Surrey Police To Use Drones At Vaisakhi Parade To Monitor Traffic, Enhance Safety

The Surrey Police Service (SPS) will be using drones at Surrey Nagar Kirtan to monitor crowd movement, traffic flow, and overall safety. SPS has procured these drones, got certification from the federal government and hired certified pilots to operate them during the upcoming Vaisakhi parade on Saturday, April 19th. The announcement was made by Surrey Police Chief Norm Lipinski at a South Asian media roundtable held last week. During the conference, the Chief engaged with media representatives, providing updates on the police transition and addressing questions on public safety concerns in

Surrey.

The Surrey Nagar Kirtan, the largest Sikh parade in North America outside India, is expected to draw over 500,000 attendees. This year, for the first time, SPS will be

responsible as the police of jurisdiction during the parade. Chief Lipinski expressed confidence in handling the event, stating that the police have already coordinated with key stakeholders, including

the RCMP—still part of the transition process—city officials, the mayor's office, and bylaw officers.

"In most aspects, we will replicate what the RCMP did during past parades, but we are also leveraging technology, such as drones," said Chief Lipinski. "Drones provide a high vantage point, helping us monitor traffic congestion and respond swiftly to emergencies."

Police Transition and Public Safety

Providing an update on the SPS transition, Lipinski emphasized that tensions with the city are now a thing of the past and the transition process is going extremely smooth. "Everyone—the city,

Donald Trump Imposes Sweeping Tariffs Across Countries; Canada Hits Back

U.S. President Donald Trump on Wednesday unveiled global reciprocal tariffs during an event at the White House in what he has referred to as "Liberation Day." Trump announced plans to impose a baseline tariff of 10% across all countries, upping those duties for various partners whom he described as bad actors. Canada, however, was not on the list, and the executive order later confirmed that it would not face additional tariffs. Rather, the existing tariff regime, which exempts goods covered by the Canada-United-



States-Mexico Agreement (CUSMA), will remain in place. While some important elements of the Canada U.S. trade relationship have been preserved, new tariffs on automobiles have now entered into force.

City of Surrey Proposes 2.8% General Property Tax Increase

2025-2029 General Operating and Capital Budgets are now available for the public to view

The City of Surrey's 2025-2029 General Operating and Capital Budgets are now available for the public to view. The Budgets have been formulated based on direction from Mayor Brenda Locke and Surrey Council, reflecting City strategies, resource requirements to maintain service delivery and feedback on community priorities obtained during the City's budget engagement process. "In these challenging and uncertain economic times with U.S. tariffs looming, our Council has dedicated itself to preparing a budget that proposes a modest 2.8% general property tax increase— among the lowest in the entire region," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "This is less than half of our general property tax increase in last year's Five-Year Financial Plan. Our Council has worked hard to ensure that we keep tax rates low while still addressing the essential needs of our growing community."

"Last year, we reached a critical crossroads regarding our police service, with the looming threat of massive tax hikes to fund the Surrey Police Service," Locke said. "Thanks to our unwavering commitment and diligent negotiations, we negotiated up to \$250 million from the province—funding that Surrey's previous Council had neither sought nor even considered. This support has helped alleviate the financial burden on our taxpayers. Our Council remains committed to making prudent financial decisions that prioritize the well-being of our residents while upholding our responsibility for sound fiscal management."

The property tax increases proposed in the 2025 General Operating Budget are as follows:

2.8% General Property Tax increase (approximately \$77 for the average assessed single-family home) to fund: General inflationary pressures; hiring of additional 20 Fire Services positions and 10 bylaw positions for 2025, as well as funding 25 police positions; and City-wide operations. 1% Roads and Traffic Levy (approximately \$27 for the average assessed single-family home)

If the proposed increases are approved, the City's portion of property taxes for the average assessed single family home in the City of Surrey would be \$3,169, which would place Surrey in the bottom third of the region for property taxes collected for the respective average assessed home in Metro Vancouver.

"While we are being financially prudent, we are not compromising on the infrastructure our growing city needs," noted Mayor Locke. "We are proposing an ambitious \$701 million Capital Plan over the next five

years, which is the largest financial commitment in the City's history including funding for 36 projects—10 of which are new this year."

Among other key initiatives, the City is moving forward with transformative projects ranging from a 10,000-seat Sports and Entertainment Arena and an Interactive Art Museum—both set to become cornerstones of Surrey's emerging City Centre Entertainment District - to smaller investments including an Ash-Scattering Pier off the banks of the Fraser River.

The proposed Capital Plan also includes moving ahead with the new Newton Community Centre, as well as a significant \$446 million investment in capital road works over five years to enhance the City's transportation infrastructure.

A public meeting of the Finance Committee will be held April 14, 2025 at 1pm to consider the 2025 Budget.

Surrey's Mohammad Jawaid Aziz arrested in US for smuggling banned goods to Pakistan's military and nuclear weapons program

US authorities have arrested a 67-year-old man from Surrey, B.C., accusing him of smuggling banned goods to Pakistan's military and its nuclear weapons program over more than 15 years.

The U.S. Department of Justice unsealed an indictment at a US court charging Mohammad Jawaid Aziz, also known as Jawaid Aziz Siddiqui and Jay Siddiqui, 67, of Pakistan and Canada, with conspiracy to violate U.S. export laws and violating U.S. export laws. Siddiqui was arrested on March 21 in the Western District of Washington while attempting to cross into the United States from Canada. He remains detained, pending transfer to the District of Minnesota.

None of the allegations have been proven in court. As alleged, from as early as 2003 through approximately March 2019, Siddiqui operated an illicit procurement network through his Canada-based company Diversified Technology Services. The purpose

of the network was to obtain U.S.-origin goods on behalf of prohibited entities in Pakistan that were associated with the country's nuclear, missile, and Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) programs. According to the indictment, Siddiqui, while operating through Diversified Technology Services, procured various goods – including sensitive and restricted items subject to export administration regulations (EAR) and those on the Commerce Control List – from U.S. companies on behalf of the restricted entities in Pakistan. As alleged, Siddiqui and his co-conspirators worked to conceal the true end-users of the goods from U.S. companies, often using front companies and transshipping goods through third countries to evade detection. Siddiqui is charged with conspiracy to violate the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) and Export Control Reform Act,

which carries a maximum statutory penalty of five years in prison; and violating the Export Control Reform Act, which carries a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison. A federal district court judge will determine any sentence after considering the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors. Sue J. Bai, head of the Justice Department's National Security Division, Assistant Director Roman Rozhavsky of the FBI's Counterintelligence Division, and Special Agent in Charge Aaron Tambrini of the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) Chicago Field Office, Office of Export Enforcement

made the announcement. Homeland Security Investigations Minneapolis, the FBI Minneapolis Field Office, and the Department of Commerce's BIS Chicago Field Office are investigating the case. Assistant U.S. Attorney Bradley Endicott for the District of Minnesota and Trial Attorney Nicholas Hunter of the National Security Division's Counterintelligence and Export Control Section are prosecuting the case. They received assistance from Assistant U.S. Attorney Michelle Jensen from the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Western District of Washington and the Department's Office of International Affairs. An indictment is merely an allegation. All defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.

Mark Carney's Liberals Unveil Plan To Build Homes And Protect Canadian Agrifood Workers



supply management, invest in businesses and workers, and cut red tape. Other measures include Protect Canada's commitment to supply management and supply-managed sectors such as dairy, poultry, and eggs; Making permanent the doubling of the revenue protection for farmers under the AgriStability Program, from \$3 million to \$6 million per farm, in the case of significant revenue drops caused by the impacts of tariffs, extreme weather events, and other external shocks; Build more domestic processing capacity, including food processing capacity in rural and remote areas, with a new \$200 million



During his election campaign this week, Mark Carney announced that a new Liberal government would build more homes that Canadians can afford, with Canada's most ambitious housing plan since the Second World War.

During and after the Second World War, Canada was facing a massive housing crisis – similar to today's. In response, the government of the day built tens of thousands of affordable starter homes for returning veterans and their families. "Canada has solved a housing crisis before, and we can do it again," he said.

"We're going to get the government back into the business of homebuilding, while partnering with workers and industry, and cutting taxes for home buyers - so more Canadians can buy their first homes."

A Mark Carney-led Liberal government will double the pace of construction to almost 500,000 new homes a year. The housing plan that will create Build Canada Homes (BCH) to get the federal government back into the business of home building, by acting as a developer to build affordable housing at scale, including on public lands.

The federal government will be catalyzing the housing industry by providing over \$25 billion in financing to innovative prefabricated home builders in Canada, including those using Canadian technologies and resources like mass timber and softwood lumber, to build faster, smarter, more affordably, and more sustainably; and, Make the housing market work better by catalyzing private capital, cutting red tape, and lowering the cost of homebuilding by cutting municipal development charges; facilitating the conversion of existing structures into affordable housing units; and, building on the success of the Housing Accelerator Fund.

Plan to protect Canadian agrifood workers

In the face of President Trump's tariffs, the Liberal Party of Canada today announced Liberals will implement a suite of policy measures to defend

Domestic Food Processing Fund; Increase support for farmers, ranchers, and producers to access new markets for their food products with an additional \$30 million in the AgriMarketing Program; Increase the help for farmers and ranchers to buy new, more efficient farm equipment with a \$30 million top up to the Agriculture Clean Technology Program; and, Double the loan guarantee limit, from \$500,000 to \$1 million, of the Canadian Agricultural Loans Act program and expand terms by 5-10 years.

Here Is What Conservative Leader Promised This Week During Election Campaign

Lock Up the Worst Criminals for Life
Conservative Leader Pierre Poilievre said will impose life sentences for anyone who is convicted of: 5 or more counts of human trafficking; Importing or exporting ten or more illegal firearms and Fentanyl trafficking.
He said that crime wave is the direct result of the Liberals' soft-on-crime agenda. Bill C-5 ended mandatory jail time for serious gun and drug crimes, letting criminals off the hook. Bill C-75 weakened bail, putting repeat offenders back on the streets faster. And Liberals slashed penalties for human traffickers, making it harder to lock them up.
Canada First Reinvestment Tax Cut
Any person or business selling an asset will pay no capital gains tax when they reinvest the proceeds in Canada. Companies that reinvest in active Canadian businesses will also defer any capital gains tax. These gains will still be taxed later on when investors cashes out or move the money out of Canada. The break will be available on any reinvestments done until the end of 2026.

This tax cut will be available for any capital gains reinvested between July 1, 2025, to December 31, 2026. But, if it causes a major economic boom, as expected, Conservatives will make it permanent.
'Canada First' National Energy Corridor
A Conservative government will create a **'Canada First' National Energy Corridor** to fast-track approvals for transmission lines, railways, pipelines, and other critical infrastructure across Canada in a pre-approved transport corridor entirely within Canada, transporting our resources within Canada and to the world while bypassing the United States. In the corridor, all levels of government will provide legally binding commitments to approve projects. This means investors will no longer face the endless regulatory limbo that has made Canadians poorer. First Nations will be involved from the outset, ensuring that economic benefits flow directly to them and that their approval is secured before any money is spent.
He said, between 2015 and 2020, Canada cancelled 16 major energy projects,

resulting in a \$176 billion hit to our economy. The Liberals killed the Energy East pipeline and passed Bill C-69, the "No-New-Pipelines" law, which makes it all but impossible to build the pipelines and energy infrastructure we need to strengthen the Canadian economy. And now, the PBO projects that the 'Carney cap' on Canadian energy will reduce oil and gas production by nearly 5%, slash GDP by \$20.5 billion annually, and eliminate 54,400 full-time jobs by 2032. An average mine opening lead time is now nearly 18 years—23% longer than Australia and 38% longer than the US. As a result of the Lost Liberal Decade, Canada now ranks 23rd in the World Bank's Ease of Doing Business Index for 2024, a seven-place drop since 2015.
Axe The Annual Liberal Beer Tax Increase
Conservatives promised to axe the automatic annual tax increases on alcohol that the Mark Carney Liberals hiked on April 1. Conservatives will bring the tax rate back down to 2017 levels so Canadians pay less and businesses earn more.
He said that this annual tax hike is automatic, meaning it gets increased without a vote in Parliament. Mark Carney's April 1 alcohol tax increase will cost Canadians about \$40 million in 2025-26. Since the Carney-Trudeau Liberals imposed this tax on Canadians, it has cost Canadians nearly \$900 million, while government taxes on alcohol now account for nearly half the price of what consumers pay.
Axe GST on Canadian-Made Cars, Create 'Keep Canadians Working Fund'
On a Canadian-made vehicle priced

at \$50,000, axing the GST will save consumers \$2,500. Poilievre also called on Canada's Premiers to axe their provincial sales taxes on new made-in-Canada cars, saving Canadians between \$6,000 and \$7,500 on that same new \$50,000 car.
Poilievre will also create the 'Keep Canadians Working Fund,' a targeted, temporary loan and credit program for businesses directly hit by Trump's tariffs, to keep workers working. The Fund will provide up to \$3 billion in short-term credit lines and low-interest loans to ensure companies can maintain operations and keep employees working in industries affected by Trump tariffs. The Fund is modelled on the Business Credit Availability Program (BCAP) that the Harper government created during the 2008 recession to successfully protect affected businesses and jobs.
Tax Fairness for Travelling Trades Workers
A new Conservative government will allow travelling trades workers to write off the full cost of food, transport and accommodation needed to go from one job to another while ending write-offs for luxury corporate jets that are not needed to do business. Corporations will be able to write off the equivalent of a commercial flight. Charter flights needed to get workers to remote job sites will not be impacted by this change. Travelling trades workers will be able to write off the full cost of food, transportation and accommodation.

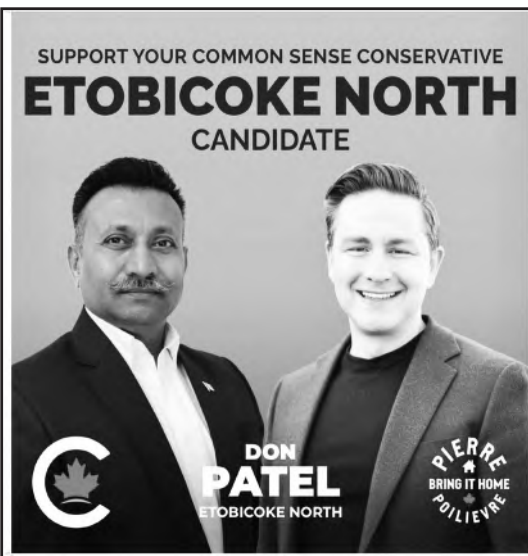
Conservatives Drop 4 Candidates Across Canada Including Two South Asians

With Federal Election just a few weeks away, a crisis is hitting Conservative Party. The Conservative Party of Canada has dropped four candidates out of its list this week for different reasons.

On Tuesday, the party ousted Windsor city councillor Mark McKenzie – who was running to represent the riding of Windsor-Tecumseh-Lakeshore – after CTV News obtained audio of 2022 podcast comments in which he joked about former prime minister Justin Trudeau getting the death penalty.

Hours later, Stefan Marquis — who was running for the Conservatives in the Montreal riding of Laurier—Sainte-Marie, held by Liberal cabinet minister Steven Guilbeault since 2019 — wrote in a post on social media that he is no longer a candidate for the party.

“In a call received this morning from one of Quebec’s operations managers for the party, I was told without further note that ‘certain’ individuals within the party had consulted



my recent posts on Twitter-X and deemed these sufficient reason to end our political collaboration,” Marquis wrote on X, along with a cartoon image of a hand pressing a button on a person’s head to get them to

speak. “The call lasted less than a minute.” Late Tuesday night, the party confirmed Lourence Singh would “not be a candidate” for the riding of New Westminster-Burnaby-Maillardville, but did not elaborate on the reason behind his departure.

Just a day later, Conservative Party dropped its fourth candidate Don Patel after engaging with a comment on social media that suggested that some people should be deported to India and that Prime Minister Narendra Modi should “take care” of them.

The Conservative party confirmed that Don Patel, who was running in Etobicoke North, was “no longer a candidate.” Patel is the fourth candidate to be dropped in this campaign.

“Endorsing such a statement is clearly unacceptable,” a Conservative campaign spokesperson said in a statement. “The Conservative Party will always stand up for the safety and security of Canadians.”

the province, and the police—is now focused on two primary goals: completing the transition and ensuring public safety,” he said.

Lipinski said, SPS, which has been operational for 120 days, has already responded to 33,000 calls, made arrests, conducted investigations, and engaged with the community. The force currently has 500 officers but needs to recruit an additional 300 to reach its target of 800. Chief Lipinski said that while the transition may take up to three years, SPS officers are gradually increasing their presence as RCMP personnel are phased

out. SPS officers are already stationed in Cloverdale and Newton, with plans to expand into South Surrey soon. Each of the city’s five policing districts will have an inspector in charge.

Community Policing and Crime Prevention

Beyond transition updates, Lipinski outlined SPS’s community policing model, emphasizing importance of community in finding solutions to the city’s problems. “Our surveys with the community found that the community wants higher presence in high density areas and wants to be part of solutions to the crime prevention in the

city.”

Addressing concerns over recent shootings, including one on Scott Road that shook the community, the chief stressed the importance of proactive policing. He said that SPS will plan to deploy officers on foot and bicycles in high-density areas.

Road Safety and Cultural Sensitivity

Lipinski also highlighted road safety initiatives, noting that Surrey saw 13 fatal collisions in 2024, most linked to impaired driving. In response, SPS has established a dedicated Road Safety Unit to combat this issue. Additionally, he was mitigating a town hall to educate new immigrants

on Canadian policing and the dangers of impaired driving.

Recognizing Surrey’s multicultural fabric, the police chief underscored SPS’s commitment to diversity. New recruits are selected from varied cultural backgrounds and undergo six weeks of mandatory cultural sensitivity training, followed by annual refresher courses. To improve communication, officers now wear name tags displaying the languages they speak. Inspector Jag Khosa further elaborated on initiatives to support marginalized communities, including the establishment of a Human Rights Unit and an Indigenous Relations Unit. “Our goal is to ensure that every officer is trained to understand and respect the communities they serve,” he stated.

Focus on Youth and Crime Prevention

The police force is also prioritizing youth crime prevention, implementing proven programs to deter at risk youth from entering gang.

Chief Lipinski urged the public to report suspicious activities, such as extortion attempts, emphasizing that while cases remain stable, they are often underreported.

“We can only help if we have the information,” he said, calling for greater public vigilance and cooperation.

The key to having fun and enjoying the event to its fullest also means having a plan in place with your family and friends prior to the event,” says Staff Sergeant Lindsey Houghton, Senior Media Relations Officer

at Surrey Police Service. “Every year, one of the types of help that police provide the most at the Parade is to help people find and be reunited with lost loved ones. Being prepared ahead of time and planning with your family can ensure everyone stays safe throughout the celebration.”

With the significant crowds, it can be very easy for people to become separated from their group or loved ones. During previous Vaisakhi celebrations, the police have responded to dozens of incidents of missing children or elderly persons.

A safety plan may include these simple tips:

- Take a family photo before you leave the house on the morning of the Parade,

this will help in locating them if needed.

- Familiarize your family members with their surroundings and have a pre-planned meeting place for the end of the event or in case you get separated.
- Make sure your family members have some form of identification and your contact information.
- Keep a current photo of your child on you in case you need to describe them to police.
- Keep your children within eyesight at all times.
- If a family member goes missing, notify the nearest police officer to you.
- If you live in the area that has been closed, please have your driver’s license with current address to provide to police

at check point in order to get to your residence.

- We encourage people to leave their pets at home, as they may become easily startled and scared.

Road closures will be in place in the City of Surrey through the weekend due to the Parade. Police ask that members of the public make arrangements ahead of time to use alternate routes.

Two Men Charged With First Degree Murder And Kidnapping Of Edmonton's Sukhvir Singh

The Edmonton Police Service (EPS) has laid charges in the murder of a male who was found deceased in northeast Edmonton on Feb. 28.

On Friday, Feb. 28, 2025, at approximately 5:30 p.m. Northeast Branch Patrol responded to the report of a deceased male located in the area of 17 Street and Yellowhead Trail. Police determined the death to be suspicious, and EPS Homicide Section took over the investigation.

The Edmonton Medical Examiner completed an autopsy on Wednesday,

Mar. 5, 2025, and identified the deceased as Sukhvir Singh, 32. The cause and manner of death are pending further investigation. However, due to the totality of the circumstances, investigators believe Singh was murdered.

Manpreet Brar and Gursimran Singh were arrested. Both men were charged with first degree murder and kidnapping in relation to Sukhvir Singh's death. Canada-wide warrants have been issued for a third male, Lovepreet Sidhu, 27, for first degree murder and kidnapping in relation to the death. All three accused were

known to the victim.

Sukhvir Singh was last seen alive in the evening hours of Wednesday, Feb. 26, 2025 in the commercial area near Gateway Boulevard south of Whitemud Drive.

Investigators released the name and a photo of Singh in an attempt to prompt those who knew him or who have information about his whereabouts during the week of Feb. 24-28, 2025 to come forward to police. EPS Homicide detectives continue to investigate.

Ontario Man Arrested in Delta for Trafficking Drugs and Possession For Purpose of Trafficking

A Delta Police Officer observed what he believed to be a drug transaction and started an investigation. As a result, an Ontario man was arrested, and a quantity of cash, cell phones, drugs and weapons were seized.

On March 26th, 2025, an officer watched a drug transaction occur at the driver's door of a car, illegally parked in the 5200 block of 8A Ave, Tsawwassen. The officer conducted a vehicle stop and observed multiple additional indicators that the driver was trafficking controlled drugs. The driver was arrested. A search of the car and the driver located a large amount of suspected fentanyl, methamphetamine, cocaine, cash, weapons, jerry cans of gasoline, and a balaclava.

A 20-year-old Ontario man has been released on an Undertaking



while the investigation continues. A report to Crown Counsel will follow, recommending charges of possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking, and possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose.

Do not provide personal information over the phone.

Do not send money or respond to any links sent by the caller.

End the call as quickly as possible.

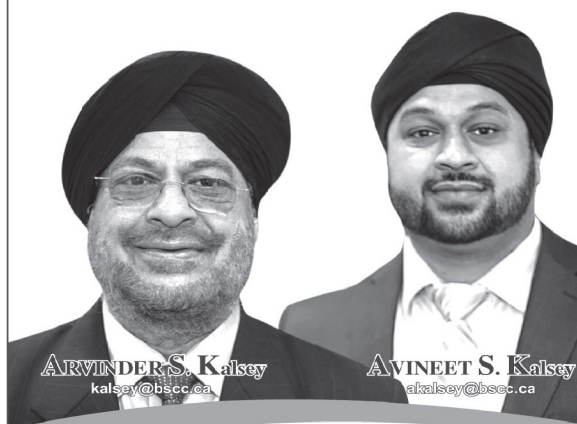

NDP To Cap Grocery Prices, Make Homes Energy Efficient

NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh made several promises during his election campaign including putting a cap on grocery prices and retrofitting lower income homes with energy efficient solutions and cutting bills. Singh announced the NDP government would introduce emergency price caps on basic food items—like pasta, frozen vegetables, and infant formula—to keep costs of food down. These items have seen some of the steepest increases since 2020: cooking oil is up 75 percent, pasta is up 43 percent, and infant formula—an essential for so many parents—is up 30 percent and still climbing.

NDP will also enforce a mandatory Grocery Code of Conduct to regulate pricing practices and prevent wage cuts in response to caps; and fully empower the Competition Bureau to act as a grocery price watchdog and crack down on price fixing.



Singh also announced a plan to lower energy bills, create good jobs, and stop giving oil and gas CEOs a free ride. New Democrats will eliminate public subsidies and tax breaks for oil and gas companies—saving \$18 billion over 10 years—and put that money to work for Canadians through a major home retrofit program including free retrofits for 2.3 million low-income households, and grants or low-interest loans for 1 million more—cutting energy bills by

up to \$4,500 a year for families across Canada.

New Democrats will: End the Consumer Carbon Tax—for good, Keep the industrial carbon price, Keep the emissions cap in place, Eliminate oil and gas subsidies and introduce a Border Carbon Adjustment.

Singh also announced a bold plan to help families afford their first home by unlocking the financial power of the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) to offer low-interest, public-backed mortgages. By offering long-term, low-interest mortgages, the plan will directly reduce monthly costs and cut tens of thousands of dollars over the life of a mortgage. For example, a reduction of just 0.5% on a typical mortgage would save a family around \$9,500 over five years—money people could use for groceries, childcare, or saving for their future.

These are on top of the previously announced tariffs, including those on steel and aluminum, which remain in place. While some important elements of the Canada U.S. trade relationship have been preserved, new tariffs on automobiles have now entered into force. These are on top of the previously announced tariffs, including those on steel and aluminum, which remain in place.

Prime Minister Mark Carney said the global reciprocal tariffs will still have an impact on the Canadian economy.

“The global economy is fundamentally different today than yesterday. We must respond with purpose and force and take every step to protect Canadian workers and businesses against the unjust tariffs imposed by the United States, including on automobiles. We will never cease to defend the interests of Canadians, safeguard our workers and businesses, and continue our pursuit to build the strongest economy in the G7,” he said.

Carney said Trump’s tariffs against Canadian goods are “unjustified, unwarranted and, in our judgment, misguided,” and the country must hit back with what he called “carefully calibrated and targeted countermeasures” to make it clear Canada will not stand for this sort of economic broadside.

Carney, announced new countermeasures to protect Canadian workers and businesses and defend Canada’s economy. These countermeasures include: 25% per cent tariffs on non-CUSMA compliant fully assembled vehicles imported into Canada from the United States. Canada will impose 25% tariffs on non-Canadian and non-Mexican content of CUSMA compliant fully assembled vehicles imported into Canada from the United States.

“Most importantly, every single dollar raised from these tariffs will go directly to support our auto workers,” Carney said.

Carney said these measures build on the Government of Canada’s previously announced supports to Canadian workers and business, including:

- Temporarily waiving the one-week employment insurance (EI) waiting period.
- Suspending rules around separation for a six-month period, so workers don’t have to exhaust severance pay before collecting EI.
- Making it easier to access EI by increasing regional unemployment rate percentages.
- Deferring corporate income tax payments and GST/HST remittances from April 2 to June 30, 2025, providing up to \$40 billion in liquidity to businesses.
- Deploying a new financing facility for businesses.
- Providing more funding to Canada’s regional development agencies, so they can better support businesses.

B.C. Eliminates Carbon Tax

VICTORIA - The B.C. government is cancelling the carbon tax by introducing legislation to drop the rate to \$0, effective Tuesday, April 1, 2025. "British Columbians are doing everything they can to reduce their emissions. But people shouldn't have to choose between climate action and being able to afford their bills," said Premier David Eby. "That's why we are eliminating the consumer carbon tax, which has become divisive at a time we need to be united. We will help people with costs and fight climate change by ensuring big polluters continue to pay, encouraging industry to innovate and giving British Columbians affordable options to make sustainable choices." The reduction of the tax to \$0 is an immediate step to align

B.C.'s carbon tax rate with the new federal carbon tax rate. The elimination of the carbon tax means people in British Columbia will no longer be required to pay the consumer carbon tax, taking approximately 17 cents per litre off the cost of fuel and approximately 15 cents per cubic metre for natural gas on their home heating bill.

The climate action tax credit, developed to help offset the impacts of the consumer carbon tax on people and families, will also be cancelled. The final payment will be distributed in April 2025.

"The carbon tax has been an important tool in B.C. for over a decade and half, but it has become too politically divisive and a distraction from the important issues we are



tackling," said Brenda Bailey, Minister of Finance. "While this is a significant shift for our province, we will offset the impact while focusing on growing the economy during these challenging economic times."

Cancelling the tax and the credit will have an estimated impact of \$1.99 billion in the coming fiscal year. The Province will restructure programs funded by carbon tax revenue to minimize the impact on B.C.'s budget, while supporting people in

British Columbia in achieving climate goals.

The Province will continue to ensure big polluters pay through the B.C. output-based carbon pricing system. The system supports decarbonization efforts, incentivizing industry to lower their emissions to avoid paying the tax.

"We remain committed to driving down emissions while making life more affordable," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Energy and Climate Solutions. "We are continuing to invest in practical solutions, such as home heat pump rebates for those who need them most and energy-efficiency upgrades, so people can lower their energy costs and reduce emissions without bearing an extra financial burden."

Provincial Funding Boosts Support For Deafblind People

Deafblind people in B.C. will continue to receive vital intervener services thanks to more than \$654,000 in additional funding to support the Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) Deafblind Community Services and the Wavefront Centre for Communication Accessibility.

Deafblind people require support to mitigate communication barriers resulting from dual loss of sight and hearing. Interveners provide specialized communication supports to people who are deafblind, making it easier for them to navigate day-to-day activities, such as grocery shopping, banking and attending appointments. Interveners support individuals who



are deafblind using a variety of communication methods, including American Sign Language (both visual and tactile), two-hand manual, voiceover, print-on-palm and large-print notes.

This funding builds on more than \$1.1 million provided to CNIB since 2022 to support a pilot initiative for intervener services. The new investment will

extend intervener services for another year and will support more deafblind adults by funding the Wavefront Centre in addition to CNIB Deafblind Community Services.

Heat for the Streets! Toyota Corolla GR- Fast and Loud!

Auto Review by Veeno Dewan

Toyota's GR Corolla Hatchback is a serious performance hatchback named for the automaker's Gazoo Racing Motorsports division, (GR). Its remit is outrageous performance in a small package - the very antithesis to the mainstream Corolla it's based on. The GR is expensive many thousands above a standard Corolla - a result of the complete reengineering from the normal Corolla. The body shell is super stiff and the floorplan altered to fit the All-Wheel Drive system. The suspension is also custom built for superior handling and all GR Corollas are assembled in a dedicated facility where many parts are assembled and fitted by hand. The engine is an exquisitely engineered 1.6L three-cylinder unit producing a stupendous 300 horsepower and 295 lb-ft of torque. Adjustable suspension, performance drive modes and all kinds of performance goodies are standard. Originally, only available with six - speed manual transmission to define its sporty performance hatchback credentials, for 2025, the most important change is the availability of an 8-speed automatic transmission option and a slight boost in torque. The direct automatic transmission (DAT) is offered as part of the new upper Premium trim line. Meanwhile, the engine has been retuned to 295 lb-ft of torque, compared to 273 lb-ft in the previous model. Other performance upgrades include uprated suspension and front and rear limited-slip differentials as standard this year.



The powertrain specification is awesome for such a small car using Toyota's rally developed GR Four All-Wheel-Drive (AWD) system giving drivers a choice of selectable 60/40, 50/50, or 30/70 split torque power distribution to the front and rear wheels. The six-speed manual transmission has selectable rev-matching, while the new eight-speed automatic arrives with paddle shifters and an awesome launch control feature. Driver selectable All-wheel drive (is standard, with front and rear Torsen limited-slip

differentials. A unique triple exhaust

that's designed to reduce backpressure for maximum power delivery finishes off the rear.

The Corolla GR arrives in two trim levels. The Core trim with as standard manual transmission for \$47,915. The automatic transmission comes only in the Premium trim which is \$58,137. The Core Grade has a colour keyed roof with rear lip spoiler. GR stamped side rockers, and wide-fender flares. On the inside, there is seating for five will and GR logoed fabric sport seats. As standard issue on the Core are features such as: an eight-inch centre touchscreen with wireless phone connectivity, six speakers, heated sport seats, heated steering wheel, automatic climate control, and a 12.3-inch digital instrument cluster. Additions and changes include a synthetic suede-wrapped steering wheel and shift

lever. Otherwise, it is standard Corolla ambience with a quality feel, good ergonomics, and switch gear. There is practical interior storage and decent room for front occupants. While the rear seats are tight they are not oppressively so. The rear seats also fold for more cargo storage. The Premium version (As Tested) adds a

carbon fibre roof and power bulge hood, (Also available as an option package to the Core trim.) there is the Automatic transmission, a wireless charger, eight-speaker JBL audio system, suede seat trim, dual-zone climate control, and a head-up display.

Pannun’s Derogatory Remarks On Dr Ambedkar Spark Tensions

Sikhs For Justice (SFJ) headed by Gurpatwant Singh Pannun recently released another video with a fiery message and this time the focus of his attack was India’s revered leader Dr Baba Saheb Ambedkar, the architect of the Constitution of India.

Pannun said SFJ was responsible for vandalizing Ambedkar’s statue at Nangal village in Phillaur sub division of Jalandhar district. The vandalism has sparked protests by the Dalit community.

A glass around the statue of Dr B R Ambedkar was found vandalised in Nangal village in Jalandhar’s Phillaur this week. The statue, encased in glass, was discovered with Khalistan slogans and provocative graffiti scrawled across its cover. The inscriptions “Sikhs Are Not Hindus” and “Trump Zindabad” were painted on the glass, while two flags, one saffron and the other blue, bearing similar messages, were taped to the casing.

Pannu took responsibility for the defacement. He criticised Dr Ambedkar, accusing him of contributing to the erasure of Sikh identity through his role in drafting the Indian Constitution.

Sharing a video and a message on Instagram, Pannun said, “SFJ holds Dr. Ambedkar responsible for constitutionally labeling Sikhs as Hindus, citing Article 25(b) of the Indian Constitution, under which Sikhs are grouped as part of the Hindu faith for legal purposes — a move SFJ says erased Sikh identity and laid the groundwork for the 1984 Sikh Genocide. Calling Ambedkar the “enabler” of the Sikh Genocide.”

He said, “With Ambedkar Jayanti (Bhim Jayanti) approaching on April 14, SFJ is calling for the statewide removal of all Ambedkar statues in Punjab, labeling them symbols of betrayal.”

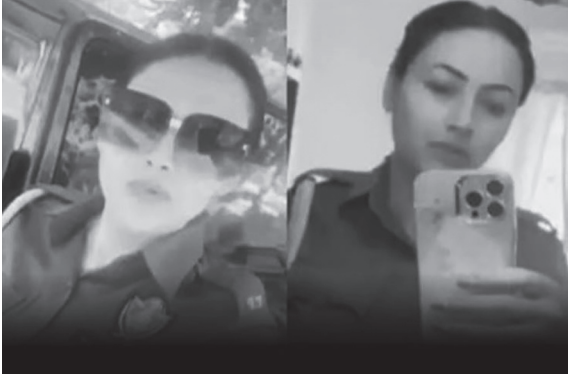
Addressing the incident, Jalandhar SSP Gurmeet Singh confirmed the vandalism and stating that an FIR is being filed. “The statue was well covered, but some mischievous elements wrote objectionable things on it. We are working on a line of investigation and expect a breakthrough soon,” he said. This is not the first such incident involving the defacement of Ambedkar statues in Punjab. Earlier this year, a statue of Ambedkar was similarly vandalised in Amritsar.

“Insta Queen” Punjab Cop Sacked After She Was Caught With 17 Grams Heroin

Punjab Police dismissed senior woman constable Amandeep Kaur, a day after she was arrested for carrying 17.71 grams of heroin. Ms Kaur was arrested amid the Punjab government’s ongoing anti-drug drive, ‘Yudh Nasheyan Virudh,’ following a tip-off.

Police, along with the Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF), caught Ms Kaur’s SUV, a Mahindra Thar, near the Badal flyover in Bathinda, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Harbans Singh, said.

“In a joint operation, we cordoned off the area under the Badal flyover. When we stopped a Thar and questioned the driver, it was a named Amandeep. She was accompanied by a man named Jaswant Singh. Upon searching the vehicle, we found 17.71 grams of heroin,” said Harbans Singh Dhaliwal.



Kaur was deployed with the Mansa police and was attached to Bathinda Police Lines at the time of her arrest. The constable has been charged under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act.

The police constable, who goes by the name “police_kaurdeep” on social media, regularly posts reels featuring her Thar. In most of the videos, Ms Kaur can be seen in her uniform, humming popular Punjabi songs while wearing big shades and a fancy watch. She can also be seen carrying an expensive iPhone.

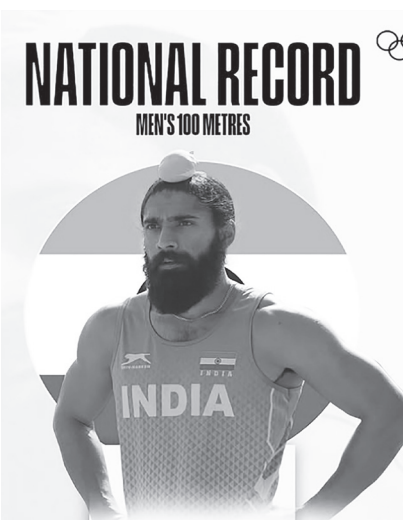

Punjab’s sprinter Gurindervir Singh has made history as India’s fastest runner, clocking a record time of 10.20 seconds in men’s 100m at the Indian Grand Prix 1 in Bengaluru, breaking the previous record of 10.23 seconds set by Manikanta Hoblidhar.

His remarkable feat is not just a personal victory, but a proud moment for all Punjabis, reaffirming that determination and discipline can overcome any obstacle.

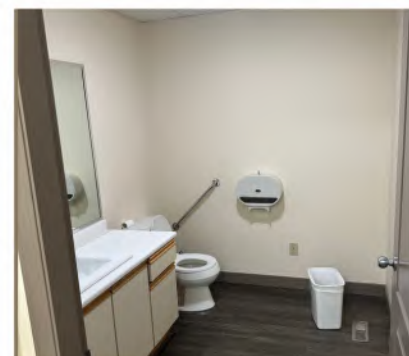
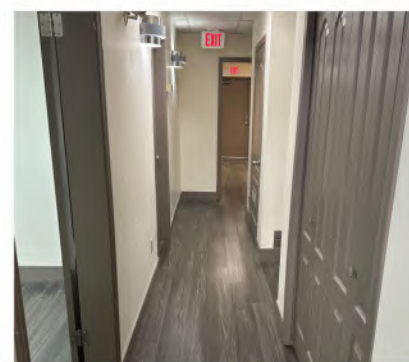
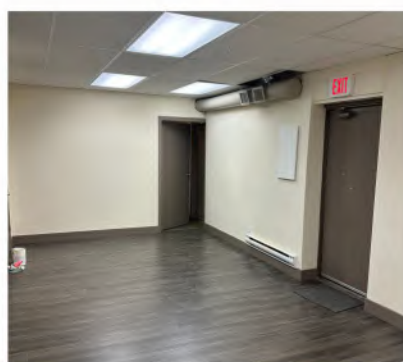

Parmish Verma Says Punjabi Singers Are Accused Of Promoting Guns Even As Hindi Songs Have ‘200 People Dancing With Guns’

Singer-actor Parmish Verma is one of the most popular faces and names in the Punjabi entertainment industry today. With his songs and films, the artist has not just amassed fans but left a mark on pop culture too. But quite very often, Parmish has faced criticism for promoting guns and violence through his work, a charge Punjabi artists face routinely. In an interview with HT, Parmish responds to the charges. Parmish Verma on Punjabi music promoting guns

When asked about why Punjabi songs are singled out for promoting violence or guns, Parmish talks about Punjabi love ballads first. “There are songs like Asi Tere Sheher Nu or Peed Tere Jaan Di (by Gurdas Maan). They are also Punjabi music,” he says, adding, “Any culture’s music is a reflection of their emotions. Even when talking about love, Punjabi music talks in excess, crossing all limits. They say Asi

Tere Sheher Nu Salaam Kar Chale that I will even leave your city now.” Justifying how guns and bullets fit into the Punjabi music scene, Parmish says, “Punjabi music goes to the depth of every emotion. If there is heartbreak, there is sacrifice. If there is annoyance, there is anger. And if there is rage, there is a gun. It’s about taking every emotion to the extreme.” Parmish Verma’s gripe with critics But the singer-turned-actor has a gripe against these critics who call out Punjabi

music for promoting guns: why isn’t the same criticism meted out to other industries, including Hindi cinema? Parmish says, “We look at, let’s say, Hindi films, where they have 200 people holding guns and dancing. We look at that as just a song, but when a Punjabi singer holds a gun, they say, ‘Aap to guns ko promote kar rahe ho (you are promoting guns)’ . There is more



content created around guns in Hindi than from Punjab. Parmish most recently appeared in his debut web series, Kanneda. The actor plays a Punjabi rapper-turned-gangster in 1990s Canada in the JioHotstar show. Kanneda also stars Zeeshan Ayyub, Ranvir Shorey, Jasmin Bajwa, and Aadar Malik.
