delta Police Remove 6 Impaired Drivers from Roads in Just 3.5 Hours

On Friday August 9th, in a concerted effort to keep our roads safe, the Delta Police Department conducted a proactive road safety blitz. This proactive engagement during a 3.5-hour period resulted in the removal of six impaired drivers including a taxi driver, from our shared roadways. This operation underscores the ongoing dangers of impaired driving and the department's unwavering commitment to protecting the community.

Stop 1 - 9:41 pm:

An officer stopped a vehicle shortly after it left a local pub. The driver provided a roadside breath sample that registered a "Warn." As a result, the officer issued a 3-day driving prohibition, and a sober driver drove the vehicle away.

Stop 2 - 9:42 pm:

Officers responded to a collision involving an off-duty taxicab that had struck a parked

car. The officer suspected impairment, and the taxi driver subsequently provided breath samples at and near 4 times the legal limit. New Phishing Scam Targets BC Hydro Customers

The BC RCMP is I warning BC Hydro customers about a new scam where customers are tricked into providing personal information by calling a fraudulent BC Hydro customer support number.

BC Hydro and the BC RCMP have received over a hundred reports throughout the province that paid advertisements are posing as BC Hydro urging customers to call their customer support number to set up new electricity services or reconnect BC Hydro service. The ads utilize BC Hydro's name, but the URL is not correct. These false sites are often found online via search engine. When BC Hydro customers call the fake number, the scammers



ask the caller a similar set of scripted questions which BC Hydro uses in its own contact centre to verify customer identity.

The RCMP is actively investigating all reports of this scam and it requests the public to report the issues to their local police if they have fallen victim. The RCMP is working with BC Hydro to have these phishing websites removed from search engines but request the public do their due diligence when on the internet to ensure they are

on the legitimate website.

To avoid falling victim to scams, BC Hydro wants its customers to know:

It does not collect credit card or bank account information over the phone or by email or text.

If an account is in arrears, BC Hydro will send several notices by mail and use an auto dialer to remind customers to make a payment. Customers can also check their account status at any time at bchydro.com.





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

John Abraham and Sharvari's thriller on caste system gets you thinking, delivers a hard-hitting message

Vedaa's win lies in the attention to details. As hard it is to digest, a girl belonging to a lower caste, requests an upper caste woman to fill her water bottle from the college's water cooler. It is so deeply ingrained in her, that in another scene, she would rather cry and let a gang of upper caste hooligans assault her, than react.

The story

John Abraham is back with action (that he wants all non-idiots to know isn't anything like this recent action films), complete with his t-shirt-ripping muscles. Only here, there's brains behind the brawn. Vedaa begins with the story of a court marshalled Gorkha officer, Major Abhimanyu Kanwar (played by John), who enters the life of a young girl, Vedaa (played by Sharvari). She has seen

honour killings up close and personally- her own brother was brutally killed by the 'Pradhan' of the village, Jitendra Pratap Singh (played by Abhishek Banerjee). He also kills a girl from his family for running away with the 'lower caste' boy. You get the drift. Sharvari plans to do a lot with her life. She yearns to learn boxing even as people around dissuade her. Abhimanyu recognises her zeal, and begins to train her, much to the dismay of the fellow male boxers.

After killing her sister, the upper caste antagonists are now chasing Sharvari in order to kill her. Does she escape?

Nikhil Advani has clearly come a long way from the sappy romance he directed in Kal Ho Naa Ho, to now Vedaa. The sensitivity of the subject at hand is revealed via just the disclaimer shown in the beginning of the film. I stopped counting after a few seconds, given how long it was. Calling it fiction in the beginning, convincing us they don't mean to hurt anyone isn't exactly reassuring for the audience who is going to be delivered a hard hitting drama about real life casteism. It's a film which ridicules the caste system, and should hurt those who still believe in it! But sigh, such are the ways of the film world.

What doesn't work

For the life of me, I still fail to understand how can a man built like a tank survive everything, yet in the climax feels the pinch as he is shot... in the shoulder? And then falls to the ground after eating four more bullets... and stands up again? What is happening? Meanwhile, Jitendra, the antagonist, is walking normally after getting shot in the stomach. Vedaa deserves this criticism because it isn't looking to sell itself as a masala potboiler with cars and goons flying. Realistic deaths for realistic dramas, please. And let's not even get started on the music of Vedaa. Both songs- Holiyaan and Mummy Ji- are just loo breaks, and test your patience in the middle of an otherwise engaging story. **Performance report card**

John is passable. Of course. his build helps and almost convinces us. Almost. For once, I was glad that there was no OTT sequence designed for the male actor's entry. John enters the frame normally, grieving the loss of his wife (played by Tamannaah Bhatia), killed by terrorists. He avenges her death and pays the price. However, Vedaa decides she will approach the courts for her justice.





Duties on Canada's softwood lumber exports cannot be justified: Bruce Ralston

The new rate will be applied retroactively to exports made in 2022 and will apply to new exports of softwood lumber products to the United States from companies that were subject to the fifth administrative reviews

The many hardworking people in B.C.'s forest industry have experienced years of unfair American duties. In addition to hurting forestry communities in B.C. and across Canada, these unjustified duties are increasing the cost of building homes in the U.S., making life harder for people south of the border." He informed that Premier David Eby has spoken directly with the U.S. ambassador, calling on the U.S. to end American duties, and instead champion economic opportunity and lower costs for people.

"We have said from the start and we will say it again now: The only solution is an end to unfair softwood lumber duties. The evidence is clear: Duties on Canada's softwood lumber exports cannot be justified. That's why, alongside the Government of Canada, we will continue to pursue litigation under North American Free Trade Agreement, the Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement, the U.S. Court of International Trade and at the World Trade Organization."

The AWD on the XRT does allow for a bit more tire slip than normal and you do get Hill descent control and an all-wheel-drive lock button that keeps the clutch on rear axle fully engaged. The XRT can handle hills, ditches, ruts, buried rocks, stumps, roots and a bit of mud. With its center differential locked, the Santa Fe XRT climbed hills easily, controlling wheel slip and sending measured amounts of torque as needed to each axle.

The Santa Fe is rated to tow as much

as 2,041kg (4,500 lb) with the XRT package and the roof rails can hold an impressive 220 pounds of camping equipment or other outdoor toys. One other attribute to the XTR if you do go outdoors, the large rear hatch opening s almost 6 inches wider than the previous model makes loading cargo into the back easier.

To sum up, the 2024 Hyundai Santa Fe is a much improved replacement for the previous model with great styling, more accommodation, and excellent

standard equipment levels. The XRT version is a versatile outdoors as a decent recreation and camping vehicle but is not really designed as an ahigh performance boulder -bashing off-roader. Highly recommended as a best buy in this sector and the XRT Package gives you that extra in the look and versatility department.

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
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
