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Gang-Related Shooting Of Jaskaran Singh Minhas On Scott Road Raises Public Safety Concerns

29-year-old man, identified as Jaskaran Singh Minhas, was shot and killed in a brazen gang-related attack, marking Surrey's first homicide of 2025. Minhas, known to police, was believed to have ties to organized crime, according to police.

The shocking nature of the shooting and the events that followed have once again left the communities of Surrey and Delta in shock. "This was a targeted, brazen shooting in a high-traffic area," said Sgt. Freda Fong of IHIT. "Those involved displayed a complete disregard for public safety."

The attack occurred in broad daylight at a busy strip mall near the 7900 block of 120 Street, a commercial hub with stores like Best Buy, Canadian Tire, Mark's, and The Keg—frequented daily by families and shoppers. A vehicle, allegedly linked to the shooting, speeding through traffic was seen by many people, before it was later found torched in a residential area of Delta, opposite a park. Several videos of the fleeing vehicle have surfaced on social media, along with images of

Minhas, though police have not officially confirmed the authenticity of the videos. "This shooting has the hallmarks of a targeted, gang-related homicide and the IGHT will be taking lead. We believe there are at least two suspects involved and investigators are working diligently to identify all parties. Investigators are currently interviewing witnesses, collecting evidence and canvassing for video," Fong said.

According to Surrey Police Service, on around the time of the events.

March 3, 2025, at approximately 5:25 officers attended the area and located the driver of a vehicle suffering lifethreatening injuries. Despite life saving measures, one man succumbed to his injuries at scene. According Surrey Now the vehicle had crashed into a tree in the parking lot.

At approximately 5:35 pm, Delta Police Department officers responded to calls of a vehicle fire in the area of 64 Avenue and Westview Drive, Delta. Investigators later confirmed the burnt vehicle in Delta is the suspect vehicle involved in the shooting. The Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT) newly established Integrated Gang Homicide Team (IGHT) assumed conduct of the investigation and later identified the victim as 29-year-old Jaskaran Singh Minhas, in an effort to advance the investigation.

Investigators are looking to speak with anyone who was in the area of the 7900 block 120 Street, Surrey and in the area of 64 Avenue and Westview Drive, Delta





What's In BC Budget To Make Living Affordable For Families?

B^C government has released the Budget for the year 2025. According to government, the budget was set with the aim of defending BC against US tariffs, strengthening healthcare, diversifying economy, lowering cost of living and making communities safer.

With a projected spending of \$94.9 billion in 2025-26 and total revenues at \$84 billion in 2025-26, the budget deficit is projected at \$10.9 billion in 2025-26.

Along with money allocated for various capital projects, healthcare, education, for families question is what budget means for their pocket this year. The BC NDP in 2024 election platform included a grocery rebate that would've seen \$1,000 in the pockets of

Minister of Finance said the budget continues to work toward reducing costs for families and enhancing tax measures to support jobs and economic growth.


"It is not a flashy budget," Minister Brenda Bailey explained. Budget 2025 builds on most British Columbians. But that is off the government's affordability measures with

\$1.1 billion over four years, beginning in 2024-25, to tackle housing affordability and provide a one-time ICBC rebate. "People continue to deal with the challenge of daily costs, especially when it comes to finding a home they can afford. Budget 2025 commits an additional \$318 million over three years to BC Builds as part of the Province's goal of delivering thousands more rental homes for middle-income people."

BC builds

Introduced in 2024 with initial program funding of \$198 million over three years, BC Builds is a housing program to speed up the development of new homes for middle-income people throughout B.C. Six projects have begun construction.

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Once Again Surrey Has Been Overlooked In The Provincial Budget

Surrey Mayor Brenda Locke, while reacting to the BC budget, said, that once again, Surrey has been overlooked in the provincial budget, with no new projects announced for our rapidly growing city. She issued the following statement: "Our residents deserve equitable support from the provincial government to build a brighter future for all who call Surrey home. Yet time and again, we see clear evidence that Surrey is not receiving its fair share of funding and resources for transportation, education, healthcare, and social infrastructure. This continued neglect is both frustrating and unfair—not

In healthcare, the disparity is glaring. While emergency rooms continue to close across British Columbia—most recently in our neighboring community of Delta, adding strain to Surrey Memorial Hospital—our city's total hospital beds

to mention damaging to our families. We

have reached a critical tipping point: it

is time for our city to be recognized and

prioritized.

remain drastically below Vancouver's, despite nearly matching Vancouver in population. The new hospital in Cloverdale, which excludes a maternity or children's ward, will leave Surrey's overall capacity at roughly 300% fewer beds than Vancouver has today. Our families deserve better

Education in Surrey is equally troubling. We have nearly 400 portables-more portables than some districts have students—forcing thousands of our children to learn in cramped temporary spaces. The Surrey School District faces a significant budget shortfall of \$16 million this year alone, despite already implementing deep cuts. Adding insult to injury, the budget reannounces just one new high school in Fleetwood, far short of the 10 new schools and 14 site acquisitions outlined in the Surrey School District's Capital Plan. Our students deserve the same opportunities and learning environments as those in other districts.

Our public transportation challenges are

also well documented. Surrey has the most overcrowded bus routes in the region, and only 27% of our residents enjoy frequent transit service compared to 90% in Vancouver. While we appreciate the SkyTrain expansion currently underway, it will not be completed until nearly 2030 and addresses only a fraction of our critical

ransit needs.

Today also marks Tariff Day, as new U.S. tariffs threaten our economic stability. Let this serve as a reminder that we must carefully direct our spending to protect and strengthen our local economy and to ensure the well-being of all Surrey residents. It is not about spending more; it is about making the right investments. We need to shore up our city's foundation one that supports growth, health, and prosperity—for both today and tomorrow. Surrey is on track to become the first city in British Columbia to reach a population of one million. It is time we receive the respect and resources this milestone demands. The provincial government must start laying the groundwork to support our city's growth by investing in critical infrastructure, affordable housing, and accessible public services. Rest assured, we will continue to advocate for Surrey's rightful share, ensuring a vibrant, inclusive, and prosperous future for everyone who calls this remarkable city home."

Budget Needed Stronger Focus on the Economy, Surrey Investments Welcomed: Surrey Board of Trade

The Surrey Board of Trade's Interim Spokesperson and Policy & Research Manager, Jasroop Gosal, was in Victoria at the BC Budget lock up to hear the BC Government's 2025 Budget and Three-Year Fiscal Plan before it was released to the public.

"This budget needed to support the economy, but it missed that mark," said Jasroop Gosal. "Although there were some initiatives that will result in good return on investment for the economy, such as a review of government programs and initiatives, we are disappointed that the government did not further invest in the economy.

"Budget 2024 had a \$7.911 billion deficit forecasted. Budget 2025 has an updated forecast of \$9.135 billion deficit. The deficit will increase in 2025/26 and 2026/27 to \$10.912 billion and \$10.203 billion, respectively, before coming down to \$9.863 billion in 2027/28.

"We were hoping to see tangible investments to help businesses pivot in the face of tariffs implemented by the United States President, but they were absent from this budget.

"We are pleased to see investments in Surrey prioritized. Surrey schools will be enhanced through capital and operational investments to address the budget shortfall that was predicted by the Surrey School District.

"We are happy that the Surrey-Langley Skytrain project will be fully funded with the Provincial Government increasing their portion of the investment to \$4.441 billion. "There are also significant investments towards the new Surrey hospital, upgrades to Surrey Memorial Hospital, and the new medical school at SFU Surrey. Moving forward, the Surrey Board of Trade and the South Surrey & White Rock Chamber of Commerce will continue to champion the economy for not only Surrey and White Rock businesses, but for businesses across BC."



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Canada To Grant Legal Status To Undocumented Construction Workers

undocumented Jp to 6,000 undocumented construction workers will be given a pathway to gain legal status in Canada, Immigration Minister Marc Miller said in a news conference this week.

Miller announced the government's intent to introduce a number of new measures to support Canada's construction industry. They include the convening of a tripartite

advisory council to assess needs in the industry and advise on new pathways to bring in the skilled workers we need, a regularization pathway for out-of-status construction workers, and support for foreign apprentices.

"As our country faces a housing shortage and uncertainty in the face of tariff threats, Canada will immediately

convene a tripartite advisory council comprised federal government union representatives, and industry leaders. This advisory council will work to identify on the ground labour needs and advise on the parameters for potential pathways that would bring

in and retain the construction workers we need for the long term, with robust protections against abuse and a strong wage threshold," he said.


In an effort to build on the success of initiatives such as the out-of-status construction workers in the Greater Toronto Area pilot, IRCC intends to create a pathway that would offer opportunities for undocumented migrants in the construction sector. These undocumented migrants are already living and working in

Canada, and are contributing to the sector, and this pathway will keep them here legally so that they can continue to build the homes our economy and communities need with the proper protections.

More information about these pathways will be shared in the near future as the new

advisory council meets to develop these important policies.

Finally, to support foreign apprentices in construction programs and to address the current labour market needs in the construction sector, temporary measure to allow foreign apprentices to complete their studies without a study permit will be allowed. By removing this administrative barrier, apprentices will be able to gain the valuable skills they need to contribute to infrastructure projects more quickly.



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

Prosecution has sworn charges of possessing a weapon for a dangerous purpose, storing a firearm contrary to regulations, and two counts of careless use or storage of a firearm against Maximilien Pailleret.

invasion involving three armed suspects. Officers located a man outside the residence holding a handgun. The man was safely arrested and later identified as the home's resident.

Through further investigation, officers determined there was no evidence of a home invasion. Officers located over 30 firearms and thousands of rounds of ammunition in various stages of storage and

display. Some firearms were found unsecured on the floor, hanging on walls, placed on furniture, while others were properly secured in a safe.



Five South Asian Men Arrested For Running Ring To Steel Liquor

Anuj Kumar, Simarpeet Singh, Sharndeep Singh, Simranjeet Singh, Prabhpreet Singh are facing charges with Theft Over \$5000, while three of them have received additional charges.

According to police between August 2024 and February 2025, the group collectively stole from 50 LCBO locations across various jurisdictions. On many occasions, multiple suspects would enter the store together and operate in a coordinated manner to distract and keep watch of employees, while others entered through a restricted access point to steal volumes of liquor. Deadly explosion at Langley house speculated as result of illegal drug extraction



n February 28, 2025 at approximately 10:40 am, Langley RCMP received a report of an explosion at a residence located in the 7300 block of 196 Street. A body was found inside the residence.

Preliminary examination of the scene has investigators focused on the cause of the explosion and fire which may be consistent with what is found at an illegal drug extraction lab. However, police said that it may take time to reach a definitive conclusion, as a thorough investigation and expert analysis are required. One

"Over the past few days, investigators have remained onsite to meticulously examine the scene. I can confirm that a deceased person has been located inside the residence," said Sergeant Zynal Sharoom of the Langley RCMP. "We are working with the BC Coroners service to identify the deceased individual." Anyone with information about this incident who has not yet spoken with authorities is to contact the Langlev RCMP and quote file 2025-6044.

All five arrested individuals were held for a bail hearing at the Ontario Court of Justice in Brampton.

Additionally, two individuals Jagshir Singh and Punit Sehjra are wanted for Theft Over \$5000 and Break and Enter.

"The work of our Criminal Investigation Bureau has been nothing short of exceptional in dismantling this prolific organized crime group. By arresting and charging multiple individuals, we are sending a strong message that those who target our communities will be found and held accountable. We

remain committed to pursuing criminals who t hreaten the safety of our neighborhoods, and ensuring they face justice for their actions," said Deputy Chief Marc Andrews, Peel Regional Police.

The investigation remains ongoing, and police anticipate more charges to be laid.

BC Premier Announces New **Measures To Defend B.C. From Trump Tariffs**

Premier David Eby has announced new tariffresponse measures with the intention of bringing forward legislation that will defend British Columbians, workers and businesses from U.S. President Donald J. Trump's tariffs on Canadian goods and energy.

"The White House started a trade war we didn't want, and we must answer with strength," Premier Eby said. "We are responding to this unprecedented attack with several targeted measures and in the coming weeks we will arm ourselves with even more tools as next steps to fend off a sustained economic aggression." The B.C. government intends introduce tariff-response legislation in the coming days that will give the Province new tools to defend B.C. jobs and businesses and respond swiftly and nimbly to emerging challenges brought on by



Trump's trade war. This would enable a range of responses, including the ability to remove interprovincial trade barriers, mandating that low-carbon fuels

added to gasoline and diesel be produced in Canada, and allowing B.C. to apply tolls/ fees to U.S. commercial vehicles using B.C. infrastructure to travel

to Alaska.

"The tariffs imposed Trump are profound mistake and hurting are families both sides of the border," Premier Eby said. "My team will continue to work hard every day to defend British Columbians through this and come out stronger on the

other side. Every option is on the table."

The Province's initial response to tariffs includes directing the BC Liquor Distribution Branch to immediately stop buying American liquor from "red" states and remove red-state brands from the shelves of public liquor stores. The B.C. government and Crown corporations have also been directed to buy Canadian goods and services first.

The counter-measures are a first step and part of a Team Canada approach that includes 25% tariffs on \$155 billion worth of imported U.S. products imposed by the federal government, as well as additional measures from other provinces and territories.


First ministers have also agreed to take meaningful action to reduce barriers to internal trade and labour mobility by June 1, 2025. The B.C. government's plan to fight back against the tariffs and defend British Columbians includes responding to U.S. tariffs with tough counteractions; expediting projects and supporting industry and workers in BC; and diversifying trade markets for B.C.

As part of this approach, B.C. is moving full steam ahead on new actions to seize economic opportunities and find new trade markets to reduce B.C.'s reliance on the U.S.

The Province is accelerating approvals and permits on major projects that are ready to move forward to create good jobs and support B.C.'s economy in the face of tariffs. The initial list of projects is valued at \$20 billion in investment and is expected to create 8,000 family-supporting jobs, especially in rural and remote communities.

To support B.C.'s strong tariff response and ensure actions are swift, responsive and coordinated, Premier Eby has established a trade and economic security task force to bring together business, labour and Indigenous leadership. A new task force on agriculture and the food economy will help ensure B.C.'s food supply and food economy continue to grow in the face of tariffs, a B.C. softwood advisory council is developing a diplomatic and trade strategy to fight for B.C.'s interests in the ongoing softwood lumber dispute, and a new cabinet committee is co-ordinating the whole-of-government approach the Province is taking.

Trudeau Says Trump Tariffs Are 'Very Dumb Thing To Do'

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau slammed Donald Trump when 25% tariffs came into effect, calling it a "very dumb thing to do" and vowed to conduct a "relentless fight" to protect its economy. Although next day Trump paused the tariffs on Canadian exports for another month, Canadian politicians are retaliating with tough measures. PM Trudeau stood strong and addressed the nation. Setting out the US embrace of Russia and contrasting that with its approach to Canada, Trudeau said: "The United States launched a trade war against Canada, their closest partner and ally, their closest friend. At the same time, they're talking about working positively with Russia, appeasing Vladimir Putin, a lying murderous dictator. Make that make sense. Canadians are reasonable and we are polite, but we will not back down from a fight, not when our country and the well-being of everyone in it is at stake.'

He said it was not in his habit to

but they pointed out even though Trump is a smart guy, "this is a very dumb thing to do."

He elaborated on how Canada is progressing in preparing for trade war. He also talked about the border measures to stop the illegal fentanyl trade across border. "They have chosen to undermine the incredible work we've done together to tackle the scourge that is fentanyl, a drug that must be wiped from the face of the earth. On that point, let me be crystal clear. There is absolutely no justification or need whatsoever for these tariffs today. The legal pretext your government is using to bring in these tariffs is that Canada is apparently unwilling to help in the fight against illegal fentanyl." Asked about Trump's motivations for imposing tariffs, Trudeau said the US president, who has spoken often of making Canada the 51st American state, "wants to see a collapse of the Canadian economy because that would make it easier to annex us." "The agree with the Wall Street Journal United States launched a trade



war against Canada," Trudeau said. "Canadians are reasonable. We are polite. We will not back down from a fight."

He made his address direct to US president. "Now I want to speak directly to one specific American. Donald, in the over eight years you and I have worked together, we've done big things. We signed a historic deal that has created record jobs and growth in both of our countries. We've done big things together on the world stage as Canada and the U.S have done together for decades, for generations."

He said Canada and America should be working together to ensure even greater prosperity for North Americans in a very uncertain and challenging world. "It's not in my habit to agree with the Wall Street Journal but Donald, they point out that even though you're a very smart guy, this is a very dumb thing to do. We two friends fighting is exactly what our opponents around the world want to see."

To Canadians he said, "I won't sugar coat it. This is going to be tough, even though we're all going to pull together because that's what we do. We will use every tool at our disposal so Canadian workers and businesses can weather this storm from expanding EI benefits and making them more flexible to providing direct supports to businesses. We will be there as needed to help. But Canada, make no mistake. No matter how long this lasts, no matter what the cost, the federal government and other orders of government will be there for you. We will defend Canadian jobs. We will take measures to prevent predatory behaviour that threatens Canadian companies because of the impacts of this trade war leaving them open to takeovers. We will relentlessly fight to protect our economy. We will stand up for Canadians every single second of every single day because this country is worth fighting for."

Ontario putting 25% surcharge on U.S.-bound electricity Monday, Ford says

Intario will impose a 25 per cent tariff on power it sends to 1.5 million homes in Minnesota, Michigan and New York in response to fresh United States levies, Premier Doug Ford announced this week.

Ford has written letters to the governors of those states to inform them of the surcharge, he told reporters at the provincial legislature. "If these tariffs persist,

if the Trump administration follows through on any more tariffs, we will immediately apply a 25 per cent surcharge on the electricity we export," Ford told reporters at the provincial legislature. "We will not hesitate to shut off their power as well." The province has also banned all U.S.-based companies from government contracts, and Ford has ended his province's contract

with Starlink, the Elon Muskcontrolled satellite network. "It's done; it's gone," he said of the

Ford also said he was prepared to cut off nickel exports to the U.S. "It will shut down manufacturing because 50 per cent of the nickel you use is coming out of Ontario," the provincial leader said Monday in an interview with NBC News.

Trump Pauses 25-Per-Cent Tariffs On Canada, Mexico **Until April 2**

An additional 11 will be underway in 2025-26. This will result in nearly 1,400 rental units for middle-income people in communities such as Abbotsford, Cowichan Nation/Duncan, Fernie, Gibsons, Lake Babine First Nation, North Vancouver, Prince Rupert, Tsawout First Nation and Whistler.

Budget 2025 builds on work underway with an additional \$318 million investment in BC Builds over three years. The new funding will deliver more homes and contribute to the Province's goal of thousands more middle-income rental units. Speculation and vacancy tax

To deliver more homes and help ensure residential properties are used as homes rather than investments, Budget 2025 increases the speculation and vacancy tax rates. The rate for foreign owners and untaxed worldwide owners rises to 3% of their home's value from 2%, and to 1% from 0.5% for Canadian citizens and permanent residents. The increase takes effect Jan. 1, 2026, and will generate an estimated additional \$47 million in revenue in 2027-28. This money will be invested back into housing in the 59 regions where the tax applies.

It's one more measure alongside

the home-flipping tax and a tax for foreign owners to curb price escalations caused by speculators.

Support for lower-income seniors and families

Budget 2025 increases supports and helps more lower-income families and seniors with rental housing costs.

New Budget 2025 investments increase monthly supports and nearly double the number of lower-income working families eligible for help through the Rental Assistance Program. By raising the income threshold for the program from \$40,000 to \$60,000, nearly 6,000 families

will be eligible for the program, up from 3,200. The average supplement families receive will increase from \$400 to \$700 a month.

Up to 1,600 more seniors will benefit from the Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters program as Budget 2025 increases the income threshold from \$37,240 to \$40,000. The average supplement seniors receive will grow from \$261 to \$337, an increase of 30%.

ICBC rebate

To help people and businesses facing high costs, Budget 2025 provides a one-time rebate of \$110. In total, the rebate is

expected to return \$410 million to personal and commercial policy holders.

Climate action tax credit

The climate action tax credit will continue to help lower-income British Columbians while the national carbon tax remains in place. All of the incremental revenue from the federally required April 1, 2025, carbon tax increase will continue to go back to people through the tax credit.

The Province remains committed to removing the consumer carbon tax should the federal government remove the requirement for carbon pricing across Canada.

BC Budget Invests In Critical Public Services To Meet Growing Demand

The provincial government has released Budget 2025: Standing Strong for B.C., a measured plan to protect jobs and the public services people rely on, while preparing British Columbia's economy to withstand the unpredictable impacts of unjustified tariffs.

"With uncertainty on the horizon, it is prudent to protect the essentials and prepare for what comes next by investing in our greatest resource, the people of British Columbia," said Brenda Bailey, Minister of Finance. "While our economy is built to withstand the threat of U.S. President Donald Trump's tariffs relatively better than most other provinces, the impact would still be significant. Our budget prepares us to carefully navigate these uncharted waters so we can put people first and support businesses as we build

a stronger, more self-sufficient future."

Budget 2025 manages B.C.'s finances and invests in critical public services to meet growing demand. It provides \$9.9 billion more in operating funding over three years, including \$7.7 billion in new funding for health care, education and social services. The budget also includes \$4 billion in annual contingencies to address unpredictable costs, including a new collective bargaining mandate, pressures on critical services and for emerging needs, such as potential tariff response measures.

The budget provides \$4.2 billion to respond to growing demand for health-care services, improve access to primary care, continue hiring health-care workers, reduce wait times at emergency departments and

hospitals, and open and operate new and renovated hospitals and facilities. It also provides funding to support addictions treatment and recovery programs.

To address health-care needs throughout the province, \$15.5 billion in capital funding is provided over the fiscal plan to help build and upgrade hospitals, long-term care facilities and cancer centres.

Budget 2025 provides \$370 million over three years to support students in the K-12 education system, including hiring additional teachers, special-education teachers, teacher psychologists and counsellors. The budget also invests \$4.6 billion over the fiscal plan in capital funding to build and upgrade schools.

"In times of uncertainty, we will be there for British Columbians. We are continuing to invest in the services people rely on to take care of their families, get the care they need, when they need it, and provide a good future for everyone across the province," Bailey said. "Our government is focused on building an economy that creates the wealth that is needed to deliver more jobs with bigger paycheques and protect our public services in the face of the threat of unjustified tariffs."

Total capital investments of \$59.9 billion over the fiscal plan are anticipated to support 180,000 good-paying direct and indirect jobs over three years.

The Province is investing \$325 million over three years to support safer communities.

This includes \$235 million in justice and public safety programs for people to get timely access to justice, a new


program to fight vandalism and other property crime, increased police funding and more police officer training seats.

deficits from \$10.9 billion in 2025-26 to \$10.2 billion in 2026-27 and \$9.9 billion in 2027-28.



Brampton Man Manjinder Kalra Arrested For Kidnapping A Girl While Pretending To Be Police Officer

Peel region Investigators have arrested and charged Manjinder Kalra, a 32-yearold man from Brampton following a kidnapping investigation in Brampton.

According to police on Tuesday, Feb. 25, 2025, the victim was confronted by a male suspect posing as law enforcement official in the area of Bovaird Drive and Airport Road in Brampton.

As part of the agreement, BC will also enhance pharmacare coverage for its residents by providing free public coverage of hormone replacement therapy to treat menopausal symptoms for all residents. This additional coverage is a significant step toward improving health care for women and gender diverse people throughout their lifetimes. BC residents can anticipate beginning to receive coverage for these products in March 2026.





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

John Rustad Proposes Free Trade Act To Strengthen Economic Ties Across Canada

Rustad has introduced the Free Trade and Mobility within Canada Act, 2025, that aims to eliminate barriers to trade, services, and workforce mobility between provinces. This legislation aims to unlock economic potential, reduce red tape, and ensure that British Columbians benefit from freer and fairer commerce within Canada.

"For too long, outdated regulations and bureaucratic barriers have held back businesses, workers, and consumers," said John Rustad, Leader of the Official Opposition Conservative Party of British Columbia. "Our Free Trade and Mobility Act ensures that if something is good enough for another province, it's good enough for British Columbia."

The proposed legislation would remove restrictions on trade in goods, services, and investments between British Columbia and other provinces and



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It also proposes to recognize equivalent certifications from other provinces, allowing skilled workers and service providers to operate in B.C. without unnecessary re-licensing or additional testing.

It proposes to ensure regulatory cooperation between licensing bodies to facilitate seamless worker mobility and business operations.

Under this bill, goods produced and approved in other provinces will be treated as if they were made in B.C., preventing unnecessary duplication of standards, fees, or testing. Likewise, professionals licensed elsewhere in Canada will no longer face redundant certification processes in B.C.

Rustad criticized the NDP government for failing to champion interprovincial trade and economic freedom. "The NDP has done nothing to break down these barriers. Instead, their policies have made it harder for businesses and workers to succeed," said Rustad. "The Conservative Party of BC is stepping up to lead where the NDP has failed."

"British Columbians deserve an economy that works for them," added Rustad. "This bill is about economic freedom, opportunity, and common sense."

Buyers Gaining Upper Hand In Fraser Valley Real Estate Market

For the first time in four months, home sales in the Fraser Valley have increased as buyers capitalize on more selection and weakening prices.

The Fraser Valley Real Estate Board recorded 920 sales in February, up 13 per cent from January, but 26 per cent below sales recorded in February 2024.

Despite a nine per cent drop in newly listed homes on the Board's Multiple Listing Service® (MLS®), new listings remained 14 per cent above the 10-year seasonal average, at 3,121. Overall inventory remains high, at 8,070 active listings, 45 per cent above February 2024 and 55 per cent above the 10-year seasonal average.

The overall sales-to-active listings ratio

continues to signal a buyer's market in the Fraser Valley, with a ratio of 11 per cent. The market is considered to be balanced with the ratio is between 12 per cent and 20 per cent.

"The combination of inventory accumulation and softening prices is providing buyers with increased leverage, especially in the single-family detached category," said Baldev Gill, CEO of the Fraser Valley Real Estate Board. "Should this pattern persist, we could see a further shift toward a buyer's market, particularly given the ongoing economic uncertainties and impending tariffs. With ample selection, buyers have flexibility and time on their side to explore their options before making a decision."

Homes across the Fraser Valley sold in fewer days in February compared to January. The average number of days to sell a single-family detached home was 39, while for a condo it was 36. Townhomes took, on average, 32 days to sell.

The composite Benchmark price in the Fraser Valley dipped less than a quarter of a per cent in February, down 0.2 per cent to \$962,500.

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

The Odyssey is an updated model for 2025 with edgier styling, a more luxurious cabin and increased standard features and technology improvements. First up, on the exterior, there is a new grille, and redesigned front and rear fascias. There is even a touch of the Acura NSX Super car in the rear lights design. Other

The single engine choice for all models is a Honda's 3.5-liter SOHC directinjected i-VTEC® V6 engine, with 280 horsepower and with torque at 262 lb/ft. A nine-speed automatic transmission is standard on all trim levels except the top line Touring, which has the 10-speed automatic gearbox with paddle shifters. Unlike its competitors, the Odyssey isn't available with all-wheel drive or with a hybrid powertrain for now.

The 2025 Odyssey is available in four trim levels: Sport, Sport-L, Touring and Black Edition. As standard features include Wireless Charging Pad, and Navigation system, power-adjustable front seats (8-way for the driver, 4-way for the

passenger), and active noise cancellation. The 2025 Honda Odyssey model comes in 4 trim levels: Sport (\$49,920), Sport-L (\$52,920), Sport Touring (\$58,320), Black Edition (\$60,120). Freight and PDI is \$2,000.

The 2025 technology updates include a new fully configurable digital display and a larger 9-inch colour touchscreen with faster functionality. There is Apple CarPlay and Android Auto compatibility, and extra USB-C ports

throughout the cabin. In addition, there are major improvements

to the rear entertainment system, with more functions and larger 12.8-inch high-resolution screens, one of the largest in its sector. The top trim versions offer packages with 11-speaker Surround Sound Display & Controls, Voice Activating System Audio, Phone, Navigation, Climate Control, Satellite Radio, Hard Drive, Rear Entertainment System, HDMI, Wireless Headphones, and In-car WiFi Network. Other packages offer 19-inch wheels. Leather seats, CabinWatchTM day/night video monitor, Cabin- TalkTM in-car PA system, 4G LTE in-car Wi-Fi, hands-free power tailgate, ventilated front seats, and LED accent lighting.

A roomy, comfortable, and versatile interior occupant room are the major

selling points and the most attractive feature of the Odyssey. There are twin power operated side doors and a low step-in height to allow easy access. The Magic Slide 2nd-row seatsTM is an excellent feature and offers multiple seating options. The second-row middle seat are removable and with an Easy Access mode allows the outboard seats to slide

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
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

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Jagtar Singh Johal A cquitted In India Court Trial

Scottish Adetained in India for seven years on terror charges has been cleared in one of nine cases against him.

Jagtar Singh Johal from Dumbarton was arrested in 2017 in the country's Punjab region northern weeks after his wedding there. He has been held in prison ever since, on trial for his alleged role in a series of targeted killings of religious and political figures.

Now a verdict in the District Court in Moga, Punjab, has acquitted him of conspiracy under the country's anti-



terror law and of being a member of a "terrorist gang". According to BBC his legal team say the allegations against Johal in all the cases, for which he faces the death

penalty, are close to identical and that the other charges should now be dismissed. Johal was accused of being a member of a terror group, the Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF), which has carried out attacks in the Punjab region. The charges against him stated that he travelled to Paris in 2013 and delivered £3,000 to other KLF figures, with the money then used to purchase weapons which were used in a series of murders and attacks against Hindu nationalist and other

religious leaders across 2016

Punjab Launches 'War Against Drugs'

The Punjab government has adopted a war-footing approach in its 'War Against Drugs' by constituting a fivemember committee of cabinet ministers to monitor the ongoing crackdown on the drug menace in the state.

Last week, the Chief Minister convened a high-level meeting with top police officials, directing them to collaborate closely. As part of several measures, the police will identify drug hotspots, dismantle supply chains, and take stringent action against traffickers. Additionally, properties belonging to drug traffickers will be seized and demolished.

AAP cabinet ministers claim that, during their three-year tenure, authorities have arrested 6,500 major drug traffickers, registered over 30,000 cases under the NDPS Act, transferred 10,000 police personnel involved in drug trafficking, and arrested 100 police officers linked to the drug trade. Announcing that the war against drug traffickers has begun, Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said that for the past three days, continuous bulldozer action has been taken against drug traffickers.

The Cabinet subcommittee, led by Finance and Taxation Minister Harpal Singh Cheema, will oversee measures taken by the police and health departments to tackle the drug problem and implement the de-addiction programme, a spokesperson from the Chief Minister's Office said.

Tough On Farmers Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann Now Acting

from a breakdown in talks to the detention of hundreds of farmer leaders to then not allowing farmers to reach Chandigarh for a dharna outside the residence of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, Punjab in the past week saw a sudden escalation between farmers and the state government.

Not long ago, Mann would act as a mediator between farmer leaders and the Centre and sit in the meetings for hours. But things have since changed and the CM has toughened his stance on farmers, who are protesting him and the Aam Aadmi Party government in the state. Mann time and again slammed the Centre for not allowing farmers to enter New Delhi. He now faces the same criticism.

Things escalated between farmer leaders

and the state government when on March 3, the former accused the CM of inappropriate behaviour and walking out of a meeting with Sanyukt Kisan Morcha leaders at the Punjab Bhawan in Chandigarh. Mann allegedly left saying that if the farmers wanted to go ahead with the March 5 dharna in Chandigarh then they could do that.

Mann, however, told reporters, "Yes I left the meeting and we will detain them as well, won't allow farmers to sit on tracks and roads, I am custodian to the three crore people of Punjab. I spent two hours in a meeting yesterday but the farmers straight up said they would protest on March 5. So, I left."

Mann, in a tweet, appealed to all farmer leaders to understand that blocking roads, halting trains, or calling for a Punjab Bandh is not the solution to any problem. "These actions only cause inconvenience to common people. It also has a significant impact on the work and businesses of other sections of society, and we should keep that in mind as well," Mann's tweet read. India Today quoted Professor Kuldip Singh of the Guru Nanak Dev University, who feels this is not sudden. Singh said, "I feel that the popularity graph of the farmer organisations is not as strong as it was a few years ago and this entire happening is a result of that."

"Moreover, the government might be feeling that there is a population other than farmers too and that population is perturbed by the daily dharnas and blockades by farmers. The government



might be thinking that they cannot make farmers happy all the time so at least they can please the other population," he added. SKM has decided to hold dharnas at the residences of all AAP MLAs on March 10, as a show of resentment against the government. This move is seen as an escalation of SKM's agitation, as it targets the ruling party's elected representatives.

According to reports, Allahbadia, in particular, assured the NCW that he would be more mindful in the future. "This is the first and last time such a mistake has happened. From now on, I will think carefully and speak with respect toward women," he reportedly told the panel.
