

There Is No Clear Winner In **BC'S Election Yet; What Happens Next?**

"To British Columbians who voted for change, I hear you and the serious message you have sent. We have not done enough and we must do better," BC NDP leader David Eby

CURREY: The 2024 British Columbia election have been very close and tense. Polls predicted tight race between the David Eby led NDP and the Conservative Party, led by John Rustad. The polls were right, as no clear winner emerged on the result day in B.C.

Both parties fell short of winning the required 47 seats to form a government. Also, there were some shocking outcomes with NDP losing almost 70 percent of its seats in Surrey. The Initial count was complete

in all electoral districts across the province with NDP winning 46 seats and BC Conservative party winning 45 seats. A party needs 47 seats in total to form a government. BC's Green party only won 2 seats across the province with a surprising

defeat of its leader Sonia Furstenau from her riding. According to election BC, "At the conclusion of initial count, voter turnout was estimated to be 57.41%. This is up from the last B.C. election in 2020, in which 53.86% of registered

voters cast a ballot. As of the close of initial count, 2,037,897 ballots have been cast, the most ever in a provincial election in B.C. The previous record was 1,986,374 votes cast in the 2017 provincial election."



Conservative challenger Mandeep Dhaliwal unseated former two-time MLA and cabinet minister Rachna Singh in Surrey North. Dhaliwal got 7,729 and Singh got 6,469 votes.



The new riding of Surrey-Serpentine River was won by former Surrey mayor Linda Hepner of the BC Conservatives defeating Baltej Singh Dhillon. Hepner got 9,557 and Dhillon got 9,047 votes.



In Surrey-White Rock, Trevor Halford the Conservative candidate defeated NDP's Darryl Walker by almost 2000 votes. Halford got 14,259 while Walker got 12,261 votes.



Conservative challenger Honveer Singh Randhawa defeated NDP's Garry Begg in Surrey-Guildford for few hundred votes. Elections BC denied Garry Begg's request for a recount. Randhawa got 8,675 and Begg got 8,572.



Elenore Sturko from Conservative party won in Surrey-Cloverdale defeating NDP's Mike Starchuk. Sturko got 10,016 votes while Starchuk got 9,340 votes.



Conservative Bryan Tepper defeated two-term MLA and former NDP cabinet minister Jinny Sims in Surrey-Panorama riding. Tepper got 8,531 and Sims **got 8,177 votes.**



B.C. Conservative Brent Chapman who courted controversy just a few days before elections for his comments on Palestine, won from Surrey-South, defeating Haroon Gaffar. Chapman got 12,471 votes and Ghaffar got 8,625 votes.



Voters in Surrey-Newton have once again elected an NDP MLA, with Jessie Sunner following in the footsteps of former MLA and labour minister Harry Bains. Sunner got 7,632 and Tegjot **Bal of the Conservative party** got 6,512 votes.



In Surrey-Fleetwood NDP candidate and current minister Jagrup Brar won defeating **Conservatives** Avtar Gill. Brar got 9,573 and Gill got 8,991 votes.



In Surrey-City Centre, less than 100 votes separate the NDP's Amna Shah and B.C. Conservative Zeeshan Wahla, triggering an automatic recount with the potential to cost the NDP another seat. Shah got 6,440 votes and Wahla got 6,347 votes.

Surrey to build designated ash scattering pier



This week Surrey Council, in its regular meeting, has directed staff to consider providing a pier for the scattering of ashes on the Fraser River.

The Parks, Recreation & Culture Department has recommended that Council proceed with the development of a designated pier, with potential

locations at Brownsville Bar Park or Surrey Public Wharf. This initiative aims to create a peaceful environment for families to commemorate their loved ones.

"Our community deserves a space where families can honour their loved ones in a meaningful way," said Mayor Brenda "Designating a pier Locke. for ash scattering respects cultural practices that are intrinsic to the grief and healing process. This project reflects our commitment to supporting residents in their most vulnerable times and will provide the opportunity for those in our community to engage in this sacred ritual while ensuring dignity and respect."

While the City of Surrey offers a "scattering garden" at Sunnyside Lawn Cemetery, many groups find that scattering ashes in water fosters a deeper sense of connection. This practice not only brings peace and closure but also symbolizes the individual's return to nature.

In 2021, staff began exploring the option of building a pier for ash scattering at Brownsville Bar Park. While a preliminary assessment was initiated, no formal direction was provided by Council and no budget was allocated for this project.

If Surrey City Council endorses the initiative, staff will further explore approvals and funding requirements to move this initiative forward, with an estimated construction cost ranging from \$2.5 million to \$3.8 million. If the initiative moves forward, a report outlining next steps will be presented to Council in 2025 for final approval.



Cab Driver Killed In Crash In Victoria

Avictoria taxi driver killed in a collision in last week in downtown Victoria has been identified by friends and family as Rajinder Singh, who everyone called Ronnie.

24 years old Ronnie lost his life in a devastating head-on collision in downtown Victoria, caused by a pickup truck being pursued by police. The Independent Investigations Office of BC (IIO) is investigating the incident that took place around 1 a.m. on October 19, 2024.

Information provided by the Victoria Police Department states that officers attempted to stop a Nissan Titan pickup truck on the 900-block of Douglas Street, near Courtney Street, after the vehicle was reportedly driving erratically.

The vehicle did not stop and was then involved in a collision with another vehicle and BC Transit bus approximately



near the intersection of Douglas Street and Humboldt Street. The bus was not in service at the time and had no passengers. Despite life-saving measures, the driver of the other vehicle was pronounced dead at the scene.

The driver of the Nissan was arrested and taken into custody.

the same day and has now commenced an investigation. Initial investigative steps will seek to clarify the circumstances leading up to and surrounding the collision and whether police action or inaction played a role. "We are heartbroken ... his sudden departure leaves a void in the hearts of all who knew him," said Amit Jagopotra, a close friend who started a GoFundMe page for the 25-year-old Singh. Jagopotra said Singh leaves behind a brother and a sister, and was a "devoted son to his ailing parents" in India, who he was helping to financially support. "As we come to terms with this tragedy, we want to honor Ronnie's last wish: to be cremated and returned to India, where he can rest in peace among his loved ones. However, the financial burden of this process is overwhelming for his family."

Canada to significantly reduce immigration in next 3 years

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said that Canada will significantly reduce the number of new immigrants it allows into the country admitting the government did not get the balance right after the COVID-19 pandemic.

According to the announcement Canada will be reducing target from 500,000 permanent residents to 395,000 in 2025, from 500,000 permanent residents to 380,000 in 2026 and setting a target of 365,000 permanent residents in 2027

"In the tumultuous times as we emerged from the pandemic, between addressing labour needs and maintaining population growth, we didn't get the balance quite right," Trudeau said.

"With the plan we're announcing today, along with previously announced measures, we're making our immigration system work better."

The change comes after significant criticism of the Liberal government's increases to immigration and the impact of strong population growth on housing availability and affordability.

Trudeau said that businesses and provinces have also been part of the reason why the immigration system got out of control. "Far too many corporations have chosen to



abuse our temporary measures, exploiting foreign workers while refusing to hire Canadians for a fair wage," Trudeau said. "All while under the watch of provinces, some colleges and universities are bringing in more international students than communities can accommodate, treating them as an expendable means to line their own pockets. That's unacceptable, and it

needs to change."

These reductions are the result of a series of changes over the past year, including a cap on international students and tightened eligibility requirements for temporary foreign workers, implemented to decrease volumes and strengthen the integrity and quality of our temporary resident programs. The changes are designed with long-term economic goals in mind to make sure that we continue to attract the best and the brightest.

The government expects the 2025–2027 Immigration Levels Plan is expected to result in a marginal population decline of 0.2% in both 2025 and 2026 before returning to a population growth of 0.8% in 2027.

"Immigration is essential to our country's economic success and growth. As Canada reopened following the pandemic, the needs of businesses were greater than the supply of workers available to support their recovery. We took decisive measures to attract some of the world's best and brightest to study and work in Canada, and to integrate them into the economy quickly. This meant a faster economic recovery. It also meant

that robust immigration helped prevent a recession, while contributing to Canada's workforce. In response to the evolving needs of our country, this transitional levels plan alleviates pressures on housing, infrastructure and social services so that over the long term we can grow our economic and social prosperity through immigration. This unprecedented plan offers a comprehensive approach to welcoming newcomers—one that preserves the integrity of our immigration programs and sets newcomers up for success. Canadians also expect a wellmanaged immigration system from the Government of Canada," said immigration minister Marc Miller.

Pierre Poilievre, the leader of the opposition Conservative Party, accused Trudeau of destroying the national consensus on immigration. "He has destroyed our immigration system through his own personal incompetence and destroyed 150 years of common sense consensus with the Liberals and Conservatives on that subject," Poilievre said. "He cannot fix what he broke on immigration and housing or anything else because he is busy fighting his own caucus."



It Doesn't Pay To Ignore Surrey

The provincial government thought we wouldn't notice, but we did: Councillor Linda Annis

Surrey First Councillor Linda Annis said the BC election results show that any provincial government that ignores Surrey does so at their political peril.

"For the past seven years, the provincial government ignored Surrey, and thought we wouldn't notice," said Annis. "But our voters did notice, and last minute election promises were not enough to wipe away seven years of neglect."

Annis said the swing to the BC Conservatives across Surrey demonstrated what can happen when Surrey voters have had enough.

"In four short years, Surrey will be BC's biggest city, and it's definitely time that we flex our political muscle to ensure our city gets more transit, more health care, more schools, and more



infrastructure," added Annis. "We have 8,000 students in portables, and students going to school in shifts. Our one hospital is struggling, the new Cloverdale hospital is really too small and doesn't even have a maternity ward. Even with the SkyTrain project to Langley, we are still short when it comes to transit and other important infrastructure. We're not asking for more than our share, but our growth demands that the provincial government step up."

Annis said demands by the provincial government more housing, with no sign of provincial support for any added infrastructure, did not sit well with Surrey voters.

"People looked around their neighbourhoods and questioned how the province could demand more housing without a plan to provide infrastructure," noted Annis. "Like everyone on council, I'm looking forward to working with each and every MLA that's been elected. But the results of this election have put them all on notice: if you don't deliver for Surrey don't expect our support at election time."

Ripudaman Singh Malik's Killers Plead Guilty

Two men have pleaded guilly and of Ripudaman Singh Malik who was wo men have pleaded guilty to killing shot to death in 2022 outside the business he owned in Surrey.

Tanner Fox and Jose Lopez, both of whom have long criminal records, were later charged with first-degree murder.

According to Global News, "Based on the agreed statement of facts, the two men were contracted to kill Malik. They shot him seven times, mostly in the head and neck, as he sat in the driver's seat of his red

Tesla in front of his business."

At the time of the arrest of Fox and Lopez, it was also reported that investigators were probing whether India was behind the killing of Malik, who was a one-time supporter of the Khalistan movement.

Malik and Ajaib Singh Bagri were acquitted were acquitted in the 1985 bombing of an Air India flight from Montreal to Mumbai. In B.C. Supreme Court in New Westminster on Monday, both Fox and Lopez pleaded guilty to the lesser charge of second-degree

"What we know from the agreed statement of facts is that there was some type of financial incentive that was involved in the commission of this crime, but in terms of any other specifics, it is another one of those situations where unfortunately it is just something that we as people on the outside will probably never know," Lopez lawyer Gloria Ng told Global News.

Things took a dramatic turn, however, when moments after the two men entered their guilty pleas, they began fighting.

In a statement, Malik's family described him as a "father, brother, husband and grandfather as well as a tireless community leader."

"While we are grateful that the shooters are being brought to justice, we know that nothing will erase the pain that we have gone through losing a family member in this way," the family said.

"However, the work is not complete. Tanner Fox and Jose Lopez were hired



to commit this murder. Until the parties responsible for hiring them and directing this assassination are brought to justice, the work remains incomplete."

The family called on the killers to "cooperate with the RCMP in bringing those that hired you to justice."

The case has attracted renewed scrutiny amid growing tensions between India and Canada, after Ottawa accused New Delhi's government agents of involvement in the killing of prominent Sikh activist Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

US Says It Wants 'Meaningful Accountability' In India's Probe Into Pannun Murder Plot

The US has said it would not be fully satisfied until there is "meaningful resulting accountability" from India's investigations into the alleged foiled plot to assassinate Sikh separatist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun on American soil, PTI reported.

The Indian government has denied its association or involvement with such a plot to kill an American national on US soil. Following allegations by the US, New Delhi had set up an inquiry committee to investigate the matter.

"We continue to expect and want to see accountability based on the results of that investigation, and certainly the United States won't be fully satisfied until there is meaningful accountability resulting from that investigation," State Department



Deputy Spokesperson Vedant Patel told reporters at a news conference.

Patel was responding to a question on last week's visit of an Indian Enquiry Committee to the US for talks.

'There was valuable engagement with India's inquiry committee last week, and information was exchanged between our two governments to further our respective investigations. We understand that the Indian inquiry committee will continue its investigation, and we expect to see further steps based on last week's conversations," Patel said. "Beyond that, I'm just not going to address this in further detail given that this is an issue that is active and remains under investigation and ongoing under both of our countries," he said.

NDP candidates Ravi Parmar won from Langford Highland, Sunita Dhir from Vancouver Langara, Reah Arora from Burnaby East and Harwinder Kaur Sandhu from Vernon Monashee. Harwinder has won for the second time from the seat.

Attorney General Nikki Sharma has won again from Vancouver Hastings, while Jessie Sunner has triumphed from Surrey Newton.

Conservative leader Harman Singh Bhangu has emerged victorious from Langley Abbotsford constituency, Honveer Singh Randhawa from Surrey Guildford and Tody Toor from Langley

Willowbrook.

Their victories mark a significant moment for the Punjabi community, which has long played a vital role in the socio-economic fabric of British Columbia.

Sikh woman found dead inside walk-in oven at Walmart store in Canada's Halifax

Adead in a Walmart oven in Halifax. Halifax Regional Police said in a press

release that police were investigating the sudden death of a 19-year-old woman found at Walmart at 6990 Mumford Road on October 19.

The police informed that the woman, who was an employee of the store, was located in a large walk-in oven belonging to the store's bakery department.

Although police did not reveal the identity of the women, local Sikh organization and media said that the victim was a young Sikh woman from India who moved to Canada recently. A GoFundMe page has been created by Maritime Sikh Society to raise funds. The fundraiser identified the

The GoFundMe page mentioned, "Kaur was only 19 years old, a young beautiful girl who came to Canada with big dreams. On Oct 19th, the fateful Saturday night, she was found burned to death in the walk-in oven at Walmart Bakery situated at Mumford Road, Halifax.

Gursimran and her mother both worked at Walmart for last two years. In that evening, like any watchful mother who breathes for her child's happiness, Gursimran's mother tried to locate her after not seeing for one hour. She asked around, but everyone brushed aside thinking that she may be somewhere helping a customer, Walmart is a superstore after all!. Her phone was not reachable.

Mother started panicking as it was unusual for her to switch her phone off during the day. She reached out to the onsite admin for help. As you all know now, her charred remains were found inside the walk in oven in the Bakery after a few hours

Imagine the horror that her mother experienced who herself opened the oven, when someone pointed out to the 'leakage' from it!"

Balbir Singh, the secretary of the Maritime Sikh Society, told the CBC that the society has been in touch with the mother of the 19-year-old victim and learned that the woman and her mother are originally from India and came to Canada two to three years ago.

He said the local Sikh community is deeply distressed by her death.

"It's a really tragic incident and everybody is deeply hurt by this, and we are waiting for the police investigation to come out,' said Singh. "We would like to know what happened to this young woman."

He added that psychological counselling is being provided to the mother and efforts are underway to bring other immediate family members from India. Singh said that once the body is released by the

medical examiner, a religious service will be held in Halifax.

Singh said it will be up to police and occupational and health investigators to make clear to the public what occurred.

Social media posts about speculations of her death have been circulating. But police have asked general public to be mindful. "It is important to note that the investigation has not yet reached a point where the cause and manner of death have been confirmed. The investigation is complex and involves several partner agencies. An investigation of this nature may take a significant amount of time. We urge the public to be mindful of sharing speculative information on social media. Please be aware of the impacts that speculation could have on family, colleagues and loved ones of the woman."

Canada raises wage requirements for employers to hire high-wage stream Foreign workers

OTTAWA, ON: Canada has introduced more changes to its foreign workers programs. Chrystia Freeland, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance announced changes aimed to protect and create jobs for Canadian workers.

To protect Canadian workers from unfair wage competition, starting November 8, 2024, the hourly wage criteria for the high-wage stream will be raised to 20 per cent above the median hourly wage—between \$5 per hour and \$8 per hour—depending on the province or territory.

This will incentivize employers to hire Canadians before turning to the program and encourage greater wage growth. And to crack down on employers who provide false information on their applications, starting October 28, 2024, the government is implementing stringent new data verification processes, which will ensure only genuine and legitimate job offers are approved.

Some employers are using the Temporary Foreign Worker Program to hire from abroad at lower wages than what they would pay Canadians. This undercuts Canadians' wage growth and the number of available jobs, puts temporary foreign workers into precarious situations, and erodes confidence in our immigration system.

"Workers are at the heart of Canada's economy. For our economy and for every generation to reach their full potential, Canadian workers need goodpaying jobs. We're doing this by making investments that increase productivity, boost innovation, and accelerate the flow



of capital into Canada. And we're doing everything we can to protect Canadian workers from unfair competition," she

She said that changes to the Temporary Foreign Worker Program are expected to move 34,000 positions from the highwage stream to the more stringent rules of the low-wage stream. This could result in as many as 20,000 fewer positions being approved, in combination with other recently announced policies --effective September 26, 2024, employers are limited to hiring no more than 10 per cent of their total workforce through the Temporary Foreign Worker Program.

The Temporary Foreign Worker Program differentiates jobs between the low-wage and high-wage streams by the wage level offered.





2025 Volvo EX40 Twin: Stylish, Premium Electric SUV Renamed.

Review by Veeno Dewan

 Γ ormally known as the XC40 Recharge, this compact Volvo electric crossover is renamed as the EX40 for 2025 to fit in with the rest of the Volvo lineup. The EX40 exudes Scandi ambience with its neat exterior and interior design and minimalist



cabin. Not as severe as the Polestar, but premium chic, nevertheless.

Not much is new for 2025. Buyers can choose between the more powerful and faster dual-motor AWD version or a rear-drive Single Motor Extended Range variant. The single motor model makes 248 hp and 310 lb-ft from a single motor/ battery combination. The twin electric motors (one front, one rear) combine to produce 402 horsepower and 494 lb-ft of torque. That is a considerable power output difference between the two models. In terms of the 2025 Volvo EX40 electric range and charging, the single-motor EX40 gets a 79.0 kWh (net) hour battery and offers a range of up to 476 kilometers, while the twin motor can deliver up to 418 km driving range with its smaller 75.0 kWh battery. Top charging rate is 150 kW DC. On a 150 kW DC fast charger, the Volvo will offer a full battery in about 30

The 2025 Volvo EX40 model comes in 6 trim levels with Canadian pricing ranging from \$59,950 to \$74,950. The entrylevel, Core model starts at \$59,950 with an electric 185-kW motor and Lithium-Ion battery. The mid-range Plus trim is \$68,000. The most expensive in the lineup is the TWIN Ultra as tested, priced at \$74,950. Freight and PDI is \$2,620.

Inside, the front seats are exceedingly comfortable in typical Volvo style and the finish and fit of the interior is faultless. As usual, there is a Swedish minimalist approach to the cabin with the door trim panels and carpets made 97% from recycled plastic bottles. A neat simple dash is offset with a complex info touch multi-use screen. The EX40 comes well equipped with such niceties as: Wireless phone charging, a 12-inch info screen, and a centre stage 9.1-inch portrait-oriented touchscreen. The infotainment system is Google-based and powered by Android and does enable Apple CarPlay. Storage is decent with large deep center console and the front door pockets are deep enough for larger water bottles. The rear compartment also offers well -finished seats and decent occupant space, while cargo space behind the rear seats is 452 litres. Folding 60/40 bench seat enables for 1,328 litres of room. The hood "frunk" offers an extra 21 litres of capacity.

Safety as in any Volvo is always a highpoint. The 2025 Volvo EX40 Safety -Standard safety systems include: forward collision warning, automatic emergency braking with pedestrian detection,



"Every party in the House of Commons must show the government of India that we are a united front. That a government like Narendra Modi's cannot find an ally in this Parliament willing to look the other way, and that we all take foreign interference incredibly

seriously," said NDP leader Jagmeet Singh. "I'm calling for the creation of a Canada-India committee so parliamentarians can look in this important matter and propose additional steps the government can take to protect Canadians and our country."

The NDP's proposal for a Canada-India committee is modelled on the



China committee of parliamentarians, which was created to conduct hearings to examine and review all aspects of the Canada-People's Republic of China relationship, including diplomatic, consular, and security aspects.

A week ago, the RCMP revealed intelligence indicating that India is behind not only electoral interference but also

violent crimes, extortions and homicides on Canadian soil. Following that, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau testified at the Hogue inquiry into foreign interference that there are a number of compromised Conservative MPs and candidates named in intelligence documents only available to Pierre Poilievre if he obtains that clearance.

Singh has called on Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre to stop refusing to apply for security clearance.

The NDP also called for an emergency debate on India in the House of Commons Monday and called for an emergency meeting of the Public Safety Committee last week, which took place Friday. Last week, Singh called on the government to work with allies including the United States and United Kingdom to put diplomatic sanctions in place, and to ban the extremist Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh Network.



Canada Back-Stabbed India, Its Behaviour 'The Pits': Indian Envoy Sanjay Verma

behaviour "the pits", India's recalled High Commissioner Sanjay Verma says India was back-stabbed and treated in a most unprofessional manner by a country that is supposed to be a friendly democracy.





There Is No Clear winner In BC's **Election yet; What Happens Next?**

The question that every British Columbian has – what happens next when no party has won the number of seats required to form a government? There will be a final count where remaining votes will be considered and there will be recount of votes in some ridings. The votes counted on October 19 were initial count.

However, there are certain votes that cannot be counted until final count, because they require additional integrity checks to ensure the voter was eligible to vote and that they only voted once.

Ballots counted at final count include mail-in ballots returned after the close of advance voting, and out-ofdistrict ballots cast by voters at nontechnology voting places.

According to Election BC, the final count process for B.C.'s provincial election is scheduled to begin on October 26 and will conclude on October 28.

Final count includes absentee and mail-in ballots that cannot be counted at initial count. The majority of the ballots counted at final count will be mail-in ballots. Packages could be returned up until 8 p.m. Pacific time on October 19, either by mail or in person. Many packages were received close to the deadline and must be counted at final count. Elections BC estimates that approximately 49,000 ballots will be considered at part of final count. A breakdown of the number of ballots being considered at final count by electoral district will be provided before final count starts.

Voting results will be updated on Elections BC's website during preparations for final count the week of October 21 (to correct any transcription errors) and while final count progresses from October 26 to

There will also be recount of votes in two ridings. District electoral officer recounts will take place in the Juan de Fuca-Malahat and Surrey City Centre electoral districts. Under the Election Act, recounts must take place in these districts because the difference between the top two candidates is 100 votes or fewer.

These recounts will take place as part of final count between October 26 and 28. Under the Election Act, ballots at district electoral officer recounts are counted manually, by hand. Candidates or official agents can also request district electoral officer recounts until October 22.

According to Election BC, Judicial recounts may occur after the conclusion of final count. If the difference between the top two candidates in an electoral district is less than 1/500th of the total ballots considered, a judicial recount must take place. "Judicial recounts are conducted by a justice of the Supreme Court of British Columbia and may include some or all of the ballots in an election. Judicial recounts can also be requested by a candidate for the same reasons as a district electoral officer recount . Judicial recount requests must be made within six days of the conclusion of final count (November 4)," said Election BC in a press release. Continued from Page 01

Female International Students Exploited By **Predatory Landlords And Traffickers**

"Brampton is home to thousands of international students who contribute significantly to the city's culture and economy. However, many face financial challenges, housing insecurity and a lack of adequate institutional support, making them prime targets for exploitation and trafficking. In particular, female students have been exploited by predatory landlords and traffickers, leading to cases of unwanted pregnancies, mental health crises and even suicide," said Coun. Rowena Santos.

"International students bring so much value to Brampton, but too often, they face exploitation and trafficking. This motion is a vital step toward providing them with the protections they deserve. By strengthening our local programs and calling for legislative change, we are sending a clear message: Brampton will not tolerate the exploitation of its students," said Patrick Brown, Mayor, City of Brampton.

As part of this motion, City staff will explore improvements to the Residential Rental Licensing (RRL) program to better protect international students, raise awareness about human trafficking and address illegal practices within the rental market. Additionally, Brampton will work with community partners to develop a culturally sensitive pilot program to provide wrap-around services, including housing assistance, mental health support, employment resources and anti-trafficking interventions tailored to the unique needs of international students. The City is calling on the federal government to fund this pilot program and to further enable local service groups to provide needed services for international students.

"The exploitation of international students is a human rights issue, and it requires a community-driven response. We welcome the City's support to advocate for create culturally appropriate services and advocate for stronger protections, ensuring these students are empowered and safe," said Gurpreet Malhotra, CEO, Indus Community

The City is also calling on the federal and provincial governments to review policies that exacerbate the vulnerabilities of international students. Current visa restrictions on work hours force many students into unsafe employment, while conditions related to deportation are weaponized by traffickers. Brampton is urging for legislative changes, including increasing legal working hours, removing deportation conditions tied to "sex work" and expanding access to regional support programs for international students.

""Our community has worked hard to address the challenges faced by international students, but more must be done. This motion is about creating real, lasting change. By enhancing the RRL program and establishing a culturally sensitive support hub, we are ensuring these students have access to safe housing and the resources they need to thrive," said Rowena Santos, Regional Councillor, Wards 1 & 5, Chair, Community Services. Additionally, the City will advocate for the endorsement of Brampton's International Students Charter by the federal and provincial governments, as well as postsecondary institutions across Ontario. This Charter sets out clear responsibilities for institutions to offer comprehensive orientation and support services, helping students navigate legal rights, housing and employment, while preventing exploitation.

Expanded Free Waste Drop-Off event collects record 3,300 tonnes of waste

Off event, held from May 1 to September 25, saw record participation and waste collection with over 21,000 loads delivered to the Central Surrey and North Surrey Recycling & Waste Centres by Surrey residents. The free five-month-long program collected more than 3,300 tonnes of waste and recyclables, a substantial increase from previous years' weekend pop-up junk events.

"I am happy to announce that Surrey has achieved our highest-ever results in this year's expanded Free Waste Drop-Off event," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "Over five months, 3,300 tonnes of waste were disposed of responsibly.



Most importantly, we have seen a 13% reduction in illegal dumping since 2021. The results are clear, by providing easier ways for our residents to get rid of

unwanted items, we are creating a cleaner and greener Surrey."

Key improvements include 195% increase in number of loads, reaching 21,000 (up from 7,150 loads from the 2019 Pop Up Junk Events); 175% increase in tonnage delivered with 3,304 tonnes of waste and recycling collected (up from 1,200 tonnes from the 2019 Pop Up Junk Events) and 13% reduction in illegal dumping since 2021.

The event's expanded format was a direct response to community feedback, providing a more accessible and convenient way for residents to dispose of unwanted items. This contributed to a cleaner, safer city while reducing illegal

dumping. Participant feedback was positive, particularly appreciating the extended timeframe and the 100kg limit for disposal.

Residents can continue to take advantage of Surrey's Large Item Pickup Program, which allows up to six free pickups per year (eight for homes with registered secondary suites). Pickup requests can be made online at surrey.ca/largeitems or by calling 604-590-7289 (press 3). Additionally, recyclables can be dropped off anytime year-round at Metro Vancouver's Central Surrey and North Surrey Recycling and Waste Centres.

BC Lost More Than 1,700 Lives Lost To Drug Overdose In First Nine Months Of 2024

7ICTORIA - Unregulated toxic and neighbours. Although the rate of toxicdrugs claimed the lives of 187 British Columbians in August and 183 in September, according to the BC Coroners Service.

NEWS

The preliminary data finds that since January 2024, at least 1,749 people have died from unregulated drug toxicity in communities throughout the province. The data for the first nine months of 2024 represents an 8% decrease from the number of deaths during the first nine months of 2023 (1,896). In both August and September, approximately six people died each day from suspected unregulated drugs.

Additional findings mention that 48% of unregulated drug deaths in September were people between the ages of 30 and 49, while 1.1% were 18 years of age and below.

"B.C. mourns the loss of 187 and 183 people to toxic drugs in August and September respectively. They were brothers and sisters, husbands and wives, friends, colleagues drug deaths this year continues to decrease compared to the past three years, the rate of toxic-drug deaths and the impact of toxic drugs circulating in B.C. communities remains unacceptable. The Province is working urgently to expand access to treatment services and save more lives. The new Opioid Treatment Access Line is available to people in all parts of B.C. to help them get fast access to addictions care. No matter where you live in the province, you can call 1 888 804-8111 to access same-day support, including medications and connection to health professionals to start you on your path to recovery," said the ministry of Mental Health and Addictions At least 77% of unregulated drug deaths in September were males, up from the yearto-date figure of 74% in 2024 and 26% of deaths related to unregulated drug toxicity were females in 2024. The rate of death among females is 21 per 100,000 people,

an increase of 60% from 2020 (13 per September. 100,000).

Vancouver (45), Surrey (19) and Greater Victoria (16) had the highest number of unregulated drug toxicity deaths in

Fentanyl was detected in 85% and stimulants in 81% of unregulated drug deaths in September 2024 that underwent expedited toxicological testing.


Ordeal In Sushant Singh Rajput Case



Canada raises wage requirements for...

The low-wage stream is for jobs where the wage offered is below the provincial or territorial median hourly wage plus 20 per cent. The high-wage stream is for jobs where the wage offered is above the provincial or territorial median hourly wage plus 20 per cent. Under this stream there is currently no limit on the number of workers an employer can hire; and CMA unemployment rates are not taken into consideration in LMIA application assessments. There are also other changes announced this year. Effective this week, imports of certain Chinese-made steel and aluminum products are subject to a 25 per cent tariff. These tariffs will help level the playing field to protect Canadian workers whose job security is being put at risk by China's unfair, intentional, and state-directed

trade practices of oversupply and overcapacity, as well as its lack of robust environmental and labour standards. Through this action in lockstep with key trading partners, Canada is also preventing trade diversion with these tariffs.

Recognizing that Canadian businesses may need time to adjust, the federal government is prepared to offer tariff relief in certain, exceptional circumstances to help make sure that Canadian workers aren't punished as new supply chains are established. Canadian businesses can apply for relief by emailing remissions-remises@ fin.gc.ca. Requests received before November 8, 2024, will be processed on a priority basis. The Ministers also launched measures to secure Canada's artificial intelligence (AI) advantage, including the

\$200 million Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative.

"The government is launching two key parts of its \$2.4 billion AI package to ensure the economic benefits of AI reach all corners of our country. Through the new \$200 million Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative, Canada's Regional Development Agencies will support AI start-ups to bring new technologies to market, and drive AI adoption by small businesses in critical sectors across the economy, such as agriculture, clean technology, health care, and manufacturing. In addition, the National Research Council of Canada Industrial Research Assistance Program is receiving \$100 million to help small- and medium-sized businesses scale up and increase productivity by building and deploying new AI solutions.
