



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# **Kashmir terror attack: Gunmen brutally** kill **26** people in Pahalgam, World leaders stand in solidarity with India

World leaders from across the world strongly condemned the deadly terrorist attack which took place in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday, April 22.

According to police and media reports, armed gunmen killed at least 26 people on Tuesday in the picturesque tourist resort of Pahalgam in the deadliest such attack in a quarter-century in Kashmir, setting off a chain of tit-for-tat moves by India and Pakistan and raising the spectre of a fullfledged conflict between the nuclear-armed neighbours.

Heart-wrenching videos of victims and their families are circulating on social media, with survivors sharing personal accounts of how armed militants killed their loved ones. Many amongst them were newly married couples. Indian Navy officer Lt Vinay Narwal was one of them.

"This attack is much larger than anything we've seen directed at civilians in recent years," Omar Abdullah, the region's top elected official, wrote on social media. "We will come down heavily on

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# **Authorities unanimously condemn Vandalism at Surrey Temple** and Vancouver Gurdwara, calling it "an act to divide community"



ome tough questions were posed to at a press conference organized by Surrey's

organized by the Lakshmi Narayan Temple on April 23 to condemn the desecration of places of worship in a single day — the temple itself and the Khalsa Diwan Society Gurdwara in Vancouver on April 19.

The April 19 vandalism, which coincided with Surrey's Vaisakhi Parade, left disturbing graffiti on the temple and gurdwara walls, including slogans such as "Khalistan Zindabad" written in both English and Punjabi. Police officials present at the conference said they will follow the evidence to determine the motive behind this act. While the conference began with a unified message of condemnation and a vow of support from municipal and provincial leaders,





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# International Student From India Dies Due To Drowning Off Vancouver's Wreck Beach

The man who drowned at Vancouver's Wreck Beach last week has been identified by family and friends as Rahul Ranwa, a 26-year-old international student from India.

Police have yet to reveal the identity, but family and friends have created a GoFundMe page to raise funds to arrange for his funeral and repatriation costs.

On April 17, 2025, at 3:25 p.m., the University RCMP received a report of a swimmer in distress at Wreck Beach between trails 4 and 6. A man was apparently in the water yelling for help and struggling to swim.

A bystander entered the water in an attempt to affect a rescue.

Unfortunately, the rescuer had to return to shore to avoid succumbing to the waters themselves and bystanders lost sight of the man.



With assistance from the Vancouver Fire Rescue, BC Ambulance Service, Metro Vancouver Parks and the Canadian Coast Guard, a marine search was undertaken. The hovercraft CCGS Moytel deployed divers and two rigid-hull inflatable boats (RHIB) from the Kitsilano Coast Guard Station conducted an extensive search.

The police conducted a shoreline search at Wreck Beach and Acadia Beach in hopes

to find the missing swimmer. Police Dog Services, RCMP Helicopter Air 1 and Remote Piloted Aircraft Systems (aka drones) have also been deployed to assist in the search. Efforts to date have not been successful in locating the missing man.

The search was unsuccessful; however, and the man was presumed drowned. Vancouver Police later responded to the discovery of a body in the water on Third Beach. "While the body description matches the missing swimmer, confirmation of their identity has not yet been fully completed," the police said.

According to the GoFundMe page, "Rahul was just 26, the only son of his parents, and had come to Canada last year as an international student. He was pursuing his MBA at Vancouver Community College — a bright student, a member of the Student Council, and someone who worked



tirelessly at a part-time job to support his family back home."

Beyond funeral and repatriation costs, the funds will be raised to help clear the debts taken by his parents in India for his education and relocation. "Rahul's dreams were built on their sacrifices, and we want to ease the financial burden they are left carrying in the midst of unimaginable grief," mentioned the page.

# BC Nurses' Union, community mourns the Passing of Former President Aman Grewal

The BC Nurses' Union and the community is in shock and expressing the profound sadness that so many members have expressed since learning of the passing of former President Aman Grewal. In the days following this loss, BCNU heard from nurses across the province who were touched by Aman's leadership, mentorship, and unwavering dedication to the profession that spanned over three decades.

Aman was a dedicated nurse and passionate union advocate with an unwavering commitment to patient care, member advocacy, and social justice. She began her nursing career at Surrey Memorial Hospital (SMH), where she found her calling in pediatrics and later, in pediatric emergency care. Her leadership journey started early—during the 1989 nurses' strike, she stepped up as SMH's job action

coordinator while the chief steward was on leave. It was a role that saw her lead hospital job action efforts, organize picket lines, and build solidarity.

She continued her activism throughout the 1993 and 2001 strikes as a member of her Worksite Job Action Committee. Over her 33-year nursing career at SMH, Aman held many roles, including clinical care coordinator, patient care coordinator (pediatrics), diabetes nurse educator, shift coordinator, and site leader.

Aman served as BCNU Vice President from 2019-2021 and President from 2021-2023. In addition to her executive leadership, Aman served as the union's provincial lobby coordinator and chaired BCNU's Human Rights and Equity Committee and Truth and Reconciliation Committee. She contributed her insight and experience to numerous committees,



including the Policy Review Committee and working groups focused on bylaw and governance reform, seniors care, internationally educated nurses, and more. Notably, Aman was instrumental in negotiating key provisions in the 2022– 2025 Nurses' Bargaining Association provincial collective agreement, which included breakthrough language on diversity, equity and inclusion. She also helped negotiate the historic establishment of minimum nurse-to-patient ratios in the province.

Aman's advocacy ensured that nurses' voices were heard, and their hard-won rights fiercely protected. She believed deeply in justice, equity, and the collective strength of our members. Her loss is profoundly felt across the union and the broader nursing community.

"BCNU extends its deepest condolences to Aman's family, friends, and all those whose lives she touched. Her legacy will continue to inspire generations of nurses and union advocates. In lieu of flowers, Aman's family requests donations be made to Surrey Hospitals Foundation, in honour of Aman's lifelong commitment to care," said a release.

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# 21-Year-Old Innocent Student From Punjab Dies From A Stray Bullet During Gunfire

All-year-old internation student tragically lost her life after she was struck by a stray bullet during gunfire on Upper James, in Hamilton, Ontario.

Hamilton Police identified her as Harsimrat Randhawa from India. Harsimrat was studying at Mohawk College and was standing at the bus stop on her way to work when she was killed, the police informed. The police said in a press release that on April 17, 2025, at approximately 7:30 p.m., Hamilton Police received reports of a shooting near Upper James and South Bend Road. When police arrived, they

found a 21-year-old female with a gunshot wound to the chest. She was transported to hospital and later died from her injuries. She was later identified as Harsimrath.

According to Indian media reports, Harsimrath was from Taran Taran district.

Through collected video, investigators have determined that the passenger of a black Mercedes SUV fired at the occupants of a white sedan. Shortly after the shooting, the white sedan fled northbound on Upper James and the Mercedes travelled westbound on South Bend.

Shots also entered the rear window of a residence on Allenby Avenue where the occupants were watching television a few feet away. Fortunately, no one was injured in the home.

Investigators are asking

anyone with dashcam or security camera footage between 7:15 p.m. and 7:45 p.m. near Upper James and South Bend to contact Sergeant Alex Buck at 905-546-4123. If you know something that can help further the investigation, please contact police.


Meanwhile, the Indian consulate in Toronto confirmed the incident and expressed condolences.

"We are deeply saddened by the tragic death of Harsimrat in Hamilton, Ontario. As per the local police, she was an innocent victim, fatally struck by a

stray bullet during a shooting incident involving two vehicles. A homicide investigation is currently underway. We are in close contact with her family and are extending all necessary assistance. Our thoughts and prayers are with the bereaved family during this difficult time," the consulate said.

he family of the student has urged the Centre and the Punjab Government for their assistance in bringing back her body.

"We came to know from our relatives. She was standing on the road and then a bullet hit her," Harsimrat's grandfather Sukhwinder Singh in said Tarn Taran. The family urged both governments to expedite the process to bring back her body to India.


### Rajvir Dhillon (Conservative Party)

Advance polls were open on Friday, April 18; Saturday, April 19; Sunday, April 20; and Monday, April 21, from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. each day.

preliminary According to the figures, 7.3 million electors voted at the advance polls in this general election. This is a 25% increase from the 5.8 million electors who voted in advance in the 2021 general election.

of electors who voted at the advance polls for all electoral districts is being calculated and will soon be available on elections.ca.

The 45th federal general election will be held on Monday, April 28, 2025.

Canadian citizens who are at least 18 years old on election day are eligible to vote if they are registered. Most Canadians who are eligible to vote are already registered in the National Register

# **Involuntary Care At Surrey Pretrial**

Ten new beds will be available at the designated mentalhealth unit at Surrey Pretrial Services Centre, with the majority open now. Care will be provided to men in provincial custody who meet the criteria under the Mental Health Act (the Act). This service will help people who are incarcerated access care so they can stabilize on their pathway to recovery and improve overall

long-term health outcomes.

Surrey mayor Brenda Locke issued the following statement: "The opening of 10 involuntary care beds at the Surrey Pretrial Services Centre highlights the urgent need for specialized for offenders services struggling with mental health challenges, substance use, and brain injuries. This initiative is a significant first step in addressing the complex issues these individuals face while prioritizing the safety of our community. It's essential to provide targeted and long-term support to those in custody to help them stabilize and

navigate their path to recovery. I understand from the healthcare professionals that this program will involve comprehensive oversight and monitoring. We care deeply about every soul affected by mental health, substance use, and brain injury challenges, as well as safety concerns for the public and community, especially in light of the recent acts of violence we have seen elsewhere.

Yet, this simply isn't enough. The demand for mental health and addiction services far outweighs available resources, and the complexities of these needs are becoming increasingly pronounced. While this focus on specialized care for those in custody is crucial, we must also acknowledge and address the broader implications for our community, including the stark reality of addiction, mental health and homelessness. With over 1,060 individuals experiencing homelessness in Surrey—a staggering 65% increase since 2020—it's evident that our resources are falling short.

We must take a comprehensive approach to mental health and addiction treatment, ensuring that every member of our community, whether inside or outside the justice system, has access to the care they need. By doing so, we can foster a healthier community, reduce the cycles of crisis, and enhance public safety for all."



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# **Get Help With High Costs Tax Rebates And Credits**

ith tax filing season coming to a close, we're getting the word out about money you can be getting right now, just by filing your taxes.

Every year, many people in B.C. miss out on hundreds or thousands of dollars in benefits to help with the cost of living. In fact, it's estimated that more than one in 10 eligible people in Canada do not file their taxes, and nearly a quarter of them are young people aged 18-24.

Don't leave money on the table – file your taxes. Even people who don't have an income and are not required to file, can still file to receive the benefit payments.

you're paying one of the lowest income taxes in the country and could qualify for benefits and credits that reduce your taxes even more. Many working- and middle-class British Columbians who file end up paying



- families with children under the age of 18, to help reduce the costs of raising kids in B.C.
- B.C. renter's tax credit an annual

refundable tax credit to help renters with the cost of housing as we build more affordable homes to get rent prices down.

- The federal GST/HST credit quarterly payments to help offset the cost of GST people pay at the store.
- And personal income tax credits which may lead to a refund of what you paid during the year.

Need help with a tax return? The Canada Revenue Agency has free tax clinics for eligible people with modest income and a simple tax situation. These clinics are hosted by community organizations and run by volunteers.

Visit gov.bc.ca/TaxBenefits to find a tax clinic near you, learn more about cash benefits when you file your taxes, and find other programs to help with costs.

Tax benefits are one way the B.C. government is working to help people and families with the cost of living, alongside our work to help people find affordable homes, protect strong public services, and grow the economy.



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
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

"Parks where children played are now littered with needles. Small businesses are boarded up and whole blocks of storefronts are shuttered because their owners can't afford to deal with constant break-ins and vandalism," Pierre Poilievre said. "Public spaces belong to everyone, but law-abiding citizens, especially families and seniors, are being pushed out to accommodate chaos and violence."

Canadian cities have a mixed record of dealing with encampments in public places, with some not acting because they don't believe they have the legal authority to remove the camps. Conservatives will work with provinces and ensure law enforcement has the clear legal tools they need to remove encampments and give Canadians back the safe streets and public spaces they deserve.

A Poilievre-led government will do this

by reversing the Liberals' radical pro-drug policies and by:

- Amending the Criminal Code to give police the tools to charge individuals when they endanger public safety or discourage the public from using, moving through, or otherwise accessing public spaces by setting up temporary structures, including
- · Clarifying in law that police can dismantle illegal encampments and ensure individuals living in them who need help are connected with housing, addiction treatment, and mental health services.
- · Giving judges the power to order people charged for illegally occupying public spaces with a temporary structure and simple possession of illegal drugs to mandatory drug treatment.
- · Returning to a housing first approach to homelessness, ensuring people get off the streets into a stable place to live with

the support they need to rebuild their lives. "These encampments are a direct result of radical Liberal policies such as drug decriminalization and unsafe supply. They are extremely dangerous for the people trapped in them, who endure overdoses, assaults, including sexual assaults, human

trafficking, and even homicide, as well as

the community around them," he said.

# **Health Care Workers Rally To Demand Restoration Of Immigration Pathways**

HEU members call on next federal government to restore B.C. PNP spots

Health care workers rallied outside Surrey Memorial Hospital on April 17 to demand justice for migrant health care workers facing deportation due to federal cuts to the provincial nominee program (PNP). Led by the Hospital Employees' Union (HEU), the event featured powerful testimony from affected HEU members and union leaders.

"Let's be clear, these workers are not 'temporary' – they are essential," says HEU secretary-business manager Lynn Bueckert. "They are trained, committed, and doing the difficult, often invisible work that keeps our health care system going."

"These HEU members are Canadian in every way that matters - except on paper," says Bueckert. "And we are demanding that Canada's next national government restore



their pathway to stay in the country and continue their work in health care."

The federal government's decision to reduce the number of PNP spots allocated to B.C. has left more than 500 health care workers in the Fraser and Coastal regions at risk of deportation this year when their visas expire. Many had accepted critical health care jobs under the belief that work with a health authority would lead to permanent residency. "We took these health care jobs during

a staffing shortage, with the promise that we would get status," says Jasveer, a housekeeping aide. "But these abrupt changes leave many of us in the dust, without any options."

HEU is calling for urgent federal action to restore the number of PNP spots allocated to B.C. and to create a dedicated federal permanent residency pathway for nonclinical health care workers who are working full-time for B.C.'s health authorities.

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# **Surrey Council Approves Rental Homes To Be Built On City Owned Land**



the Regular Council AMeeting, Surrey Council approved the use of City owned land for a purposebuilt rental housing development that will add an estimated 350 new rental homes in Surrey. A minimum of 20% of the new units will be rented at below market rates. Located at 10975 126A Street, the 2.9-acre site is in the South Westminster Neighbourhood and near the Scott Road SkyTrain Station.

"Council is taking action on the shortage of affordable housing by approving the use of City owned land to help facilitate the creation of more rental homes in Surrey," said Mayor Brenda Locke. "A key factor in choosing this site is its proximity to rapid transit and the North Surrey Sport & Ice Complex. When completed, these new units planned for this development will significantly change the landscape of housing options in Surrey."

It is envisioned the development would consist of six-story wood structures, similar to other housing in the area. The project is part of the Surrey Affordable Rental Housing Strategy that aims to preserve and expand rentals and increase affordable housing for low to moderate income renters. "This is a strategic opportunity for the City to address our pressing housing needs through a well-planned rental development on City land," said Rob Costanzo, City Manager. "With Council's endorsement, staff will now begin the procurement process to secure a development partner who will design, build, and operate these homes. Our intention is to start construction in 2027, with completion slated for 2029. By aligning this project with both the needs of our community and rapid transit access, we can provide more affordable, modern options for Surrey residents."



Currently, the City's wholly owned development corporation, Surrey City Development Corporation, has submitted a development application for the creation of 1,800 dwelling units in a multiphased project on City owned

The ceremony acknowledged the handover of authority and leadership from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), represented by Deputy Commissioner Dwayne McDonald, to SPS and Chief Constable Norm Lipinski.

The historic ceremony took place at the Cloverdale Agriplex with The Honourable Wendy Cocchia, Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia, and The Honourable

SPS assumed overarching responsibility for policing in the City of Surrey on November 29, 2024, as the new police of jurisdiction.

The Change of Command ceremony is a symbolic event, rooted in military tradition, that signifies the passing of authority and leadership.

Garry Begg, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General of British Columbia, said, that it was a remarkable day as we celebrated the Surrey Police Service as British Columbia's newest police agency, taking over as police of jurisdiction in Surrey. "The RCMP proudly served Surrey for decades and we thank them for their tireless service and commitment to public safety," said Chief Constable Norm Lipinski.







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
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# Dr. Ambedkar Jayanti Celebrated Across Canada; Surrey Mayor **Declares April 14 As Equality Day**

In her message, Mayor Locke shared her learnings of Baba Sahib Dr. Ambedkar and the conditions of caste discrimination he lived in. Mayor Locke affirmed by saying, "Surrey has no place for discrimination."

Acharya Dwvedi of the Hindi Literary Society was a keynote speaker, who described why some of the discrimination practices continue in India. He also acknowledged many of the contributions of Dr. Ambedkar in addressing the practice of untouchability.

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

## Kashmir terror attack: Gunmen brutally kill 26 people...

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi cut short his two-day visit to Saudi Arabia and returned to New Delhi early Wednesday. In his first public remarks after the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, Modi on Thursday said India will pursue the perpetrators of the dastardly act to the ends of the earth, break their backs and raze them to the ground. He termed the attack as an assault not just on the innocent tourists, but the very soul of India and said the "perpetrators and conspirators of the act would get a punishment they would never have imagined".

"Today, from the soil of Bihar, I say to the whole world that we will pursue them to the ends of the earth. India's spirit will never be broken by terrorism. Every effort will be made to ensure justice is done. The entire nation is firm in this resolve. Everyone who believes in humanity is with us. I thank the people of various countries and their leaders who have stood with us in these times," said the PM, switching to English in between as he spoke on the

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occasion of a National Panchayati Raj Day

U.N. Secretary-General Antonio Guterres strongly condemned the attack and stressed that "attacks against civilians are unacceptable under any circumstances," U.N. spokesman Stephane Dujarric said. U.S. Vice President JD Vance, who was visiting India, called it a "devastating terrorist attack." He added on social media: "Over the past few days, we have been overcome with the beauty of this country and its people. Our thoughts and prayers are with them as they mourn this horrific attack."

U.S. President Donald Trump noted on social media the "deeply disturbing news out of Kashmir. The United States stands strong with India against terrorism." Other global leaders, including Russian President Vladimir Putin and Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, condemned the attack.

"The United States stands with India,"
U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio said

Tulsi Gabbard, Director of National Intelligence, US, said, "We stand with the people of India in condemning the terrorist attack in Jammu & Kashmir, and send our condolences and prayers to the victims families. We must all stand up against these jihadists and their ideology."

Canada was slow to join the leaders in condemning the attacks, but later Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney wrote on platform X, "I am horrified by the terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir, a senseless and shocking act of violence that has killed and injured innocent civilians and tourists. Canada strongly condemns this terrorist attack. We offer our condolences to the victims and their families."

Conservative Party leader Pierre Poilievre said, "I condemn in the strongest terms the horrific terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir that took the lives of innocent civilians, including tourists and families. Our hearts are with the victims, their loved ones, and all those affected. Canada stands



united against terror in all its forms."

"Prime Minister @GiorgiaMeloni called Prime Minister @narendramodi and strongly condemned the terrible terror attack on Indian soil. She conveyed her thoughts and prayers for the victims and wished a speedy recovery of those injured. She expressed full support of Italy in the fight against terrorism. PM Modi appreciated her call and the clear message of support against terrorism and those behind it. India and Italy will continue to work together including in international platforms to strengthen counter-terrorism efforts", Indian Ministry of External Affairs wrote on X.

Various Indo-Canadian organizations too joined the world in condemning

the attacks. Candle light vigils are being organized in different parts of Canada to stand in solidarity with the victims and pay tribute to those innocent who lost their lives in this brutal act of terror.

How has the Indian government responded?

A statement issued in the name of The Resistance Front (TRF), which is believed to be an offshoot of the Pakistani-based Lashkar-e-Taiba, claimed responsibility for the attack. India announced a series of retaliatory steps on Wednesday after its leaders huddled for hours in the morning, following PM Modi's return from Saudi Arabia.

### The steps include:

•Suspending India's participation in the Indus Waters Treaty, a 1960 pact that has governed how India and Pakistan share the waters of the six Indus basin rivers. In theory, India could now try to cut – or entirely stop – the flow of water from these rivers into Pakistan, though that is practically difficult.

• The main land border crossing between the two countries, the Integrated Check Post Attari, or the Attari-Wagah crossing, will be closed with immediate effect, and those who have crossed over with "valid endorsements" have to return through the route before May 1.

•SAARC Visa Exemption Scheme (SVES) visas granted to Pakistanis have been cancelled, and any Pakistani currently visiting India on a SVES visa must leave within 48 hours of the statement issued on Wednesday. •The military, naval and air advisers in the Pakistani High Commission in New Delhi have a week to leave India, while Indian military, naval and air advisers will be pulled back from the Indian High Commission in Islamabad. Five support staff members will also be pulled from each High Commission.

•The staffing for each High Commission will be reduced from 55 members to 30 through further reductions by May 1.







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



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# 2025 Hyundai Santa Fe HEV Review: Bolder, Premium Design

Auto Review by Veeno Dewan

The 2025 Hyundai Santa Fe is a spacious, smooth, and distinct midsize mid-size SUV. Now in its fifth generation it has a completely new look; Square and bolder it looks almost Land Rover like in its premium looks and presence. There is a clever use of the "H" motif in the shape of the head- and tail lights, and the body-coloured trim bar across the lower fascia, its not at all gimmicky and looks cool actually. The interior is premium, impressive and contemporary, and three rows of seating is standard except on the Calligraphy trim. The handy grab handle hidden in the C-pillar makes accessing the available roof

rails and optional accessories such has ski- or bike racks and even a rooftop tent easy.

easy.
There is a choice of either gasoline or

hybrid powered (HEV) models. tested the Hybrid version powered by a 1.6L four-cylinder hybrid setup, with 231 hp and 271 lb-ft of torque. The XRT and Ultimate Calligraphy trims are powered by a turbocharged 2.5L engine paired with an eight-speed dual-clutch automatic transmission compared to the hybrid's sixspeed conventional gearbox. The XRT has a top towing capacity of 4,500 pounds The other gas models can tow up to 3,500 lb. when properly equipped, while the hybrids have a maximum towing capacity of 2,000 pounds.

In terms of equipment, the standard spec is goods as it always is WITH Hyundai. There is a 12.3-inch digital gauge cluster in a slick looking curved glass panel dash with an integrated touchscreen infotainment system.

Wireless Apple CarPlay and Android Auto is standard on every model. A separate 6.6-inch touchscreen provides access to the climate controls. Two wireless smartphone charging pads and various USB-C ports abound along with an available UV-C sterilization tray to help kill germs on passengers' phones, wallets, and other personal items!

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

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

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# **VPD Seeks Witnesses To Vandalism At Sikh Temple**

released images of a vehicle and two people who were outside the Khalsa Diwan Society Gurdwara on Ross Street when it was vandalized Saturday morning, and asks anyone who recognizes them to contact police.

"We believe these people may have information about this crime and what the motivation

Jancouver Police have was," says Sergeant Steve Addison. "We ask anyone who recognizes the people in these pictures, or the vehicle, to come forward and speak with our investigators."

VPD initiated a criminal investigation on April 19, after suspects spray-painted on the walls outside the gurdwara, located near Ross Street and Marine Drive in South Vancouver. The graffiti was written in both English and Punjabi.

Investigators from VPD's Major Crime Section, who have been collecting and analyzing evidence from the crime scene and surrounding neighbourhood, have obtained images of a white pickup and two people who were in the area at the time.

Police believe the truck drove

through the area around the time of the offence, between approximately 4 and 4:30 a.m. on April 19. Two people, whom are believed to be associated to the truck, then walked near the front entrance of the temple. One person was wearing a yellow cap, yellow jacket, and black pants. The other was wearing a grey hoodie with black pants.

# **Authorities unanimously condemn**

a heated debate started when members of the community raised difficult questions.

Concerns were voiced over what some described as the government's "lukewarm" response to inflammatory slogans and imagery — including floats used in Surrey Vaisakhi Parade depicting Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi behind bars.

There were also calls for clarity on how far freedom of speech may go when it borders on incitement. Chief Lipinski acknowledged the legal challenges involved. "There is a fine line between free speech and hate speech. But vandalism crosses that line, and we will act accordingly."

Several speakers from the temple noted the growing frustration within communities over perceived inaction in the face of repeated provocations. "There's growing frustration over repeated provocations and the lack of decisive action," said one temple spokesperson. "It seems like the pot boils over time and again, and yet, little is done until it spills."

However, Surrey City, Surrey police and the province sent a loud and clear message - they do not favour any ideology, and are against any act threatening the public to

attend places of worship in their community. Surrey Mayor Brenda Locke, Surrey Police Chief Norm Lipinski, Surrey Police officer Jag Khosa, Province's Attorney General Niki Sharma, Surrey city Counselor and member of police board Rob Stutt, management of Lakshmi Narayan temple and Ross Street Gurdwara were all present at the conference to show their support to both Hindu and Sikh community and unanimously condemn the

The incidents, which occurred in the early hours of April 19 — the day of Surrey's Vaisakhi Parade — have sent ripples of concern through both the Hindu and Sikh communities. Surrey Temple authorities informed that the same act of vandalism was carried out on walls of Mata Bhameshwari Temple too on the same day.

Vancouver Police released images of a vehicle and two people who were outside the Khalsa Diwan Society Gurdwara on Ross Street when it was vandalized and is asking anyone who recognizes them to contact police.

Temple president Satish Kumar said, "In addition to the vandalism, the temple's security camera was stolen, clearly indicating

an intentional and malicious act. This deeply troubling incident is not only a hate crime/ criminal offense, but also a direct attack on a sacred space that serves as a spiritual, cultural, and communal hub for many local families — including seniors and children. Such actions have no place in our society and strike at the very heart of our values of respect, inclusion, and peace. We strongly condemn this act of hate and call upon law enforcement to investigate this matter with utmost urgency."

Surrey Mayor Brenda Locke stood firmly in support of religious harmony, stating, "Without question, Surrey is a safe city but it must feel safe. Places of worship are sanctuaries; such hateful acts strike at the heart of our peace and unity. This city will not tolerate divisive actions, and we will use every tool at our disposal to identify and prosecute the culprits."

Echoing her sentiments, Police Chief Norm Lipinski assured the public that the investigation is being handled with urgency. "Even minor vandalism deserves a full response — and this is far from minor. A special team has been assigned to the case and we are working closely with the Vancouver Police Department. We urge anyone with information to contact us or Crime Stoppers."

Attorney General Niki Sharma described the

events as heartbreaking. "Three places of worship in one day — it was an attack not just on buildings, but on the very fabric of our multicultural society. These temples and gurdwaras are not just places of prayer they are community hubs, offering language classes, yoga sessions, and support for all ages. An attack on them is an attack on us all."

The temple secretary Vinay Sharma believes the vandalism is part of an effort to scare people and foment hostility. "We are mature enough as Hindus and Sikhs that we do not fight with each other," Sharma said. "We know these people just want to divide and create a rift."

From the Ross Street Gurdwara, leaders of the Khalsa Diwan Society reaffirmed their commitment to communal peace. "Our society was built by Hindu and Sikh pioneers — hand in hand. These vandals seek to divide what generations have united. Their hatred is not welcome here."

"The act is part of an ongoing campaign by extremist forces that seek to instill fear and division within the Canadian Sikh Community. Their actions undermine the values of inclusivity, respect, and mutual support that are foundation to both Sikhism and Canadian society," said Kashmir Singh Dhaliwal, general secretary, Khalsa Diwan

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# Class 7 Licence Holder Will Be Eligible To Get Class 5 Licence Without Road Test

BC has introduced legislation to improve graduated licensing programs to create a simpler, more accessible process for new drivers, while improving safety standards for motorcycle drivers. If approved, the changes will update the Graduated Licensing Program (GLP) to remove the requirement for a second road test to obtain a Class 5 licence. Instead, for those drivers eligible to move to a Class 5 licence, government will be creating a new 12-month restriction period, during which they must demonstrate safe driving behaviour to progress.

According to current requirements all new drivers (regardless of age) must pass two road tests (Class 7 and Class 5). The Novice stage is 24 months (can be reduced to 18 with approved driver training). There is no requirement to move to a full licence. Many remain in the Novice stage for years.

After full implementation of the new legislation which is expected in early 2026, the requirement for a second road test will be removed. All drivers must still spend time driving safely before moving to full Class 5.

For drivers under 25 year of age:

A minimum of 12 months as a Learner with existing restrictions:

- \* then, 24 months as a Novice with existing restrictions; and
- \* then, driver record assessment and a new 12-month restriction period under Class 5 before earning full privileges.
- \* 25 and older:
- \* minimum nine months as a Learner;
- \* then 12 months as a Novice with no suspensions or prohibitions; and
- \* driver record assessment and a new 12-month restriction period under Class 5 before earning full privileges.
- \* Drivers with approved training can still shorten the Novice stage (under 25 only).
- \* Safety isn't compromised and drivers still gain experience before full privileges.

Garry Begg, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General, said, "By removing unnecessary barriers for new drivers and strengthening safety measures for new riders, we're making the licensing system more accessible, while helping to reduce serious injuries and fatalities on our roads."

B.C.'s graduated licensing programs for passenger vehicles and motorcycles

has not been significantly updated in the past 25 years. The decision to update provincial licensing programs is guided by a commitment to road safety and aligns with most other jurisdictions. Ontario will be the only province that requires a second road test to exit the Graduated Licensing Program.

Research indicates that age and inexperience contribute to crash risk. As new drivers get more experience, their crash risk decreases. Evidence shows that having an extended period with restrictions and enhanced driver-record reviews builds the necessary skills and behaviours to promote safe driving. The changes remove requirements not proven to increase road safety, which will reduce wait times for those seeking a road test to earn their Novice (Class 7) licence

The proposed legislative changes will also establish a new Motorcyclist Licensing Program (MLP) that all new motorcycle riders will need to complete. This approach ensures new riders gain the unique skills required to ride safely. The new MLP will also have a restriction period and enhanced



safety measure requirements for protective gear, which will be established through regulations. These changes will help reduce fatalities and serious injuries resulting from motorcycle-related crashes.

Motorcycle riders are over-represented in fatal crashes in B.C. They make up 3.7% of insured vehicles yet are involved in 14.2% of all road fatalities. Of motorcycle crashes where licensed riders were at fault, 46% involved a licensed rider with less than five years of riding experience.

Proposed changes to the GLP and MLP will continue to be informed by engagements with key partners, including Indigenous communities, driver training schools and health authorities, with implementation planned for early 2026.

The victim, Pawanpreet Kaur, a 21-yearold woman from Brampton, was shot multiple times and pronounced deceased at the scene.

three children - son AR Ameen, and two daughters, Khatija Rahman and Raheema Rahman. Soon after the news broke, the musician opened up about how "shattering" it is to bear the "weight of broken hearts."

AR Rahman posted a heartbreaking update on X (formerly Twitter), "We had hoped to reach the grand thirty, but all things, it seems, carry an unseen end. Even the throne of God might tremble at the weight of broken hearts. Yet, in this shattering, we seek meaning, though the pieces may not

find their place again. To our friends, thank you for your kindness and for respecting our privacy as we walk through this fragile chapter. #arrsairaabreakup."

In March, after Rahman underwent an angiography following complaints of chest pain in Chennai, Saira Banu said in public that she didn't want to be referred to as "Ex-wife" as they were not divorced

She wrote, "What happened in Pahalgam is reprehensible. People were there on vacations, honeymoons, celebrating with their families. Just taking in the beauty of Kashmir. This is not a tragedy we can

"I'm so deeply anguished by this," Priyanka added.



Twenty-six people were killed after terrorists opened fire at Baisaran, a popular meadow near the resort town of Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir around 3 PM on Tuesday. An Indian Navy officer and an Intelligence Bureau personnel were also killed in the attack.

The Resistance Front (TRF), a proxy of the banned Pakistan-based terror

group Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), claimed

A massive manhunt has been launched. Army, Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), and Jammu and Kashmir Police have cordoned off the area. Helicopters were deployed to evacuate the injured from the inaccessible meadow. Locals helped in transporting the wounded on ponies down the rugged terrain to Pahalgam.



# Pahalgam Terror Attack Cuts Short Bollywood's **Cautious Love Affair With Kashmir**

Tew Delhi: On Tuesday, the idyllic town of Pahalgam in Kashmir - often referred to as India's "mini Switzerland" was shattered by a gruesome terror attack that claimed the lives of 26 tourists.

Allegedly targeted for not offering prayers, they were gunned down in cold blood, a first-of-its-kind unprovoked attack on civilians in a region that had long been considered an oasis of peace, even during Kashmir's darkest chapters.

Unlike neighbouring areas like Anantnag or Pulwama that have endured insurgencyrelated violence for decades, Pahalgam had remained untouched. The attack not only stunned the nation but also severed, perhaps indefinitely, Bollywood's tentative rekindling of its once-flourishing relationship with the valley.

Local voices painted a stark picture. "Humaari toh rozi roti gayi," said a shopkeeper in the bustling main bazaar of Pahalgam. For thousands whose livelihoods depended on tourism and film shoots, the tragedy brought with it not just mourning but economic devastation.

#### **Betaab And The Birth Of Betaab Valley**

The cinematic history of Pahalgam began in 1983 with the release of Betaab, the debut film of Sunny Deol and Amrita Singh. Directed by Rahul Rawail, the film was a sweeping romance set against the breathtaking backdrops of lush meadows, pine forests and snow-capped peaks.

The love story between two youngsters from different worlds struck a chord, but what left an indelible mark was the location. A still from Betaab

Such was the film's visual impact that the area where it was shot came to be known as "Betaab Valley", a name now officially marked on the tourist map of Jammu & Kashmir.

It became one of the most photographed and visited destinations in the Valley, pulling in both film crews and tourists for decades.

The Golden Era Of Filming In Kashmir Following Betaab, a wave of filmmakers toward Kashmir. Films like Kashmir Ki Kali (1964) starring Shammi Kapoor and Sharmila Tagore, had already captured Pahalgam's beauty, but the post-Betaab era saw a marked uptick in big-budget productions choosing the Valley as their set. and 1980s, Kashmir was a central hub for Bollywood films. Known for its breathtaking landscapes, it became the setting for numerous iconic movies that have defined Indian cinema. Films like Kashmir Ki Kali (1964), Arzoo (1965), Jab Jab Phool Khile (1965), and Kabhi Kabhie (1976) featured the majestic Dal Lake, lush meadows and snow-capped mountains.

The grandeur of Kashmir was captured in classics like Silsila (1981), Satte Pe Satta (1982), and Roti (1974), which created an inseparable link between Bollywood and Kashmir.

#### A Break In The Romance

The 1990s were marked by a wave of militancy in Kashmir, particularly in areas like Anantnag, Pulwama and Sopore. Bollywood pulled back, no longer willing to risk shooting in a region that had turned volatile. Pahalgam, despite being relatively untouched by violence, suffered from the broader perception that Kashmir was 'unsafe'

The tide began to turn in the 2000s. After a hiatus of 28 years, Kashmir's silver screen presence was reignited by director Imtiaz Ali, who in 2011 decided to film Rockstar, starring Ranbir Kapoor and Nargis Fakhri, in the famous Betaab Valley.

The choice of location was not coincidental: the valley had earned fame decades earlier with the 1983 film Betaab. Imtiaz Ali's film brought Kashmir back into the cinematic fold, and soon, the Valley's magic was discovered by more filmmakers.

In 2012, Bollywood's "Badshah", Shah Rukh Khan, visited Pahalgam for Jab Tak Hai Jaan. The film's romantic track Jiya Re, shot against the stunning Betaab Valley, reintroduced the Valley to a global audience. The Valley's pristine beauty, captured by Yash Chopra's camera, signalled the revival of Kashmir as a film destination, and Bollywood's love affair with the region was reborn.

In 2013, Ranbir Kapoor returned to the snow-clad landscapes of Gulmarg and Pahalgam for Yeh Jawaani Hai Deewani alongside Deepika Padukone, shooting in temperatures as low as -6.7°C.

Despite the 2014 floods, which devastated Kashmir and led to massive loss of life and property, filmmakers did not shy away. Films like Fitoor (2014), an adaptation of Charles Dickens' Great Expectations, was filmed around Srinagar's Dal Lake and Pahalgam.

The same year, Highway, starring Alia

Bhatt, was shot in the Aru Valley in Pahalgam. The film, released in 2015, focused on the themes of freedom and escape, and used Kashmir's landscapes as a metaphor for the protagonist's emotional journey.

Haider (2014), directed by Vishal Bhardwaj, was shot in Pahalgam and other parts of the Kashmir Valley.

Salman Khan's Bajrangi Bhaijaan (2015) shot scenes in Pahalgam that doubled for Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

Rocky Aur Rani Kii Prem Kahaani (2023), starring Alia Bhatt and Ranveer Singh, was also shot in Pahalgam, Gulmarg and

Aside from this, Sam Bahadur, which tells the story of India's first Field Marshal Sam Manekshaw, was shot in Pahalgam and Srinagar, both located in the Kashmir

Each film contributed not just to India's pop culture memory but also helped rebuild Kashmir's image as a safe, scenic haven. The shoots brought in money, visibility, and jobs. Hotel occupancy rose, homestays thrived, and a new generation of Kashmiris saw Bollywood not as a distant dream but a tangible opportunity.

The abrogation of Article 370 on August 5, 2019 also played its part. This constitutional change revoked the special status of Jammu and Kashmir and was followed by the implementation of the Jammu and Kashmir Film Policy in 2021.

Supported by actors like Aamir Khan and filmmakers such as Rajkumar Hirani, the policy aimed to bring normalcy by attracting filmmakers back to the Valley.

The results were swift. The plan seemed to work. Pahalgam emerged as a symbol of Kashmir's rebirth. Until now.
