





Alberta First Responders pay heartwarming tribute to Harshandeep Singh

ore than 250 people poured into a More than 250 people pourse funeral home last Sunday to honour the life of slain security guard, 20-year-old Harshandeep Singh in Edmonton. Alberta First Responders Association organized an Honour Guard to show their respect to slain Harshandeep and his family.

Harshandeep was shot to death in a stairwell while patrolling an apartment building in Edmonton on December 6.

"We identify him as a first responder," said Jerry Galliford, a provincial sheriff and president of the Alberta First Responders Association, which helped organize the memorial. "He may be a civilian member, but he's on the front lines. He's putting himself at risk. He's a professional, and that's how we identify a first responder."

Galliford hoped Harshandeep's death would lead to more recognition of

Attendees at Sunday's memorial included first responders, fellow security guards, members of Edmonton's Sikh community, Singh's extended family and Mayor Amarjeet Sohi.

Edmonton Police informed that on Friday, Dec. 6, 2024, at approximately 12:30 a.m., Downtown Branch patrol officers responded to a report of a gunshot inside an apartment building in the area of 106 Street and 107 Avenue. Upon arrival, officers located an unresponsive 20-yearold male security guard Harshandeep Singh in a stairwell and immediately conducted first aid. EMS responded, treated and transported him to hospital where he was declared deceased. An autopsy on Singh's dead body determined the cause of death was a gunshot wound and the manner of death was homicide.

NDP, BC Greens Announce Co-Operation Deal

The BC NDP, holding a ▲ slim 47-seat majority in the 93-seat legislature. faced uncertainty following a cabinet minister's cancer treatment announcement. To maintain confidence, the government has struck a deal with the two BC Green MLAs, ensuring their support in key votes.

Called the 2024 Co-operation and Responsible Government Accord, the document outlines a list of priorities agreed upon by the parities, including health care, affordable

housing and the economy. This deal secures Green support for confidence and supply in exchange for advancing Green



initiatives on healthcare, housing, renter support, homelessness, transit, climate, forestry, tax and legislative reform. BC Green party said in a statement, "Unlike the 2017 CASA this agreement

strong "agree includes disagree" provisions to and a one-year renewal clause, allowing the BC Greens to maintain their independence while working with the government. These provisions ensure the Greens can hold the government accountable on both shared commitments and issues outside the agreement." Premier David Eby said

in a statement, "British Columbians expect us to

work collaboratively to deliver on the most important issues people are facing. I'm pleased to share that the government and BC Greens have reached an agreement to

work together on a specific set of shared priorities."

He said, strengthening health care, building affordable housing, creating livable communities and growing a strong sustainable economy are part of the agreement.

"We are two distinct parties with two distinct identities, and we won't always agree. We also have many shared values. The agreement lays out specific areas of action we will work together to achieve. This agreement will strengthen the stability of government and help deliver on the priorities of British Columbians. We will continue to work with all MLAs who want to make the legislature work for

people," he said.

"I am deeply encouraged by this agreement to work together on the critical issues that matter most to British Columbians. It represents many weeks of hard work to ensure that our government takes meaningful steps to tackle the affordability crisis, improve access to healthcare, and address the urgent climate challenges our province faces. While no agreement is ever perfect, this is a significant step forward. It provides a clear framework for action on the priorities of everyday British Columbians," said Sonia Furstenau, leader of the BC Green Party and former MLA for Cowichan Valley

Surrey Teachers, Parents Sound Alarm Bells About **The Critical Needs In Surrey Schools**

The gap between student I needs and Surrey schools' capacity to meet them has become so severe that teachers, parents, and support workers hosted a joint news conference on December 16 to call upon government to make the significant investments needed to resolve the crisis.

Lizanne Foster, president of the Surrey Teachers' Association (STA), worked with Tammy Murphy, president of CUPE 728, and Anne Whitmore, president of the District Parent Advisory Council, to sound alarm bells about the critical needs in Surrey schools.

In a joint letter to Premier David Eby and Minister of Education and Child Care Lisa Beare, they described Surrey's severe infrastructure, staffing, and resource shortages and called for specific actions and increased funding to remedy the very difficult situation they face in BC's most rapidly growing municipality.

Global news reported, "The group warned overcrowded classrooms and insufficient resources have contributed to unsafe and unproductive learning conditions, including violent behaviour from students with unmet needs. Youth with diverse learning needs are being left out of inclusive education and isolated due to the lack of adequate supports."

They also highlighted Eby's campaign promises to ensure there would be an education assistant in every K–3 classroom

and a mental health counsellor in every school, and they put government on notice that they will be watching for evidence that these promises were not just empty words.

Monday's news conference at the STA office shone a light on multiple problems: severe overcrowding in Surrey schools and years-long delays in approvals for new school construction; the shortage of inclusive education support workers to assist the most vulnerable students; the shortage of teachers and specialist teachers, such as counsellors; and the urgent need for sufficient funding to provide wrap-around support.

To have the voices of teachers, support staff, and parents raised in unison sends a very powerful message indeed.

Police search for 11 suspects linked to violence at Brampton temple protest

Police in Peel Region are working to identify 11 persons of interest who were allegedly involved in violence that broke out during protests in Brampton and Mississauga last month.

Recently police released photographs of several suspects who are allegedly responsible for various offences including assault and assault with weapons. In a press release, police said investigators are asking for help to identify individuals involved in criminality during the November protest incidents in Brampton and Mississauga. "Included in this release are images of persons of interest or suspects responsible for offences that include assault, assault with a weapon, assault causing bodily harm, assault

police officer and public incitement of hatred. Investigators are asking for your help in identifying them."

A Strategic Investigative Team was formed to investigate several offences that occurred during and after protests at a Mandir on The Gore Road in Brampton as well as related incidents at the Westwood Mall in Mississauga.

Investigators continue to analyze hundreds of videos of the incidents and are working to identify additional suspects involved and anticipate further arrests.

Anyone with information on the identity of the depicted individuals are asked to contact investigators at either 12 Division (Mississauga) at 905-453-2121 extension 1233, or 21 Division (Brampton) at 905-453-2121 extension 2133. https://prp.ca.evidence.com/axon/ community-request/public/pr240353091 The protests were part of a series of demonstrations, including one at a Hindu Sabha Mandir in Brampton, where protesters were seen waving Khalistani flags and protesting against Indian Consulate Life certificate camp. The protest then took a violent turn and chaos ensued.

Later the same night, two more demonstrations began at two different locations in Mississauga, at the Sri Guru Singh Sabha and the Westwood Mall. Police had reported a presence of weapons at the sites of these protests and dozens of officers were seen in the area.

Why Does Pierre Poilievre Want to Defund the CBC?

Conservative Party leader Pierre Poilievre has stated that, if elected, he would defund the CBC leaving Radio-Canada intact. Earlier this year, he wrote on X: "I can't wait to defund the CBC and sell off the headquarters for housing." He also shared a link inviting his followers to the Conservative Party website to a petition calling on the federal government to end subsidies to CBC.

What is Mr. Poilievre's reason for taking this position? The answer can be obtained from the petition on the Conservative Party website. The last line of the petition reads: "... we call on this Liberal government to defund the CBC to save taxpayer dollars and ensure a free and competitive press in the Canadian media landscape."

I note that this is not the first time a Canadian politician has called for defunding the **PROVENCE STRUCTURE**

CBC. Previously, Maxine Bernier, a former Conservative MP and Cabinet Minister in Stephen Harper's government and presently the leader of the People's Party of Canada, had made the same demand.

The right-wing lobby group Canadian Taxpayers Federation also has a petition on its website to defund the CBC. Their petition reads: "Taxpayers shouldn't be forced to fund the CBC and other media organizations. We should be able to choose which organization we want to support with our own money."

The mandate of Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC/Radio Canada) is to inform, enlighten and entertain, while contributing to the development of a shared national consciousness and identity and culture. No other broadcaster in Canada has such a mandate.

An independent public broadcaster is a necessity for a thriving democracy, providing Canadians with shared access to high-quality local and national news and programming. The focus of private broadcasters is to make profits for their owners and shareholders. They are not interested in providing high-quality local or national news or in contributing to the development of a shared national consciousness and identity and culture.

CBC serves the biggest news audience in Canada, providing local, national and international news, in English and French, on TV, radio, Web and mobile, from coast to coast to coast. No other media organization in the country does this. In fact, no other national media company has a station in the North or French-language stations outside Québec.

CBC's 2024-25 budget is \$1.38 billion. Government funding accounts for approximately 70 percent of CBC/Radio-Canada's budget, while the remainder of its funding comes from self-generated revenue including advertising.

A 2020 report showed Canada's spending on public broadcasting to be just \$33 per capita, \$55 less than the global average. In the face of an evolving media landscape, the rise of digital platforms, and increased polarization, Canada needs to strengthen its public service media, not defund it.

The CBC serves as a crucial remedy to the growing blight of online disinformation, ensuring that diverse voices are heard, and news is fact-checked. Defunding the CBC would further allow digital media giants to deepen societal divisions. Strengthening the CBC is an investment in a more informed, connected, and strong Canada.


In 2011, a study undertaken by Deloitte showed that CBC contributes \$3.7 billion to the Canadian economy, a substantial return for a public investment of \$1.1 billion. The study cites CBC's contributions to local economies, a vibrant production sector, and creative clusters. The study also highlights CBC's role as an innovator which pioneers innovative technologies that are later adopted by other broadcasters and the broader creative sector.

Does Mr. Poilievre care that Canadians do not want to defund the CBC. A recent poll reported by Toronto Star on November 30, 2024, shows that seventy-eight percent of Canadians want the CBC to continue. That includes 67 per cent of Canadians who identify as Conservatives.

In today's world, unbiased reporting has become more important than ever before. With the rise of fake news and biased reporting, it is essential that media outlets maintain a high level of integrity in their reporting. Unbiased reporting is crucial to educate the public and allow them to form their own opinions based on factual information.

The push for reduced public spending on the CBC is not an attempt to save taxpayer dollars. It is a calculated move to advance a particular political ideology that would see private broadcasters take over all media outlets and further polarize our society. We can access the revenue we need to fund our public broadcaster properly by going after multinational corporations that do not pay a fair share of taxes.

Shots fired at two houses in Newton, police **looking for South Asian men**

¬wo shootings in less than two days rocked the Newton residential area in Surrey. Both the shootings targeted houses, and vehicles parked outside the houses and took place in close vicinity.

Surrey Police Service informed that fist shooting took place on Sunday, December at approximately 1:30 am. Shots were fired outside of a residence in the 7700 block 126A Street, Surrey. Several residents were inside asleep at the time and no one was injured. Surrey Police Service officers, with the assistance of the Lower Mainland Integrated Forensic Identification Service (IFIS), discovered that both a vehicle parked in the driveway and the side of the house were struck by several bullets.

Two suspects, described as adults



wearing dark clothing, were seen running away. The investigation is ongoing and being led by Surrey Police Services' Frontline Investigative Support Team (FLIST).

The second shooting happened just before 6 pm on Monday,

December 16 that has left two people injured. Surrey Police received a call from a woman saying that she and her husband had been shot while outside in the 12600 block 67B Ave, Surrey. In their car nearby, was a young child who was unharmed.

Both victims have been taken to hospital for treatment of serious injuries.

Two suspects, described as adult South Asian men, were last seen driving away in a dark-coloured sedan.

The investigation is in its early stages and is being supported by RCMP Surrey Provincial **Operations Support Unit Serious** Crime Unit and General Investigation Unit officers, as well as Surrey Police Service's Frontline Investigative Support Team (FLIST).

"Justin Trudeau failed in the biggest job a Prime Minister has: to work for people, not the powerful. To focus on Canadians, not themselves. The Liberals don't deserve another chance. That's why the NDP will vote to bring this government down, and give Canadians a chance to vote for a government who will work for them. No matter who is leading the Liberal Party, this government's time is up. We will put forward a clear motion of non-confidence in the next sitting of the House of Commons. I called for Justin Trudeau to resign, and he should."

After backing out of a governance agreement with the Liberals this fall, the NDP has voted with the government on a number of confidence motions over the past few months. Conservative Leader Pierre Poilievre criticized Singh for not voting down the government earlier — specifically when the Conservatives put forward a motion using Singh's own criticism of the Liberals

is no chance to introduce any motion for months-until after you get your pension. You did the same stunt in September, claiming you'd no longer prop Trudeau up. Then you went back on your word and voted 8 times AGAINST AN ELECTION & for your boss Trudeau. Just 11 days ago you voted against a non-confidence motion filled with your own words. Had you voted the other way, we'd be almost half-way through the election now," Poilievre said in a response to Singh's letter on platform X, formerly Twitter.

Shock waves were sent through Canada after Freeland's resignation with many speculating if it is the end of the Trudeau term. In a letter addressed to PM Trudeau that was posted on Freeland's Platform X, she wrote, she was asked by the PM to step down as the finance minister and was offered another position in the cabinet. But Freeland said that instead of changing the role, "the only honest and viable path is for her to resign from the Cabinet."

She said that over the past few weeks PM

and her have been at odds about best path forward for Canada. She slammed "costly political gimmicks" and said the government needed to keep fiscal reserves available for a possible trade war with the incoming US administration of Donald Trump. Last month, Trudeau announced a temporary sales-tax holiday and tax rebates for millions of Canadians.

Days after Freeland resigned suddenly, PM announced Cabinet shuffle.

Under the latest shuffle Trudeau announced 12 changes to his cabinet, bringing in eight new ministers. New Finance Minister Dominic LeBlanc will keep his new portfolio in finance but will no longer be minister of public safety and democratic institutions. Longtime Ottawa MP David McGuinty will become the new minister of Public Safety.

Anita Anand becomes Minister of Transport and Internal Trade, Gary Anandasangaree becomes Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs and Minister responsible for the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency, Steven MacKinnon becomes Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Labour and Ginette Petitpas Taylor becomes President of the Treasury Board.

Democratic Institutions and Minister responsible for the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario. Edmonton Police arrested and charged Evan Rain, 30, and Judith Saulteaux, 30, with 1st degree murder on Friday, Dec. 6 in relation to Singh's death. Investigators do not believe anyone else was involved in Singh's death and a weapon was recovered during the arrest.

In the meantime, a video of a security guard's cold-blooded shooting in an apartment building was circulating on social media platforms. In the video, a man and a woman can be seen walking down the hallway. The man can be heard yelling as he lifts and points a large gun several times. At the end of the hallway, he appears to use the gun to hit someone off camera multiple times, while the woman and another person stand nearby. All three enter a stairwell with what appears to be the security guard with his hands above his head. The next moments are caught on video from inside the stairwell. It shows the security guard being held by the woman briefly before he runs down the stairs and is shot by the man in the back. He falls to the ground at the bottom of the stairs, and all three people exit the stairwell.

The police said that they were aware of a video circulating online that depicts Mr. Singh's shooting death on Friday, Dec. 6, 2024. "We are unable to comment on the authenticity of the video as the investigation is ongoing. While three individuals are observed in the video, EPS is confident that only two individuals were involved in the shooting death."

"Edmontonians are rightly outraged by this tragic incident," said EPS Homicide Staff Sgt. Rob Bilawey. "Posting or sharing incorrect information during an ongoing investigation impedes the process and disrespects the victim and their loved ones. We send our deepest condolences to the friends and family of the deceased."

According to a GoFundMe fundraiser, Singh was the only son of his parents. He came to Canada just 1.5 years ago. A fundraiser was created with a target of \$50,000 to raise money for his funeral. In less than 24 hours since starting this GoFundMe, an incredible \$122,720, far exceeding the initial goal.

Gulzar Singh Nirman, who created the fundraiser on Harshandeep's family behalf said. "While we know that no amount of money can bring Harshandeep back to his grieving family, your compassion and support reflect something much greater-the belief in humanity, unity, and the values that define us as a global community."

He said, "We would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to the media and press community for helping spread the word about this campaign. Your efforts ensured that Harshandeep's story reached a wide audience, and for that, we are immensely grateful. We also extend our deepest thanks to the first responders and Edmonton Police Service for their swift response and ongoing efforts during this tragic situation. Your work is vital, and we are truly thankful for your dedication and service."

In recent times, Canada may have been a source of concern for many youth from Punjab seeking a better life. However, this outpouring of support has shown a different narrative-a reflection of the positive culture and values Canada holds dear. This collective kindness demonstrates that even in the face of tragedy, Canadians stand united in compassion and solidarity.

These funds will help send Harshandeep's body back to his home in Matehri Jattan, Haryana, India, allowing his parents to perform his final rites. The funds will also assist his family in overcoming the financial hardships they endured to send him to Canada in search of opportunities, and they will provide support for his beloved sister as the family navigates this immense loss, said the fundraiser page.

Canada Gets Tough On Illegal Drug Trade And Immigration Under New US-Canada Border Security Plan

Canada has promised to implement a set of sweeping new security measures along the country's US border, including strengthened surveillance and a joint "strike force" to target transnational organised crime and tighten rules against immigration at border.

The pledge follows a threat from President-elect Donald Trump to impose, when he takes office in January, a 25% tariff on Canadian goods if the country does not secure its shared border to the flow of irregular migrants and illegal drugs.

Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Finance and Intergovernmental Affairs, along with Marc Miller, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship announced Canada's Border Plan. The plan will have an investment of \$1.3 billion and is built around five pillars.

"We are investing in new tools and resources to address the threat of illegal synthetic drugs in driving the overdose crisis. To support law and border enforcement, our government is strengthening our regulatory controls and investing in drug analysis and intelligence. This is another important step in addressing the overdose crisis and keeping communities safe," said Ya'ara Saks, Minister of Mental Health and Addictions and Associate Minister of Health. **Detecting and disrupting the fentanyl trade**

The Government of Canada will increase support to law enforcement agencies in detecting, intercepting and addressing fentanyl and precursor chemicals by adding artificial intelligence and imaging tools that will further help detect illegal drugs before they enter Canada.

As well, the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) will train and deploy new canine teams to intercept illegal drugs. The agency currently has over 80 detector dog teams located at various ports of entry across Canada. CBSA will also deploy new chemical detection tools at high-risk



ports of entry.

Health Canada will create a new Canadian Drug Profiling Centre to support 2,000 investigations a year, and expand capacity at regional labs.

By launching a new Chemical Precursor Risk Management Unit, Health Canada will be able to provide better insight into precursor chemicals and distribution channels, enhance monitoring and surveillance and enable timely law enforcement action. In addition, Health Canada will accelerate the regulatory process for banning precursors so that border and law enforcement can take swift action to prevent their illegal importation and use.

Introducing significant new tools for law enforcement

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) will deploy a new Aerial Intelligence Task Force comprised of helicopters, drones, and mobile surveillance towers. Counter-drone technology will support RCMP officers and provide 24/7 surveillance between ports of entry.

As well, new legislative requirements proposed in the Fall Economic Statement 2024 will expressly obligate port owners and operators to provide the CBSA, free of charge, with the space and facilities needed to conduct export inspections, just as they currently do for imports.

In addition, the Government will invest to expand the RCMP and the Communications Security Establishment (CSE)'s intelligence collection capacity, enabling these agencies to target transnational organized crime and fentanyl trafficking more effectively.

Enhancing operational coordination

Increased information sharing between Canadian and United States (U.S.) officials on each illegal border interception enables officials to target and take stronger action against those who abuse our system, allowing for enhanced intelligence sharing in real time, monitoring of illegal migration trends and hot spots, improved operational interoperability, proactive resource planning and deployment, and ultimately, the targeting and disruption of organized crime groups facilitating illegal border crossings.

Increasing information sharing

The Government of Canada will build on our information and intelligence sharing between our federal, provincial, territorial authorities, the U.S. and other international partners.

Enhanced information sharing will allow authorities to identify, monitor and collaborate with partners to intercept high-risk individuals attempting to travel along with goods of interest attempting to move between countries.

Minimizing unnecessary border volumes Government of Canada will implement changes to end 'flagpoling', which happens when a temporary resident leaves Canada and immediately returns to a port of entry to get immigration services. This practice uses significant resources at the border, distracts border officers from enforcement activities, and slows cross-border traffic.

The Government also proposed, in the Fall Economic Statement 2024, to amend the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act to secure and extend new authorities to cancel, change or suspend immigration documents and to cancel, suspend or stop accepting new applications, which would give Canada greater control over its immigration documents to protect Canadians and public resources. These authorities could also help prevent those who may pose a risk to Canada from entering the country and prevent further southbound irregular migration.

Additional measures include imposing new restrictions on countries that do not rapidly facilitate the return of their citizens in the event of fraudulent entry or a removal order.

The Safe Third Country Agreement (STCA) and its Additional Protocol remain in place. People must claim asylum in the first country they enter – be it Canada or the U.S. This agreement mitigates against unlawful entry into either country, and maintains border integrity for both countries. Claimants that do not meet an exception or exemption to the STCA will be returned to the first safe country they entered, either Canada or the U.S.

The vehicle was off road, and stuck in the foreshore of the river and not in the water. Prior to police arrival, Delta Fire Department firefighters and good Samaritans came to the aid of the female driver and two young children.

Two charges of attempted murder have been sworn against the driver of the car, who has been arrested and remains in custody awaiting her first court appearance.

Applications for the DFA event must be submitted to the Ministry of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness within 90 calendar days of the event declaration. The deadline to submit applications for this event is now March 13, 2025. The new deadline applies to all communities, including those previously declared on Nov. 25, 2024.

Eligible local governments and First Nations that have infrastructure damage as a result of the flooding should submit a DFA for communities application as soon as possible. 



2025 RAM 1500 Tungsten: Power, Versatility and Good Looks!

Review by Veeno Dewan

The venerable full-size Ram 1500 pickup continues into 2025 with a number of updates. For the Canadian market there are two different Ram cab models: quad and crew cabs, (the two door is gone,) three bed lengths and seven different trim levels with numerous options. Major 2025 revisions include the elimination of the mighty Hemi V8 engine from the lineup and the introduction of new powerplant choices; plus, all trucks are now 4x4-only. There are cabin revisions and technology and engineering updates and a new top-of-the-line Tungsten trim is reintroduced for 2025. All models receive new styling cues including a larger grille and new front and rear lighting, and available power tailgates.

Most importantly, the 5.7L "Hemi" V8 engine is now replaced by regular and high-output versions of a turbocharged inline six-cylinder engine, Two-wheel drive is gone, and all trims are 4x4-only. "V engine" fans can still order the base

venerable Pentastar V6 engine if necessary. The two new engines are both twin-turbocharged 3.0L inline six-cylinder units, known as Hurricane. The regular-output version makes 420 horsepower and 469 lb-ft of torque. The high-output version makes 540 horsepower and 521 lb-ft of torque, and it is in the upscale Limited Longhorn, Limited, and Tungsten trims. Note - the Hurricane 3.0L inline-six is recommended for premium fuel, while the high-output version favours 91-octane premium gasoline. An active four-corner air suspension system is optional or standard on all but the base Tradesman model, and the Ram 1500 continues to use coil springs at all four wheels.

The 2025 Ram 1500 runs all of its powertrains through the sturdy ZF eight-speed automatic transmission, with power going to all four wheels through a choice of 3.21, new 3.55, or 3.92 final-drive ratios. Rear differential options include open, limited slip, or electronic locking.

All crew cabs start out with a 5-foot-7 bed, although the Tungsten trims can be kitted out with a 6-foot-4 bed. Also new for 2025 is an available power tailgate with obstacle detection when opening or closing via a key fob. Also available is the RamBox system, a pair of locking, waterproof, and drainable storage bins in the bed rails, which include a 115volt outlet. Crew cabs include available in-floor storage bins. Towing capacity across the lineup is a maximum of 11,580 lbs, while maximum payload tops out at 1,043 kg (2,300 lbs). Cabin wise - new available features include a 14.5-inch centre touchscreen, 10.25-inch passenger screen, and 12.3inch digital instrument cluster: rearview camera mirror; dual wireless phone charging pad; there is also the ability to use your phone as a key; and an on-board 2-kW inverter that can power items such as a television or chainsaw. A new hands-free highway driving

assist is available.

All trims include adaptive cruise control, active lane management, emergency front braking, front and rear park assist with rear braking, and mandatory rearview Available camera. features include blind-spot monitoring, panoramic camera, drowsy driver warning, evasive steering assist, intersection collision warning, traffic sign recognition, trailer reverse steering control, head-up display, and a selfparking feature.

The 2025 Ram 1500 Tungsten and upper echelon versions are super loaded with such standard or available features as a dual-pane sunroof, 10.25-inch passenger screen, 10- to 23-speaker sound systems, power-adjustable pedals, heated front and rear seats, ventilated front seats, massaging seats, power-adjustable head restraints, suede headliner, open-pore wood accents, and digital mirror with tow mode. The Tungsten trim (As tested) that replaces the



top Limited Edition has premium materials and cabin technologies and loads this top trim with front seat massagers and a headup display. Note- The hands -off driving system of the new Ram systems will only operate when prompted by a knock or tap on the turn signal.

Canadian Pricing for the 2025 Ram 1500 in Quad Cab format starts with the entry level Tradesman at \$60,445 with the Big Horn at \$65,445; the Sport is \$75,945; the Rebel at \$77,945; The Upscale Laramie at version is \$82,445; the Limited at \$94,945; and the newfor-2025 Tungsten begins at \$107,945.

It not hard to see why the Ram 1500 is so popular with pickup buyers, it look great with its aggressive styling, and wonderfully luxurious and comfortable and well- appointed cabin. On the road, the coil over suspension and easy steering make it a smooth all-round performer. The downside, if

there is one is that the Ram1500 is very expensive if you opt for high spec models and start ticking option boxes. Plus -with no V8 Hemi engine option – this might turn off some buyers. Still, the Ram1500 is a wonderful truck to drive and own and remains a dependable, quality ,well-made truck for work or play. Highly recommended.

Punjab Gears Up For Municipal Elections

As many as 3,336 candidates are set to battle it out in the civic polls scheduled to be held in the state on December 21. Elections will be held to five municipal corporations, 41 municipal councils, nagar panchayats and vacant seats in other civic bodies. The campaigning for the elections ended today.

The Amritsar and Jalandhar MCs have 85 wards each, Ludhiana has 95, Patiala 60 and Phagwara 50.

The ruling AAP is seeing these polls, which are being fought on party symbols, as an ideal opportunity to wrest control of all major municipal corporations. Other parties, including Congress, BJP and SAD, are crying

foul over alleged abuse of official machinery by the ruling party, alleging that their candidates were prevented from filing nomination papers.

December 21 will be a 'close day' for shops, factories and commercial establishments within the jurisdiction of the civic bodies going to the polls so that workers can cast their votes

It will be a holiday in all schools where buildings are being used for poll purpose Government employees and workers,

who are voters of these municipal bodies but posted elsewhere, will get special leave to exercise their franchise The day of polling will be a 'Dry Day' in the revenue jurisdiction of the

municipal bodies going to polls With the AAP government nearing three years of its five-year term, the elections are crucial as these would reflect the popularity of the party among urban voters. Trying to ride on anti-incumbency, the Opposition parties are flagging the alleged abuse of power first in the panchayat polls and now in the civic body polls and deteriorating" law and order situation in the state. The polls are being seen as mainly a fight between AAP and the Congress. The ruling party is aiming to wrest control of the MCs in Amritsar, Jalandhar, Ludhiana and Patiala, where the Congress is in majority.



Five-Time Haryana Chief Minister Chief Minister Om Prakash Chautala Passes Away

Indian National Lok Dal president and five-time Haryana chief minister Om Prakash Chautala died in Gurugram on Friday, 20 December 2024, at the age of 89.

Chautala, who was former deputy prime minister Devi Lal's son, suffered a cardiac arrest at his house and was immediately rushed to a hospital but could not be saved, a party spokesperson told PTI. He breathed his last at around 12 noon in Medanta hospital, a senior police officer said.

Chautala, who came from a prominent political family in



Haryana and was face of a prominent regional outfit, had been facing age-related health issues in the recent past. He is survived by two sons and three daughters. His wife Sneh Lata had passed away over five years ago.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Haryana chief minister Nayab Singh Saini were among a host of leaders who condoled the demise of Chautala. Expressing grief, Modi said on X, "He (Chautala) was active in the state politics for many years and strove constantly to advance the work of Devi Lal." The Haryana government declared a three-day state mourning from Friday as a mark of respect.

India registers strong protest with Dhaka over comments by Bangla govt aide

India has lodged a strong protest with Dhaka over certain controversial comments by key aide of Bangladesh's interim government Mahfuj Alam.

In a recent Facebook post, Alam had said India should recognise the uprising that forced the then prime minister Sheikh Hasina to resign. Days later, in another post, he also claimed that certain Indian territories should be part of Bangladesh. He deleted the post later.

"We have registered our strong protest on the issue with the

Bangladesh side. We understand that the post being referred to has reportedly been taken down," external affairs ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said.

"We would like to remind all concerned to be mindful of their public comments," he said.

"While India has repeatedly signalled interest in fostering relations with the people and the interim government of Bangladesh, such comments underline the need for responsibility in public articulation," Jaiswal added.

25 individuals arrested in Surrey Police "Boost and Bust"

2⁵ people were arrested, 27 charges were sworn, two arrest warrants were executed, several weapons were seized, and thousands of dollars in stolen merchandise was recovered.

On December 12, 2024, Surrey Police Service (SPS), Metro Vancouver Transit Police, and the Delta Police Department teamed up with businesses and loss prevention officers in Surrey's City Centre area to target shoplifting in a project called "Boost and Bust".

The project resulted the arrest of 25

individuals. Two of those individuals were also wanted on outstanding warrants. In addition, two arrests were related to the thefts of "bait bicycles". One replica firearm, four hunting knives, and two cans of bear spray were seized from the suspects upon their arrests. Over \$3,000 in stolen merchandise was recovered and returned to retailers.

"Shoplifting incidents often do not simply involve theft from businesses and the commensurate loss of product and inconvenience, they also can present risks to staff and customers at the retail locations," said SPS Media Liaison Ian MacDonald.

This crime type has also been steadily increasing in frequency in Surrey over the past two years. In 2022 there were 2,596 reported shoplifting incidents; and in 2023 that number had increased to 3,314, a 28% increase. Year-to-date in 2024 there have been over 3,800 reported shoplifting incidents, representing a 15% increase over 2023 and a 46% increase over 2022.

"Participating in joint projects with other

police agencies increases law enforcement effectiveness, cross-trains officers, and builds a solid foundation of cooperative problemsolving. Officers learned new investigative skills from each other, processed several arrests, and returned stolen items to businesses. All in all, a very effective collaboration that the DPD looks forward to building upon with our partners from Surrey and Transit Police," said Acting Inspector James Sandberg, Public Affairs Manager for the DPD.

Action! B.C. sets the scene to attract more film, TV productions

ANGL-EY: BC has announced increased tax incentives for British Columbia's motion picture sector.

Budget 2025 will include increases to the Film Incentive BC (FIBC) tax credit, which supports C a n a d i a n - c o n t e n t productions, and the production services tax credit (PSTC) that provides a tax incentive for international projects made in B.C.

With the approval of budget legislation, the FIBC will increase from 35% to 36%, and the PSTC will increase from 28% to 36% for productions with principal photography starting Jan. 1, 2025. To further give major productions incentives in the province, projects with B.C. production costs of greater than \$200 million will receive a 2% bonus.

"Our province is home to one of the busiest film and TV production centres in North America," said Premier David Eby. "But film production in B.C. has taken a big hit over the last few years, responding to significant impacts from the pandemic, multiple labour disruptions and changes to industry practices. We're boosting tax incentives - and our competitive advantage to ensure that our province remains a destination of choice for filmmakers in Canada and around the world, employing skilled British Columbian crews." Based on feedback from animated productions, the Province also intends to restore regional and distant location tax credits for companies with a bricksand-mortar presence outside of Metro Vancouver, the

Fraser Valley and Whistler/ Squamish.

"B.C. is a motion-picture powerhouse with spectacular locations, world-class crews, studios and outstanding creative talent that major productions rely on," said Spencer Chandra Herbert, Minister of Tourism, Arts, Culture and Sport. "I was recently in Los Angeles and heard directly from studio executives about the significant production increases in B.C. that would flow from changes like these. These changes will help us land more top-tier projects, fuel economic and job growth, and showcase everything we love about B.C. to the world."

In 2023, strike action halted the industry for more than six months and a decrease in global productions have affected the province's film industry. According to Creative BC, more than 37,000 jobs in the province were supported by the motion-picture industry in 2022, compared to 26,000 in 2023.

In B.C., foreign productions make up more than 80% of total production spending on average. Maintaining strong international relationships is critical for the film and TV industry to continue to thrive.

In November, Bailey, Chandra Herbert and Nina parliamentary Krieger, secretary for arts and film, went to Los Angeles to meet with studio decision-makers. The delegation discussed ways to enhance the Province's competitiveness and highlight the benefits of filming in B.C. and understand the needs of the industry.

More accessible taxis will help people stay connected

People who rely on wheelchair-accessible taxis will have more options to move between work, school and appointments as the Province helps to increase the number of accessible taxis.

The third round of funding for the Passenger Transportation Accessibility Program (PTAP) launched Monday, Dec. 16, 2024, to help ensure people in British Columbia can get to where they need to go. The program helps taxi operators buy and maintain wheelchair-accessible vehicles, increasing the number of these vehicles in service.

People who depend on accessible taxis historically have experienced longer wait times or lack of service. To address this, the Province developed the PTAP program in 2022 to increase the availability of accessible taxis by offsetting the costs that taxi companies and owner-operators face in providing wheelchair-accessible vehicles.

Approximately \$7 million is available for this round of funding to partially subsidize eligible applicants for costs related to vehicle maintenance, converting an existing vehicle, buying a converted vehicle, or purchasing a new vehicle and converting it.

The acquisition and conversion rebate will remain open all year to ensure companies can access funding as soon as a purchase is made. Applications for the maintenance portion of the rebate will be accepted until Feb. 14, 2025.







'Girls Will Be Girls' Movie Review: A Textured, Eloquent Coming-Of-Age Story



66 won't allow anything more than a friendship,"

decrees Anila (Kani Kusruti), a very mom thing to say. She is sizing up a tall, sweet boy, Srinivas (Kesav Binoy Kiron), who's drawn her daughter's affections at their elite, hillside boarding school. The girl, Mira (Preeti Panigrahi), stands at the door and listens.

The camera mimics her watchful gaze. It is a simple domestic intervention, yet it *it* thrums with suspense.

This is a charged, decisive moment in Shuchi Talati's Girls Will Be Girls, which won two prizes at the Sundance Film Festival. Anila is a fussy, controlling parent, turning up annually from

Haridwar to tide Mira through her exams. She is also lonely and emotionally desolate. Her choice of dress to meet Srinivas gives it away: a bright, oversized pink top with puffed shoulders, likely purchased at a younger age. Mira, soon to turn 18, is at the threshold of that age. Sincere, petite and academically bright, she is appointed against tradition as her school's first girl Head Prefect (how close the word hews to 'perfect'). The prestige and significance of the appointment seem to weigh on Mira.

In the opening scene, after taking her school pledge, she stalks down to inspect a line of delinquents, bossily issuing punishments and warnings. A friend ribs her by calling her 'Mirabai', mocking her matchless devotion to school rules.

Girls Will Be Girls (English)

In its initial stretches, Girls Will Be Girls resembles a conventional comingof-age indie like Greta Gerwig's Lady Bird, although Mira, at least at school, is the opposite of a teen rebel. Her romantic and sexual awakening is captured in furtive glances and gestures: tender hands brush against cold, hard instruments (Mira peers through both a microscope and a telescope. Our vision in teenage, as per Talati, is both expanded and thinned). There is a waltz of sexual jealousy between mother and daughter once the blithely unperturbed Srinivas becomes a habitue of their home, addressing Anila by her first name and, later, lying in bed beside her. The film gains psychological force with Mira's unravelling. Panigrahi's bright, pleasant face reddens and rocks with a range of emotions. The screenplay by Talati is subtle and detailed. However, given the mostly static compositions and two primary settings, we are urged to hang onto words for clues. When
