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B.C. Could See Economic Loss Of \$69 Billion Due To Trump's Tariffs

As Canada is developing strategy to fight against threatened United States tariffs of 25% on all Canadian imports, BC has done a preliminary assessment of potential impacts to the B.C. economy of a trade war with the United States.

According to the preliminary assessment, done by the BC's Ministry of Finance, in president-elect Donald Trump's tariffs scenario, B.C. could see a cumulative loss of \$69 billion in economic activity between 2025 and 2028. The Province's real GDP is projected to potentially decline by 0.6% year over year in both 2025 and 2026.

Job losses are estimated at



124,000 by 2028 with the largest declines in natural-resource sector export industries and associated manufacturing.



Losses would also be felt in the transportation and retail sectors. The unemployment rate could increase to 6.7% in

2025 and 7.1% in 2026, and corporate profits could see an annual decline in the range of \$3.6 billion to \$6.1 billion.

Tariffs imposed by the United States, along with potential retaliatory measures, could impact many of the province's key revenue streams, such as personal and corporate income taxes. Preliminary analysis indicates this could reduce annual revenues by between \$1.6 billion and \$2.5 billion.

This preliminary assessment is one of many possibilities as there is considerable uncertainty about the exact nature, magnitude and timing of United States policies that may be implemented.

facing extraordinary times.


"I've helped managed multiple crises and I've helped save two economies," Carney said. "I know how business works, and I know how to make it work for you."

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Canada As 51St State? Four-In-Five Americans Say A Merger Should Be Up To Canadians; 90% Of Us Say 'No'

Americans oppose a merger 2:1; just 52% say if Canada does join the U.S., it should get 'full statehood'

omments once dismissed as "trolling", "musing" or "Trump just being Trump" have taken on more serious overtones as the U.S. presidentelect persists in talking about having Canada join the United States.


After a month of what was initially waved off as "silly talk", the narrative is creating significant anxiety among Canadians, and bemusement among the few Americans actually aware of the situation.

A cross-border study conducted by the non-profit Angus Reid Institute finds that while one-in-three Canadians (32%) believe Donald Trump is serious in his professed goal of making Canada the 51st state, most Americans – two-thirds – have paid little attention to the incoming president's comments.

When it comes to appetite for such a "merger" – Americans are twice as likely to oppose (49%) Canada joining their nation than support it (25%). The idea has little to no traction at home – except among Conservatives.

The Survey finds while one-in-10 Canadians overall say they would vote to join the U.S. in a referendum, that proportion rises to 20 per cent among 2021 Conservative voters and drops to three per cent among Liberals and one per cent among New Democrats.

If Canada does join, three-quarters (77%) of Americans say it should only be by our own choice, as opposed to the result of pressure (5%) or military force (1%).

Even if Canada did choose to join the U.S., only half of their southern neighbours favour (yes, neighbour and favour with a 'u') giving Canada full statehood, with citizenship and voting rights.

One-quarter instead say Canada should be relegated to a reduced status like that of Puerto Rico, which does not have congressional representation and whose residents are not able to vote in presidential elections.

While Americans are not overly fond of the idea of Canada joining their union, politics plays a significant factor. Consider that Trump voters are more in support (42%) than in opposition (32%), were it up to them. Those who voted for Democratic nominee Kamala Harris provide significantly more pushback, with just nine per cent supporting the

andeep Singh Maan, who won a \$2-million lottery jackpot while also part of a workplace lotto pool has been told he doesn't have to split his winnings with his coworkers.

"Winning the lottery should be a happy event. In this case, sadly, it has ruined relationships," said BC Supreme court judge after dismissing claim of Mann's coworkers who said they were entitled to shares of a \$2-million BC/49 lottery jackpot won by a

The case, Nagra v. Maan (2025 BCSC 38), arose after Mandeep Singh Maan won a the prize on a ticket purchased on Aug. 15, 2022. The plaintiffs - Balvinder Kaur Nagra, Sukhjinder Singh Sidhu, Binipal Singh

Sanghera, and Jeevan Pedan - claimed the ticket was part of a workplace lottery pool and that they were entitled to equal shares. They argued that the group had a longstanding verbal agreement to pool money for tickets twice weekly.

The plaintiffs testified that each member of the group regularly contributed \$10 toward ticket purchases every Monday and Friday. According to their testimony, the pool funds were primarily used to buy a predetermined "Standard Package" of tickets, which included BC/49. They further alleged that Maan was responsible for purchasing the Aug.15 tickets on behalf of the group after receiving pooled funds earlier that day.

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Changes To Open Work Permits For Family Members Of Temporary Residents Will Come Into Effect From January 21

As part of the broader measures announced in September 2024, Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) is changing open work permit (OWP) eligibility for family members of international students and

foreign workers.

Effective January 21, 2025, only spouses of certain international students and foreign workers will be able to apply for a family OWP.

Family OWPs will be limited to spouses

of international students who are enrolled in master's programs that are 16 months or longer, doctoral programs, or select professional and eligible programs.

Family OWPs will also be limited to spouses of foreign workers who are employed in TEER 0 or 1 occupations, or select TEER 2 or 3 occupations in sectors with labour shortages or linked to government priorities. These include occupations in the natural and applied sciences, construction, health care, natural resources, education, sports and military sectors. The full list will be available on January 21, 2025.

In addition, the foreign worker must also have at least 16 months remaining on their work permit at the time when their spouse applies for the OWP. Dependent children of foreign workers will no longer be eligible. OWPs that were approved under the previous measures and have not expired will remain valid. In situations where students may need more time to complete



their program or where family members received a shorter work permit than the principal applicant, in-Canada family members (including spouses and dependent children) can apply to renew their work permit as long as they are applying under the same criteria as the current work permit, and the requested duration of the renewal matches that of the existing study or work permit of the principal applicant

Spouses of workers covered by free-trade agreements and those transitioning to permanent residence will not be impacted by these changes. Family members who will no longer qualify for a family OWP can apply for any type of work permit they are eligible for under Canada's work permit programs.

However, Maan denied these claims, arguing that any lottery pools were irregular, informal and typically formed on an ad hoc basis. He maintained that the winning ticket was purchased with his personal funds, as part of his routine lottery-playing habit, which he testified involves spending about \$400 monthly on tickets.

According to National Post, the judge noted that the arrangement was somewhat ad hoc. "That is, no one person was responsible for group lottery ticket purchases and the decision on who would buy the tickets for any given week or day was made from purchase to purchase, spontaneously and as the need arose," she wrote in her decision.

"Frequently, it was either Mr. Maan or Mr.

Sidhu who bought the group tickets. More rarely, it was Ms. Nagra. Other times, a young man named Mr. Singh, who worked at (the same company) but was not a member of the lottery group, went to the store to buy the tickets."

She added: "Beyond this, the parties disagree on many things. For example, they disagree on how often they bought tickets as a group, whether the purchases they did make during the relevant period always involved the same group of five people, what kinds of lottery tickets they normally bought, and whether photos of the group tickets were usually sent around once they were bought. There was no written agreement, and they kept no records other than some WhatsApp messages and about 16 photos of lottery tickets."



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Time For Canada To Strengthen Trade Ties With Europe

Over the years our leaders have told us that the US is our closest ally and friend. These days when I hear Trump speak, I wonder if this is so.

Donald Trump, the incoming US president of US, has been making threats against Canada, Mexico, European Union and others for the last few weeks. Initially, our leaders told us not to take Mr. Trump seriously and that he was simply joking when he said Canda should become 51st state. Now they tell us that we should take him seriously in relation to 25 percent tariff on Canadian exports.

Two weeks ago, Mr. Trump announced that he would use "economic force" to absorb Canada into the United States. What happened to the principles such as liberty, democracy, sovereignty, territorial integrity and global co-operation that US leaders used to talk about?

How should we respond to Trump's threats? I have read several responses by some wellknown journalists. Of those, I found two responses extremely interesting. The first one was by Pete McMartin in the Vancouver Sun on December 26, 2024. The title of his piece was: Why the US should be Canada's 11th province. In his article, McMartin outlined 16 reasons as to why the U.S. should become Canada's 11th province. I will not outline those except the first one which read: "Because Canada isn't led by a convicted

The second response was by The Economist in its January 4, 2025, edition. The piece is titled: "Why Canada should join the EU." It states: "Europe needs space and resources, Canada needs people. Let's deal."

The Economist argues: Canada is vast and blessed with natural resources but relatively few people, while the EU is small, cramped and mineral-poor. It states Canadians can be thought of as honorary Europeans. Like Europeans, Canadians believe that markets work but must

The Economist argues that the EU should invite Canada to become its 28th member. It concludes that the EU should ratify the Canada-EU trade deal, enacted in 2017, which is yet to be ratified by ten of its members. Although others have responded to Mr. Trump's threats what impressed me about the piece in the Economist is the argument that Canada and EU should expand trade.

Whenever we have a trade dispute with the US our leaders tell us that we should expand our trade with Europe, Asia and others so that we don't depend so much on the US. This discussion lasts a few weeks, and the situation reverts to what it was before.



Canada has traditionally relied heavily on trade with the US, with approximately 75 percent of its exports heading South of the border. When we depend only on one customer, we allow that customer to have significant bargaining power.

It has become clear that over reliance on the US exposes the Canadian economy to risks such as economic downturns and protectionist policies. Diversifying trade with Europe and Asia offers Canada an opportunity to build economic resilience and capitalize on growing markets.

I am not sure how many trade offices have been opened by Canada in Europe, Asia and other continents. If it has not already been done, it should be done as soon as possible. The sole objective of these offices should be to market Canadian products and facilitate trade between Canada and other countries.

Through the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA), Canada has preferential access to over 500 million consumers in the European Union. This allows Canadian producers to tap into one of the world's largest economic blocs. Diversification mitigates the risks associated with U.S. centric trade policies, such as tariff and trade disputes. Expanding trade with Europe, Asia and others enhances economic stability by spreading risk across multiple regions.

Economic diversification supports job creation in key sectors such as manufacturing, technology, and services. Increased trade revenues contribute to overall economic growth and prosperity across Canada.

Our governments should immediately pay attention to this and diversify our trade.

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
Over 90% Of Canadian Students Affected By **Education Crisis, New Survey Finds**

The Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF/FCE) has released initial findings from the first edition of their new pan-Canadian educator survey series, Parachute. The data paints a vivid picture of poor working and learning conditions across the country.

The CTF/FCE urges ministries of Education to address the concerns underscored by teachers and educators and take action to strengthen provincial and territorial public education systems. Over 90% of Canadian K-12 students attend public schools: they, their teachers, and communities deserve proactive stewardship from Education ministers.

Parachute surveyed almost 5,000 education professionals, including teachers, principals, education assistants, and support workers. The initial results underscore five key issues at the heart of the crisis: lack of ministerial support, untenable working conditions, class size and complexity, rising incidents of violence and aggression, overwork and lack of preparation time.

The survey also collected over 800



testimonials detailing measures provincial and territorial governments could implement to improve Canada's public education systems.

A majority (63%) of educators deem their provincial or territorial ministries of Education as "not supportive at all," highlighting widespread systemic neglect.

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Nearly 80% of educators report struggling to cope with unpredictable and mounting workloads. 70% cite poor working conditions as a major factor. A staggering 95% of educators observe that staff shortages are negatively impacting students. The most severe consequences include unmet academic needs and the erosion of specialized services and supports.

Almost 77% of educators report that students' needs have become "significantly more complex" compared to five years ago. The number of highneed students without adequate support, along with the diversity of their needs, are the main factors contributing to classroom challenges. Students requiring special education support are being systematically left behind, exacerbating inequities in the classroom. Over half (55%) of educators have experienced violence or aggression in the past year. While 84% reported these incidents, only 25% indicated that appropriate actions were taken by health and safety committees or officers to address them. School administrators are

Three quarters of educators report that their job demands have become less manageable over the past five years, and 20% describe them as "very unmanageable."

"Via the Parachute survey series, teachers and education workers have provided a clear roadmap for systemic reform. Dedicated student support and classrooms that are safe and manageable should be the norm, not the exception. Provincial and territorial governments are failing in their responsibility to both students and educators. Canada's public education system is in a state of crisis; Ministers must address the evident and resolvable issues at hand," said Heidi Yetman, President of the CTF/FCE.


BC teachers are also urging government to heed the warnings and chart a new course—one that would make British Columbia a public education model for the country. "As a progressive government committed to quality public services, the BC NDP really needs to seize this moment and this message," BCTF President Clint Johnston said. "Let's make BC the educational beacon for all of Canada. Together, we can do

He pointed out that in its election platform, the BC NDP promised two significant changes that would be immensely positive in schools: ensuring there is an educational assistant in every K-3 classroom and a counsellor in every school.

"Fulfilling these two promises would be gamechangers in many classes," Johnston said. "We've already had an initial meeting with the new Minister of Education and Child Care, Lisa Beare, and we look forward to working together to tackle the challenges and bring about the improvements our students and members need."

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The LA wildfires, or the Kenneth fire, have ravaged through parts of Los Angeles, and have yet to be contained. We've been on the ground fuelling distribution centres with additional resources, and running them to evacuation centers and shelters," said Omar Singh, Khalsa Aid US Director.

Moving forward, the team is committed to offering continuous assistance in the coming days to ensure ongoing relief for those affected. In the meantime, they are ask donors and supporters from the US to please reach out to local shelters, ask what resources they may need and donate where you

Members of Southern California's

Sikh community have also been preparing hot meals for those affected by the firestorms. In Bakersville, a city just north of Los Angeles, Sikh residents are similarly mobilizing, collecting items such as new socks, blankets, and underwear, as well as food, water, and Gatorade to redistribute to community members impacted by the fires. "In the Sikh community I have received a lot of requests of folks wanting to help, they really felt a call to do something and help our neighbors in the Los Angeles area," Manpreet Kaur, vice mayor of Bakersfield, told local broadcasting network KERO-TV. "We've taken all of our Gudwara's, which are Sikh places of worship, and we have made them collection sites so that we can collect the supplies that are most needed," Kuar continued.



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

Poilievre to Axe Liberal Capital Gains Tax Hike

onservative leader Pierre Poilievre committed to reversing last June's NDP-Liberal tax hike on capital gains—a economists agree will kill over 400,000 jobs. The NDP-Liberals hiked the capital gains tax inclusion rate to 66% as of June 25, 2024, which Conservatives will reverse. Poilievre

will make up the lost revenue from "Axing the Liberal Jobs Tax" by cutting taxpayer-funded corporate welfare and handouts that have been wrought with scandal and waste.

"Trudeau's Chief Economic Advisor, Carbon Tax Carney, and former Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland supported this job-killing tax increase, which



is further driving billions of dollars out of our country right as we face President Trump's tariff threats," Poilievre said. "This Liberal job investment and killing tax was a bad idea before President Trump's tariff threat, it is outright insanity now."

The C.D. Howe Institute has confirmed that the capital gains tax hike will kill 414,000 jobs and cause Canada's GDP to decline by \$90 billion.

Alberta Won't Support Feds Plan To Deal With Trump Tariffs

lberta is refusing to sign on Ato a joint statement from all other premiers and the prime minister on the plan to respond to U.S. president-elect Donald Trump's potential tariffs on Canadian goods.

The decision from Premier Danielle Smith comes after a first ministers meeting in Ottawa on Wednesday that was aimed at showing a united front in response to the tariff threats.

As the premiers and Justin Trudeau held their closing news conference, a joint statement was released, vowing a collaborative approach to any tariffs and promising supports for business and regions that could be hard

Smith, who joined the meeting virtually, decided not to sign on and instead released her own statement saying Alberta will not agree to export tariffs on energy

or other products. "Federal government officials continue to publicly and privately float the idea of cutting off energy supply to the U.S. and imposing export tariffs on Alberta energy and other products to the United States. B.C. Could See Economic Loss Of \$69 Billion Due To Trump's Tariffs

In 2019, the Bank of Canada estimated the impacts of a 25% tariff. National Bank recently reported that the Bank of Canada's estimate of the Canadian GDP impact "would exceed that of any previous recession, barring the temporary setback at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic." In the face of this uncertainty, the Province is using a three-part strategy: respond, strengthen and diversify.

To respond to these tariffs, B.C. is engaged in contingency planning across government and will participate in nationally co-ordinated retaliation if and when required. B.C. will strengthen its domestic position by growing the economy to create high-paying jobs to generate the wealth needed to support people through strong public services, such as health care and education.

This includes fast-tracking permitting in B.C. and reducing trade barriers between provinces. Lastly, B.C. will focus on diversifying its trade relationships, using the Asia-Pacific network to become less

reliant on exports to the United States. Premier David Eby has directed Cabinet ministers to focus on growing B.C.'s economy and protecting vital public

"No matter what the world throws at us, British Columbia has everything we need to succeed - abundant natural resources, access to markets and most importantly the people who call this place home," said Premier David Eby. "In times of instability, we are strongest when we work together to build on these unique advantages. Our team will prioritize growing the economy and building the wealth needed to support strong public services working families rely on."

The mandate letters to cabinet ministers lay out the government's high-level commitments and broad policy direction. "A strong fiscal foundation is essential to helping people build a good life here. By making the best use of public dollars, we can protect services and tackle the challenges people worry about around the kitchen table - from delivering homes people can afford to hiring family doctors."

The Surrey Board of Trade (SBOT) has also expressed deep concerns about the potential economic consequences. "The Surrey Board of Trade appreciates the Province's proactive approach to mitigating potential economic shocks from US tariffs," said Jasroop Gosal, Interim Spokesperson and Policy & Research Manager of the Surrey Board of Trade. "We especially appreciate the Premier leaning on the chamber of commerce/board of trade network, including the Surrey Board of Trade, to communicate data and impacts to the Premier and Finance Minister directly. Businesses must actively support these efforts by diversifying their own markets and engaging in strategic planning to navigate this uncertainty."

which have caused so much misery over the last nine years. Carbon Tax Carney's own record shows clearly where he stands," the party said in a release.

The Conservatives also rejected the idea that Carney is an outsider, noting in a statement that he served as an economic adviser to the Liberal government under Trudeau. "As a long-time Liberal insider ... Carbon Tax Carney is the furthest thing possible from an outsider," the party said. "It's clear that Carbon Tax Carney and the Liberals will say anything to try and hold power. But they cannot be trusted."

Carney was appointed Governor of the Bank of Canada, effective 1 February 2008, for a term of seven years. After five and half years of service as Governor, he departed the Bank of Canada on 1 June 2013 to become the Governor of the Bank of England. He was appointed to this position on 26 November 2012, with an effective date of 1 July 2013.

Born in Fort Smith, Northwest Territories, Carney received a bachelor's degree in economics from Harvard University in 1988. He received a master's degree in economics in 1993 and a doctorate in economics in 1995, both from Oxford University. Mr. Carney was also awarded an Honorary Doctor of Laws from the University of Manitoba in April 2013.

Prior to joining the public service, Carney had a thirteen-year career with Goldman Sachs in its London, Tokyo, New York and Toronto offices. Mr. Carney was appointed Deputy Governor of the Bank of Canada in August 2003. In November 2004, he left the Bank to become Senior Associate Deputy Minister of Finance – a position he held until his appointment as Governor of the Bank.

Former finance minister Chrystia Freeland and Liberal House leader Karina Gould are both expected to launch their rival leadership bids in the coming days. Liberal MP Chandra Arya has already launched his campaign to be next PM of Canada.

"First Ministers agreed that enhancing security must be undertaken by authorities on both sides of the Canada-U.S. border to stop the flow of illegal firearms.

"First Ministers agreed to continue united advocacy efforts with key U.S. Administration, Congressional, business leaders to emphasize the negative impacts of U.S. tariffs on American national interests and the U.S. economy. Co-operation with Canada offers significant complementary benefits to U.S. priorities.

"While they are making every effort to prevent U.S tariffs, First Ministers are committed to continuing to work together on a full range of measures to ensure a robust response to possible U.S. tariffs, including supports for sectors, businesses, and individuals. If the federal government implements retaliatory measures, it will ensure the rapid availability of substantial resources that effectively mitigate economic impacts to workers and businesses. 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
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
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




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BC Truck Driver Daljit Sohi Honored as TCA Highway Angel for Returning Lost Purse

Starting January Canadians need Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to travel to or through UK

The UK Electronic Travel Authorisation **▲** (ETA) is a digital travel permit and is a new requirement for Canadian citizens who are planning to visit or transit through the United Kingdom. As a Canadian citizen, you've long enjoyed the privilege of traveling to the UK visa-free. However, starting January 8, 2025; you must obtain an Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) to enter the UK.

This new UK entry requirement for Canadian citizens aims to enhance border security and streamline the entry process for visitors. While it introduces an additional step in your travel preparations, the UK ETA system promises to be quick and straightforward.

According to the latest Electronic Visa news, The UK ETA replaced the UK visa waiver scheme when it was first introduced to Qatari citizens back in October 2023 and for a maximum stay of



6 months. It is much easier than having to apply for a UK visa from Canada. In other words, it is kind of a UK Visa free of paper documents; everything can be done and linked digitally. This pre-authorization will be mandatory for short stays, tourism, business, or transit purposes. Canadians can apply for the UK ETA starting on November 28, 2024, to travel to the UK from January 8, 2025. On this page,

Starting January Canadians need Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to travel...

you'll learn everything you need to know about the UK ETA for Canadian citizens, including how to apply for an ETA, the costs involved, and what to expect during your trip to the United Kingdom.

The UK ETA allows for short stays in the UK for the following purposes;

Coming to the UK for up to 6 months, for tourism, visiting family and friends, business, or short-term study.

Coming to the UK for up to 3 months on

the Creative Worker visa concession. Coming to the UK for a permitted paid

Transiting through the UK - including if you're not going through UK border control.

According to UK government website, in 2023, Canadian travelers took a total of 37.2 million trips abroad, spending a combined US\$38.3 billion on international tourism. That same year, the UK saw a record 1.0

million visits from Canada. These visitors contributed a record £969.6 million to the UK economy, with an average expenditure of £966 per visit.

Canadian citizens will need to meet specific eligibility criteria to obtain a UK ETA for travel on or after January 8, 2025. These include:

You must be a Canadian citizen holding a valid Canadian passport. The UK ETA is available only to citizens of eligible visaexempt countries, including Canada.

The UK ETA is intended for short visits (up to 6 months) for purposes such as: Tourism, business and transit.


You must hold a valid Canadian passport with at least 6 months of validity remaining from your intended date of entry into the


The application fee is £10, or about \$17.78 (Cdn.) and every traveller, including babies and children, must have their own ETA.



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Liberal Leadership Candidates Must Embrace Fiscal Reckoning

No matter who Canada's next prime minister is, it's time to lay down a marker: the party with Canada's finances is over. Canadians have had it with the Trudeau government's irresponsible spending. One of the reasons Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's popularity has taken a nosedive is because Canadians are sick and tired of his government's debt and deficits.

Canadians are tired of the spending sprees. We're tired of billion-dollar announcements at which politicians congratulate each other for spending money that's borrowed on the backs of our children.

Shockingly, former finance minister Chrystia Freeland might have said it best in her resignation letter last month. Canadians are tired of "costly political gimmicks, which we can ill afford and which make Canadians doubt the gravity of the moment."

No doubt those words were ringing through Trudeau's head as he delivered his resignation speech

Freeland resigned as finance minister because Trudeau wanted to borrow and spend even more money on initiatives Freeland saw as gimmicks.

If Freeland is the source of sober advice in the fiscal drunk tank, there can be no doubt it's time for a reckoning.

Freeland didn't resign because

Trudeau loves deficits. She resigned because the government crashed through her \$40.1 billion "fiscal guardrail" by some \$20 billion and Trudeau wanted to go even further.

As finance minister, Freeland is responsible for adding hundreds of billions of dollars to Canada's

national debt, a debt which Trudeau has single-handedly doubled in just nine years.

Freeland is no fiscal hawk. Her record is not an ode to fiscal responsibility. But if she's calling for restraint, the moment must truly be at hand.

Here's the reality: interest

charges on the nation debt now cost taxpayers \$53.7 billion a year.

That's more than the federal government spends on health

And Canada's debt interest payments now exceed every single penny brought in by the GST

If ever there was a moment for a political consensus on ending deficit spending, it's now.

In the coming days, candidates will throw their hats in the ring to succeed Trudeau as Liberal leader and become the next prime minister of Canada.

But if those candidates want Canadians to even begin to consider giving the Liberals another mandate, they need to pitch the biggest fiscal U-turn in the history of Canadian politics. There are three key points candidates who want to actually

attention need to speak to. First: Take the mantle of Paul Martin and slay the deficit. It's time to end deficit spending. Not in five years. Not in three years. This year.

Canadian taxpayers'

Candidates need to lay out a plan to immediately balance the budget.

Second: No new spending that isn't paid for.

Every dollar of new spending should be paired with a spending cut. If candidates want to propose any new spending, there must be a clear offset on exactly what will be scrapped. Not a vague generality of where savings can be found. A specific program must be put on the chopping block.

Third: No new taxes. The deficit should be eliminated, but not on the backs of Canadian taxpayers.

This government has raised taxes left, right, and centre.

The Liberals have introduced and increased the carbon tax repeatedly. Just days ago, the government once again hiked payroll taxes.

Canadians are stretched to the max. Fifty per cent of Canadians say they're \$200 away from not being able to pay their bills.

It's time for the government to tighten its belt, not for Canadians to tighten theirs.

Poll after poll has shown Canadians have tuned the Liberals out. Folks are sick and tired of debt and deficits. And the more Trudeau tried to fix his popularity problems by borrowing and spending more, the more unpopular he became. If Liberal leadership candidates want to be taken seriously, they need to run as fast as they can away from Trudeau's fiscal record. And the way to do that is to offer a serious plan to immediately balance the budget without raising taxes.

If they propose anything less, Canadian taxpayers will tune them, like Trudeau, out.

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

This project will expand the range of value-added products made in-house, increase productivity and create nine jobs.

"B.C. has some of the most creative, innovative and motivated forestry companies on the planet," said Ravi Parmar, Minister of Forests. "The BC Manufacturing Jobs Fund helps businesses scale up, increase productivity and create new jobs by getting the most value out of every tree we harvest."

The BCMJF is part of a series of programs the Province has introduced to support sustainability in B.C.'s forestry sector. To date, the BCMJF has provided incentives with more than \$600 million flowing into forest-product manufacturing, leading to the direct creation and protection of more than 3,000 forest-sector jobs. Most of these jobs are in regional, remote and Indigenous communities.

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2025 Mazda CX-50 GS-L Light Trails - No Issue For This SUV!

For 2025 the Mazda CX-50 SUV is aimed at the outdoorsy set and will handle mild trails, but don't expect big chunky tires, factory lifted suspension, and under body skid plates. However, you do gain a reinforced roof that can manage heavy loads and people sleeping in a custom tent up there. AWD is standard issue on the CX-50 and it arrives with a choice of two engines. New for 2025 is the availability of a new hybrid version of the CX50 with a 219 hp, 163 ft-lb torque, 2.5 L hybrid, engine unit with a combined with 1.59 kWh, 650 V electric motors, plus e-AWD. This engine delivers an impressive 6.2 L/100 km combined.

The base gasoline engine is a 2.5L I4 making 187 hp and 186 lb-ft of torque. Fuel economy is rated at 9.7 L/100 km City and 7.9 L/100 km on the highway. The more powerful 2.5L turbocharged Four-cylinder unit makes 256 hp and 320 lb-ft. on 93-octane grade fuel and 227 hp and 310 lb-ft on regular gasoline. Fuel economy figures for the Turbo unit are rated at 10.4 L/100 km in the city and 8.1 on the highway. The transmission is a six-speed auto unit with selectable drive modes and AWD as standard,

The 2025 Mazda CX-50 is available in Canada in three trim levels. The base trim is the GS-L at \$39,950 (As evaluated.) which includes as standard equipment across the range: panoramic sunroof, heated seats and steering wheel, dual zone climate zones, 10.25" touchscreen display, Apple CarPlay, and Android Auto. Every CX-50 comes with All-Wheel Drive, a drive mode selector with sport and off-road settings, roof rails, and a height-programmable power tailgate. The only options on our tester was the smart -looking luxurious Ash Ochre Leatherette seats at \$250. The mid-level GT trim, adds leather upholstery,

ventilated front seats, heated rear seats, a 12-speaker stereo, built-in navigation, satellite radio, a wireless phone charger, and a head-up display.

On the safety front, there's a surround-view monitoring system, traffic sign recognition, low-speed reverse automatic emergency braking, and front and rear parking sensors, along with a few other features. The Turbo GT adds: LED

headlights and taillights, leather seating, 360-view camera, paddle shifters, larger exhaust tips, a selectable tow-mode, and a 3,500-pound towing capacity.

Safety technology is further enhanced by advanced safety and driverassist items like blind-spot

monitoring with rear cross-traffic alert, lane-departure warning and lane-keeping assistance, forward collision warning with pedestrian detection and adaptive cruise control are also standard.

The interior of the CX-50 offers space for five passengers in two rows of seats. Inside, is a tastefully upscale interior with a visually interesting mix of colors and materials throughout. Some great detail such as the raised stitching detail on the dash look super cool, along with the truck-like vertical HVAC vents. There are comfortable seats front and rear and excellent room in all quarters. Rear cargo space is increased with flat folding seats with 889 L of cargo room with the rear seats upright and 1,595 L when folded. Standard roof rails, and a heightprogrammable power tailgate also add to the versatility.

The CX-50 rides very well on the highway with decent acceleration and smooth gear changes. This turbo engine is very sprightly with good passing

power on the highway. Despite its sporty nature, the CX-50 is easy and pleasurable to drive in the urban grind.

There is also a sport mode which changes the transmission shift points



r e s p o n s e and enhances t h e G-vectoring control performance for sharper steering response and optimizes traction control when accelerating. The drive modes include an off-road setting that adjusts the engine and transmission response, and also the torque split between the front and rear axles. Fuel economy is rated at City. 9.7 L/ 100 KM Hwy. 8.0 L/100 KM. Combined 8.9 L/ KM.

Negatives are few, the base engine is not as refined or as powerful as the turbo unit.

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
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
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

Bapu Surat Singh Khalsa, Who Fought For Sikh Prisoners, Dies At 91

Sikh activist Bapu Surat Singh Khalsa, known for his Surat The commitment to seek captive Sikh prisoners, passed away at the age of 91 in California.

Bapu Surat Singh Khalsa began his hunger strike on January 16, 2015, at the age of 82, seeking justice for Sikh prisoners who remained incarcerated despite having served their sentences. His hunger strike lasted until January 14, 2023, making his movement one of the longest and most significant nonviolent protests in Punjab's history. He was a resident of Hassanpur village on Ferozepur road in Ludhiana.

Indian **Express** reported, "Though Khalsa was an activist right from a young age, he became very popular when he started a hunger strike on January 16, 2015, at his house in the Hassanpur village in Ludhiana with a demand to release Bandi Singhs from jail."

Surat Singh Khalsa, who was a US citizen, is survived by one daughter and five sons, all of them also US citizens. He was a government teacher who resigned



from his position in June 1984 in protest against Operation Blue Star. He moved to the United States in 1988 to live with his children but continued to visit Punjab regularly.

'Emergency' Not Screened In Most Places In Punjab After SGPC Protests



Kangana Ranaut's Emergency was not screened at most cinemas in Punjab on Friday following protests by the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) and Sikh organisations against the movie. The SGPC has claimed that the film, directed by Ranaut, portrays the Sikh community in a defamatory manner

and promotes an anti-Sikh agenda. SGPC had demanded that Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann ban its screening in Punjab. In a letter to Mann, SGPC President Harjinder Singh Dhami said the movie was a "calculated attempt to distort history and harm Sikh sentiments" and warned that releasing it could provoke outrage within the Sikh community.

"BJP MP's movie depicts the 1984 attacks on the sacred Sikh shrines, including Sri Harmandir Sahib (Golden Temple), Sri Akal Takht Sahib, and other holy sites, along with the Sikh genocide and ethnic cleansing, in a way that suppresses the truth and works under an anti-Sikh agenda to spread hatred against the community. Moreover, the film

also maligns the character of the Sikh martyr Sant Jarnail Singh Khalsa Bhindranwale," the letter reads.

"The SGPC has already raised objections to the film with Punjab's Chief Secretary but expressed disappointment over the government's lack of action. The SGPC has also sent representations to all Deputy Commissioners in Punjab, urging them to prevent the movie's screening," the letter further stated.

"If the film releases on January 17, 2025, it will naturally evoke anger and protests within the Sikh community. The Punjab government must take responsibility to ensure the movie is not released in the state. Otherwise, the SGPC will be compelled to launch strong protests across Punjab," it added.

City Says 2024 A Record-Breaking Year For Housing And Development In 2024

The City of Surrey issued over 6,000 new housing units and generated over \$2.8 billion in construction value

The City of Surrey says that it set a record in 2024 by delivering 6,297 net new housing units and generating a record of over \$2.8 billion in construction activity. This surpasses the City's previous record of 5,932 housing units delivered in 2019.

"This is the first time the City of Surrey has surpassed 6,000 housing units," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "Despite high interest rates, labour challenges and soft pre-sales, a record-breaking \$2.8 billion in construction activity

occurred in Surrey in 2024. I am proud of the work Council has done in streamlining our land development and permitting approvals. Council's commitment in providing more housing will carry into 2025, as we continue to look for improvements and efficiencies in our approval process."

Notably, there were two development incentive programs launched in 2024 through the Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF) that contributed



over 2,560 housing units. The Rapid Transit Incentive Program accelerated 2,380 units and the Non-Market Incentive Program advanced 180 below-market rental units. In addition to the

incentive programs, key process improvements were introduced to facilitate the delivery of housing and streamline approvals, including simplified development permit process for houseplexes with reduced fees and faster approvals. Pilot program for excavation building permits will allow permits to be issued ahead of final adoption of rezoning and development permit issuance.

"While we celebrate the successes of 2024, the City is committed to delivering service excellence while streamlining development with many planned improvements and enhancements set for 2025 to ensure that Surrey remains the city to live, work, build, and play," Locke said.

Surrey Council Considers \$17.3M In Road Improvement Contracts, Including 1St Phase Of 132 Street Widening

Surrey City Council will consider \$17.3M in road improvement and expansion contracts across the city, including the crucial first phase of the 132 Street Road Widening Project. These significant improvements will address the growing demands of Surrey's transportation network and improve overall road safety for drivers and pedestrians alike.

"Investing in the widening of Newton's 132 Street corridor and upgrades to our existing road network is vital as we prepare to accommodate Surrey's growing population, which is projected to reach one million people in the next two decades," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "These improvements are not just about improving traffic flow, they are essential for enhancing safety, connectivity, and overall quality of life for our residents. These investments are part of the \$300M that Council has approved to enhance and

upgrade our road network over four years to lay the groundwork for a more efficient and accessible transportation system."

"These road improvements will mark a significant step forward for Newton," said Councillor Harry Bains, Chair of the Focus Newton Task Force. "Through the Focus Newton Task Force, we've listened to our community and recognized the urgent need for enhanced transportation infrastructure. The widening of 132 Street and other vital upgrades will not only improve traffic flow but also ensure safer pathways for our pedestrians and cyclists. Together, we're building a better, more connected future for our residents."

The proposed contracts include:

132 Street Road Widening Project: A \$9.2M contract is proposed for 132 Street Arterial Widening from 72 to 76 Avenues from two lanes to four lanes to improve traffic, safety, and walking and cycling facilities. 132 Street is one of the City's busiest corridors, and this contract represents the first phase of a multiphased program for congestion relief and to support growth in Newton. Subsequent phases for widening between 76 Avenue and 84 Avenue will be undertaken.

Annual Paving and Minor Road Restoration: A \$2.9M annual paving and minor road restoration contract is proposed for repairs associated with in-house water and sanitary utility construction, ensuring roads are quickly returned to optimal condition.

Major Road Network Paving: A \$5.2M contract for road paving projects is proposed for the repaving of 24 lane-kilometers of Major Road Network roads to ensure roads are in a state of good repair and enhancing the safety and usability of major roadways, including:

Khan and Kapoor had worked together in Vishal Bhardwaj's 2017 period film Rangoon, which also starred Kangana Ranaut.

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
