

New era of policing in city: Surrey Police Service officially takes over from RCMP

The primary ways that residents and business owners access policing services in Surrey will not change as a result of this change to the police of jurisdiction. Police office locations and the main police phone numbers are staying the same, including 9-1-1 and non-emergency (604-599-0502).

he years-long saga over who will police the city of Surrey finally ended. At 12:00 a.m. on November 29, 2024, Surrey Police Service (SPS) assumed responsibility for policing and law enforcement as the City of Surrey's new police of jurisdiction.

The change in Surrey's police of jurisdiction is part of the ongoing police model transition process that began when the City of Surrey resolved to move to a municipal police service in 2018. Since that time, the City of Surrey, RCMP, SPS, and provincial and



federal governments have been working together to implement a phased approach to the transition period.

This is the next phase in the City's ongoing transition to a municipal police service. "November 29, 2024, marks the beginning of a new era of policing in Surrey, as Surrey



Sukhbir Badal escapes assassination bid while performing guard duty

Former Punjab deputy chief minister Sukhbir Singh Badal escaped an assassination attempt at the Golden Temple in Amritsar on Wednesday after a 68-year-old man fired at him before being overpowered by a police officer, in an incident that triggered outrage, posed questions about the security setup, and threatened to trigger turmoil.

The suspect, Narain Singh Chaura, was arrested and investigations revealed that he was the mastermind of the 2004 Burail jailbreak, apart from being involved in a raft of terror cases since 1992.

Badal, who suffered a foot fracture weeks ago and is currently wheelchair-bound, was performing his second day of duty as a "sewadar" in uniform at



the main entrance of the Golden Temple as part of penance prescribed to him by the Akal Takht - the highest temporal seat of the Sikhs - for "mistakes" the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) government committed between 2007 and 2017.

Police said they were working to ascertain if Chaura was working as a "lone wolf" or if a larger conspiracy was at play.

The attempted murder sparked national outrage, with senior political leaders condemning the incident and hitting out at the incumbent Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) administration even as the state government commended the Punjab Police for its "swift action".

He took his spot at 9.05am and was surrounded by 20-25 people. Chaura entered the temple complex around 9.20am. He washed his feet at an ablution tank two-and-a-half metres away from the senior SAD leader, and pulled out a pistol.

The shooter was about eight feet away from Badal when he tried to open fire, before being overpowered by an alert police officer, Jasvir Singh. Singh grabbed Chaura's hands, who shot into the air, 7-8feet above Badal. Meanwhile, several people standing around him formed a cordon, while others began to thrash the 68-year-old shooter.

Volunteers of the Shiromani Parbandhak Gurdwara Committee (SGPC), responsible for management of the gurdwara, and other police personnel snatched the man's pistol.

Badal, on a wheelchair, continued

to perform penance surrounded by dozens of people.

After wrapping up duty at the gate an hour later, he washed utensils at the shrine's community kitchen. Later, his wife and the SAD's Bathinda lawmaker Harsimrat Kaur Badal joined him and performed sewa there.

Other SAD leaders, including Bikram Singh Majithia, who were also made to atone, performed sewa at the shrine complex.

Police said that Chaura, who hails from Dera Baba Nanak town in Gurdaspur district, was spotted on CCTV footage in the Temple on Tuesday as well.

Punjab Police commissioner Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said the security apparatus around the temple was shored up.

Akal Takht issues 'tankhah' for Sukhbir Badal, strips Parkash Singh Badal of 'Fakhr-e-Qaum' title

The Five High Priests headed by Akal Takht Jathedar Giani Raghbir Singh this week pronounced 'tankhah' (religious punishment) to Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader Sukhbir Badal, former Akali ministers and the party's core committee members holding them guilty of religious misconduct for taking controversial decisions during SAD's tenure from 2007 to 2017, Tribune reported.

Giani Raghbir Singh addressed the 'guilty' Akalis from the podium of the Akal Takht, asking them to wear plaques around their necks with a message of their admittance of guilt.

The Akal Takht has also withdrawn the Fakhr-e-Qaum title, conferred on late Parkash Singh Badal, keeping in view that he was the state's chief minister when the mistakes were committed that led to a dent to the Sikh Panth and its sentiments.

The Jathedar also directed the working committee of the SAD to accept the resignation of Sukhbir Badal as party chief and report back to the Akal Takht within three days.

Sukhdev Dhindsa was also awarded a similar punishment owing to his old age and health concerns. They were also directed to perform sewa at Guru Ram Dass Jee Langar Hall.

Meanwhile, others were asked to clean up washrooms of the Golden Temple complex for an hour, followed by washing dishes and cleaning shoes of devotees for an hour each.

The Takht termed the 'mistakes' as sins, and asked Sukhbir to answer its queries, pertaining to controversial decisions taken during the party's rule from 2007-2017, in either 'yes' or 'no'.

The punishment stems from allegations that the Akali leadership maintained ties with Dera Sacha Sauda head Gurmeet Ram Rahim despite his excommunication by the Sikh community in 2007. Later, the



leadership allegedly facilitated his pardon by the Akal Takht.

The party leadership also faced criticism for failing to address key panthic issues when they were in power between 2007 and 2017. These included incidents of sacrilege, and police firing at Kotkapura as well as the appointment of DGP Sumedh Singh Saini, who was accused of rights

On behalf of the NDP, Premier Eby made several promises during the election

campaign which he and his ministers must fulfill. I fully understand his promises relating to housing, healthcare, education, and public safety but I have difficulty understanding the promise relating to a tax cut.

During the election campaign, the NDP promised to reduce taxes for most residents by increasing the amount of tax-free income people can claim. The NDP's promise relating to affordability reads: "Putting \$1,000 in the wallets of BC households now, and every year. Over 90% of British Columbians will benefit with \$500 for individuals or \$1,000 for households."

When it comes to taxes, I am no different than most British Columbians. I would love to receive either \$500 or 1,000 in my wallet. Most British Columbians want to pay least amount of taxes but want to receive all the services the government can provide. We want the best healthcare with no emergency room closures in hospitals. We want the best teachers in our schools without students having to go into portable classrooms. We want the government to take action about the prices of food and housing. We do not want to see anyone in BC go hungry or without a home. In addition, we want the government to make sure we have excellent roads, bridges and hospitals.

How can the government pay for all these services if it reduces taxes? The government's finances are no different than household finances. When a government reduces taxes, it has less money coming that leads to a higher budget deficit and a higher debt. A tax cut would erode the government's ability to tackle many of the challenges we face including childcare, healthcare and investments in housing.

A tax cut would make sense if the province was running a surplus. However, that is not the case. The provincial deficit is estimated at \$9 billion a year.

We have seen the results of tax cuts by the BC Liberal government in the early 2000s. Those cuts disproportionally benefitted the rich. At the same time, there was a dramatic cut in public services. Thousands of healthcare workers were laid off and services were provided by contractors. In addition, there were significant cuts to public services as well as to the education system.

According to a recently released report by the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives following the tax and spending cuts under the BC Liberals, the role of public spending

The City conducted extensive public engagement process



for the 72 Avenue corridor, which included two community sessions and an online survey that engaged over 2,480 residents. The City is now sharing the preliminary design plans with Council. Feedback overwhelmingly supports the proposed improvements, with 74% of respondents satisfied or very satisfied with the design

along this segment. Residents surveyed emphasized the need for an alternate east-west route to ease traffic on neighbouring streets and highways.

The project includes three segments one is improvements from 144 Street to 152 Street with construction anticipated from 2026-27, featuring two travel lanes in each direction, left-turn

lanes at major intersections, and a multi-use pathway for cycling and walking on the north side, and a sidewalk on the south side. The second is extension from 152 Street to Highway 15 with construction anticipated2025, featuring two travel lanes in each direction, improved ditches and wider road shoulders for farm vehicles to support both farming and transportation needs.

There will also be improvements from 188 Street to 196 Street with construction anticipated from Spring 2025-26, featuring two travel lanes in each direction, bike lanes, and sidewalks on both sides, and on-street parking in limited areas.

Funding will be sourced from Development Cost Charges and the Roads and Traffic Safety Levy, as well as potential external funding.


in the provincial economy was seriously diminished. As a share of the GDP, provincial government operating spending dropped sharply in the early 2000s and remains lower today than 25 years ago. This is despite some important investments in social programs by the NDP government since 2017.

Surrey Board of Trade Raises Concerns Over Potential Removal of LMIA Points in Permanent Residence

The Surrey Board of Trade has sent a let-ter to Immigration minister Marc Miller to express concerns about the proposal to remove the 50 points awarded to permanent residence applicants through a positive Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA) for certain job tiers.

The letter states, "The current tier level job system recognizes roles requiring specialized skills and education, ensuring that Canada attracts talented individuals equipped to meet our labour market needs. These points not only help skilled workers contribute to Canada's economic growth but also support employers who rely on these individuals for roles demanding expertise and knowledge that cannot be easily sourced locally. Moreover, for many applicants such as skilled workers with extensive experience from their home countries, these points can be critical to achieving a successful permanent residence application. For instance, an individual with seven years of professional experience from their home country may



only be able to count three of those years toward their Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) score. Given the current high CRS thresholds, the 50 LMIA points could make a significant difference in helping such skilled applicants meet the required score and contribute to Canada's workforce."

"The Minister indicated that he is considering removing the LMIA points for permanent residence applications as a result of concerns regarding fraudulent job offers being sold for thousands of dollars," said Jasroop Gosal, Interim Spokesperson and Policy & Research Manager. "While we

also share these concerns of individuals taking advantage of the system, the LMIA points are a signal to the world that we are welcoming to skilled and talented individuals. Given the current high Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) thresholds, the 50 LMIA points could make a significant difference in helping such skilled applicants meet the required score and contribute to Canada's workforce."

"Canada is facing a skills shortage in many fields, including health sciences and clean technology, and these skilled workers are highly sought after. Without the points, these individuals may decide to leave Canada, resulting in a brain-drain effect occurring."

SBOT is urging the government to focus on enhanced regulations and measures to verify the legitimacy of job offers. This approach would target fraudulent practices while protecting employers who genuinely rely on the LMIA system to attract and retain talent essential for their operations.

Canadian Families Will Pay \$800 More For Food In 2025

onsumers can expect rood prices to continue to rise. Canada's Food Price Report 2023 predicts a 5% to 7% food price increase in 2023, with the most substantial increases in vegetables, dairy, and meat. The report forecasts that an average family of four, including a man (age 31-50), woman (age 31-50), boy (age 14-18), and girl (age 9-13) will spend up to \$16,288.41 per year on food, an increase of up to \$1,065.60 from what was observed in 2022.

"To say that it's been a challenging year for Canadians at the grocery store would be an understatement," says Dr. Sylvain Charlebois, project lead and Director of the Agri-Food Analyt-

ics Lab at Dalhousie University. "Consumers will continue to get smarter about grocery shopping as they navigate through this socalled food inflation storm."

Canada's Food Price Report is an annual collaboration between research partners Dalhousie University, the University of Guelph, the University of Saskatchewan, and the University of British Columbia.

International events continue to affect food prices at home. "The uncertainty from the ongoing Ukraine war shows no signs of ceasing and the Canadian dollar compared to the US dollar has recently ranged five to seven cents lower and this has driven up the cost of all imported American



products" says Dr. Stuart Smyth, University of Saskatchewan campus lead. "Labour shortages in key sectors, such as crop harvesting, food processing, and transportation lower supply and

drive-up prices."

What can a concerned consumer do? Now is the time to become a "smart shopper" by consulting flyers for specials, creating and sticking to a budget and shopping list, looking for substitutes for expensive foods (such as frozen fruits and vegetables instead of fresh, and plant-based proteins like chickpeas or lentils instead of meat), or freezing meat when it comes on sale.

"We haven't seen food prices increase this high in Canada for over 40 years and based on our findings, the increases we have predicted are still quite high but not as high as the increases for 2022," says Dr. Simon Somogyi, University of Guelph campus lead. "That may be cold comfort for Canadians, as food prices are already high, but if inflation can come down, it's possible that we could see price increases for 2023 at or below 5%."

You've (not) Got Mail: Seven-in-10 Canadians affected by Canada Post strike, sympathy falls near evenly on both sides

his post-Black Friday week is the I normally the busiest of the year for Canada Post, where it would be expected to deliver approximately two million packages each day. However, ongoing strike action from the Canadian Union of Postal Workers has seen silent days joining unseasonably early silent nights at Canada Post offices across the country. As the stalemate continues, Canadians are facing significant delays in sending and receiving their holiday well wishes and gifts.

New data from the non-profit Angus Reid Institute finds seven-in-10 Canadians already affected by delays in either sending or receiving packages – a number that will only grow as the strike approaches the three-week mark. The dispute centres around a number of

different issues. Workers want a 24 per cent wage increase over four years and improved benefits including better sick leave. The union also disputes a push by Canada Post to add weekend deliveries and takes umbrage with the increasing number of part-time or contract workers Canada Post has been hiring.

Canada Post is countering by suggesting that these changes are needed, given the financial pressures the crown corporation is facing, losing close to half a billion dollars in the first half of 2024.

As the two camps swap proposals, Canadians are evidently sympathetic to both sides of the debate. One-third (34%) say that Canada Post is right to push back on demands and attempt to change how the business operates, given the financial hemorrhage it has endured in recent years.

Close to the same number (29%) say that they stand with the union in their demands. One-quarter (23%) offer sympathy to neither, and likely just want their letters and packages back on the move.

Two people wounded in random downtown stabbing, suspect shot dead

Two people were injured and taken to hospital. Their injuries are not believed to be life-threatening.

New era of policing in city: Surrey Police Service officially takes over from RCMP

Chief Constable Norm Lipinski city-wide services including of SPS said. "SPS would like to express its gratitude to the past and current members of the Surrey RCMP who have served in Surrey since 1951. Their legacy of an unwavering commitment to public safety in the City of Surrey is deeply appreciated. SPS looks forward to the continued public safety contributions of the BC RCMP Provincial Operations Unit's Support temporary assistance until the transition period is completed."

Although SPS will assume overarching responsibility for policing on November 29, the BC RCMP Provincial Police Service will provide temporary policing supports in Surrey until SPS is fully established as a standalone policing service. The continuation of this plan for a phased transition means residents will continue to see both SPS and RCMP officers and vehicles in Surrey until the transition is completed.

Initially, there will be a higher concentration of Frontline SPS officers in Whalley/City Centre and Newton, with more RCMP officers in Guildford/Fleetwood, Cloverdale, and South Surrey. However, officers from both agencies will perform various policing duties across the city: SPS officers will manage several traffic enforcement, emergency and community planning, programs, and RCMP officers will maintain conduct of most specialized policing services in Newton as well as the Criminal Crash Investigation Team, citywide.

While officers from both police agencies will primarily provide policing services in "home" districts, the agencies will


coordinate responses where and when required to address any emerging public safety needs. Similarly, there will be no to ongoing interruption investigations during the transition. While not all files will be transferred to SPS at this time, both SPS and the RCMP are taking steps to ensure that every file transfer is done with the

utmost consideration for security, confidentiality, and the victims of crimes. In addition, SPS is now joining several other municipal police agencies as a partner in the Lower Mainland Integrated Teams, which means that any Surrey-related files with those teams, such as homicides, will remain with those teams.

As SPS continues to increase its staffing, SPS officers will take



over more of the frontline policing and investigative duties that SPS is not taking over on November 29th. The BC RCMP Provincial Police Service presence in Surrey will, over time, be reduced and RCMP members demobilized in alignment with SPS's growth. Garry Begg, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General, called it a landmark achievement and significant milestone in Canadian policing, as it represents a key marker in the largest police transition of its kind in the country. "As a former RCMP officer who served for 40 years, I am proud of the history of the RCMP in Surrey. No matter the uniform, I know that every officer puts their lives on the line day in and day out to keep people and businesses safe. Police officers serve with honour and dedication, and I thank both SPS and RCMP officers for



their unwavering commitment to the people of Surrey. As we start a new era of policing in Surrey, I look forward to the SPS's community-led, innovative approach to policing that brings together skilled officers with diverse backgrounds from across the country that meets the needs of our community. There is much work ahead as this transition moves into its final stages, and although the journey has not been without its challenges I want to extend my deepest gratitude to the City of Surrey, the federal government, RCMP, and Chief Lipinski and SPS administrator Mike Serr. Rising Diplomatic Tensions And Allegations Of Foreign Interference Fuel Plummeting Canadian Views Of India approach India?

mid fresh, but so far denied, allegations A of Indian political interference in Canada's 2022 Conservative Party leadership race, a new public opinion poll from the non-profit Angus Reid Institute, in partnership with the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada, indicates a significant decline in Canadian views towards the subcontinental superpower.

Where a majority (52%) of people in this country told ARI 20 months ago that Ottawa should approach New Delhi either as a

valued partner and ally or on friendly terms, that sentiment has dropped by half to just 24 per cent.

Further, favourable views of India have plummeted from a high of 56 per cent in January 2020 to 26 per cent today. The inverse negative view has more than doubled.


These data also reveal India is now only seen more favourably by Canadians than Russia and China, while trust in New Delhi sits at less than one-third (28%).

There is less consensus over how Canada is perceived to be handling the relationship, although a plurality are inclined to say Ottawa isn't managing it well (39%) compared to one-third (32%) who say the opposite and almost the same number (29%) who say they aren't sure. A significant political tension colours these perceptions. Those who say they would vote for the Liberal Party of Canada in the next election are most complimentary of the Trudeau government's performance on this file, while professed Conservative supporters

say the current government is mishandling the situation.

The froideur between the two nations shows little sign of warming in the short term. The belief among 39 per cent in Canada is things will not improve until Prime Minister Justin Trudeau is no longer in office, while 34 per cent say the same of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

That said, two-thirds (64%) of Canadians say this country should at minimum, "cautiously" attempt to re-open trade negotiations on a free trade agreement with India, a finding slightly boosted by threats from incoming U.S. President Donald Trump of blanket 25 per cent tariffs on



Canadian exports.

The survey also finds the proportion of Canadians who want increased trade ties with India has halved from one-in-five (18%) in 2014 to eight per cent now.

The survey finding mention that among Canada's top 10 trading partners, only China (76%) and India (66%) are selected by a majority of Canadians as not "strictly upholding the rule of law or respecting human rights."

Two-thirds (66%) say Canada should "stand up for what it believes is right" with India even if it means a further deterioration of the relationship.



Foreign Affairs Committee blocks NDP motion to recognise 1984 anti-Sikh violence as 'genocide'


motion moved by the ANew Democratic Party or NDP for the recognition of the violence against Sikhs in India in 1984 as a "genocide" failed to be passed by a Parliamentary committee, this week.

NDP leader Jagmeet Singh moved the motion before the House of Commons Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and International Development. He said notice of the motion had been given on June 19 this year.

Introducing the motion, Singh asked the committee to "call on the House to recognise that a genocide was carried out against the

Sikhs in India" in 1984 and to "call upon Indian government to make measures to bring those responsible for this violence to justice."

Canada's Parliamentary Secretary for Foreign Affairs Rob Oliphant described those events as "horrendous" and "tragic", adding it was "not just an Indian issue but also a Canadian issue by virtue of our population in this country." However, he raised procedural questions about it being adopted by the committee and suggested other alternatives. Later, Singh posted on X, "Today, in the Foreign Affairs Committee the Liberals and Conservatives teamed up to block a

known about this for months. They could have spent the time to listen to the concerns of the community, listening to the evidence, understanding why it is so important, listening to the evidence that clearly establishes it as a genocide and the definitions for genocide were met. Instead, they turned their backs on justice."

Sukh Dhaliwal, Liberal MP wrote on his platform "At the FAAE Х, committee, Singh introduced

a motion addressing the 1984 Sikh Genocide—a motion I fully supported. I'm deeply saddened that the debate was adjourned. I remain committed to honouring and advocating for the lives lost during this tragic chapter in Sikh history." World Sikh Organization while responding said, "Today in the Foreign Affairs Committee, Liberals and Conservatives blocked NDP Leader's motion to recognize the Sikh Genocide suggesting the motion was not the right "way of working" to raise the issue. On its 40th anniversary, this refusal to hear evidence or voices from the Sikh community is deeply disappointing."

Indigenous Knowledge Keeper Kung Jaadee **Inspires Connection To Roots At Vivek Canada Event**

iving outside India for your ⊿entire life often means relying on stories to understand your culture. Whether it's stories of your family's history or traditions, these narratives become the bridge connecting you to your roots. Vivek Canada's Dawn to Dusk program embodies this spirit of connection by fostering a sense of community through meaningful activities that connect youth and senior citizens over Indian culture. Each event feels like coming home to a family gathering, where the lines between generations blur, creating a warm and inclusive atmosphere.

Vivek Canada, is a Vancouver-based non-profit organization, dedicated to alleviating poverty and fostering rural development in India. It's Dawn to Dusk program is aimed at bridging the gap between South Asian youth and seniors. Every gathering is centered around a special activity, and November's event involved an Indigenous knowledge keeper, Kung Jaadee (Roberta Kennedy). Kung Jaadee has been sharing her stories for over 30 years across Canada. She belongs to the Xaayda (Haida), x^wməθk^wəyəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), Tlingit, Tsleil-Waututh Nations, and is part Hawaiian. Her name, which was presented to her by her cousin Crystal Robinson, means 'Moon Woman'. This name carries a deep symbolism, as it signifies her role as a storyteller who brings light and wisdom to her community, much like how the moon illuminates the night sky.

While educating us about her culture, she tried to connect with us personally. Her hands, her movement, and interaction with the audience displayed her animation and love for storytelling. Everyone was captivated by her beautiful Regalia, and her singing and drumming. Furthermore, she taught us how to say multiple things in her Haida and Squamish languages, helping us feel connected to her roots while learning about ours. One of her most memorable stories was about the Raven, a central figure in Haida culture. In this story, the Raven, feeling lonely, hosts a grand feast and invites guests from all corners of the world. This story, which speaks to themes of community, inclusivity, and the power of love, resonates deeply with the Dawn to Dusk program's mission. The Raven's act of inviting everyone, regardless of their background, to share in a communal celebration, mirrors the program's efforts to bring people together and celebrate diverse cultures, through a journey of listening and learning. And of course,



just like at our events, everyone always looks forward to the food!

Overall, this event marked the first time an Indigenous knowledge keeper attended, and it was a significant milestone in the Dawn to Dusk program's path towards inclusivity and cultural exchange. Indian and Indigenous cultures share numerous similarities, especially in their reverence for elders, storytelling traditions, and emphasis on community and interconnectedness. Each step we take moves us closer to becoming a more informed and unified society,



as we are all a part of the quest called 'Truth and Reconciliation', which asks us to unlearn what we think we know, and learn what we should know. This is understanding and honoring each other's histories and cultures. This is learning about other cultures and traditions.

Surrey Launches Early Excavation Pilot Program To Accelerate New Housing

Surrey City Council has endorsed an early excavation pilot program aimed at expediting the construction of new multi-family housing projects. This initiative allows for the issuance of "excavation only" building permits for qualified development projects, enabling excavation work to commence before the final adoption of rezoning and development permits.

The pilot program is designed to identify projects that have reached a satisfactory level of certainty, ensuring that rigorous safety and environmental standards remain a priority. Among the conditions for eligibility, projects must have received preliminary approval from Council and align with existing city regulations to minimize risks associated with excavation. "The early excavation pilot program is another example of Council's commitment to accelerating housing in Surrey," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "By enabling



excavation work to begin earlier, we are taking an important step towards addressing our urgent housing needs, while ensuring community safety and project integrity. We are dedicated to providing a diverse range of housing options in a timely and this initiative will help us achieve that goal." With the current housing market under pressure, the pilot program seeks to optimize project timelines and streamline



the development process. Currently, with over 43,000 new housing units conditionally approved by Council, approximately 25,000 units may be eligible for this expedited process. By allowing excavation to occur concurrently with the finalization of necessary permits, the City aims to reduce the overall delivery time of new homes significantly. Moving forward, Council will monitor the program's effectiveness and provide updates in the first quarter of 2025. If successful, the initiative may lead to permanent changes in housing development processes in Surrey.

On Monday, Council also approved amendments to the City Centre's office and residential development density bonus policies. These changes will establish minimum density expectations and clarify the collection process for density bonus contributions, aligning the City's policies with provincial legislation

while fostering growth in the City Centre.

One man in custody after stabbing in Newton neighbourhood

One man is in custody and a victim is being treated for serious wounds to their arm after a stabbing this morning near 73rd Avenue and 130th Street in the Newton neighbourhood of Surrey.

Shortly before 10:00 am on December 4, Surrey Police Service (SPS) was called by a victim who was stabbed multiple times in the arm. SPS officers were on scene within minutes and able to apply medical intervention to the victim while waiting for medical assistance.

Other SPS officers, with the assistance of the Integrated Police Dog Services (IPDS), were able to locate a suspect male and arrest them without incident. During the search for the suspect, a nearby school, Princess Margaret Secondary, was placed in a temporary "hold and secure", which has since been lifted. The suspect remains in custody pending further investigation. The victim is currently being treated in hospital for his injuries. There is currently a road closure on 130th Street between 73rd and 74th Avenues while police investigate. Police are asking anyone who may have witnessed the incident or who may have dash or surveillance camera footage to please contact Surrey Police Service at 604-599-0502.





The Mazda3 is an award-winning car, much loved by Canadians for its sporty looks, refined interior, and sprightly performance, the Mazda3 arrives as either a hatchback or a sedan. For 2025, the Mazda3 continues with stylish good looks and an array of trim lines and engine choices to attract buyers. One major temptation for performance minded drivers is that you can still opt for a six-speed manual

transmission version.

adds to the GT Turbo trim with more performance, unique Zircon Sand paint, black exterior trim, and a dark interior. The GT trims also add Alexa Built-in Voice Application.

There is the option of six-speed automatic transmission with manualshift mode and sport mode. Also of note is the availability of the Mazda3 Sport with the option of All Wheel Drive via an i-Activ AWD system for the first time. G-Vectoring Control Plus those aids in cornering is also provided. For 2025, the Suna Edition (Sport only) automatic transmission. The top AWD GT Sport Turbo is powered by a turbocharged version of the 2.5L fourcylinder delivering 250 hp and 320 lbft of torque on premium 93 octane gas, and 227 hp and 310 lb-ft of torque with regular 87 octane.

"Ensuring our 4,200 kilometres of roads are safe and passable this winter is a top priority for the City of Surrey," said Mayor



Brenda Locke. "I commend our incredible snow removal crew for their dedication keeping our priority roads clear. We all have a role to play in helping keep our community safe this winter. Please do your part to clear snow and ice from sidewalks outside your home and prepare your vehicle for winter driving."

The City's comprehensive winter road preparedness

strategy includes a diverse 77unit fleet, ready to clear snow and de-ice over 4,200 kilometres of roadway. To keep roads clear when snow falls, the City utilizes state-of-the-art technologies, such as the Road Weather Information System, Traffic Camera Network, and Global Positioning Satellite (GPS) Turn-by-Turn Route Assistance, all functioning together to establish the strongest municipal snow fighting network in the province.

The City's focus is keeping priority roads as clear as possible to support public safety, ensure emergency services can respond quickly, and to maintain public transit and vehicle travel on main arterial roads. The City uses a three-level priority system:

Priority one roads include arterial roads, major collector roads, bus routes and hilly areas Priority two roads include access routes to secondary roads which connect local traffic with arterial or major collector roads

Priority three routes include the remaining residential roads, which are addressed in a systematic manner, starting with identified problem areas, once all other roads are cleared

 $E_{\rm protections}^{\rm mployees}$ will benefit from new protections when bringing forward concerns about serious wrongdoing as the scope of the Public Interest Disclosure Act (PIDA) expands to research universities and WorkSafeBC.

The act protects employees and promotes accountability and transparency by providing a system for employees to report serious wrongdoing to designated officers within their organization or to the Office of the Ombudsperson.

PIDA has been implemented using a phased approach since it came into force in December 2019. This marks the final scheduled phase of implementation of the act in the broader public sector. Approximately 320,000 employees across 197 organizations are now covered by the act.

Disclosers and those who participate in PIDA investigations are protected from reprisal. This includes demotion, termination of employment or other measures that negatively affect their work conditions. The act also ensures that investigations are conducted fairly and promotes transparency by requiring organizations and the ombudsperson to annually report disclosures

received and the results of any investigations. The Province passed PIDA in 2018 in response to the ombudsperson's 2017 report, Misfire: The 2012 Ministry of Health Employment Terminations and Related Matters. The report made 41 recommendations that the Province has fully implemented.

This expansion will cover WorkSafe BC and the following six research universities: University of British Columbia, University of Victoria, University of Northern BC, Simon Fraser University, Thompson Rivers University, Royal Roads University Specific types of wrongdoing that may be

disclosed under PIDA include:

* a serious act or omission that, if proven, would constitute an offence under an enactment of B.C., or Canada;

* an act or omission that creates substantial and specific danger to the life, health or safety of persons, or to the environment, other than a danger that is inherent in the performance of an employee's duties or functions;

* a serious misuse of public funds or public assets;

^{*} gross or systemic mismanagement; and

^c knowingly directing or counselling a person to commit a wrongdoing above.

STAY SAFE AT A CLUB/PARTY/ CONCERT

- Where possible, have friends/family with you, don't walk around at night on your own

- Familiarize yourself with the layout of the venue; try to stay in well-lit, crowded areas

- Take note of where to find event staff or security/police officers and first aid

- If you plan to drink, do so responsibly. Don't accept drinks from people you do not know or leave your drink unattended. - If you see something, say something.



OUTDOORS

- Know your route, be aware of your surroundings, and avoid headphones

- Always walk in well-lit areas; avoid wooded and dimly lit areas, especially at night

- When out for a run, face oncoming traffic and wear reflective clothes

- If you suspect you are being followed, cross the street, go to the nearest home, service station or business and call the police

SHOPPING

- Keep your handbag closed and close at

hand - crowded shopping areas make you an easier target for purse snatchers and pickpockets. Never display large sums of money in public

- Stay alert when using your phone, be aware of who's near you; be aware of your surroundings in a parking lot

- Use a valid rideshare or taxi service. If you feel uneasy about the driver, do not get in the car.

- When driving, make sure your car has enough fuel to complete your journey, check for broken lights, windshield cracks. - Never give a ride to a stranger.

- Keep all the doors locked, even when you are in the vehicle

- On trains and buses, stand in a well-lit place near other people.

- If someone is bothering you, tell the driver of the bus or a Transit Security Officer - you can stay with them if you continue to feel uncomfortable.






